TO : Commanding Officer, Headquarters Command, Allied Force, APO 512.

1. a. The 2675th Headquarters Company AMG (Provisional) is hereby re-designated as the 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission (U. S. Contingent) (Provisional) with the following authorized allotment of grades and ratings:

b. The above allotment may be sub-allotted by the Commanding Officer of the 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission (U. S. Contingent) (Prov), at his discretion, to a provisional headquarters and headquarters company, and to provisional letter designated companies thereunder. Strength will always be reported under the regimental designation only.

2. a. The following units will be redesignated by the Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission (U. S. Contingent) (Prov), consistent with paragraph 1 b above:

- (1) Headquarters and Headquarters Company, AMGOT, 15th Army Group (U. S. Contingent) (Prov).
- (2) 2672d Headquarters Company SMG (Prov).
- (3) School for Military Government, Allied Force (Prov).

b. The Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission (U. S. Contingent) (Prov) is authorized to publish orders attaching personnel or sub-divisions of the regiment to headquarters or units within the theater, as approved by the Chief, Military Government Section, Allied Force Headquarters, and to publish travel orders that do not obligate funds.

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3. Upon re-designation the 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission (U. S. Contingent) (Prov) remains assigned to Headquarters Command, Allied Force.

4. Internal administration and operational control are authorized as desired by the Chief, Military Government Section, Allied Force.

5. The Headquarters Command, Allied Force, will function as the superior command in all normal matters except as authorized in paragraph 4 above.

6. a. It is desired that you dissolve the following units:

- (1) 2672d Headquarters Company SMG (Prov)
- (2) School for Military Government, Allied Force

b. Personnel and equipment now assigned to the units in paragraph 6a (1) and (2) above, will be transferred to the 2675th Regiment, Allied Commission (U. S. Contingent) (Prov).

7. Dates and places of redesignation, allotments, and dissolutions will be reported to this headquarters without delay. Seven (7) copies of each accomplishing order will be forwarded to the Commanding General, SOS NATOUA.

8. a. Final rosters will be prepared by the units being dissolved and the unit being redesignated. An initial roster will be prepared by the newly designated unit. All rosters will be prepared and forwarded in accordance with AR 345-900.

b. The appropriate data (see paragraph 18, AR 345-800) will be entered in the morning report of each unit in accordance with Section III, AR 345-400, as modified by paragraph 3g, letter this headquarters, AG 330.33/100 -S, dated 29 July 1943, subject: "Adoption of New Morning Reports."

SUBJECT: Organization of 2675th Regiment (U.S. Contingent) and its
British Counterparts.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Reference is made to Administrative Memorandum Number 69, this headquarters, cc, and letter Headquarters NATOUSA, file AG 322/164 A-0, dated 30 September 1943.

2. a. The Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission (U.S. Contingent) (Provisional), less detachments with AMG 15th Army Group and Headquarters AMG (ACC), is established initially at TIZI OUZOU, NORTH AFRICA, using U.S. personnel now on duty with the Military Government School and Holding Center as a cadre.

b. The British Administrative Headquarters, less detachments with AMG 15th Army Group and Headquarters AMG (ACC), is established initially at TIZI OUZOU, NORTH AFRICA, using British personnel now on duty with the Military Government School and Holding Center as a cadre.

3. a. The senior U.S. Army officer on duty with Headquarters AMG (ACC) is, by virtue of rank, the Commanding General, (U.S. Contingent), Allied Control Commission for ITALY.

b. The officer (U.S.) now Commandant, Military Government School and Holding Center at TIZI OUZOU, NORTH AFRICA, is designated as Headquarters Commandant, (Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment (U.S. Contingent) (Provisional)) for Headquarters Allied Military Government (Allied Control Commission for ITALY).

c. The British Administrative Headquarters responsible for records and administration of personnel held on War Establishments will be commanded by a British officer of the rank of Colonel.

4. Officer personnel, over and above the authorized strength of operating Regions and their next higher headquarters, will be assigned by Headquarters AMG (ACC), subject to the approval of this headquarters. Such officers may, however, be attached, to Regions or other headquarters for instruction or to meet temporary needs. Allocations of personnel as between AMG 15th Army Group and Headquarters AMG (ACC) will be controlled by this headquarters.

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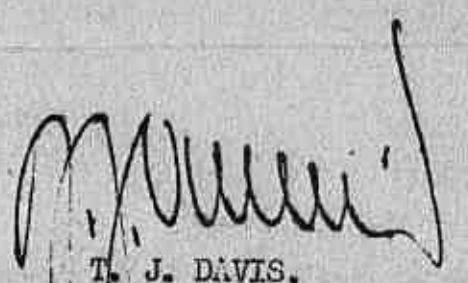

My dear General Joyce,

1. The organisation of Regimental Headquarters and Headquarters Company 2675th Regiment ACC, is progressing satisfactorily.
2. In order to complete the regimental organisation, the enclosed order has been prepared in form for publishing, but its publication is withheld pending your approval or other action. This procedure was adopted to save time in transmitting the order.
3. If you approve will you please direct its distribution to H.Q., A.M.G. to A.M.G. 15th Army Group, and to Sub-Commissions. It is also requested that you notify me by cable or courier of your action. If you desire material changes in the order, please have all copies returned by air together with your instructions.
4. (a) It is necessary that lettered companies be organized because the Table of Equipment for the regiment allots many items on the basis of so many per company. These items, along with all other company property, must be shown on Company property books, according to the present system of property record keeping.

(b) Aside from that portion of A.M.G. 15th Army Group performing Headquarters functions, which portion is to be designated permanently as 15th Army Group Detachment, Headquarters Company 2675th Regiment A.C.C., the personnel with that Army Group are assigned to Company G, the company designation which would normally be given to the now non-existent Region No. 7.
5. The organization of British Administrative Headquarters, corresponding to our American regimental headquarters has been delayed pending the appointment of a Commanding Officer. That matter has now been decided and progress will quickly follow.

TO : Major General Kenyon A. Joyce, United States Army.

1. The organization of the 2675th Regiment (U.S. Contingent) as indicated by General Orders 1 and 2 herewith, and directives pertaining to its administration, present several problems to this Headquarters.

2. It is the opinion of your Staff that the following records must be retained at Headquarters Allied Military Government Detachment:

Form 66-1 (Officers Qualification Card)
Form 20 (S/M Qualification Card)
Form 24 (Service Record and Allied Papers)
Form 1 (Morning Report)
Form 5 (Sick Book)

In this connection see letter AFHQ, AG 367.4-1 WMS-AGM of 3 November 1943, Subject: Organization of 2675th Regiment (U.S. Contingent) and its British Counterparts, paragraph 5, inclosed herewith.

3. It will be necessary that all reports, rosters, and returns from all companies and detachments in the field either;

- a. be forwarded to Regimental Headquarters through Headquarters, Allied Military Government (AGG) or;
- b. duplicate copies be sent to this Headquarters.

This is necessary in order to plan for required assignments and replacements of personnel and the supply of equipment and transportation to Regions.

4. No apparent reason exists for making the 5th and 8th Army Detachments into a Company separate from the 15th Army Group Detachment. It is believed that for convenience all personnel within the 15th Army Group should be included in one company. The entire group is a small, mobile unit which when completely organized will remain intact except for normal casualties.

5. It must be understood that transfers of personnel in the field will be made by the Adjutant General of Headquarters, Allied Military Government, (AGG) "By command of Major General Joyce", similar to transfer by Division Order.

6. In view of the foregoing, it is suggested that if approval is given to the inclosed General Order No. 1 and General Order No. 2, that Regimental Headquarters be instructed;

- a. to issue an amending order to General Order No. 2, incorporating Headquarters 15th Army Group, 5th and 8th Army Detachments into one company, -Company "G".

- b. to require that a copy of all records and returns from all units in the field, be furnished to Headquarters, Allied Military Government Detachment.
- c. to issue instructions to Headquarters Allied Military Government, (ACC) that they will furnish Regimental Headquarters with copies of all orders affecting personnel and equipment.
- d. to furnish copies of all orders to Headquarters Allied Military Government (ACC).
- e. that the Commanding General only, has authority to transfer personnel in the field.

SUBJECT: Situation Report and Inquiry

TO : Judge Advocate, NATCUSA, APO 534, U. S. A.

1. After arrival at these headquarters, 3 December 1943 from Hq AGC, Brindisi, I found great uncertainty, as at Brindisi on the question of whether Major General Kenyon A. Joyce, or Colonel G. M. Parkin, has General Courts Martial jurisdiction over personnel in AMG (AGC). Available records here have not afforded me information upon which to resolve the uncertainty.

2. Chronology of events.

a. On 30 September 1943, Hq NATCUSA redesignated the 2675th Hq and Hq Co AMG (Prov) as 2675th Regt AG (U.S. Contingent) (Prov) and directed the organization of the regiment (Letter AG 322/164 A-O, Hq NATCUSA 30 September 1943).

b. On 23 October 1943, Brig General McSherry assumed command of the regiment pursuant to provisions of para 6 a, AR 600-20 and organized the regiment as directed by Hq NATCUSA (GO No. 1 Hq 2675th Reg AG (U.S. Contingent) (Prov).)

c. Request for granting of GCM jurisdiction was made. (These headquarters have no record of date of request, text of request, or identity of requesting authority).

d. On 3 November 1943 AFHQ (Military Government Section) designated the C.O. of the School for Military Government and Holding Center (Tizi Ouzou, North Africa) as Hq Commandant A.M.G (Allied Control Commission) and as Commanding Officer of 2675th Regiment AGC (U.S. Cont.) (Prov).

NOTE: That AFHQ (Military Government Section) refers to the Regiment as 2675th Regiment AGC, although I can find no record of any NATCUSA or AFHQ directive redesignating the regiment as 2675th Regiment AGC.

e. On 1 November 1943, Major General Joyce was appointed Deputy President of Allied Control Commission.

f. On 4 November 1943, a cable was sent from KAJ (Kenyon A. Joyce) through the C.O. IBS to AFHQ for Sawbridge requesting that "when GCM jurisdiction is assigned me will you insure that a qualified Staff Judge Advocate is assigned my headquarters" (Cite FARGO 562; No. 562 Hq AMG and HB 505 Hq IBS).

g. On 6 November 1943, Col. G. M. Parkin, Inf. C.O. School for Military Government and Holding Center, (Tizi Ouzou, North Africa) assumed command of 2675th Regiment AGC (U.S. Contingent (Prov) and reorganized it.

(GO No. 1 and No. 2 Hq 2675th Regiment ACC (U. S. Contingent) (Prov) 6 November 1943).

h. On 19 November 1943, the C.O. 2675th Regiment AC (U.S. Contingent) (Prov) was granted GCM jurisdiction (Cable No. 2939 from AGWAR to Freedom).

i. On 22 November 1943, Hq NATCUSA cabled CG, IBS and Joyce advising Gen. Joyce of the granting of GCM to the GO 2675th Regiment Allied Commission (U.S. Contingent) (Prov) desiring him (Regt CO) to acknowledge understanding of his powers, and advising that Lt. Col. Donald P. Mayhew, JAGD, O-346243, being assigned your (Gen. Joyce's) headquarters as SJA, reference your (Gen. Joyce's) cable B 505 current signed CG NATCUSA cite NAJAG to CG, IBS for Joyce (No. 2113384 Nr. 3752).

3. Discussion

a. Records of these Headquarters reveal no clear and unambiguous directive on the part of either Headquarters NATCUSA or AFHQ, either dissolving 2675th Regiment AC (U.S. Contingent) (Prov), establishing a 2675th Regiment ACC (U.S. Contingent) (Prov) or redesignating the former as the latter. Col. Parkin, in assuming command of the regiment did not indicate that he was assuming command of a redesignated regiment. He did not continue on with the existing series of general orders of Headquarters 2675th Regiment AC (US Contingent) (Prov), but commenced with GO No. 1 Headquarters 2675th Regt. ACC (U.S. Contingent) (Prov). These facts may form the basis of a strong contention that 2675th Regiment AC (U.S. Contingent) (Prov) still exists de jure and that 2675th Regiment ACC (U.S. Contingent) (Prov) exists de facto only, if at all.

f. The following considerations give rise to a question whether it was or is contemplated that a officer other than a general officer should exercise GCM over AMG and ACC personnel:

(1) GCM jurisdiction must have been requested at a time when Brigadier General McSherry was commanding AMG and the regiment - prior to November 1, 1943.

(2) Maj. General Joyce then became senior U. S. Officer in the AMG-ACC establishment - 1 November 1943.

(3) Gen. Joyce considered that GCM jurisdiction would be granted to him and wanted a SJA in his headquarters (2 f above).

(4) The assignment of a SJA to General Joyce would indicate that he was considered as being the officer to exercise the GCM jurisdiction.

(5) The relatively large number of officers in the regiment (829 officers to the 1045 enlisted men) many of them full Colonels, and the fact that a field officer can not, under AW 104, forfeit any of a company grade officer's pay, would indicate that a general officer should exercise disciplinary command.

4. I am unable to resolve the following questions in whole or in part because the pertinent files and records of this headquarters, such as they are, have been packed and the bulk of the personnel are moving to the mainland. General McSherry is no longer in the command, General Joyce remains with the Italian government at Brindisi and I am moving at once to Naples. I am advised, verbally, that Colonel Park has appointed or is about to appoint, a GCM to try one or two officers and has provided for inferior courts. In order that I may be properly informed on the status of the GCM jurisdiction over U.S. personnel in the AMG and ACC I am anxious to have information on the points raised below:

(1) Was the AFHQ (Military Government Section) letter (2 g above) a competent redesignation of the regiment or has the regiment been otherwise redesignated; if so, does the grant of GCM jurisdiction to the CO of the 2675th Regiment A.C. become vested in the CO of the regiment as redesignated, viz., 2675th Regiment ACC?

(2) If the letter was not competent to amount to redesignation of the regiment can it be considered as competent to appoint Colonel Parkin as CO of the original regiment and this vest him with GCM jurisdiction?

(3) Was it contemplated, and is it now contemplated, by Hq NATCUSA or AFHQ that other than a general officer should exercise GCM over so large a body of U. S. Officers?

SUBJECT: Allotment of grades and ratings to 2675th Regiment, ACC.
TO : Major General Kenyon A. Joyce, Acting Deputy President, ACC.

1. Mr. McCloy has carried back to the War Department your request for the utmost flexibility in the allotment of grades and ratings to the unit holding personnel for ACC, and I am sure he will do the best he can to take off all restrictions. In the meantime it is worth reviewing the situation as it now stands to see what can be done about it at this end.

2. Attached hereto is a table showing in two columns the authorized and presently assigned grades of enlisted men for service with AMG ACC in this Theatre. The authorized allotment was established by the War Department by letter dated August 25, 1943, and was based on estimates by total number only prepared by this Section for Military Government in Regions 1 to 4 plus National Headquarters. This allotment was established by the War Department by comparing it with other administrative unit requirements, and not by securing a basis for organization from AMG or ACC.

3. By NATOUSA letter AG 322/164 A-O dated 30 September, this allotment was assigned to the 2675th Regiment, which was designated as the unit to hold all U.S. personnel, officers and enlisted men, engaged in AMG-ACC activities in the Theatre.

4. This letter appears to give the greatest flexibility possible within the War Department authorization, despite the unit's being called a "Regiment", as the NATOUSA letter referred to provides that the allotment "may be sub-allotted by the Commanding Officer of the 2675th Regiment....at his discretion to a provisional headquarters and headquarters company, and to provisional latter designated companies thereunder."

5. To meet the problem raised by you, namely, the inability to make promotions in view of lack of vacancies in the first three grades and the heavy over-assignment existing in the grade of sergeant, it might be well to prepare for the following action (assuming Mr. McCloy is not successful):

- as
- a. Request a change by the War Department in the existing authorization,
 - b. Reduce the assigned number of sergeants by release to replacement pools, with replacement by Pfc and Pvts.

6. With respect to 4a, attention is invited to the comment of General Sawbridge, Ass't Chief of Staff G-1, that the regiment is very heavily over-graded right now, and that the trouble originated when men were selected and sent over by the War Department on their special qualifications without regard to the authorized allotment of grades.

7. With respect to 4b., it is to be noted that G-1 MATOUSA will be reluctant to acquiesce in the release of sergeants to the Theatre replacement pools which are already overstrength in the same grade.

8. I suggest that you direct that the following steps be taken:

- a. Initiate a study of the requirements by grade for the actual duties being performed by enlisted men in AMG-ACC.
- b. Upon completion of the study forward it to this section for transmittal to the War Department through G-1, MATOUSA, in an effort to secure a change in existing authorization to conform to actual requirements.
- c. Survey the duties being performed by the 106 sergeants now assigned to see how many might be released and replaced in the lower grades.
- d. Submit the survey through this section to C.G. MATOUSA, with the request that the excess number found be released to replacement pools.

MEMORANDUM TO: Brigadier General Taylor.

1. The purpose of my inquiry to the Staff Judge Advocate General (See attached report) was to find a reasonable method of using the disciplinary powers given to General Officers by AW 104 insofar as Junior Officers are concerned and to include forfeiture of pay.

2. I believe that many cases could be adequately punished without the time and effort involved in a General Court Trial for the less serious offenses which require more punishment than an officer below the grade of Brigadier General can give. I had in mind that Col. Parkin for the Rear Echelon and myself for the Forward might somehow be invested with such power.

3. Under paragraph 4, there is an efficient method of accomplishing this. Request you talk to Lt. Col. Mayhew, have him outline the procedure, and obtain General Joyce's consent to it, or a modification thereof, so that we can put it into operation.

4. Attached, also, is the Staff Judge Advocate's report on what I consider is a prime mixup on the whole 2675th Regiment. The General Courts-Martial jurisdiction is one angle that may cause considerable trouble. Believe General Joyce should be aware of it. I have hopes that this may cause sufficient repercussion to cause action in ALGIERS to untangle the whole Regimental mixup.

SUBJECT ; Delegation of Disciplinary Power by the C.G.

1. You have inquired, orally, whether Gen. Joyce might delegate his power of imposing upon Captains and Lieutenants (U.S.) a forfeiture of one-half a month's pay as disciplinary punishment under A.W. 104. It is my conclusion that he may not.

2. The power to impose disciplinary punishment under A.W. 104 is an attribute of command. Without power of command it does not exist. With the vesting of command the authority vests, subject to its exercise being limited by a superior commander. However, a superior commander may not delegate to an inferior commander or to another officer any part of his authority under A.W. 104.

3. The authority to impose a forfeiture of pay as disciplinary punishment is limited to general officers. Consequently, although the C.O., 2675th Regiment, the C.O.'s of Hq. Co., and of the lettered companies may impose admonition, reprimand, withholding of privileges, and restriction to limits upon officers under their command, only a general officer exercising command over personnel of the regiment may impose a forfeiture of pay as authorized by A.W. 104.

4. The administrative acts preliminary to and incidental to the imposition of the punishment may be done in the name of the commanding officer; but the determination to impose punishment and its measure must be that of the commander having the authority to impose it. Accordingly, it is the function of lower C.O.'s to cause to be made such preliminary investigation as may be necessary to satisfy themselves (and higher commanders) that an offense cognizable under A.W. 104 (a minor offense only) has or has not been committed. If it appears that such an offense has been committed and that it is one which need not properly be referred to a higher commander, such lower C.O. may, in strict accordance with pars; 105 to 109 M.C.M., impose authorized disciplinary punishment. If the offense appears to be one which should be brought to attention of a higher commanding officer, the file should be forwarded with recommendations. Any superior C.O. in the chain of command has the power to impose
