Statement
To the Mess Council

4 May '44

On the 3 Apr. I gave a financial statement to the Council showing a balance of cash in hand of 17667 and cash in bank 6316 Lire.

This balance when entered on Army Form 1514 with the necessary analysis was passed by the auditors on 3 May. Herewith copy of the audit form.

When Lt Shanks took over accounts from me on 17 Apr. 44 he signed a declaration showing the financial position as follows:-

Cash in hand 27765

" in bank 6316

Stock 10206

As at that time Serg Ley had a float of 8101 Lire Mr. Shanks signed for cash received 19664.

Owing to exigences of Service I had to leave this Hq rather suddenly. Lt. Bonazone took over my secretarial duties, Lt Shanks the Accounts and Capt Jones buying of wines.

During my absence the auditors saw the books presented by Lt Shanks. When I returned on 1 May I found Lt Shanks about to go into hospital. During my absence he had prepared elaborate statements showing analysis of accounts and made a report to the PMC. He asked me to hold the books and files and instruct the Mess Secs at Velia and Vittorio to hold their moneys until further orders. I did so. He further asked me to sign the Statement of Accounts as 31 Mar which he had prepared for the auditors. I could not do this as he had prepared it in ignorance of various events as evident from his report. I prepared my own statement which was accepted.

The auditors were satisfied with the books which they duly signed and made the following recommendations to be submitted to the Council.

- 1) That 21000 spent on Villa Crockery be written off as expenditure. i.e. transferred from Villa creditors to General Account.
- 2) That 35000 loans from Naples which were subsequently converted into gifts be cross entered into General Account.
- 3) That 7321 be transferred from sundry debtors to Wine Account since obviously the wine tickets are not outstanding.
- 4) 3650 repayment transferred from sundry creditors to General Account.
- 5) 100 refund payable on crate to be written off.
- 6) 940 payment by Villa messes to be readjusted as wines.

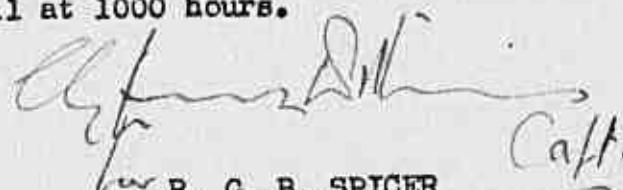

Sir,

On the night of 18th March 1944, whilst on duty as Guard Commander it was reported to me by the Italian Night Watchman that the main door on the left wing had been broken open. I investigated this and found that the door had been forced. On returning to the Guard Room I had occasion to send one of my sentries to the dance hall. When he returned he reported to me that he had seen an American soldier, who was not a member of the Allied Control Commission. I questioned the soldier, who stated that he did not belong to this Unit but refused to answer the question as to how he got into the building and also refused to give his name or to produce his identity discs.

I reported the matter to Captain Bocchino who took charge of the case.

SUBJECT: British and American Red Cross.

TO : All Regional Commissioners & S.C.A.O.s. 5 and 8 Armies.

1. For the guidance and direction of all officers of the Allied Control Commission, this directive sets forth the relationship between ACC and the American and British Red Cross Societies.
2. The assistance of the American and British Red Cross Societies is on a voluntary basis. Both groups are distributing clothing through indigenous welfare agencies, with the aid of the Italian Red Cross. The Red Cross Societies have accepted the responsibility of supervising distribution and performing such welfare activities among the needy populace as ACC may direct. Red Cross participation is of a temporary nature, since it is desired to have local agencies ready to assume the responsibility of caring for themselves in a very short time.
3. Red Cross personnel, assigned to assist ACC in the discharge of their responsibilities are not to be placed in charge of any set program. Red Cross personnel are under the direction of the Allied officers to whom they are assigned and will take orders within the framework of Red Cross policy, reporting regularly to the officer responsible for their work as to the progress or completion of the assignment.
4. One member of the Red Cross staff in each Region will be designated by the Red Cross Director as Regional Supervisor. Through his submissions of reports to Red Cross office will be made. It is understood that the contents of such reports will have been discussed with ACC officers before the Supervisor submits them to Red Cross Headquarters. The Supervisor will also have the responsibility for clearing with ACC officers the details of service in his Region. A member of the Red Cross staff attached to the Italian Refugee March, or to the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, will be designated by the Red Cross Director to undertake similar duties to those of the Regional Supervisors.
5. Red Cross workers will participate in the following :
 - (a) Joint preliminary planning, for present and future relief operations, in cooperation with ACC.

 - (b) Surveys of relief needs in cooperation with divisions of ACC (particularly the Sub-Commissions of Public Health and Welfare and Displaced Persons, and the Italian Refugee Branch of R.C. & M.G. Section).
 - (c) Assisting and advising with ACC on specialized relief projects, particularly with women and children and civilian hospital services, in cooperation with the other activities of ACC.
 - (d) Supplying advisory services to ACC on matters pertaining to relief and Red Cross activities which may be of value to the overall administration of the territory under occupation.
 - (e) Liaison with the Italian Red Cross and/or other indigenous local agencies in the planning for use of their personnel, facilities, and supplies in present and future operations.

6. For the Red Cross to exercise properly these functions, ACC accepts the responsibility for :

- (a) Billeting and messing ACC and AEC War Relief Staff on assignment.
- (b) Transportation and travel orders of Red Cross Staff, if necessary.
- (c) Office space, clerical aid and other assistance as necessary for the proper prosecution of their duties to the extent it is possible for ACC to provide.
