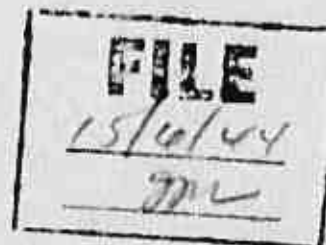

HEADQUARTERS MATOUSA, APO 534, 3 February 1944.

TO: Commanding Officer, Adriatic Depot, APO 528.

(INFO: Commanding General, 208 MATOUSA, APO 750.)

1. This headquarters has no record of having authorized the issue of the supplies and equipment listed on the inclosed report. Information is desired as to whether the issues of medical supplies herein listed were for the use of United States personnel or for use of the Italian civilian personnel.

2. Your attention is directed to current directive, Allied Forces Headquarters, AG 400-1 (AMG-ACC) GDS-AMG, dated 18 December 1943, subject, "Civilian Supply in Occupied Territory".

3. If the medical supplies and equipment were issued for civilian supply and not for United States personnel, immediate steps should be taken to recover the following non-expendable supplies:

97110 Kits, Medical, MCO's
97120 Kits, Medical, Privates
97565 Chest, MD No 1, Complete
97570 Chest, MD No 2, Complete
97575 Chest, MD No 4, Complete
99555 Stove, Coleman, Double-burner
9N580 Prophylactic Kits

4. Expendable medical supplies may be issued to AMG/ACC when in the opinion of a medical officer they are necessary to save life or prevent suffering without prior approval of his headquarters. Supplies issued in this manner will be dropped on shipping ticket upon which will appear the statement "issued to prevent suffering or to save life". No other medical supplies may be issued from Army stocks without prior approval of this headquarters.
