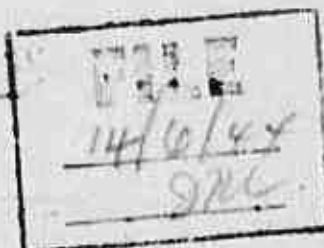

There are at present in course of preparation, an Order dealing with the Declaration of Essential Supplies and prohibition against removal and transfer of certain commodities, certain further General Orders dealing with agriculture, and a revised order covering the reorganization of the Bar Association.

6. Proclamations and General Orders can be amended or varied only by order of the Chief Commissioner in the case of Proclamations and by the Executive Commissioner in the case of General Orders. It follows that Sections and Sub-Commissions will take no action in conflict with the above.

RELATION BETWEEN ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION
HEADQUARTERS AND REGIONS. REGIONAL ORDERS.

1. The powers delegated to Regional Commissioners are set out in Paragraph 1 of Executive Memorandum No. 30, to which this Memorandum is supplemental.
2. This Memorandum is issued with the intention of clarifying the principles which should govern the publication of Regional Orders in whatever form or by whatever description promulgated.
3. Regional Orders must not deal with over-all policies, such as censorship and defascistization.
4. Matters involving long term policy (i.e. extending beyond occupation) should be done by Italian decree, or by General Order (where it will take too long to await the issuance of an expected Italian decree), and not by Regional Order. A simple machinery has been established whereby Italian decrees can be made effective in Military Government Territory by an endorsement signed by the Executive Commissioner and published in the Gazzetta Ufficiale. The above procedure should be followed whenever possible and HQ. ACC should be approached to make the necessary arrangements.
5. It is important that Regional Orders should not contravene Proclamations or General Orders. It is not permissible for a Regional Order to purport to amend or construe a Proclamation or General Order, and any attempt to do so is legally ineffective. Further it is not permissible for a Regional Order to purport to amend or construe a Proclamation or General Order.

1. The powers delegated to Regional Commissioners are set out in Paragraph 1 of Executive Memorandum No. 50, to which this Memorandum is supplemental.
2. This Memorandum is issued with the intention of clarifying the principles which should govern the publication of Regional Orders in whatever form or by whatever description promulgated.
3. Regional Orders must not deal with over-all policies, such as censorship and defascistization.
4. Matters involving long term policy (i.e. extending beyond occupation) should be done by Italian decree, or by General Order (where it will take too long to await the issuance of an expected Italian decree), and not by Regional Order. A simple machinery has been established whereby Italian decrees can be made effective in Military Government Territory by an endorsement signed by the Executive Commissioner and published in the Gazzetta Ufficiale. The above procedure should be followed whenever possible and HQ. ACC should be approached to make the necessary arrangements.
5. It is important that Regional Orders should not contravene Proclamations or General Orders. It is not permissible for a Regional Order to purport to amend or construe a Proclamation or General Order, and any attempt to do so is legally ineffective. Further it is not permissible for a Regional Order to purport to transfer to Italian Courts the trial of offences which would normally be heard before Allied Military Courts. Whenever it is desired to make any such transfer, the matter must always be referred to HQ ACC.
6. Every Regional Order is to be submitted before signature to the Regional Legal Officer, who should sign a certificate that the Order conforms with the principles laid down above and is in proper form for signature.

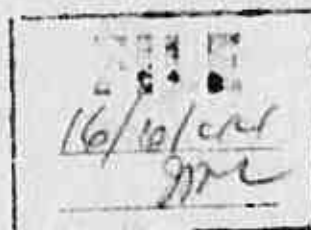

1. This effect from 1 May 1941 the road and road section (16231) is placed out of bounds to all Allied personnel other than those proceeding to and from approved Allied rest centres or convalescent homes on the Sorrento peninsula, either on duty or for rest.

2. To Allied officer or OR will be allowed to proceed in either direction along this road unless he is in possession of: -

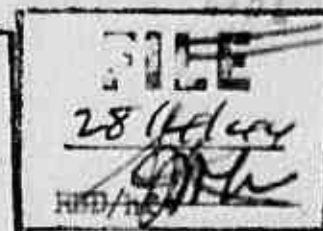
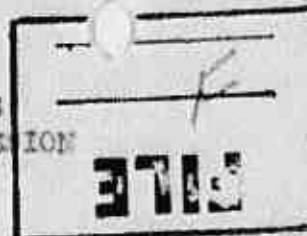

1. Applications for grave space for direct interments in SALERNO British Military Cemetery (map ref 782252) will be made to 235 Town Major giving as much notice as possible.
2. A representative from the unit desiring to make a burial will report to 235 Town Major who will point out the allotted grave on the cemetery plan or on the site.
3. 235 Town Major will ensure that an adequate number of graves are at all times prepared ready for immediate use and that labour is available to fill in graves immediately after use under the direction of the unit making the burial.
4. The officiating Chaplain or the Officer IC F 2.1 will ensure that the Regimental (or Personal) number, Rank, Initials, Name and unit with dates of death and burial are written in BLOCK letters, with hard black lead pencil (NOT indelible pencil or ink) on the temporary grave marking stake obtainable from 235 Town Major and the stake erected at the head of the grave.
5. After the burial the Officiating Chaplain or the Officer IC Burial will attend at the office of 235 Town Major and complete the Burial Register.
6. The unit making the burial will provide a burial party and ensure that the grave is filled in after burial.
