- (c) Bathing will only take place in parties organized by the O.C. Unit in which will always be included one or two strong swimmers as lifeguards.
All lifeguards will be equipped with whistle to draw attention to their orders. They will also be provided with lifebuoys or other life saving gear (where possible) and with a rope for a life line.
- (d) Fatal accidents occur only when bathing orders are not enforced or unit discipline is lax. O.Cs units will therefore be responsible for ensuring that the above orders are enforced on all occasions when bathing takes place.

Essays should, therefore, be designed in substance and form to serve as the basis for a talk and discussion in units. On any issue under discussion the writer should also give the facts on which these views are based. Essays will be judged on their contents and not on their literary standards.

313. POSTAL - REDIRECTION OF CORRESPONDENCE

1. The widespread failure of individuals and units to undertake their proper responsibilities in the matter of redirection of mail is leading to serious delay and is throwing an unnecessary load upon the Army Postal Service in General and Postal Tracing Sections in particular.
2. Special attention is drawn to "Postal Notes for Army Units and Departments" and G.R.O. 682/1943 on this subject.
3. Postal Tracing Sections are intended to deal with the mail of casualties and then only for the period during which the casualty is unable to notify his correspondents and former unit(s) of his new postal address. The mail for such casualties is suffering serious delay because of the failure mentioned in para 1.
4. (a) Responsibility for redirection of mail rests first with the individual whose duty it is to notify his new postal address to all regular correspondents and to all units and establishments to which his correspondence has been addressed in the previous three months. Whenever possible, this will be done prior to departure from the last unit. This applies particularly to men passing through hospitals, convalescent depots and reinforcement and training depots.
(b) AF A2042c (Postal Address Redirection Card) is designed for the purpose of notifying correspondents and former units of a new postal address and this card should be used in preference to any other method of advice. Priority treatment is given to these cards within the Army Postal Service (These may
