PROPOSED EMERGENCY REGISTRATION SYSTEM

Caution should be exercised before a decision to re-register is taken. It is only likely to be necessary in the event of the various central records having been destroyed.

In my view, the decision to re-register is not the prerogative of any one Division but of (1) Security Services (i.e. IB Counter-Intelligence and Police - the latter service should be responsible for its proper application.) I recommend, therefore, that whenever the question of registration is contemplated, it should be considered by an Emergency Registration Panel, to consist of not more than two representatives of each of the Divisions referred to above.

Basic
Principles.

Whenever the normal registration is considered effective, even though its efficiency has been impaired, it should be utilised and recourse should not be made to an Emergency Registration System unless it is absolutely essential. To produce even the most simple Emergency Registration system will be an extremely big undertaking, and cannot be accomplished in a short period of time.

When an Emergency Registration System is required, it should be made as simple as possible and any proposed scheme should be of considerable flexibility.

Form Distribution.

(c) Previously printed Emergency Registration Forms, comprising of duplicate blank forms, will be distributed on a broadcast system, such as through the Bakers, (with whom all families are registered), or through employers of large numbers of persons, or upon application to the Podesta.

Information.

(d) Such forms will require the following information to be inserted:

1. Full Name: SEX: Personal Registration No.
2. Present address: Ration Card No.
3. Permanent address where this differs from 2.
4. Normal trade or profession.
5. If in employment, where and in what capacity.
6. Full date of birth.
7. When person registering is the head of a household, the names of all persons under the age of 16 years living with him.
8. Stamp of Issuing Office.

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- (e) These completed forms will be handed in to the Podesta, or "posted" in various receptacles which will be distributed throughout the locality for that purpose.
- (f) The Podesta will organize assistance to check these forms one half of which will be stamped and returned through the post to the individual, and the duplicate filed in alphabetical order at the office of the Podesta. Consideration should be given to the separation of males and females in the indexes.
- (g) The supervision of the efficiency of the application of such a system will be that of the C.A.O., through the C.A.P.O.
- (h) Whenever any other Permit or Authority is granted, such as movement or rations, the applicant would be required to produce his E.R. Card, which would be so endorsed, so that unless a person complied with the requirements of the Emergency Registration System, no other Permits or facilities would be available to him.
