SUBJECT: Letters of Sympathy.

TO : All Unit Commanders, this Regiment.

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1. Section IV, Circular #10, Hq NATCUSA, dated 24 January 1944 is quoted for the information and guidance of all concerned.

"14. Letters of Sympathy and Notification to Next of Kin. a. Notification to emergency addressee and next of kin will be made only by The Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C. based on official casualty reports rendered by this headquarters (Hq NATCUSA). No other notification as such will be made by commanders or others in this theater. Letters of sympathy will be prepared by The Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C., upon receipt of the official casualty report rendered by this headquarters (Hq NATCUSA). (See paragraph 7d, AR 600-550, dated 14 May 1943).

b. When commanders, chaplains, or personnel officers desire to send letters of sympathy, such letters will be forwarded in duplicate, unsealed, to this headquarters (Hq NATCUSA) for approval, censorship, and transmittal. The full name and serial number of the casualty must be stated. An envelope addressed to the relative will be attached. When practicable these letters will accompany records and allied papers."

3. It is desired that the above contents be brought to the attention of all members of your command.
