Subject: Italian Communications - Naples and Salerno.

To: The Under Secretary of State for Telecommunications and Posts.

1. Telephones.

While Naples is under military control, it is necessary that telecommunications demands be passed via military channels. Accordingly, the procedure for obtaining new telephone circuits, alterations, etc., in the Naples area will be as follows:-

- (a) In the case of telephone circuits in the Naples multi office area, the Italian Government representative will advise Major George Knauer, Telecommunications Officer, Region III of his requirements. Major Knauer will then make the necessary arrangements with the agencies involved.

- (b) Requests for inter-exchange circuits connecting with the Italian Government switchboards in Naples or Salerno shall be made to the Telecommunications and Posts Sub-Commission, ACC, Salerno.

- (c) In no instances should requests be made directly to Chief Signal Officer, Line of Communications, Naples.

2. Telegraphs.

When the Italian Government telegraph circuit between Salerno and Naples is working, the procedure for dealing with messages will be as follows:-

- (a) Between Salerno and Naples, all telegraph messages will be passed over the Italian telegraph circuit under control of the Italian Government.

- (b) Requests for inter-exchange circuits connecting with
the Italian Government switchboards in Naples or Salerno
shall be made to the Telecommunications and Posts Sub-
Commission, SSC, Salerno.

- (c) In no instances should requests be made directly to
Chief Signal Officer, Line of Communications, Naples.

2. Telegraphs.

When the Italian Government telegraph circuit between Salerno
and Naples is working, the procedure for dealing with messages will be as
follows:-

- (a) Between Salerno and Naples, all telegraph messages
will be passed over the Italian telegraph circuit,
under control of the Italian Government.

- (b) Messages intended for Sardinia or Sicily over
submarine cables from Naples, will be delivered
by the Italian Government by hand to the Adjutant,
Room 21, Messening Floor, Provincia Building,
Naples.

- (c) Messages incoming from Sardinia or Sicily over
submarine cables to Naples will be collected
periodically by Italian courier from the offices
stated above under (b). (Arrangements should be made
for this courier service by the Italian Government.)

3. Until the Italian telegraph circuit between Salerno and
Naples is working, additional arrangements will be made as follows:-

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- (a) Messages from Salerno for Sardinia or Sicily via submarine cable from Naples will be handed by the Italian Government to the Adjutant, Room 5, Ground Floor, Palace of Justice Building, Salerno.
- (b) Messages to Salerno, from Sardinia or Sicily via submarine cables to Naples, will be passed over Allied military channels to Salerno, and arrangements should be made by the Italian Government to collect these messages periodically from the officer mentioned (a).
