"Circular 16, PBS, 23 Jan 44, places all restaurants out of bounds to all personnel of the Allied Forces, except those establishments organized and controlled by the Allied Forces themselves. This in effect prohibits the patronage by military personnel of all civilian owned and civilian operated eating places. Bars at which no foodstuffs are sold are not included in this category."
