Area Routine Order No. 605, serial No. 53, dated 24 Apr 44, is repeated for information:-

57 Area Standing Order No. 76 is repeated for attention and strict compliance.

A list of known and suitable bathing places will be notified in A.R.O.s from time to time. Pending their publication, bathing will only take place at points that are approved by a Medical Officer.

Standing Order No. 76

- (a) Bathing will only take place at such points as are known to O.C. Unit to be safe.
- (b) There will be no bathing in rough weather.
- (c) Bathing will only take place in parties organized by the O.C. Unit in which will always be included one or two strong swimmers as lifeguards.  
All lifeguards will be equipped with whistle to draw attention to their orders. They will also be provided with lifebuoys or other life saving gear (where possible) and with a rope for a life line.
- (d) Fatal accidents occur only when bathing orders are not enforced or unit discipline is lax. O.C.s units will therefore be responsible for ensuring that the above orders are enforced on all occasions when bathing takes place.

NOTE.- With regard to the above order, will ORs who consider themselves to be strong swimmers submit their names to the British Orderly Room.

- (d) To conserve temps which are in short supply, units will withdraw to store all but the minimum required for the particular purpose a building is used for.
- (e) Units will report by 15 Mar 44 to Gs RE concerned any alteration or addition to the electrical system which has been carried out without authority, in order that the work may be inspected.

INSPECTION OF HISTORICAL & EDUCATIONAL PROPERTY

Forces, the following is brought to the notice of all ranks concerning the above subject.

2. Investigations show that these reports of damage have been exaggerated, but at the same time establishes that a certain amount of damage has been done by thoughtlessness or carelessness, and even by a few willfully destructive individuals.
3. It is important on all ranks how vitally necessary it is that all troops behave in manner which safeguards the good name of our armies and keeps credit to their record. It is the responsibility and obligation of all to preserve and protect these objects to the greatest extent possible.
