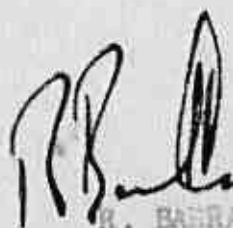

PROPOSED INSTRUCTION CONCERNING POSTING OF AMG OFFICERS (MILITARY)

GENERAL

1. All officers for AMG are posted to the pool of officers at TIZI OZZON. From the pool they are selected and finally posted to fill appointments on AMG establishments as and when formed.

SELECTION

2. The Head Planning staffs are responsible for selecting officers of the rank of Major and below from the pool for appointments in AMG establishments. Lieut Colonels and above are selected for appointments by MGS, where necessary on the recommendations of the head planning staffs.

POSTING OF OFFICERS FROM POOL TO AMG ESTABLISHMENTS

3. All postings of officers from H. G. Pool to AMG establishments as and when MGS have been approved and forming orders issued must receive the covering authority of M.S. This is necessary as the question of staff pay is involved.

4. In order to put this into effect the following action will be taken:

a. After final selection of officers has taken place (see para 2 above) the Commandant of the School is responsible that the names and particulars of all officers who have been selected for appointments to fill a particular MG, are forwarded to MGS with a request that the authority of MG be obtained for the posting and appointments of the officers concerned. These applications will be forwarded in duplicate to MGS.

b. MGS will forward applications to MG.

c. When MG covering authority has been obtained this will be notified to the Commandant of the School who will be responsible for notifying the necessary casualties to GHS, 2nd Echelon and quoting the MG authority.

d. Similarly the AMG establishment or unit, concerned will notify the necessary casualties to MG 2nd Echelon bringing the officers concerned onto the strength of its establishment and appointing them to their respective appointments.

e. Care must be taken, when applications are submitted by the School for MG authority, to show clearly if any question of promotion is involved in posting an officer and appointing him to a higher grade a pointment. e. g. "Capt. A BAKER (54321) BLANKET - promoted Major and appointed SO grade 2 AMG Region 101."

f. Applications will only be submitted by M G School when appointments are firm and there is no likelihood of subsequent alterations - except in cases of unforeseen emergencies.

h. In order to put this into effect the following action will be taken:

a. After final selection of officers has taken place (see para 2 above) the Commandant of the School is responsible that the names and particulars of all officers who have been selected for appointments to fill a particular AG, are forwarded to AGS with a request that the authority of AG be obtained for the posting and appointments of the officers concerned. These applications will be forwarded in duplicate to AGS.

b. AGS will forward applications to AG.

c. When AG covering authority has been obtained this will be notified to the Commandant of the School who will be responsible for notifying the necessary casualties to GHA 2nd Echelon and quoting the AG authority.

Care must be taken, when applications are submitted by the School for AGS authority, to show clearly if any question of promotion is involved in posting an officer and appointing him to a higher grade appointment. e. g. "Capt. A BAKER (54321) BLANKETHE - promoted Major and appointed AG 2nd Echelon 101."

f. Applications will only be submitted by AG School when appointments are AGS and there is no likelihood of subsequent alterations - except in cases of unforeseen emergencies.

NOTIFICATION OF CASUALTIES

5. The Commandant of the School is responsible for notifying casualties to AGS 2nd Echelon, of all officers posted to the AG Pool or attached to the Pool. 173

6. AGS Establishments or units when formed, are responsible for:

a. Notifying GHA 2nd Echelon of casual ties in respect of all officers posted to such establishments or units.

b. Any casualty affecting the promotion or upgrading, bringing on strength and striking off strength of an officer must be notified through AGS channels to the AG of the Army AG or GHA under whom AGS is functioning, in order to obtain covering authority.

In consequence of fresh demands for senior personnel made by the Director of Civil Affairs, and changes in the order of priority of fulfilling the various demands, it has been necessary to re-cast entirely the lists of personnel already prepared and in the hands of the Directorate.

To do this, it is essential that we should bring into the picture all demands made to date to arrive at a gross total of officers involved, since it is obvious that some appointments can only be filled by the promotion of certain of the men already commissioned and who have left the country.

To fill appointments overseas we have been asked for

The 21 for List 1 and the 2 for List 2 have already embarked overseas. The 54 for List 3 were nominated by us to the War Office on the 5th August, but changes must now be made for the following reasons:-

- Commander Willis, who was nominated for Colonel, has found it necessary to withdraw from the scheme.
- Supt. John of Cardiff, who was nominated provisionally as Major subject to confirmation at a later stage of his instruction at Wimbleton, is considered unsuitable for Major.
- The Directorate has now indicated that senior officers required for 'Planning' are to take priority over executive officers for Italy.

We have exhausted our pool of trained personnel and we can only produce the personnel required by using up our present instructing staff and re-shuffling those already selected for other appointments.

The List attached shows all the appointments we are asked to fill, and proposals for filling them. In addition to the personnel required by the Civil Affairs Directorate, we have to provide new instructional staffs for Wimbleton and Peel House. It is proposed to do this as follows:-

Wimbleton:- one police instructor required.

It is proposed to transfer Mr. Holmes to Wimbleton, when the present course at Peel House, where he is now engaged, is completed. He will instruct for one course only at Wimbleton, and will thereafter be replaced by Chief Inspector Shewring, who will take that course as a student, gaining the necessary experience. Mr. Holmes will then be commissioned as a Lieutenant Colonel and will transfer to the Planning Section (COSSAC) for Belgium.

Peel House:- Commandant and one police instructor required.

It is proposed to nominate Commander Willis as Commandant of Peel House in place of Mr. Young for the one remaining course. He will do this in a civilian capacity and at the end of the course will return to his normal duties as Chief Constable of Bedfordshire.

For instructor, we propose to use Chief Inspector Martyn of Lancashire.

Major-General Kirby, in his letter to Sir Frank Newson, suggests that Sir Frank Brook should act as adviser and co-ordinator of the police planning sections and that he should be attached to the Civil Affairs Directorate in a civilian capacity.

Sir Frank Brook agrees that it would serve a useful purpose if he were to act as Police Adviser to the Director in a part-time capacity.

Major-General Kirby also suggests that Commander Willis, after acting as Commandant of the 3rd Peel House course, should co-ordinate the work of the police officers attached to the four country planning sections.

Mr. St. Johnston would continue, as hitherto, to work part-time in a civilian capacity, but the War Office would continue, also as hitherto, to reimburse the Oxfordshire police authority for his travelling and subsistence expenses.

Para 1. Reference paragraphs 14 and 16-2 of our 5973 HAF 250 and our HAF 295 indicating need for some 930 additional officer personnel after allowing for those which will be moved forward from AMDOT SICILY after operation HUSKY, also giving appreciation and making recommendations military government. If proposal is approved, following are provisional details of personnel requirement and are liable to modification.

Para 2. Gross total is divided into following subdivisions as it is contemplated that military government will be organized for regions in order that the territory may be coped with as advance is made up the Boot. There would be extensions of AMDOT SICILY except number 6 and number 7 which would require a new overall organization.
Region 1 - SICILY 210. Region 2 - CALABRIA, LUCANIA, PUGLIA 195.
Region 3 - CAMPANIA 138. Region 4 - ABRUZZI, LAZIO 200. Region 5 - UMBRIA, MARCHES 135. Region 6 - SARDINIA 100. Region 7 - Central Government 417. Total 1,395. Figure 417, region 7 should ultimately be reduced by 42 officers referred to in paragraph 3 below.

Para 3. 195 officer personnel from AMDOT SICILY have been provisionally allocated to region 2 and 42 to AMDOT region 1 and 2 Hq who it is proposed will be responsible for planning for region 2, including operations BUTTERESS and COBLETT. Net total number of fresh personnel to be provided will therefore amount to: Region 1 and 2, nil. Region 3, 138. Region 4, 200. Region 5, 135. Region 6, 100. Region 7, 417.

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Para 4. Following is breakdown of 989 personnel into respective planning staffs and main bodies. Region 1 and 2, nil. Region 3, planning staff 26 - main body 112. Region 4, planning staff 26 - main body 174. Region 5, planning staff 24 - main body, 111. Region 6, planning staff 20 - main body 80. Region 7, planning staff, 98 - main body, 327.

Para 5. Breakdown of total into senior and junior ranks is: Region 1 and 2, nil. Region 3, 7 Colonels, 25 Lt Colonels, 106 junior officers. Region 4, 8 Colonels, 38 Lt Colonels, 154 junior officers. Region 5, 5 Colonels, 19 Lt Colonels, 111 junior officers. Region 6, 2 Colonels, 10 Lt Colonels, 88 junior officers. Region 7, 46 Colonels, 75 Lt Colonels, 296 junior officers. Regional heads with several million persons under their control and principal divisional heads in central administration should have rank of Brigadier General which should facilitate choice of first class men and ensure adequate status. Further CCAO and DCCAO should have the rank Major General. Also percentage of Colonels and Lt Colonels is somewhat higher than in SICILY by reason of the higher responsibility in the central administration. For ranks of Lt Colonels and upwards, propose that overall division should be equal. In order to meet difficulties of finding suitable man power in sufficient numbers we propose that for lower ranks, IE, Majors downward, division should be on basis 66% American, 34% British as under: Senior officers American, 118, British, 117. Junior officers American, 487, British 268. Grand total, American, 620, British, 370.

Para 6. It is apparent to all concerned here that higher calibre staff than hitherto available will be required at head of both technical and administrative fields if a successful military government of so large an area is to be organized. It is suggested that government departments must be prepared to supply senior personnel and key men should be enlisted from industrial and commercial posts. It is felt that the experience such personnel would gain would be of high value either in the event of their transfer from AMEOT to other Theaters, or of the establishment of a Commission of Control over an Italian authority.
