3. It appears from your scheme that APO 394, which is located at Headquarters Allied Control Commission, Brindisi, is also the distribution center of mail for the entire 2675th A.C.C. Regiment. MEMORANDUM ON POSTAL SERVICE FOR PERSONNEL OF 2675th REGIMENT A. C. C.

1. In order for satisfactory postal service to be rendered all American personnel of the Allied Control Commission and Allied Military Government, APO 394 has been established and will operate at Headquarters, Allied Control Commission. This APO number is to be used as the mail address, for both official and personal mail, by all personnel of the Commission and Regiment. One exception is Company "F" (Region VI), Sardinia, which will continue to use APO 397.
2. It will be understood that APO 394 does not operate as a post office in the customary sense. Mail for all the personnel of the regiment will not be delivered, sorted, and redistributed at the location of this APO. The Postal Service NATOUSA has been notified of the geographical location of every unit of the regiment as listed in Regimental APO Bulletins and Special Orders and promulgated for the information of all concerned. Mail, properly addressed in accordance therewith to the regimental unit, APO 394, will be redirected by the Army Postal Service and routed through the APO currently serving the particular organization, in order to ensure the promptest possible delivery.
3. A complete and accurate mail directory section should be operated at Headquarters, 2675th Regiment, A.C.C., (Forward Echelon); and Headquarters, 2675th Regiment, A.C.C., (Rear Echelon). These sections should maintain card files showing locations of all personnel on duty with the Regiment. Proper record will be made of all changes within the organization in order that mail can be properly readdressed and forwarded without delay.
4. Each company should maintain a card file showing locations of all personnel on duty with such company. Proper record should be made of all changes within the organization in order that mail can be properly readdressed and forwarded without delay.
5. On change of location of any regimental unit, Headquarters 2675th Reg't. should at once advise AG Postal, NATOUSA, of the new geographical address of the unit in order that the Postal Service may without delay properly readdress mail to the APO serving that locality. Company Commanders on change of location should establish immediate contact with the APO unit serving their new area.
6. Change of address cards, NAP Forms 11 and 12, are attached. Such forms are available at all APOs and all personnel should immediately complete and mail such cards to the following:

My dear General Taylor:

The present failure to receive their mail is having a very poor effect on the morale of both officers and men of AMG in Italy. That is particularly true at this time of year when they are all expecting packages from home.

I have had an officer check into the system of distribution here with the APO Officials. He reports that all mail for the mainland and Sicily is received by APO #790, the central distributing point which is located about 6 miles from our Headquarters. There, the 394 mail is collected and dispatched to BRINDISI including all mail and packages for the rather larger number of men and officers of AMG Region III, Region IV, 5th Army Group and our own HQAMG; all of the above with their Headquarters here in the city. What happens thereafter, I do not know but a very small amount of it seems to return here. Since official mail is not mixed with the personal mail, this seems to be a needless hardship for the men and the extra shipping back and forth a needless use of good shipping space.

I highly recommend that the APO be established at NAPLES where the mail can be quickly sorted and mail for HQACC sent off either to BRINDISI or SALERNO as quickly or nearly so as at present. We plan to operate scheduled courier service to SALERNO about 4 times daily. It will reduce the burden of handling at your Headquarters which in the end will be a time saver. It will reduce shipping space requirements from NAPLES to BRINDISI and return by a very considerable amount. In addition, it will insure faster and better mail service for the hundreds of men whose Headquarters are at NAPLES.

I believe that if this matter is properly explained to General Joyce that he will approve the location of APO #394 at NAPLES. There is every reason for it and none that I can find against it.

1. The mail of both British and American personnel in Headquarters, AMG have gone seriously wrong recently. This has been due, as far as I can make out, to the following factors:

- a. Headquarters, AMG, was not recognized on the mainland of Italy as a correct postal address, thus a number of our mails have gone to 15th Army Group, AMG. I am dealing with this point
- b. A number of our personnel gave Headquarters, ACC, as their postal address. This was inevitable in the confusion that has arisen regarding our nomenclature.
- c. The American Regimental APO No. 394 was also allotted to your Headquarters, as well as to Regimental Headquarters at Tizzi Ouzou.

2. For these reasons I feel that possibly there is a large quantity of mail, both British and American, sitting undelivered at Brindisi. Troops of both nationalities are naturally getting somewhat disturbed about absence of mail. I should be grateful if you could have all letters for personnel not actually at Brindisi, sent in a bag by the quickest possible means, to Headquarters, AMG, Provincia Building, Naples. We have the locations of all personnel, British and American, in our office, and will arrange to have these letters re-directed. It will be much appreciated if you could do this in time for us to arrange the delivery of mails for Christmas.

1. There is no undelivered mail for either British or American personnel of units of 2675 Regt. here in Brindisi. A number of sacks of mail have been sent here erroneously but have always been shipped out at once to their proper location.

2. The proper address, of course, for personnel at this Headquarters is "Headquarters Allied Control Commission, APO 394." The proper address for personnel of units of the 2675 Regt. is "Company _____ 2675 Regt, APO 394." It is the business of the Commanding Officer of each unit to instruct his personnel regarding the proper address which they should use. This information has been furnished to all units. Until these addresses are properly corrected, it is inevitable that some mail will come here that does not belong here.

3. The mail for all units served by APO 394 is given a sorting service either at Algiers or Naples Base Post Offices and is forwarded to the APO nearest geographically to the location of the unit for delivery to the unit. Occasionally, through somebody's error, mail is sent here which belongs to a Regimental unit. These errors are called to the attention of the proper authorities in order that they may be rectified.

5. The units of your command should be directed to use only the addresses which are shown on attached copy, if they are correct. If the mailing scheme inclosed is not correct, this APO and also the Postal Division should be notified at once, giving the correct unit names.

6. Any change in unit location should be reported to Postal Division at NATOUA and at P.E.B., and APO 394 to Postal Officer.

REPORT ON POSTAL SERVICES, APO 394

5 January 1944

1. Problems involved:

- a. Location and proper delivery of personal mail of members of this organization which has failed to reach its destination.
- b. Speeding up of the delivery of current mail.

2. Remedial measures recommended:

- a. Location and proper delivery of personal mail of members of this organization which has failed to reach its destination.

(1) Failure, in the present case of mail to reach its destination is chargeable to one or more of the following causes:

(a) Inadequate directory service: The Base Post Offices in this theatre of operations maintain directory services. These consist of card files which give the name, serial number, and present assignment of all personnel within the theatre. These files, to be of any use, must be kept up to date. Generally, they are. But, in the case of AMG-ACC personnel, two factors have operated to handicap the Base Post Offices. One is the failure, both on the part of the organization, and of the individual, to submit special orders and change of address cards for the information of the Base Post Office. The other is the frequent change of station on the part of AMG-ACC personnel.

(b) Bad addresses.

(2) Remedial Measures:

(a) Establishment of uniform system of addressing personal mail. This has been done, with the establishment of the 2675th Regiment, and the assignment of APO 394.

(b) Establishment of a directory service by APO 394. The work of building up such a directory has already been commended. With the completion of this directory, and the commencement of operations by APO 394 along the lines outlined in the attached memorandum, it is felt that the difficulties now experienced will disappear, once the system has been established, and has been in operation for approximately one month to six weeks.

b. Speeding up of the delivery of current mail.

It is felt that the remedial measures set forth in Par 2a (2), above, should prove adequate.

PROPOSED OPERATION OF APO 394 (ACC)

5 January 1944

1. Scope:

The scope of the operations of APO 394 can best be judged by its mission, which is to provide prompt and accurate mail service to the personnel of ACC-AMG. However, certain problems arise in this connection which appear to be outside the normal run of postal difficulties. They are as follows:

a. Physical separation of ACC-AMG units: The various units of ACC-AMG are, at present, more widely scattered, by far, than the corresponding units of, for example, an average Infantry division.

b. Frequent change of station on the part of personnel of ACC-AMG.

2. Operations Proposed:

a. The location proposed for APO 394 is Naples, where APO 790 the Base Post Office for Italy and Sicily, is located.

b. Incoming mail: All mail for ACC-AMG personnel to be routed initially to APO 394, regardless of location of the personnel or of the units to which they belong. Handling time should not exceed 24 hours.

c. Directory service: APO 394 will maintain a complete directory of all ACC-AMG personnel, and, upon receipt of incoming mail, will break it down by companies, marking it for delivery to the nearest APO to the unit concerned. By doing this, a minimum of misdirection should result, inasmuch as the APO 394 directory can necessarily be much more accurate and up-to-date than a directory maintained by a Base Post Office.

d. Outgoing mail: APO 394 will afford the same service, so far as outgoing mail is concerned, as a Division APO. That is, it will receive it, bag it, and deliver it to the Base Post Office for dispatch to destination. In this connection, outlying units will deliver outgoing mail to the APO from which they receive incoming mail, which APO will deliver correspondingly to the Base Post Office.

e. Stamp, Money-Order, and EFM Services: APO 394 will afford the same service in this regard as a Division APO. Outlying units will, of course, make use of the facilities of the APO from which they receive incoming mail.

3. Space and Personnel Required:

a. The space now provided for APO 394 in the Provincia Building, Naples, with the addition of one small office, should prove adequate. 912

MEMORANDUM ON POSTAL SERVICE FOR PERSONNEL OF 2657th REGIMENT A. C. C.

1. In order for satisfactory postal service to be rendered all American personnel of the Allied Control Commission and Allied Military Government, APO 394 has been established and will operate at Headquarters, Allied Control Commission. This APO number is to be used as the mail address, for both official and personal mail, by all personnel of the Commission and Regiment. One exception is Company "F" (Region VI), Sardinia, which will continue to use APO 397.

2. It will be understood that APO 394 does not operate as a post office in the customary sense. Mail for all the personnel of the regiment will not be delivered, sorted, and redistributed at the location of this APO. The Postal Service MATOUSA has been notified of the geographical location of every unit of the regiment as listed in Regimental APO Bulletins and Special Orders and promulgated for the information of all concerned. Mail, properly addressed in accordance therewith to the regimental unit, APO 394, will be redirected by the Army Postal Service and routed through the APO currently serving the particular organization, in order to ensure the promptest possible delivery.

3. A complete and accurate mail directory-section should be operated at Headquarters, 2675th Regiment, A.C.C., (Forward Echelon); and Headquarters, 2675th Regiment, A.C.C., (Rear Echelon). These sections should maintain card files showing locations of all personnel on duty with the regiment. Proper record will be made of all changes within the organization in order that mail can be properly re-addressed and forwarded without delay.

4. Each company should maintain a card file showing locations of all personnel on duty with such company. Proper record should be made of all changes within the organization in order that mail can be properly readdressed and forwarded without delay.

5. On change of location of any regimental unit, Headquarters 2675th Reg't. should at once advise AG Postal, MATOUSA, of the new geographical address of the unit in order that the Postal Service may without delay properly readdress mail to the APO serving that locality. Company Commanders on change of location should establish immediate contact with the APO unit serving their new area.

6. Change of address cards, NAP Forms 11 and 12, are attached. Such forms are available at all APOs and all personnel should immediately complete and mail such cards to the following:

7. Personnel should advise their correspondents of their new APO number, showing the unit designation, as listed in Regimental APO Bulletin or Special Order. V-Mail change of address forms should be used for this purpose if available.

8. The cable address of all personnel of the regiment is AMUSHA, with the exception of personnel on duty with Company "F" (Region VI). (See para. 1).

I -- CONSERVATION OF VEHICLE TRACKS

Section II, Circular Number 154, this headquarters, cs, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. All concerned will make every effort to obtain the maximum wear from all types of tracks and to use partially worn tracks to the maximum extent.
2. Replacement of vehicle tracks will, except in units alerted for combat, be made only in case the tracks on the vehicle are completely worn out.
3. Necessary replacement of tracks for full and half track combat vehicles not in or alerted for immediate combat, will be made from available used steel or rubber reversible or non-reversible tracks having from 25% to 50% of their original wear life. Units equipped with Medium Tractor M4 may be issued new rubber tracks if the only used tracks available are steel.
4. Units alerted for combat may, for replacement, draw tracks possessing not less than 75% of original wear life; but such replacement will not be made prior to two weeks before date of movement to combat area. At the time of movement to combat area, tracks in excess of organizational spares will be turned in to the nearest Ordnance Depot.
