Reference is made to our MCS: 311.7 of 5 April, in particular to para 2 thereof.

- 1. It has been agreed by the authorities concerned that official communications to and from the Allied Missions attached to the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission may be subjected to consorthip, and that this procedure should be adopted. The Ettish Resident Minister at AFH, has drawn the attention of all representatives of the United Nations in Algiers, excepting the French and Russian, whose Governments ere also represented with the Sub-Commission, to the regulations governing the despatch of communications addressed to representatives of the United Nations Governments with the Sub-Commission. The regulations referred to are contained in pera 3 of this Meadquarters letter AG 383.7-5 MCS-AGM of 29 October 1943. No approach has been made to the CPAL or to the Russian representative since both nations have representatives in Italy other than with the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission. and thus have alternative means of communication available. Indeed, so fer as this Section is aware, no communications to the representatives of these Governments with the Sub-Commission have ever passed through this Headquarters or through the Director of the Sub-Commission. and it is considered impolitic to raise the issue at this time.
- 2. In the future communications intended for the Allied Missions with the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission will be received in this Section in open envelopes which we shall enclose in an outer cover addressed to Civil Censorship Group, APO # 39%, for censorship and onward transmission to the Director of the Sub-Commission. In order to expedite the delivery of these communications you may wish to make special arrangements with the Civil Censorship Group for their coward trans-10 mission from Salerno.

In the reverse direction it is requested that you will arrange for representatives of the United Nations Governments with the Displaced Jersons Sub-Commission to deliver communications in open envelopes to the Director of the Sub-Commission, and for the latter to despatch these communications to the Military Government Section through the Civil Censorship Group, to whom separate instructions are being issued by INC

Section (Communications Censorship Branch AFHQ.

3. It is notified for your information that the British Resident Minister in communicating with the representatives of the United Nations. to whom reference is made in para 1, explained that the only object of this requirement is to ensure that there should be no exception to the general rule that all communications transmitted through facilities provided by the Supreme Allied Commander should be routed through official military channels.
