SUBJECT: Hotel Registration.

TO : R.C.'s Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII and IX.
 S.C.A.C.'s 5 & 8 Armies.

1. The Italian Minister of Interior has instructed all Prefetti in Italian Government territory, as in Appendix "A" attached, that the practice of requiring persons, making a stay at hotels and boarding houses, to state the race to which they belong is to cease.

2. The instructions issued by the Minister of the Interior will be obeyed by all Prefetti in Military Government territory.

3. It will be understood that persons staying at hotels and boarding houses will continue to make a statement as to their nationality as heretofore.

TRANSLATION

It has been brought to the attention of this Ministry that in many hotels, customers are still requested to state "their race" which is then recorded on the hotel registry card.

Said request, besides causing resentment on the part of travelers of the Jewish Race, is contrary to the provisions of the R.D.L. 20, Jan 1944, No 25 published in the Ufficiali Gazette No 5, and as a result of which regulations were issued for the restoring of the civil and political rights to the Italian citizen and foreigners who are Jewish Race.

Since the political and moral discriminations between the Jews and Aryans no longer exist, inquiries relating to "racial membership" of each citizens must also cease.

It is therefore requested that H.E. order as soon as possible that the word "race" be struck off the printed forms of the hotels; that no requests be made in said matter and lastly new printed forms must not contain any reference to the word "race". In the same manner, matters concerning identification of Italians and foreigners, every indication of race must be omitted from the forms of the dependent offices. (The travelers declaration).


Paragraph 4, of letter this headquarters, file and subject as above, dated 5 June 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"4. It will be the responsibility of Commanding Officers to insure that in the future selection of military personnel for positions of trust, no officer or enlisted man will be permitted to undertake duties which afford access to Top Secret, Secret or Confidential material until a check has been made of:

- The Intelligence Files of the next superior echelon of command.
- The Intelligence Files of the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, this headquarters.

The foregoing is not to be construed as indicating that a check will be made of all personnel at present engaged in work of a confidential nature. A check of such personnel will be made only if some grounds for doubt or suspicion exist or if other pertinent directives necessitate an investigation. Commanding Officers are responsible that the same check is made before enlisted applicants on active duty are finally selected for or transferred to an Officer Candidate School or to Aviation Cadet status."

SUBJECT: Clearance of Personnel for Cryptographic Duties.

TO : All Concerned.

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1. The purpose of this directive is to establish a policy for this theater which will be adhered to by all concerned in assigning personnel to cryptographic duties, including Weather Communications Units.

2. In order that the prescribed Secret and Confidential cryptographic systems of the Army and Weather Units may be adequately safeguarded, the following policy governing the selection of commissioned, enlisted and civilian personnel for duties in connection therewith is published. Such personnel must be individuals:

a. Of excellent character who are citizens, preferably native-born of the United States.

b. Who have no intimate connection with foreigners in the United States or in foreign countries.

c. Whose loyalty, integrity, discretion and trustworthiness are unquestioned.

3. Whose financial status and/or habits are such as to render unlikely their succumbing to any temptations arising from these sources.

4. All commissioned, enlisted and civilian personnel now employed in duties connected with Secret and Confidential Cryptographic Systems of the Army or the Weather Service who have not yet been investigated, will be investigated immediately to determine their qualifications with respect to the items cited in paragraph 2 above.

a. Preliminary investigations will be made by Counter Intelligence Corps personnel. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel are available through the Intelligence agencies at Headquarters of Divisions, Corps, Armies, Air Commands and Base Sections. All preliminary investigations will be requested by an officer with command jurisdiction over the personnel to be investigated and such requests will be made through Channels to the Intelligence agency concerned. Preliminary investigations will consist of interviews with at least three qualified individuals, and such additional inquiry as may be required to establish or show the lack of qualifications prescribed in paragraph 2 above.

b. Detailed investigations will be requested on form CI-161-C, G-2 NATOUSA (See Appendix A) which will be forwarded in duplicate through Channels to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, this headquarters, Chief, Counter Intelligence Branch, APO 534, together with form CI-160-C, (See Appendix B) also accomplished in duplicate. Attached to each copy of form CI-160-C will be the following identification photographs (2" x 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " in size):

- (1) One front view, to include face and bust.
- (2) One profile view, to include face and shoulders. One copy of form CI-160-C and one copy of each of the identification photographs will be filed in the appropriate records of the headquarters to which the personnel involved are assigned for duty and will be forwarded to the new headquarters upon reassignment of the personnel.

5. In every case the officer requesting an investigation should first examine the Service Record or Form 20 of an enlisted man or the Form 66-1 of an officer to ascertain whether an investigation has been previously completed on the individual with satisfactory results.

6. In all cases of officers and enlisted men now assigned to cryptographic duties, whose Form 20, 66-1 or Service Records do not indicate that they have been cleared for such duties, the provisions of paragraph 4 above will be complied with immediately and such personnel may continue in their present assignment pending completion of the investigation with satisfactory results.

7. Before any individual is cleared for cryptographic duties in this theater, records will be referred to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, this headquarters for proper clearance.

8. If after investigation any individuals now employed in cryptographic duties are found not to meet one or more of the qualifications stated in paragraph 2 above, they will be relieved therefrom immediately and assigned to less responsible duties. A report of such action will be forwarded to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, this headquarters, Chief, Counter Intelligence Branch, APO 534, through channels.

9. No personnel will be accepted in any cryptographic or code school in this theater until a preliminary investigation has been completed with satisfactory results. Application for admission to such schools must be accompanied by a statement specifying completion of such investigation. After finishing school, personnel whose detailed investigation has not been completed may be assigned to cryptographic duties pending completion of the detailed investigation with satisfactory results, whereupon an entry will be made on an officer's 66-1 or an enlisted man's Service Record or Form 20 to

the effect that he has been cleared for cryptographic duties.

10. Under exceptional conditions, Commanding Generals of Armies, Air Forces and Base Sections may assign uninvestigated personnel to cryptographic duties until such time as personnel cleared in accordance with this directive are available. However, in all such cases, the substituted personnel will be carefully selected with respect to the qualifications set forth in paragraph 2, above, and action will be taken immediately to comply with paragraph 4, above, even though they may be relieved upon availability of cleared personnel.

11. This directive applies to all cryptographic personnel except the following:

a. Any officer or enlisted man having ten or more years continuous service in the United States Army, unless there is adequate reason to doubt his loyalty. Active Reserve Status of Reserve Officers and commissioned or enlisted personnel in a National Guard unit is not to be construed as constituting continuous service in the United States Army.

b. Personnel in headquarters below Division or Wing whose only contact with Secret and Confidential systems or devices is the following:

- (1) Air - Ground Liaison Code.
- (2) Divisional Field Code.
- (3) Combat Code.
- (4) M-209 Converter.
- (5) Daily Syko Card.
- (6) Recognition Signals Extracts.
- (7) Aloco Daily Extracts.
- (8) Airmetec Daily Scrambles.
- (9) Forimet.
- (10) Authenticator Extracts.
- (11) SOI Extracts.

SUBJECT: Control of Civilian Movement.

TO : Regional Commissioners Regions I, II, III, V and VI.
S.C.A.O.'s Fifth and Eighth Armies.

1. Introduction.

It is evident that the enemy intends to continue his efforts to introduce espionage and sabotage agents into Southern Italy on a considerable scale. In order to meet this threat and to neutralize as far as possible the activities of such agents, it has been decided that a wider and more effective system of control of civilian movement will be introduced.

Allied Control Commission officers are therefore requested to accord the Military Security Services every possible assistance, and to see that the restrictions referred to herein are properly and strictly imposed.

2. Restrictions.

(a) Army and Corps Areas.

In the Army (and Corps) areas the existing regulation will continue to apply whereby civilians are forbidden to travel more than 10 km. from their own homes without an AMF pass.

Those civilians who wish to proceed into such areas will require to obtain a special pass which will normally be issued by the AMF authority of the area into which they intend to travel.

(b) Territory under AMF.

In territory under Allied Military Government in rear of the Army (and Corps) areas, restrictions on inter-provincial movement is to be re-imposed forthwith, i.e. civilians in this area will be forbidden to travel from one province to another without an AMF pass.

(c) Italian Administered Territory.

...and to neutralise as far as possible the activities of
of civil movement will be introduced.

Allied Control Commission officers are therefore requested to accord the
Military Security Services every possible assistance, and to see that the restric-
tions referred to herein are properly and strictly imposed.

2. Restrictions.

(a) Army and Corps Areas.

In the Army (and Corps) areas the existing regulation will continue
to apply whereby civilians are forbidden to travel more than 10 km. from
their own homes without an AMC pass.

Those civilians who wish to proceed into such areas will require to
obtain a special pass which will normally be issued by the AMG authority
of the area into which they intend to travel.

(b) Territory under AMG.

In territory under Allied Military Government in rear of the Army (and
Corps) areas, restrictions on inter-provincial movement is to be re-imposed
forthwith, i.e. civilians in this area will be forbidden to travel from one
province to another without an AMG pass.

(c) Italian Administered Territory.

There will be no restriction on movement within that part of Southern
Italy which is administered by the Italian Government, nor within ⁸³³⁴
and Sarlinia. An Allied Control Commission pass will, however, be required
for movement between Southern Italy, Sicily and Sarlinia, and also for all
movement from AMG territory into King's Italy and vice versa.

3. Check Posts.

(a) In Restricted Areas.

In Army (and Corps) areas and in territory administered by Allied
Military Government every effort will be made to enforce the above restric-
tions by means of a widespread system of 'snag' check posts, which will be
established for a few hours daily at irregular times and at varying points.
The responsibility of arranging such checks will rest with F.S.S. or
C.I.C. units.

The object of these check posts will be: (i) to turn back those seeking to move outside the prescribed limits without a pass, (ii) to take action against those who have committed serious and flagrant breaches of the regulations, (iii) to question or detain for investigation persons whose conduct or "story" is suspicious.

(b) In Unrestricted Areas.

In territory administered by the Italian Government a similar system of 'anap' check posts will be established. In this instance, however, the objects will be limited to (1) briefly questioning those passing the point with a view to discovering suspicious individuals who should be subject to further interrogation and investigation, and (2) instilling a sense of insecurity in the minds of agents or other undesirable individuals so that they may hesitate to move about or even abandon their mission.

(c) Organisation and Composition.

This system of check posts will be organised by Army, Corps, District and Base Section Headquarters and NOT by AMG/ACC, both in AMG and ACC territories.

These check posts will normally be manned by appropriate combinations, according to circumstances of F.E.P./C.I.C., S.I.M. (C.S.), G.C.H.R. and Guardia di Finanza.

Every effort will be made by Allied Control Commission officers to ensure the fullest co-operation of the Italian Police in connection with these duties.

Passes.

(a) Army Areas and Poggia.

In the case of persons wishing to move North-Westwards across the "Control Line" (which follows the general line of the Rivers Eifero and Valturro) or to enter Poggia Province, the existing procedure will normally be followed whereby they must first obtain (through their local AMG/ACC representative) a pass issued by the appropriate AMG authority in the area of their destination.

(b) AMG Provinces.

(c) Organization and Composition.

This system of check posts will be organized by Army, Corps, District and Base Section Headquarters and NOT by AMG/ACC, both in AMG and ACC territories.

These check posts will normally be manned by appropriate combinations, according to circumstances of F.S.P./C.I.C., S.I.M. (C.S.), C.C.E.R. and Guardia di Finanza.

Every effort will be made by Allied Control Commission officers to ensure the fullest co-operation of the Italian police in connection with these duties.

Passes.

(a) Army Areas and Poggia.

In the case of persons wishing to move North-Westwards across the "Control Line" (which follows the general line of the Rivers Biferno and Volturno) or to enter Poggia Province, the existing procedure will normally be followed whereby they must first obtain (through their local AMG/ACC representative) a pass issued by the appropriate AMG authority in the area of their destination.

(b) AMG Provinces.

For other journeys involving movement into, or between, Provinces within the restricted area (e.g. from Bari to Avellino or from Poggia to Naples) a pass will be issued by the local AMG/ACC representative at the point of departure.

(c) Discretion of Provincial Commissioners.

The procedure described in para. (b) above may be employed in cases described in (a) above when, for urgent administrative, economic or other reasons, the procedure described in (a) would be impracticable owing to the time factor. In such cases the passes will be issued by the Provincial Commissioner or by a member of his staff on his behalf who will immediately forward details of the issue of such passes to the SCIO or PC of the area of destination.

(d) Reasons for Travel.

It is essential that the issue of passes to cross the "Control Line" or to enter Puglia Province be strictly limited to those cases where the journey will benefit the Allied cause, or where there are important administrative or economic reasons, or in exceptional cases, where there are urgent compassionate grounds. The issue of other passes will be limited to persons who show good and genuine reason why they wish to travel, whether on official matters, business or family grounds.

(e) Issue of Travel Tickets.

Allied Control Commission officials will ensure that transport tickets will not be issued by the railway authorities or other travel agencies to places within restricted areas unless the persons applying for tickets are in possession of a proper pass to their intended destination.

(f) Italian Government Officials.

Passes for Italian Government officials will be issued by this Headquarters and signed by the Secretary General or by the Deputy Secretary General, Allied Control Commission, and will be issued after application has been received from the Government Department concerned or from Italian Liaison Section, Allied Control Commission, and considered by the appropriate Sub-Commission who will be responsible for examining the application as to actual necessity for the proposed journey. Such passes will be prepared for signature by the Sub-Commission concerned.

(g) Italian Military Personnel.

The movement of members of the Italian Military Forces is unrestricted providing they are on duty and in possession of proper credentials. The Italian Military Forces when not on duty, e.g. when on leave, are subject to the same restrictions as civilians.

(h) Issuing Officers.

It will be within the discretion of the Provincial Commissioner to authorise specified and approved officers of the Quarters or CC.RR to issue passes for inter-provincial travel. It is emphasised, however, that passes permitting persons to enter the Army areas or Puglia Province must be issued by AM/LCO officers.

(f) Italian Government Officials.

Passes for Italian Government officials will be issued by this Headquarters and signed by the Secretary General or by the Deputy Secretary General, Allied Control Commission, and will be issued after application has been received from the Government Department concerned or from Italian Liaison Section, Allied Control Commission, and considered by the appropriate Sub-Commission who will be responsible for examining the application as to actual necessity for the proposed journey. Such passes will be prepared for signature by the Sub-Commission concerned.

(g) Italian Military Personnel.

The movement of members of the Italian Military Forces is unrestricted providing they are on duty and in possession of proper credentials. The Italian Military Forces when not on duty, e.g. when on leave, are subject to the same restrictions as civilians.

(h) Issuing Officers.

It will be within the discretion of the Provincial Commissioner to authorize specified and approved officers of the Quarters or CO. HQ to issue passes for inter-provincial travel. It is emphasized, however, that passes permitting persons to enter the Army areas or Foggia Province must be issued by AF/ACC officers.

(i) Semi-Permanent Passes.

In the case of persons living near a Provincial boundary and whose place of employment is in, or partly in, and adjoining Province or Provinces, a semi-permanent pass may be issued and such passes shall expire on 31 March, 30 June, 30 September and 31 December annually, and then become renewable upon further application. Such passes may also be issued to all persons who have sufficient reason for frequent travel between Provinces.

(j) It is suggested that when an application for travel into an Army area or into Foggia Province is received in AF/ACC territory that the officer concerned completes the pass on behalf of the applicant (provided he is satisfied with the sufficiency of reasons for such travel) and forwards it to the SCAG/FC of the destination for approval; signature and return.

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5. It will be seen that in future, Provincial Commissioners will be authorised under certain circumstances to issue passes for entry into any area or Pagan Province without prior permission from the point of destination (vide 4 (c)) and further that the movement of members of Italian Military Forces is unrestricted, (vide 4 (c)).

SUBJECT: Standard form of civilian pass.

TO : Regional Commissioners Regions I, II, III, V and VI.
S.C.A.O.'s Fifth and Eighth Armies.

1. It has been decided to adopt a standard form of pass incorporating the "Special" and "General" passes which have hitherto been in use. These are being issued in books of 50 with duplicates so that copies may be retained. As from the date of receipt of this memorandum the new pass will be taken into use, and all stocks of old passes will be destroyed.

2. It is necessary that uniformity shall be observed in the wording of facilities granted and therefore the following instructions will be strictly observed:

- (a) Passes will be completed in ink or typewritten - pencil will not be used.
- (b) The identity card number of the bearer will be endorsed on every pass at the time of issue.
- (c) All amounts, weights, sizes, involving the use of figures will be written in words as well as figures.
- (d) The precise nature of the journey must be clearly defined, and the nature and quantity of goods to be carried must be stated.
- (e) No pass shall be issued in one province to enable persons to remain in "unassigned" foods in another province without the prior approval of the Sezione Alimentazione concerned.
- (f) Permission to travel during hours of curfew will be granted only in exceptional circumstances.
- (g) The limit of availability of the pass shall not exceed the minimum of time necessary to complete the proposed journey and to transact the applicant's business. If unforeseen circumstances render an extension necessary the officer issuing the pass will advise the original office of issue of his action. All applicants to, or endorsements upon, passes (e.g. with regard to extension, validity or duration) will be made on the back of the pass, and worded simply and clearly so that no question of ambiguity arises.

- (a) Passes will be completed in ink or typewritten - pencil will not be used.
- (b) The identity card number of the bearer will be endorsed on every pass at the time of issue.
- (c) All amounts, weights, sizes, involving the use of figures will be written in words as well as figures.
- (d) The precise nature of the journey must be clearly defined, and the nature and quantity of goods to be carried must be stated.
- (e) No pass shall be issued in one province to enable persons to purchase "massed" foods in another province without the prior approval of the Sanione Alimentazione concerned.
- (f) Permission to travel during hours of curfew will be granted only in exceptional circumstances.
- (g) The limit of availability of the pass shall not exceed the minimum of time necessary to complete the proposed journey and to transact the applicants business. If unforeseen circumstances render an extension necessary the officer amending the pass will advise the original office of issue of his action. All applicants to, or endorsements upon, passes (e.g. with regard to extension, validity or duration) will be made on the back of the pass, and worded simply and clearly so that no question of ambiguity arises.

3. Passes of the more general kind such as those permitting inter-provincial travel or freedom from curfew restrictions may, at the discretion of the Provincial Commissioner, be issued by specified officers of the Quarters or Carabinieri.

4. Supplies of the new form of pass are being forwarded under separate cover.

They must not discuss or speculate on information concerning secret weapons, secret equipment, troop or ship movements, either by publication or private, before announcement is made by proper authority. Nothing will be passed, discussed, or published in relation to international conferences, regarding the above subjects, without the authorization from the President's executive office.

2. Six rooms on the Italian floor of the building were brightly illuminated last night without any black-out at all. When I went up to investigate with the Corporal of the Guard, I found the whole floor deserted. We put out the lights.

I recommend that the Italian Liaison Section be approached to decide whether they would prefer to be responsible for inspecting their own Black-out precautions every night after sundown. On this occasion the culprits were probably workmen, since the rooms illuminated are unoccupied. We could make the Works Foreman responsible, but as the floor is Italian, it might be better to give them the initial responsibility.

3. It was brought to my notice yeasterday that a message in plain containing a very controversial question of the highest policy was handled in this building by non-confidential clerks before being taken to the officer interested.

May I recommend that from AG Dept. at least one confidential clerk be used for restricted and secret messages?
