1. Rumors relative to change in exchange rate have been current in Sicily in last fortnight - rate of 67 lire to Dollar mentioned.

2. Message from C.P.O. Brindisi Area of 17 Oct re possibility of Allied printing Bank of Italy Lira Notes.

3. Requests of Badoglio Government for money. Only instance so far has been request from Region VI (Sardinia) for L. 150,000,000 for payment and other needs of Italian Army, which was sent them on 3 Oct included in L. 200,000,000 received for by Brig. Boulnais, Head of Allied Mission. Mr. White asked to see and was shown receipt and book-keeping entry covering this operation. He pointed out the importance of clearly recording and explaining all such entries. Monthly reports should reflect these operations showing the breakdowns according to categories of how these amounts were spent. Large expenditures particularly should be carefully broken down. Forms of monthly statistical reports by Armies was examined. Mr. White will endeavour to have meeting in N. Africa with Col. Simms, British Paymaster-in-Chief and Lt. Cmdr Southard to try and get the necessary data. It is now contemplated that AMPA accounts will reflect, in schedules annexed to balance sheet, how armies are spending money received from AMPA.

4. Increases in pay to civil employees, police, etc. Question must be approached with very careful consideration. We have got to be pretty hard-boiled. Especially as new Italian Government and mayors will be inclined to popularize themselves by granting such increases freely.


5. Paying of interests on Govt. Bonds may be desirable at this stage to encourage investment in new Govt. Bond issues, which will absorb surplus purchasing power.

6. Payment of interest on Bank Deposits with AMPA. Reason for this was explained.

7. Need for stenographic and Typist help. Mr. White may be able to supply a few civilians from Africa.

MINUTES OF P. H. PLANNING COMMITTEE

Meeting No. 8.

1. Personnel.

The Adjutant Assistant Chiefs of Staff (JACS) submitted a written statement showing that there were 277 officers present at the centre (excluding permanent school staff) the numbers being made up of 183 American and 94 British officers and that of these 154 officers (viz: 122 American and 32 British) were attending the School as students the balance viz: 61 American and 62 British being assigned to planning staff. These figures did not include the draft arriving to-day from England. Detailed breakdown of the numbers of officers still required by regions and divisions totalling 552, American and 352 British officers were also submitted.

2. Situation.

(a) Military

Col. Dalrymple stated that the 20 Civil Affairs officers whom it had been hoped to get from the Middle East would not now arrive until the first week in October. He dealt with the Military situation so far as Sardinia and Corsica was concerned and commented specially on the systematic destruction of the port of Naples by the enemy from the point of view of availability for the future discharge of supplies.

(b) Political

Col. Maxwell emphasised that following on a meeting held by General Eisenhower Major General Lord Herdell and Brigadier General Holmes had been despatched to proceed to H. C. Allied Mission to work out a formula for dealing with ad hoc with the political situation as then found.

It had been decided that it would be politically undesirable to publish proclamations in the usual way in those areas in which the King was present, that Marshal Bagdolio had appointed a Commissioner for Liberated Areas and that Italian Civil Government would function through that official. The Civil Affairs Officers of Region 2 had accordingly been put under General Macfarlane and would be answerable generally for dealing on a liaison basis with the local authorities. In specially selected areas within the liberated areas, however, it would be necessary for operational reasons to exercise a

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(b) Political

Col. Maxwell emphasized that following on a meeting held by General Eisenhower Major General Lord Rennell and Brigadier General Holmes had been deputed to proceed to H.Q. Allied Mission to work out a formula for dealing I 621 ad hoc with the political situation as then found.

It has been decided that it would be politically inadvisable to publish proclamations in the usual way in those areas in which the King was present, that Marshal Badoglio had appointed a Commissioner for Liberated Areas and that Italian Civil Government would function through that official. The Civil Affairs Officers of Region 2 had accordingly been put under General Macfarlane and would be answerable generally for dealing on a liaison basis with the local authorities. In specially selected areas within the liberated areas, however, it would be necessary for operational reasons to exercise a greater control than supervision and such areas would be specially dealt with on AIC lines for so long as operational necessity required it.

Col. Maxwell then indicated that pending any detailed armistice terms being signed the short terms already signed would be acted on so far as might be expedient, and that it should be assumed that detailed armistice terms would ultimately be drawn up. Directives would follow at the earliest possible moment.

At Col. Maxwell's request Col. Fairman then dealt with the position as he knew it. It was explained that it was not expedient to send advanced H.Q. of the Armistice Commission to the mainland until the present position had been clarified, the shape of the Italian Government had been fixed and directives could be issued.

Col. Fairman indicated that although there may well be little change ultimately in our Armistice Control plan involving a Commission with 5 sections the nomenclature may be changed to suit circumstances e.g. by the substitution of the words Allied Commission for Armistice Control. The Italian Government may be given the status of co-belligerent but would not be considered as allies and would be in the position of having to prove their worth by their deeds.

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Equal British MOST SECRET Personnel Paintman urged and it was directed that JACCS should concentrate now on considering what, in their view, would be the types of directives which the present circumstances might warrant and that they should submit their recommendations so that they could be taken into account when the final directives from A.P.H.Q. were being worked out.

Colonel Maxwell then stressed the complicated personnel situation which would undoubtedly arise in Apulia, Sardinia and by reason of transfers from Regions 1 and 2 and directed that JACCS should forthwith get together, on the basis of the administrative staff contemplated for Region 7, the administrative staff to deal with such problems as they might arise.

(c) Supply

Col. Butterworth stressed that every person concerned with AMG or Armistice Control must realise that local resources and captured material must be used to the full before recourse is made to imported goods. Only the supplies bid for would be forthcoming and all must realise that when scheduled imported stores are finished no more can be made available. JACCS must now work out their own planning on a long term policy particularly for next year. Full information as to calorific values and the standard to be worked to would be circulated.

It was stressed that M.G.S. is not a G-L or a supply section and that the responsibility for initial supplies to regions going into the field must rest with the Military Government School and Holding Centre.

Officers were informed that the responsibility for Merchant Shipping to and from Italy would be taken over by another body and would not be within the province of ~~Merchant~~ Control with which they would have to deal.

3. Regional matters and reports.

(a) Region 6 Sardinia.

General.

(1) It was pointed out that having regard to what has happened the situation in Sardinia must be considered as an armistice one by anticipation and that the mission to be sent out would be under AFHQ protection until it was possible to transfer it to armistice control.

(ii) Currency.

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The supplies bid for would be forthcoming and all must realise that when scheduled imported stores are finished no more can be made available. JACS must now work out their own planning on a long term policy particularly for next year. Full information as to calorific values and the standard to be worked to would be circulated.

It was stressed that M.G.S. is not a G-4 or a supply section and that the responsibility for initial supplies to regions going into the field must rest with the Military Government School and Holding Centre.

Officers were informed that the responsibility for Merchant Shipping to and from Italy would be taken over by another body and would not be within the province of ~~Armistice~~ Control with which they would have to deal.

3. Regional matters and reports.

(a) Region 6 Sardinia.

General.

(1) It was pointed out that having regard to what has happened the situation in Sardinia must be considered as an armistice one by anticipation and that the mission to be sent out would be under AFHQ pro-temp until it was possible to transfer it to Armistice Control.

(ii) Currency.

On the question of currency Brig. Hamlyn advised and it was decided that AM Lire alone should be taken into Sardinia (50,000,000 lire being supplied to start with) and that this should be made legal tender by virtue of a proclamation to be got out and issued by the Italian Government and countersigned by the Allied authorities. It was further decided that arrangements should be made for an AMFA officer to live on the Island.

(iii) Coal mining.

Col. Maxwell stressed the very great importance to the Allies of the coal mining industry particularly having regard to the enormous deficit on the mainland.

On the above Col. Bulnois stated that the importance of the coal was well realised and that the figure they had in mind for export was 120,000 tons a month which would necessitate 85,000 tons shipping being available on a 15 day turn round. In order to remove doubts he placed on record that Sardinian Coal could only be shipped on a trip owing to inherent combustibility and
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 not be possible owing to this peculiarity with Spanish MoSFF SECRET piles of it in North Africa.

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Decision No. 2
The desirability of creating full AMG control of areas immediately surrounding the coal mining areas was raised and the general question of the Sardinian Mission being given powers to act on its own as circumstances appeared to require was touched upon. It was decided that these matters be investigated.

(b) Section 4

Brigadier Carr submitted a verbal detailed progress report and the following special points arose:-

1. It had been decided, having regard to existing Italian organization to set up a separate zone to cover Rome City and District (i. e. for a radius of approximately 30 miles outside the city).

2. Owing to the special problems which will be met with in Rome, Brigadier Carr pressed for a special transport pool of 100 vehicles to be made available to meet emergencies. This question was discussed at length and with it the implication of employing local Italian labour as drivers and it was decided that Colonel Butterworth should go into the question and see whether it would be practicable to obtain captured enemy vehicles and to ship them over to Italy to meet the expected emergency.

3. Regions 10 and 11

It was decided that the question as to what was to happen from Decision No. 4
the planning point of view in respect of Region 10 and 11 as originally contemplated should be brought up for discussion at the next meeting of this committee.

4. Training

It was reported that the week of intensive study for officers arriving at the Center (decided on at the last meeting) had justified itself and would be continued for future arrivals.

This being so, the time had not yet come to send Advanced HQ Allied Armistice Control into the field and that in its place the Military Staff Mission under Lieut-General Mason Macfarlane had been charged with the duty of co-ordinating with the Italian representatives on all staff matters and would in addition be used as an ad hoc body to deal with all other points which might arise. In this connection it was emphasized that the intention of having Armistice Control Commission remained, but that the question of sending forward an advanced part of it had been deferred and would be brought forward again as opportunity offered.

In general connection with Armistice Control, it was to be noted that the correct abbreviation would in future be Armistice C. C. and not A.C.C.

c. Own Resources

In the light of the above consideration had to be given as to how, in the lack of specific directives, planning should proceed and as a working basis it had been decided as follows:-

AMG:-

- (1) Region 4 must proceed as rapidly as possible with its planning on AMG lines but must now, because of geographical and operational considerations, be prepared to operate in the first instance at least with two armies and must bid for convoy space according to

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Region 6 is now to be considered as next in order of priority of planning after Region 4 and consideration is to be given forthwith to the provision of personnel on Labour, Education and Transportion.

- (III) Region 5 must proceed with its planning as rapidly as possible its priority being assessed as next after Region 6.

- (V) Region 7 is at the moment to be in abeyance.
- (VI) In all the above cases particular emphasis must be paid to the question of civilian supplies and to the necessity for early bidding to ensure shipping space.
- (VII) On the general question of liaison it would be for M.I. Gov Sect. to initiate liaison with combat formations. This should be done at the earliest possible moment in each case particularly so as to facilitate bidding for shipping space for supplies and personnel. Regions and M.I. Gov Sec. should however do all possible in anticipation of such liaison in the way of pre-bidding such space and having ready at all times estimates, co-ordinated with Colonel Patterworth, of their requirements in likely eventualities.

Directive No. 1

2. Arristice C. C.

Colonel Maxwell next dealt with the question constitution of the Arristice C. C. and the number of section considered likely and directed that organization proceed on the basis of all sections and sub commissions as envisaged by us being required in full although arrangements must be made for the Sections moving to the mainland to be able to do so in such echelons as may be necessary having regard to the situation prevailing from time to time.

Directive No. 2

Nature deferred from previous meeting.

2. Relief and Welfare.

C. and the number of section considered likely and directed that organization proceed on the basis of all sections and sub commissions as envisaged by us being required in full although arrangements must be made for the Sections moving to the mainland to be able to do so in such echelons as may be necessary having regard to the situation prevailing from time to time.

Matters deferred from previous meeting.

2. Relief and Welfare.

The Acting Joint Chief Planners reported with regard to relief and it was agreed that under Artistic Control any scheme for relief must be very flexible and that while it would be subject to military considerations, the responsibility of the Control to see that food was available for the population, the detailed giving of relief would largely have to be left to the Italian Government.

The question of Welfare was then raised and claims were put forward by Brig Parkinson under which the Public Health section would become a controlling section for apparently all forms of welfare as well as for public health. Colonel Maxwell mentioned the probability of Red Cross organizations being the first allied civilian agencies to be allowed on the mainland, and that they would logically deal with many types of welfare. Major Powell stressed the desirability of following Italian practice wherever possible.

It was decided that Brig Parkinson should submit his proposals to the Acting Joint Chief Planners for discussion in detail but that having regard to the situation which might be found in Italy and to the personnel available a not too wide view be taken at the start of the scope of welfare duties for which the Public Health section should take themselves responsible.

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Directive No. 3

It was given as a directive by Colonel MAXELL in connection with future consideration of questions of relief and welfare that relief is primarily to be considered as a local administrative problem while welfare is primarily to be considered as a Section of the Public Health Division.

b. Accommodation - Standing Joint Committee.

It was reported that it had been found that by close liaison between Planners, the School and the Commandant questions of accommodation could be satisfactorily solved and that it was not felt there was no need for a Standing Joint Committee on the matter.

Decision No. 2

It was decided accordingly that the Standing Joint Committee be dissolved.

c. Records and Filing.

The system which had been worked out by the Acting Joint Chief Planners as set out in their Planning Directive No. 3 was noted.

d. Financial Officers.

The necessity for having junior financial officers with regions in the field who could act as provincial financial officers was stressed on all sides and in the uses or Regions 4 and 5 the number required was estimated at 1, and 7 respectively. The measures which had to be taken in SICILY to provide such officers were recalled and it was the general consensus of opinion that financial officers could not be spared from the Amistice Control Commission organization or Regional HQ's in sufficient numbers to provide mobilized regions with adequate number of financial officers.

It was decided:

- (I) That while at the moment it was not practicable to ask London and Washington for increases in total personnel to be supplied, a first bid for financial officers should be made whenever there is a possibility of asking for further recruitment.

Decision No. 3

- (II) That in the meantime mobilized regions be provided with such numbers of financial officers as are considered absolutely necessary by attaching to them where necessary financial officers assigned to other regions, and that the financial division be given first call on officers in the 3. Regions presented their reports verbally as to action taken and the following points arose out of the discussions which took place.

b. Region 4.

Estimates of Supplies which have been got out will now have to be split to cover the likely geographical and military situation and such estimates must be co-ordinated with Col. Butterworth.

The question of getting a few vehicles in advance of activation is to be followed up and with this in view Region 4 is to send in their QM officer to discuss the matter with Colonel Butterworth and Colonel Dalrymple.

b. Regions 2 and 9.

The desirability of these regions being supplied with adequate Selection Staffs was stressed and the possibility of providing these from time next arrivals of officers was mentioned.

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2. General points.

(I) Interterritory. It was decided that the Acting Joint Chief Planners should prepare a paper for Colonel Butterworth on essential minimum requirements and that this be then taken up by Colonel Butterworth on as high a level as possible.

Decision No. 4
It was further decided that Col. Butterworth should approach AIC in SICILY by cable to explore the possibilities of obtaining typewriters from there.

(II) Visits to SICILY. It was decided that lists of officer whom it was desired should visit SICILY be supplied to Major Jackson.

4. Future Operational Plans. No separate report on this was submitted as all known information had been given under item 1 above.

5. Training. Decision No. 7
Major Howell reported that lectures which were being given by personnel who had had experience in the field were proving most valuable. Major Howell urged that in order to give new personnel the proper background and general working knowledge, they be turned over completely to the Director of Studies for intensive training for one week after arrival. The points were raised as to certain regions needing most urgent and as to special cases but it was agreed in principle that new arrivals should wherever practicable be given such training under the Director of Studies.

PROVISION OF SHIPPING SPACE.

Stated that position was as follows:

1. A general estimate of requirements for Italy as a whole had been made by Capt. Todd to S.O.S. This was divided into two parts above and below Rome, and the information was in the library here.

6. The question of transport for movement of supplies internally was still under consideration, as a result of difficulties met in Sicily.

7. The information was given unofficially that Medical Supplies would be available, and 30,000 tons of flour, in North Africa. It had to be remembered that after an allocation was made, there would be at least 15 days delay before supplies could be landed.

- (a) The source of power for ordering the removal of supplies from one place to another should be easily accessible.

Colonel Maxwell stated that since the last meeting of the Committee the suggestions of the Combined Chiefs of Staff for dealing with Armistice Control had been received in FAN cable 217 (copies of which had been supplied to the Planners) and that it was necessary to despatch a cable on 11 September to the Combined Chiefs of Staff giving considered views thereon.

Colonel Maxwell then referred to the plan as proposed in FAN 217 and outlined its proposals and the constitution proposed in it. He emphasized that the sections and subcommissions into which the Combined Chiefs of Staff had split the commission should not be considered as finally binding but that suggested departures therefrom should only be made with good reason.

Colonel Maxwell next referred to the tactical situation as now known, to the fact that draft armistice terms had been received, and to the proposed Interim Armistice Committee which was being set up by the Commander-in-Chief.

1. It was decided that proposed sections and sub commissions in PAM 217 should not be considered as finally binding and that meeting this afternoon should be free to make recommendations on the ground:
- a. That Para 2 d is obviously permissive of changes, and
 - b. That the sub-sections are not clear entirely to agree with the Italian governmental set-up.
 - c. On the ground that the economic and finance section appears unduly heavy.
2. Proposed CAO's comes under the Ministry of the Interior.
3. Proposed that Justice should include order if that is the practice in Italy. If order at present comes under the Ministry of Interior, question should be further debated. In any case CAFO's will form part of the same subsection as order.
4. Property control. If under Italian law a Ministry is already charged with custodial duties, same arrangement should continue. Otherwise we should form sub-division of Justice.
5. Non-military internees. It appears that these might be handled by the sub-commission 4 of the military section with any liaison department required. In the event of the military section being unable to handle this subject an ad interim subsection should be formed in the sub-commission for the Ministry of the Interior and the Italian Ministry of the Interior would be required to do the housekeeping.
6. Proposed if a Transportation section is formed it would be preferable to call it a Communication section to be in line with Italian nomenclature. It could naturally be divided as in the case of the Ministry in question into 3 sub commissions--Transportation, Tele-communications and Shipping. After consultation with Mr. Campbell of MSSB it was agreed that supervision over Italian merchant shipping through the sub-commission of shipping mentioned above should reside in the Armistice Commission but that the commission would work in close cooperation with MSSB and

It could naturally be divided as in the case of the Ministry in question into 3 sub commissions--Transportation, Tele-communications and Shipping. After consultation with Mr. Campbell of MASEO it was agreed that supervision over Italian merchant shipping through the sub-commission of shipping mentioned above should reside in the Armistice Commission but that the commission would work in close cooperation with MASEO and the C in C Med.

7. It is recommended that the sub-commission on Justice be entitled Legal Sub-Commission and that it be initially divided into two sub-sections, Chief Counsel to the Commission, and Justice.

8. Foreign Trade. Proposal accepted.
9. Industry and Commerce. Accepted.
10. Public Works and Utilities. Public works should be considered to include maintenance of roads and buildings. In addition this sub-commission would control:
a. All electrical power undertakings.
b. Gas undertakings
c. Water undertakings.

11. Fuel. Accepted, but will involve in any case modification of MAP 241.

12. Food. There appears to be no Italian equivalent to the proposed Food sub-commission. Suggested that any eventual need for liaison with Civilian Agencies (food and relief) should be found by an additional and appropriate sub-commission. For the moment this does not seem necessary. In the meantime further investigation required into handling of food distribution and rationing in Italy.
 13. Agriculture. Accepted.
 14. Public Health. Does this come under Ministry of Interior?
 15. Labor. Accepted.

Colonel Maxwell stated that General Holmes had asked that the question should be discussed both from the Legal and Financial points of view as to whether this Division should be kept entirely separate or be under one or other of such Divisions. After discussion it was decided:

- (a) That so far as AIC is concerned it should remain a separate Division.
- (b) That so far as ACK is concerned the matter be reviewed by the Acting Joint Chief Planners and that they consult Brigadier Hamlyn thereon and tender their recommendations either to the next meeting of this committee or (2) by note to General Holmes as soon as practicable before the next meeting.

Decision 1.

(b) Split of Communications and Utilities Division

- (1) Colonel Maxwell reported that since the last meeting the combined Chiefs of Staffs had been recommended to agree to the splitting (for AIA and National HQ purposes) of the Communications and Utilities Division into (a) Transportation and Communications (b) Fuel Power and Utilities. The staff which had been requested for the new divisions was indicated.

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Decission 2.

- (2) It was decided that the Acting Joint Chief Planners should so far as National HQ or ACK were concerned proceed on the basis of the split divisions as contemplated above but that planning for regions proceed on the basis of a composite division for these subjects as originally proposed.

(c) Relief

Colonel Maxwell stated General Holmes' view that having regard to future uncertainty it was undesirable to put on the term relief an interpretation different from that given to it when planning the AMG Sicily organization. Colonel Maxwell spoke of "relief in that connection and gave as a general rule that relief should fundamentally be regarded as a financial gift to one or more persons with the object of giving them the purchasing power necessary to support life. From the point of view of availability of supplies to be purchased and the necessity for relief as defined above the CAO on the spot must first approach it as an administrative problem consulting HQs as necessary. HQ would then approach the matter from the Financial or Supply angle as necessary and would arrange accordingly.

It was decided that the Acting Joint Chief Planners should discuss and report to the next meeting what forms relief might take under ACK and should in doing so, consult with the Public Health, Finance and Legal Divisions thereon.

(2) Re-adjustment of Legal Division.

Decision 3.

It was decided as a matter of principle that both Legal and Financial Divisions should be regarded as being under the Acting Joint Chief Planners.

(b) The question was raised as to the number of Administrative Staff officers provisionally allowed for National HQ compared with the numbers provisionally allowed for on Regional HQ. The likelihood of Regional officers being centered in that HQ rather than being permanently dispersed was discussed and it was decided

(1) That Planners must come to a conclusion in the matter of the number and type of Administrative Staff officers when making up their TO/NE's, but

(2) The principle must be accepted that the total overall figures for officers already given must not be exceeded although there was no objection to a re-shuffling of types and numbers within those total figures.

4. Accommodation for Planning Staffs.

The Acting Joint Chief Planners reported that as a result of discussions with Colonel Parkin, plans were in hand for re-allocating accommodation in the planning building, for providing tents and utilising verandah space and that if necessary regional staffs would be housed elsewhere. The urgent need for temporary accommodation was greatly stressed.

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On the question of accommodation generally, it was decided that

ject to armistice control only.

4. Colonel Maxwell stated that it could be assumed that the Commander in Chief in the theatre of operations would be the person through whom Armistice Control would flow.
5. Colonel Maxwell then drew the special attention of the officers present to Appendix 12 of the paper and commented on the fact that the figures might well need considerable adjustment in the light of experience particularly with regard to those included for civilian agencies. The differences between the figures for AMG and control was pointed out and commented upon.
6. In order to clarify officers' minds, Colonel Maxwell explained the difference in function between Public Relations and Psychological Warfare, defining the latter broadly as directed against the enemy whilst the former was directed to other than our enemies.
7. Colonel Maxwell next referred officers to Appendix 1 of the paper being the chart of suggested organization for control and stated that this was only tentative but would, on General Holmes' direction, be worked to until some other directive was received.

b. With regard to the filling of appointments to planning staff it was decided that the acting Joint Chief Planners as constituted in paragraph 8 c above should

- (1) Appoint to planning staffs, officers of the rank of Major and below and inform MGs as to action taken.
- (2) Recommend the names of Lt. Cols. and Colonels for appointment where such officers have not ~~been~~ assigned to a post.

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c. With regard to the split between American and British officers in the control organization it was decided that this must depend on personnel available.

d. It was again stressed that although wherever possible, locations for employment given by Washington or London should be followed as might always be employed in any capacity for which he had qualifications irrespective of the type of post for which he had originally been sent out, and that appointments were at present informal and subject to change.

Dear Rathbone

Many thanks for your letter of the 20th raising a number of points to which we must find answers quickly and of which I am glad to have notice before Sunday. The following paragraphs follow your numbers.

2. You will find in cable NAF 296 to the Combined Chiefs of Staff proposals regarding number of ORs and PW. This does not take account of the increase in vehicles now considered necessary after Sicilian experience and drivers should be somewhat adjusted accordingly. I suggest that the WE/TU should have a footnote to the effect that the number of GR/M will be reviewed after say two months in the light of the amount of Italian labour which has been mobilised. Certainly GRs should be entitled to recruit locally, but the scope of recruiting should be governed by general administrative instructions. I do not think that AFHQ will view sympathetically an application for a batman-orderly for every officer and I think the best thing is to rely on the local recruitment rather than go beyond the basis already in practice accepted by Washington and London. Regions should prepare TOS/TOs for discussion with you. Approval would then be given by this section of AFHQ and the S/A Committee (Br) and appropriate G-1 American channel.

3. I think the discrepancy you mention is more apparent than real. Paper number five and the minutes of the Planning Meeting of August 16th refer to planning for occupied territory and this is the matter on which you are now primarily engaged. The Overall Outline of August 3rd refers to "control." This is now in review here and we expect to bring the matter up in revised form very shortly. The alternatives you mentioned are debatable, but we have been guided in the allocation of functions by the experience of the individuals we have been looking for. Therefore the Regional Deputy Chief of Staff must be a man of wide army and staff experience, while the Divisional Deputy Chief of Staff was to be a man of governmental rather than military background and I think we should stick to this at present. As regards b., I think your suggestions should be approved.

4. Same comments as above. Matter now under review.

5. This matter is being dealt with on a somewhat different basis which I will explain verbally on Sunday.

6. No difficulty at all. Colonel Parkman will no doubt arrange this with the appropriate section at AFHQ.

7. Thank you for bringing this point up. I am afraid that at present office procedure generally needs tightening up and the only way to achieve it is by the officers responsible at your end and ours, Major Jackman, working the matter out in detail. I have already shown him what you say.

There are one or two points which I should like to raise in connection with the conference to which you are coming here next Sunday, and I thought it ~~may~~ be helpful if I let you have them in advance in case any of them require looking into.

2. T/O's / W/E's

We have received these from you as regards officers and vehicles. What about OR and EM? Are you preparing these or do you want us to put up ~~cockshy~~? Also I am not clear whether some of the OR staff is to be provided from local civil population - for example, orderlies, cooks, mess staff, servants, etc. If so, have we carte blanche to engage any of these shapes as we want, when we get there; or have they got to be allowed for on a definite W/E? I gather that some of the CAO in Sicily who were dumped down in a town with absolutely no one, very much felt the need, as they naturally would, of a Batman Orderly, and I suggest that these should be provided for.

3. Functions of Assistant Chiefs of Staff, National Headquarters.

• There is a discrepancy as to the functions to be exercised in various papers which we have received from you. You told me that one coordinates the various divisions (finance, legal, agricultural etc.) and the other will coordinate the Regions, - this is the division of duties given in "Memorandum On Preparation For Post-Husky Operations".

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dated ^{ed} July 19, Section III and in Appendix "A" to minutes of meeting #2 held at N.O.S. on August 16, but in Appendix #4, to "Overall Outline for the Occupation of Italy" dated August 3, the table shows each Assistant Chief of Staff as responsible for a number of Divisions. It seems to me that the organization last referred to is the best because a question put up by a Regional Commissioner and similarly a directive or instruction sent to a Regional Commissioner will ^{and if one A.C.O.S. is responsible for all} fall under one or more of these divisions, the other would have ^{other} divisions nothing to do.

b. There is a small point in connection with the table ^{of} Appendix #4, above referred to. "H.Q.British" and "H.Q.U.S." are both shown under one Assistant Chief of Staff. Presumably this refers to establishment personnel and domestic questions. If so, it would surely be better if "H.Q.British" were placed under ~~the~~ British Assistant Chief of Staff and "H.Q.U.S." under his American opposite number.

c. Functions of Headquarters Commandants National Headquarters.

Appendix #5 to "Overall Outline for the Occupation of Italy" shows on page 3 a total of 30 Officers under and including a Headquarters Commandant and his deputy. I can well believe that the personnel and domestic questions to be dealt with concerning National Headquarters, will be numerous and complex. ^{but} Be it even so, is not the proposed staff on the large side?

5. Increment of National Headquarters to accompany first region to be established.

It occurred to me as being worth consideration that one or two selected officers of National Headquarters might with advantage accompany the staff of the first Region to go over, in order to insure that national policy ^{is} not prejudiced. This would follow the army principle of attaching a G.H.Q. ^{increment} incalculable to the senior formation Headquarters exercising control at the beginning of an operation, the object being, as you know, to insure that long term maintenance policy is kept in mind and provided for.

6. Interviewing Prisoners of War.

It has been suggested to me by Major Kennedy whom we have provisionally earmarked as the Agricultural Officer at National Headquarters, that it would be of great value if he could be permitted to be present at interviews with suitable prisoners of war, if such exist. Most of the handbooks are prewar, and if among available prisoners there were any with an intimate knowledge of Italian Agricultural affairs on a national level, it would be of very great advantage if Major Kennedy could be permitted to be present when they are interviewed, and to put any questions he might wish to. Perhaps this could be arranged through Col. Ford who is in the Intelligence Section of the A.F.H.Q.

8. Method of forwarding papers.

We have been receiving a number of papers lately addressed "Planning Staff" on the envelope, but with little or nothing else on the papers themselves to identify them. Some of them do

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not even bear a date - for example the notes received this morning compiled by the C.A.O. Palermo. I am sure you will agree that it should greatly facilitate Office Organization, ~~Procedure~~ and correct disposal of papers generally if all papers emanating from you were forwarded with a brief covering letter bearing a number and date, and either containing a direction or simply saying that a given number of copies of a certain paper were forwarded for such action and distribution as we thought desirable.

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ADMINISTRATIVE

1. Col. Maxwell asked Major Rowell on the position of manuals, grammars, and material necessary for School curriculum. Major Rowell, needed copies of grammars, dictionaries, booklets on Fascist Italy. Agreed to be obtained.

A close cooperation should exist between Col. Forester and Major Rowell on matters of distribution etc.

It was agreed that all planners should read, Paper # 5, Overall Plan for Italy, Summary from A.F.H.Q.

Col. Dalrymple sent cable to London for 100 copies of "Sicily Plan", less part # 4.

MAPS

Col. Maxwell to Major Jackman, report on distribution of maps. Major Jackman reports that everyone concerned has received an adequate supply; if more are needed, he can furnish them.

Col. Maxwell directed Region 3 to bid for maps, by number, sheet, and scale. Col. Southerland raised the question of road maps of Sicily, some form of road map will be obtained.

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COMMUNICATIONS

Major Jackman reported that direct telephone communication could be obtained. Teletype, difficulty was not in getting the prescribed equipment but the personnel to operate some.

Col. Parkin reported that to his knowledge there was only one wire T.T. lead to this place. It was pointed out by Major Jackman that teletype would insure security; the question of teletype was to be investigated further and action taken.

An internal communication system should be instituted in Hollywood H.Q. Action to be taken.

Telephone to be installed in office of Region # 7.

Major Jackman reported that 2 motorcycles have been obtained and would be passed into service immediately.

SECURITY

Security officer was to issue passes to everyone including A.F.N.Q.Staff. List to be obtained from Major Jackman. Proper Guard personnel will be selected from 103 E.M.

The H.Q. Building would not serve as a dormitory and office, but just as office.- Col. Maxwell.

It was agreed to have an E.M. sleep in the respective regional offices at night.

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BACK MESSAGE

This subject was considered satisfactory, but additional study should be made in obtaining more information on proper classification of officers etc.

TYPEWRITERS AND MIMEOGRAPHS

Col. Maxwell - The situation on typewriters is critical and immediate steps should be taken to relieve the crisis.

Major Jackman reported 5 mimeograph machines were in Algiers for delivery and 20 typewriters were promised for delivery as soon as possible.

Col. Maxwell suggested that definite bids should be placed with A.F.H.Q., as follows:

PROGRESS OF CAMP

Col. Parkin reported that he could accomodate 1000 men and progress was going very well. Tentage to be furnished by British and Americans. French apartments to be requisitioned to take care of 54 Senior officers.

In addition a camp for jr. officers should be established. One difficulty for this project is piping water, and an investigation should be conducted to determine where pipes will come from. If situation should become critical, permission could be granted for billeting Sr. officers in town at 25 Francs per day. Approximately 200 officers should be expected by the end of the month. 152

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TRANSPORTATION

This question at present is also vital and immediate steps are being taken to rectify it. Some jeeps and 2 - 2½ ton trucks to be assigned to Headquarters, in addition 2 C. and R. cars are to be obtained immediately for the Planning Groups.

At this point of the meeting, before going into planning, Col. Maxwell insisted that all sections should attend the meetings until otherwise notified.

2.

PLANNING

The next region to be mobilized is Region # 3 under Col. Ashley (B) and Col. Sutherland (A). It was stressed that this region should complete its planning and all administrative problems as soon as possible. As a basis, Col. Spofford, in Sicily, is redrafting the present plan and it should be here within the next few days. A meeting will then be held in Algiers with Region # 3 by A.F.H.Q. It was suggested that preliminary plans should be submitted to V th Army as soon as practicable. Col. Maxwell suggested that all basic studies of planning should be left behind for other planning groups.

Col. Sutherland suggested that the Compendium should serve as a good guide, and administrative details should be added to it.

LIAISON

Col. Sutherland said that he had been keeping close liaison with General Staff, V th Army, and everything is very satisfactory.

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It was suggested by Col. Maxwell that Col. Ashley should be liaison to X th Army and Col. Sutherland to V th Army, but both officers should pay their respects and keep liaison to both Armies together, as much as possible.

Col. Maxwell also suggested that planning should take up liaison with regions.

Col. Maxwell here injected that for planning future operations all officers should read every piece of material available.

The officers should use every bit of information and should do their own research; every means should be employed to obtain all information possible before leaving for actual field duty.

Col. Maxwell notified the meeting that the Middle East Command was getting ready to launch an attack on the Dodecanese Islands. A.F.H.Q. is going to request M.E.C. to send a liaison officer to H.Q.A.F., so that both commands can work out a plan to conform with the A.F.H.Q. plan and therefore have a systematic working of Amgot.

It was agreed that planners would do language classes, and would also attend the important lectures.

It was requested by Col. Maxwell that both Col. Parkin and Major Rowell send in a combined weekly schedule to Gen. Holmes.

Col. Forester is to have assigned to him immediately a Transportation Officer.

1. Reports on action taken since last meeting.

a. Communications.

- (1) Major Jackman reported that with regard to telephones the Deputy Chief Signal Officer, AFHQ, had directed a survey to be made of existing facilities with recommendations for improvements and that an officer from his section was so engaged today. It was anticipated that it would be possible to link up the School with AFHQ by Army line through existing Army exchanges so as to cut out the present civilian stage and that a teletype fitted with a scrambler (which would take messages up to the equal of American "Confidential" British "Secret") could probably be installed. In the latter connection the difficulty would be personnel to man the teletype rather than the provision of the instruments.

- (2) With regard to DRL, Major Jackman reported that 2 m/cs had been secured which would provide, with the mail jeep, a basic DRL Service. It was decided on (a) and (b) above that Major Jackman continue to press the matters.

PART I - ADMINISTRATIVE

1. Reports on action taken since last meeting.

a. Communications.

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(2) With regard to DRL, Major Jackman reported that 2 m/c's had been secured which would provide, with the mail jeep, a basic DRL Service. It was decided on (a) and (b) above that Major Jackman continue to press the matters.

b. Security Officer at Planning Centre & Security.

(1) Colonel Forester reported that Captain Gillett had been appointed Security Officer.

(2) On the question of Security it was decided that passes to the planning building be furnished by the Security Office on demand by Major Jackman to the officers on the permanent staff of M.G.S.

c. Guards at Planning Building.

Lt. Colonel Forester reported that those had been arranged and that the wiring of the building was proceeding as rapidly as possible.

d. Maps.

Major Jackman reported that maps to Lt. Colonel Forest's requirements to date have been supplied and that local maps for students instructional purposes in map reading would be supplied by the Map Department soon.

It was decided that map requirements by regions, other than 3, hq submittal as soon as possible to M.G.S., and in respect of Region 3 that the demand for submitted within 48 hours of this meeting. The suggestion that ordinary road mapping maps of Italy would be valuable was noted.

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2. Furnishing of Documents.

Colonel Dalrymple indicated what had already been sent to the School and stated that in addition 100 copies of the AMG plan had been bid for by fast air from London. The question arose as to the person to whom such information should be addressed and it was decided that documents, other than those relating to the Interior administration of the School, be addressed until further notice by U.G.S. to Lt. Colonel Forester for distribution as he considered necessary.

It was further decided that efforts be made to obtain as many copies as possible of the second draft of documents which were being prepared in London on various phases of civilian affairs in Italy (Action Lt. Col. Dalrymple).

1. Provision of Back Messages re Personnel.

Lt. Colonel Dalrymple stated that all such had been furnished and that when the code which was being used by the Americans for classifying officers had been clarified a copy of this would be supplied.

2. Typewriters and Mimeographs.

Major Jackman reported that immediate delivery has been promised of 5 mimeograph machines and 20 typewriters, at least, out of the consignment due to arrive in a few days from England. Otherwise, no typewriters were in sight either on the British or the American side. Colonel Forester stated that on demand for the 5 mimeographs he had been informed that they would not be available until 21 August.

Colonel Maxwell stated that in view of the urgency, he felt it necessary that application be made to C.A.O. for immediate issue of typewriters on a priority basis as follows:

2. Tented Camp.

Colonel Parkin reported that wire, tables and RE stores had been collected today and that British tents would be collected tomorrow. P/W labor would be available from tomorrow. The main difficulty was lack of engineer supervisory staff. As it was definite that no RE personnel could be made available for at least 15 days it was decided that the Engineer Coy of the Headquarters Command be approached, if possible through General Holmes to provide plumbing labor on a priority one basis.

Colonel Parkin stated that he has space available now, excluding tents.

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Colonel Parkin stated that he has space available now, excluding tentage for approximately 120 personnel and he was warned that it would be necessary to have at least emergency accommodation for a further seventy personnel with a week.

On the question of tentage it was decided that Colonel Parkin should continue to press for American tentage to supplement British tentage.

3. Transport.(a) Domestic Transport.

Colonel Parkin stated that whilst he could convey personnel from the School to Algiers he was not able to do so (except for the odd person) in the reverse direction as his transport always returned to the School laden with rations and essential stores.

The various possibilities of obtaining transport from Algiers were discussed and Major Jackman was directed to make the best arrangements possible so that personnel arriving from overseas might get out to the School with the least possible delay. The 21 Car Coy, under control of AFHQ, Headquarters Command, was mentioned as a possible good source of supply.

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Colonel Parkin mentioned that two C&R cars had been authorized for release to him but so far had not arrived. He was pressing the matter.

4. Before leaving Part I Colonel Maxwell explained that although matters of detail would be discussed under this part which might not intimately concern certain members present he felt it well that all members should attend this part in order that they might be kept fully aware of the administrative situation.

PART II - PLANNING

1. a. Colonel Maxwell dealt in outline with the general subject of planning the framework for which is essentially the original AMG plan (supplemented by technical directives) which will be amended from time to time in the light of experience.

b. Colonel Maxwell then outlined the difference in planning and the different factors which have to be taken into account in thinking of Italy as compared with Sicily and instanced the following:-

g. 15th Army Group. The recent visit of General Holmes, Colonel Sutherland and Major Rowell to 15th Army Group was referred to.

b. Fifth Army. The constant liaison with 5th Army which had already taken place was noted.

c. X Corps. The recent interview which Lieutenant Colonel Dalmyarle and Lieutenant Colonel Sutherland had had with Brigadier Webb was mentioned.

d. Generally.

(1) Colonel Maxwell stated that it must be regarded as a first principle that planning staffs must take on the duties of liaison with operational formations and in the case of Region 3 it was decided that Lt. Colonel Sutherland should continue as principle liaison with 5th Army and that Colonel Ashley should be likewise with X Corps but if at all possible both officers or deputies should visit each formation together.

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Equal British M&ST ~~ONC&ME~~ special subject of liaison with the Middle East whom it had been ascertained were preparing plans for the government of Decdecance and ultimately Albania, Colonel Maxwell stated that a liaison officer from there had been requested and that liaison with him would probably fall to be carried on by the planning staffs of Region 7 under Lt. Colonel Forester.

3. Reports on Preparation of TO/NE.

a. Colonel Sutherland reported that the TO for Region 3 is in draft but that the WE is still to be got out. With regard to TBA and G 1098 specimens were being compiled. It was decided that a British officer be assigned to assist Colonel Sutherland with the WE and G 1098 as soon as ever practicable.

b. Colonel Dalrymple tabled a suggested scale of transport (see Appendix A) which was agreed.

4. Allotment of Officers to Planning Groups.

A chart showing the present allocation was submitted by Colonel Forester and after discussion and amendment to include for officers expected to return from AMG was agreed to in the form shown at Appendix 3 to these minutes. It was emphasized that the allocation of people to posts as shown therein was of course by no means final.

5. Training.

a. A question was raised whether planning staffs were to attend Italian lessons in all cases and Colonel Maxwell directed that this must be so.

b. On the question of books for language study Major Rowell stated that the School had had its own grammar book mimeographed but that he was particularly in need of Italian-English dictionaries and more American training manuals. Major Jackson was directed to obtain these on a high priority basis.

c. It was stressed that in addition to school training, personnel must be trained by Colonel Aitken through Colonel Parkin and Major Rowell in military duties including refresher courses in basic weapons and weekly training programs in advance were directed to be submitted to M.G.S.

d. The necessity for all personnel being able to drive and service at least a jeep and preferably also a motorcycle was stressed and Lt. Colonel Forester was directed to appoint a transport officer and arrange for as many drivers as possible to be trained.

e. On the question of the supply of enlisted men, Colonel Maxwell explained the prospective position.

PROCEEDINGS

- (a) Col. Maxwell outlined the need for frequent meetings of the Committee to consider various aspects of planning and stated that these meetings should be held at approximately monthly intervals and be held at either Washington or the U.S.A.U. Lt. Col. Purcell (Chairman) made arrangements for a suitable room to be available at 721 1/2 7th Street. It was agreed that it would be part of the duty of ministers and of the Committee to submit and study present figures of actual American overseas movements.
- (b) (i) On the question of Secretary it was suggested that Lt. Col. ~~D'Albrey~~ act as Secretary to the Committee with Capt. W. de Knop as his assistant.
- (ii) It was further decided that a joint Secretariat should be appointed from Planning Service at 721 1/2 7th Street and would conduct planning for the Committee from the Planning Office there and should co-ordinate the agenda with Col. Maxwell.
- (iii) On the question of agenda it was decided that a formal agenda be prepared for consideration in advance of the place before the members of the Committee, the last meeting, to facilitate clear discussion.

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(x) Col. Mac will outline the need for frequent meetings of the Committee to co-ordinate matters of planning and related. The meetings which would be held at either Army or Navy Headquarters could be held at either Army or Navy Headquarters for a suitable time to be established. The Col. Mac will discuss the duty of members of the Committee to submit and study progress reports of actions taken by their organizations.

(ii) (1) On the question of Secretariat, it was decided that

Col. Sayf will act as Secretary to the Committee with Dep. v. to know in his capacity.

(ii) It was further decided that a Joint Committee should be appointed from planning sections of the Army who should submit a report to the Committee prior to planning a specific date and should co-ordinate the report with Col. Sayf.

(iii) On the question of agenda it was decided that a formal agenda be prepared as far in advance as possible in advance and to be placed before the meeting, like the minutes of the last meeting, at least one clear day before the meeting with the proviso that changes not on the agenda may, with the concurrence of the Chairman be brought up at a particular ad-hoc meeting.

2. COMMITTEE

The need for frequent communications with the School was stressed. It was decided as follows (Colonel Major Jackson)

(a) That the question of improved telephone services to TIZI were to be investigated.

(b) That Major Jackson communicate with Other Naval Officer the possibility of the installation of a teletype or teletype service between APH and the School.

(c) That Major Jackson propose to the provision of an in-service DRL service or the hiring of two runs each day and that in the main time to keep service available enough for to take the DRL and personnel traffic be maintained.

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3. SECURITY.

Col Maxwell stressed once strongly the need for security measures in connection with planning and it was decided

- (a) That a Security Officer be appointed forthcoming for the School (action in Col Forster).
- (b) That security partitions per traffic between RING and the school be put in hand and implemented (action Security Officer M.L. Govt. School and Major Jackson).
- (c) That adequate means be arranged for Planning Building at RING OZONE (action Lt. Col. Forster in conjunction with Col PARKIN).
- (d) That adequate wiring be arranged round the planning building and proper keys be provided for remote the building (action Lt. Col. Forster in conjunction with Col PARKIN).
- (e) The necessity for a physical relocation of officers and U.S. personnel in connection with planning was emphasized from the security point of view both from the point of view of the type and capacity of personnel to be used in connection therewith. (action as necessary to Lt. Col. Forster and appointments board referred to below)
- (f) The desirability of reducing to an absolute minimum the numbers of persons having knowledge of detailed operational plans was stressed. It was agreed that all in planning should be kept fully aware of general plans for military government or control. Within respect to the above Col MAXWELL was instructed particularly in writing to the notice of Col SUTCLIFFE the necessity that strictest secrecy concerning those operational planning details which in the course of his work he has been cognizant.
- (g) Col Maxwell emphasized the need for general security points including:-
 - (i) Keeping and indexing of maps.
 - (ii) Checking of documents and the number of copies run off.

The practice of numbering copies of documents run off was commented upon favourably and brought to the notice of all com-

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(e) The desirability for a rapid selection of officers in O.S. for use in connection with planning was emphasized from the security point of view both from the point of view of the type and capacity of personnel to be used in connection therewith. (Actions necessary to Lt. Col. Forster and appointment board referred to below).

- (f) The desirability of reducing to an absolute minimum the numbers of persons having knowledge of detailed operational plans in excess while it was agreed that all in planning should be kept fully aware of general plans for military government or control. With regard to the above notice of Col. SUTHERLAND, the necessary precautions concerning those operational planning details of which in the course of his work he has become cognizant.
- (g) Col. Maxwell emphasized the need for general security points including:-

- (i) Kept and indexing of work.
- (ii) Cleaning of documents and the number of copies run off.

The practice of numbering copies of documents ran off was mentioned upon favourable and brought to the notice of all concerned.

IV. PUBLICATIONS AND INTELLIGENCE.

- (a) It was decided that large scale and small maps of Italy be obtained for the School for use in a map room ad hoc. General dispositions and that if possible four plans on a scale as possible to obtain of ACUZ and MAPS (notion Capt. CAMERON).
- (b) It was felt that the planning staff would have more use than the M.C.S. for detailed studies of parts of Italy and it was decided that copies of all such documents and if necessary the only copy received by HE should be handed over to the planning staff.
- (c) Col. Derrydale submitted a list - copy attached to these, of documents (copies) - of documents which it was suggested to supply to the planning staff. It was agreed that these documents should be forwarded to Lt. Col. Dalrymple.

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PERSONNEL - OFFICERS

The general policy for the notifying of the anticipated arrival of personnel at the school and their intervening and assignment to either Planning staff or school was raised and Major General explained the various already laid down for notifying the school of prospective arrivals and for the School notifying where each personnel had been placed. At the suggestion which might have place in their situation, this subject was agreed to as follows:

- (a) Appointments or assignments holding rank of Lt Col and upwards to be subject to prior approval of General Officer or Col. Marshal.
- (b) The fact that a particular officer might have been originally sent outside the theatre or reported inside the UK for a particular appointment or type of assignment does not necessarily preclude him from being used in a different capacity for which he shows ability or for which the need for his job is best suited.
- (c) That in this case, please inform Central Selection Board or Appointments Committee can be set up by Col. Postmaster (Adm) Major General and Major P.R.K.L.S. (communicate the interview board procedures which are not previously known determined).
- (d) That a copy of all personnel received or despatched concerning personnel be furnished to MI5 Govt School for the Planning Staff and that the Planning Staff be furnished with copies of all cables prior to July 1st, 1945, dates which may eventually concern the School. (mention Lt. Col. Delverdale).
- (e) SALARY PAY The question as to whether or not officers at the school individual planners will receive their pay until paid and it was decided that a full reconciliation on the matter be made to the next meeting and that in the meantime officers at the school be warned not to expect extra pay for the period they are at the school whether in the capacity as planners or students.

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(a) That in the first place under normal Selection Board or appointments Committee can be put up Lt. Col. FORSTER (with Major SOWELL and Major SUMMERS) constitutes the In-service board for officers whose use has not previously been determined.

(d) That copies of all documents received or dispatched concerning personnel by Headquarters to All Govt. School for the Planning Staff and the Planning Staff be compiled with copies of all cables previously sent to such authority which may eventually concern the School. (Action Lt. Col. DELVERNO).

(e) STAFF PAY. The question as to whether or not officers at the School including planners will receive, what pay and rank and if it is decided that full recompensation on the matter be made at the next meeting and that in the meantime officers at the school be warned not to expect staff pay for the period they work at the school whether in the capacity as planners or students.

PERSONNEL, ORG. AND EST.

Col. MAXWELL referred to the difficulties which were being encountered over the obtaining of certain relatives to the supply of other ranks. So far no J.M. was concerned appeared to be satisfactory.

7. EQUIPMENT FOR PLANNING STAFF AND SCHOOL.

(a) Typewriters and Minicar. Col. MAXWELL while enunciating the necessity for adequate supply of the above gave the reasons for not bidding especially with London with MACHINERY for them. The question of hiring of typewriters locally was raised and Capt. CAMERON is in agreement.

It was decided that equipment requirements be submitted to HQ, British Army from sources of supply for typewriters on an generous scale as can be justified, typewriters being on the order of one per four clerks and so forth. The order is to be placed (Lt. Col. MAXWELL and Capt. de KEMP who take no further action).

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(b) MEMOIRS.

It was decided that the question of vehicles and equipment
