I -- ORGANIZATION NEWSPAPERS

SUBJECT: Additional U.S. Military Censorship Regulations. *Egc*TO: Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, ACC (Prov),
APO 394, U.S. Army.

1. Reference Circular Number 32, cs, Headquarters, NATOUSA.
2. Chief Base Censor in Italy has advised that the additional instructions relative to postcards imposed by Allied Armies in Italy under the provisions of paragraph 13 b, above cited circular, is being violated. It is realized that this violation is unintentional on the part of U.S. troops and is solely the result of ignorance. It is therefore desired that all members of this command be informed that the following directive has been published by competent authority and will be complied with:

"The mailing of picture postcards showing
an identifiable place or view in Italy,
is prohibited".

3. It is desired that the above directive be brought to the attention of all U.S. personnel in your Command.
