1. The First Echelon of Headquarters, ACC, Rear Party, departed Palermo 31 January at 0700 hours by Notor Convoy No. 013101-E with thirty one motor vehicles, including two motorcycles, and personnel consisting of six (6) officers and fifty eight (52) enlisted men or other ranks. The vehicles in this convoy consist of the following:

10 - Trucks, 1/4 ton

5 - Staff Cars

2 - Trucke, 3 ton

12 - Trucks, 15 cwt.

2 - Motorcycles

- 2. This convoy should arrive Salerno on 3 or 4 February and the Convoy Commander will report to your office for father instructions.
- 3. All officers, enlisted men and other ranks, of the above personnel in this convoy will proceed on to Maoles, with the exception of Private R. C. Jones, British, who is assigned to the Public Safety Sub-Commission and who should be retained in Salerno.
- 4. All motor vehicles, office furniture, office equipment and other equipment in the convoy will be dispatched to Haples, where the proper distribution will be made. In this connection, the ratio of distribution of available motor vehicles between Salerno and Maples Headquarters is now being calculated and the actual distribution of additional vehicles to Salerno will be made immediately after the arrival of the Pelermo convoy in Maples.
- 5. The Second Echelon of Headquarters, ACC, Rear Party, consisting of eight (8) officers, eighty nine (89) enlisted men or other ranks, motor vehicles, equipment and freight will move from Palermo by sea. The large of departure of this party is not yet known, due to the uncertain shipping accompodations. You will be advised of the dates of departure and arrival upon receipt of information in this office.

I enclose a copy of a nominal roll of personnel compiled by ACC, Brindisi on the 5th of January. Needless to say, It is considerably out of date by this time and you will see that I have made some pencil erasures and some notes on each sheet as to whether the personnel listed are, or are not all eventually coming to Salerno. These are very rough so you will not be able to extract an accurate nominal roll of people coming, but I thought you might like to have the list which will. at least, give you an idea of who is at Brindisi. As regards numbers, you have a guide in the list attached to the memorandum dated 22nd of January, but there will be some amendments to this. As you know, nothing like all the Administrative Half Section will have joined you in the moves being carried out today and tomorrow, but they will roll up in driblets. 2. As regards the big move from Brindisi, and the few extra people from here, I gether that the territory is being handed over on or about the 10th of February or, at least, it is hoped that it will be. The move will take place a day or two before this date. Main Meadquarters will be in Naples, Rear Headquarters in Salerno. 3. I have not forgotten your dire need for assistance, but whenever I think I have got hold of semeone, he slips through my fingers. I thought you had been told that a Major Ebsworth was on his way up from Sicily to take over Hesiquerters Commandant at Salerno. If you were never told this, I am sorry. I was distinctly under the impression you had been. Please don't think this is the slightest reflection on you. I have gone into the matter fully with Brigadier Gueterbock and he feels that in view of the number of high personages who wells be at Salerno, the Meadquarters Commandant there must hold the runk of Major. When we are able to sort out the whole of the officer personnel question, it is possible that we may be able to make some different arrangement. As you know, you already hold one step in local rank above your own, and this we shall make a proper acting rank as soon as we are able, but two steps up is a different matter having regard to the enormous number of other officers with claims to promotion. This is for your private information. 4. I hope to send you shortly the Headquarters Commandant and AG set-up for Salerno as it will be when the move from Brindisi is completed. Reshatth se Capt. B. Until the main body from Falkamo has arrived at MAPLES and vehicles have been serviced we have not got enough transport for maintenance and house-keeping at SALERNO. Therefore the earliest date of arrival of the leading convoy from BRI DISI to SALERNO is 19 December. I shall not send any trucks down to BRINDISI for the move until I know the date of arrival of the main body from PALERMO. 3. Owing to the non-arrival of advanced party by road from PALKHMO we have not got enough vehicles even for the final reconnaissances and initial work at SALERNO. I have asked AFRQ for the loan of certain vehicles and hope to hear the enswer tomorrow. As soon as I can I shall get all hands on the job. 4. Advance Party from Balabisi. I am sending Lt. Mastroianni to RALERNO to be conducting officer for the Italian Government advance party. I am also sending a Signals Officer from FALERING to BRINDISI to pick Col. Henderson's brains and to return here as soon as he has done so. Col. - 3. In addition to the housing accommodations above, certain other forms of help will be required.
- a. Motor Transport: Motor transport will be needed to move the Commission and Covernment from EKINDISI and PALERMO to SALERMO and MAPINS. Exact requirements will be requested when known. Also a certain amount of permanent administrative transport will be needed for which the Commission will take the necessary steps to establish a table of equipment or war establishment.
- b. Rations: Rations will be needed from military sources for the Commission. Advisory Council and Government. Formal application in writing for the latter will be made from BRINDISI.
- c. <u>Signals</u>: While a local contact indicates no immediate obstacle in satting up adequate facilities, it is requested that PBS be directed to give our requirements a high priority particularly for telephone sets. Requirements will be submitted as soon as the decisions have been made on the move.
- d. Office Equipment and Furniture: The very considerable expansion of Government and Commission activities will require the stocking of large number of offices and living quarters. Help will be needed to produce the necessary furniture and in some cases to provide motor transport to permit bringing in furniture from distance points.
- 4. Brig. Gueterbook will represent the Commission in all matters connected with this move. An Italian Delegation will arrive shortly to work with Brig. Gueterbook who will speak for the Commission, Advisory Council and Italian Government.
