SUBJECT: Report on Property, SALERNO
TO : Deputy Executive Commissioner

In reference to the requisitioning of properties at Salerno for the Soviet Representative the u/s report is submitted, as requested.

1. (i) The TORRELLA property would appear to be suitable and the easiest to requisition.
(ii) One observation - there are no windows or doors
(iii) This villa is at present occupied by the GAC as HQ, Officers and GAC messes and billets
2. (i) The properties Nos 30 34 38 40 and 42 Via Pio would no doubt be equally suitable.
(ii) The windows and doors do exist in these villas.
(iii) All properties are at present occupied by civilians with one exception - No 30 is the HQ of the RPT. No 40 is the best building and well appointed - it is understood that Colonel DENIS GAC and Capt. BRACE of AGC are billeted at this villa.
(iv) It would seem that quite a problem would arise to find alternative accommodation and carry out the removal of the families in occupation.
3. (i) It is suggested that it would be easier to find alternative accommodation for the GAC.
(ii) Capt. BRACE is in a strong liaison position with the Town Major (Major HEWITT) and with the Sub Area HQ and it is suggested that it is quite possible that he may be able to obtain agreement, if desired.

SUBJECT: Villa Alba

TO: Liaison Office, 94th Subarea, Salerno.

It is the intention of this command to establish in Cava dei Tirreni as soon as possible an Italian military hospital to shelter and cure soldiers belonging to commands and units that are detached in the area Nocera-Cava-Salerno. At present hospital facilities for these soldiers are lacking, due to the fact that the military health establishments of Naples and Paganì do not leave any other available place.

Villa Alba in Cava lends itself very well to this purpose, for it has served as a military hospital in the past and offers adequate installations.

Since this villa is at present at the disposal of Allied military agencies which, however, are not using it, we should like to ask the Subarea if it would kindly place it at our disposal.

We should like to add that no other place with facilities adequate for the planned hospital, is available.

Reference conference at this Hq on 11 Mar 44 attended by Capt Drage, representing ACC, Lt-Col Labello representing the Italian Army, Lt-Col Rossi representing the Italian Govt, Major Hewitt, Town Major Salerno and Major Hurley DAA & QMG 94 Sub Area.

The following arrangements then agreed are confirmed as follows:-

1. Lt-Col Rossi will act on behalf of the Italian Govt in respect of accommodation in a position vis a vis the Town Major Salerno and the Hq Comdt ACC. It is understood that Lt-Col Rossi has full authority to make final decisions in this respect.
2. Lt-Col Rossi will hand to the Town Major a list of all premises requisitioned by the Italian Govt in the SALERNO area (including AMALFI, RAVELLO, VIETRI and CAVA) and the Town Major on behalf of the Allied Forces will hand to Lt-Col Rossi a similar list to include also premises earmarked by him in the event of additional commitments. Hq Comdt ACC will give the Town Major and Lt-Col Rossi a list of the premises occupied by the ACC. These lists will be exchanged as soon as possible.
3. Before the Town Major, Hq Comdt ACC or Lt-Col Rossi arrange future requisitioning of premises, they will notify the other parties to confirm that their proposals do not conflict with the places of the others.
4. Action of a similar nature will be taken as necessary by Lt-Col Labello on behalf of the Italian Army.

An additional copy of this letter is enclosed which you are requested to forward to Lt-Col Rossi.

MEMORANDUM TO: Mr. H. A. Caccia, Political Section, Hq., ACC, Naples

I am very glad Mr. Reber is going to manage to see Prunas today, since there seems to be something on the mind of the Italian Foreign Office which they do not care to divulge to me.

You may remember that the Queen of Italy sent her Gentleman-in-Waiting to keep touch with the Public Health Sub-Commission on the subject of Red Cross issues of clothing. She asked for clothing for the district round Ravello; where clothing is being sent to two orphanages. The officers of the Province, who deal with local committees, point out that normally no clothing is issued outside battle areas, but that they are delighted to acquiesce in her requests. Miss Lockie proposes to suggest that the Queen nominates certain local welfare societies to purchase Red Cross supplies which may be found in excess of free issue requirements. I understand a report is being made for the Queen's benefit.

Roberti tells me there is some criticism in the local papers of the causes of the recent railway tunnel accident, in which 502 persons were killed. There has been an Italian Government report, but he thinks the findings of the A.C.C. enquiry should also be published. I have asked Public Safety if this can conveniently be done.

The main concern of the Italian Foreign Office at present seems to be their need of new offices. At present they occupy a four-room flat with 37 staff. Unfortunately their request for one floor of the Salerno Social Club was received just after it had been snapped up for club premises to be used by a formation which is going to be reconstituted here.

Colonels Harris and Henderson are anxious to see you when you come down, and I should be glad of a few minutes with you myself for instructions as to what papers I should deal with here before sending on to you. With the exception of certain obvious cases it is difficult to know whether you should see the paper first and give me instructions or if the reply from the sub-commission concerned would be likely to vary your opinion.

As it is well known to the Political Section (A.C.C.) the Ministry of Foreign Affairs is at present located at Salerno in an apartment which is wholly inadequate for its present necessities and for the increased number of its officials and employees (37 persons in 8 small rooms).

Moreover there is absolutely no space available to establish a new important office dealing with all matters concerning the Italian Prisoners of War. On the other hand it is very difficult to find in Salerno adequate accommodations and all efforts that have been made to this effect had brought no results so far.

Only recently the "Reale Casino Sociale", the local men's club, has informed that it would gladly welcome the Ministry in its premises turning over, for this purpose, one of the two floors that belong to it.

The offer was made providing the Allied Authorities would rescind the order of requisition of the floor in question which, it appears, is being used, from time to time, by Allied forces for entertainments and other social affairs.

In view of the scarcity of quarters in Salerno, we are compelled to ask the collaboration of the Allies, so that they may cede to us one of the three following buildings, which, since they are only partially occupied by the Allies, are not entirely utilized, and therefore, by narrowing their services into two of the buildings, they could allow us to take over the third.

The buildings in question are, as follows:

1. The Prefettura Palace - The Allies occupy only one floor as a recreation club for their troops. The other floors are damaged, but can be easily repaired, and could be utilized to house other Allied offices, unless the whole building could be turned over to us.
2. Angrisani Building, Via Roma 32 - At present it has the Education Office in the ground floor, and Allied troops are billeted on the other floors. This building is also damaged, but we could make repairs, and it would be very suitable for our offices, perhaps it is the most suited for our needs.

The Ministry of the Interior, due to the continual arrival of new officials, and the necessity of enlarging its offices in proportion to the increasing size of its work, cannot remain in the premises already chosen in December, and must find a building which may house all its departments.

In view of the scarcity of quarters in Salerno, we are compelled to ask the collaboration of the Allies, so that they may cede to us one of the three following buildings, which, since they are only partially occupied by the Allies, are not entirely utilized, and therefore, by narrowing their services into two of the buildings, they could allow us to take over the third.

The buildings in question are, as follows:

1. The Prefettura Palace - The Allies occupy only one floor as a recreation club for their troops. The other floors are damaged, but can be easily repaired, and could be utilized to house other Allied offices, unless the whole building could be turned over to us. ✓
2. Angrisani Building, Via Roma 21 - At present it has the Education Office in the ground floor, and Allied troops are billeted on the other floors. This building is also damaged, but we could make repairs, and it would be very suitable for our offices, perhaps it is the most suited for our needs. ✓
3. The ex-Fascist Federation Bldg - This very large modern building is shown to be occupied by very few officers and men of the Allied Navies, while, because of its great amount of space, it could accommodate many offices and would be very useful. X

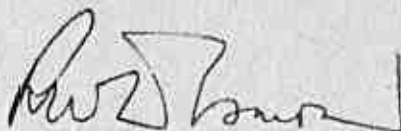

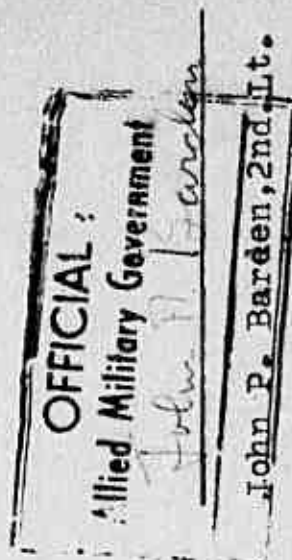

- f. No chlorinated water is available for use by mess. A few liter bags have been delivered but none have been hung for use.

1. I have seen Major Caspello. We have no transport to let him have as we are dreadfully short, and shall be short until our main body arrives from Palermo about Christmas day. We hope, however, to be able to borrow a jeep from Region IV for him.

2. He had some idea that he was going to look round for accommodation for the Italian Government. I told him what the situation was. When it comes to accommodation, I cannot have Italians looking round without coming to me beforehand in order to get the picture. As regards the Italian Government, there is this Italian reconnaissance party which has to make contact with the Archbishop regarding alternative accommodation in the Salerno area, or failing alternative accommodation, the seminary. That is all arranged. I went down to Salerno to meet these officers who were due on the 18th, but they never turned up, so I came back to Naples. I understand they are actually arriving at Salerno today, 20th of December.

3. Our present proposal is to accommodate the King and his household at Revallo, and I am trying to clear this with 94 Base Sub-area. General Hamblen has no objection in principle, but the individual buildings will have to be cleared with 94 Sub-area.

4. Work is progressing both at Naples and at Salerno. At Naples the over-crowding difficulty is considerable, and one has to fight for everything. Progress at Naples is, therefore, somewhat slow. At Salerno the general attitude is much more helpful and things are therefore easier to arrange. There have been delays at Salerno owing to engineering difficulties, but they are being got over.

5. By the end of December there will be enough accommodation in the Palace of Justice for the Salerno group of the AGO. We shall be a little crowded, but it will be all right. By the end of January the rest of the building should be clear and things will be easier. Living accommodation for officers will be all right though conditions may be a little less comfortable than might be desired. This is principally due to shortage of coal which prevents us from heating buildings. As far as I can see, you should be able to send your advanced party between Christmas and the New Year, and move your main body in during the first week in January. AS 1

told you before, you will have to apply to your local Base Sub-area for road vehicles, and to movements Brindisi for train accommodation.

6. You would be advised to bring with you as much of the following articles as you can reasonably do without causing undue hardship:

- a. Office furniture
- b. Beds and mattresses
- c. Tables
- d. Small chairs

The principle that I am going on as regards requisitioning and moving furniture, is as follows: I am only requisitioning articles from empty or damaged public or company buildings, e.g., hotels, offices, furnished apartments, etc. I am not removing any furniture from private houses, flats, etc., which are in occupation.

7. If you have any Italian servants in your area who are good and wish to keep on in the employment of the ACC, it would be a good thing for you to bring them to Salerno. In particular I refer to people like cooks and head waiters. We shall find some difficulty in getting enough good servants for the rather large number of Villas and messes in Salerno and Naples.

8. You kindly sent Moss Vernon a list of officers and enlisted men at Brindisi, but this list contained a number of names of officers who, I am sure, will not come to Salerno. We do require urgently, lists of what you actually propose to bring, namely, officers, enlisted men, vehicles, equipment, and requisitioned goods.

I am going down to Salerno tomorrow morning to see what can be done. There will inevitably be some delays. I should be glad if you will let me know by cable whether you are prepared to move to Salerno as soon as the ACC accommodation is ready, regardless of whether the Italian Government accommodation is ready.

To the Authorities, whoever they may be, who want to occupy the Pontificio Seminario Pius XI, of Salerno.

I wish to remind them that the above said Seminario, is in full use, as an Ecclesiastic Institute, and it belongs to the Vatican.

It would be ungenerous to occupy it in these moments while the Vatican, surrounded by the Germans as it is, ignores what occurs over here, and I have no way of communicating with it.

The Holy Vatican, is the great moral power, the only one in the world with which Italy is in diplomatic relations.

Germany is to be blamed for having annulled the force of law and for having substituted the law of oppression. Therefore what happens to this Seminario is the application in a small way of the same principle. Whether small or large the principle remains identical.

If the Seminary was empty it could be said "Res Nullius" but on the contrary, lessons are held and it is fully occupied by Students, Superiors and Professors.

It is the only Institute of this kind in the vast Tirrenic zone, that goes from the Gulf of Gaeta to the Gulf of Taranto.

It is to be added that not having means of communicating with the Vatican, I have had to take the whole matter into my own hands, seeing to the repairs necessary and the cost has amounted to half a million.

To be quite certain before starting said repairs and before inviting the Bishops to send me their pupils, I asked and obtained a written permit for the reopening of the Seminary, from the local Authorities of the Allied nations.

 - d) The only alternative, if the Procura must be moved, is the old Corte d'Assise, two kilometers from Palazzo di Giustizia, a building which has no windows and no furniture.
 - e) On the other hand I stand ready to find a place near

Palazzo di Giustizia which would be suitable in every respect for dispensary.

f) Nothing in this memorandum is intended to suggest that it would not be perfectly satisfactory to move the Procura else where in the Palazzo Giustizia, supposing a compromise can be worked out on this point.
