In connection with the transfer of Capt. Randall, now in Sicily, from A.C. to Region 4, there is one point which I should like to make clear. This officer has only recently begun his training with AMFA and it is therefore desirable that he should put in the maximum amount of time on this work before he leaves for the Region.

In order therefore that he may receive as much instruction as possible in the time available he should be allowed to continue with his present duties, after reporting to Capt. Lambert, until such time as Region 4 move forward.

I suggest that Lt. Benson who is travelling to Sicily with Region 4 and who is to replace Capt. Randall should remain with your advance party until such time as Capt. Randall leaves for Region 4, after which he should report to C.F.O. Palermo for AMFA training.

1. It has been represented in JAGM, AC, that the Legal Staff (S) assigned to Region 4 will in fact be quite insufficient to administer the legal side in that Region.

3. In my view, this would be an excellent plan and would provide for better training for legal officers then remaining in Malayan.

1. Your para 2. Approved in principle, subject to amendments as necessary at a later date. Following observations are made:

(a) It cannot yet be accepted that the Nationality of the Brigadier of the Admin Staff (No. 3 Section) should be British.

(b) Director of Utilities Power and Fuel Division was Brit. (British). Consider Director new Sub commission Public Works and Utilities should be Brit. (British) and not Col. as shown.

(c) Nationality of Brigadier Interior cannot yet be finally determined.

(d) The re-allocation of officers by ranks to the new sub commissions is noted; your para 4 also refers. It is not yet clear how far this will be possible when personnel have arrived from U.S. and U.K. on the original Paper No. 5 basis. As soon as possible therefore the following information will be required.

(1) Nominal roll of officer whom it has not been possible to place in the new organization.

(11) List of appointments it has not been found possible to fill with existing or future personnel arriving.

2. Your para 3 (b). On the American side the formation of the new Regt will in itself provide a pool from which officers can be drawn. It only remains to ensure that the Regt is large enough to cover such extra contingencies.

On the British side this proposal will be considered when submitting new VI or the necessary amendments to present W.E.

3. Your para 6. Noted.

4. Your para 7. This has already been taken up with Washington. Experience in Sicily has shown that CAPs are not required to such an extent as CACs, and in fact CAPs are often required to undertake the duties of a CAC.

5. Your para 8. Your suggestions are only approved as a temporary measure. American Officers should receive all possible training by understudy and by actual employment so that the proper ratio between the two nationalities can be achieved at the earliest possible moment. A report is required on this matter periodically.

6. Your para 10 (second half). The responsibility for the provision of staff for the Deputy President of the Allied Commission has not yet been settled. Any

6. Your para 10 (second half). The responsibility for the provision of staff for the Deputy President of the Allied Commission has not yet been settled. Any vacancies that required to be filled by us will necessitate a corresponding increase demand on Washington or London.

Subject: LETTER OF OFFERING FROM U.S.To: M.C.S., A.C.C.From: M.C. School.

The enclosed copy of letter received from J.A.C.S., A.C.C., is forwarded for information. It is a result of an unofficial conversation between Lt. Col. Bradley-Smith, who arrived with the last draft of officers, and D.D.C.A. (P & T) per Office.

If this report is accurate, it appears that some confusion exists. As you are aware, documentation in this school deals only with casualties after and including posting to this school.

The report suggests that the school should deal with relinquishment of any staff appointment held prior to transfer to Civil Affairs and also with posting to a staff appointment on joining the school.

No authority is revealed here for such relinquishment, nor does any staff appointment exist on the holding center to which they can be appointed. The latter difficulty can to some extent be overcome by automatically back-dating all appointments to date of posting to the school, provided that date of activation of region is sufficiently early. In all but a very few cases this will be possible.

If it is proposed to allow officers on the holding center to be regarded as holding staff appointments, presumably this must apply to officers from whatever theatre of operations the cases. In that case, it is suggested that some general authority should be given by M.C., A.C.C., to avoid the necessity of submitting the name of every officer arriving at the school to U.S. for their authority, an arrangement likely to cause delay in getting officers' records up-to-date.

Defective para 3: Ord Rules have no power to re-grant temporary rank at the moment. This will be altered by a GAO shortly to be published.

2. Officers posted from Britain are posted in the rank and staff grade in which they are to be taken on the strength of the M.O. Holding Centre. Such postings are made w.e.f. date of embarkation for Africa. Officers will be taken on the strength of M.O.A.F. in those grades as notified in the list submitted to M.O.S., A.F.H.Q. Subsequent changes of grade on appointment to planning or other staffs will be notified as changes from those grades.

Example.

Major Jones, formerly G.S.O. 3 London District is posted as G.S.O.2 to M.O. Holding Centre and is subsequently appointed G.S.O.1 No. 39 Legion. He assumes rank and pay as G.S.O.2 from date of embarkation and rank and pay as G.S.O.1 from date of new appointment. The second casualty is published as "relinquishes appointment as G.S.O.2 and assumes appointment as G.S.O.1."

N.B. BOTH casualties should appear in Part II Orders published by the competent authority. Until the first is published, the appointment of G.S.O.3 London District cannot be properly filled.

3. All other casualties affecting officers, such as notifications of re-grant of temporary rank etc., must appear in Part II Orders of the competent authority. (N.B. Re-grant of temporary rank is of some importance to officers of the regular army.)

Dear *Rathbone*

1. I have received from Brigadier Dunn nominal rolls of officers who attended the first three courses at the Civil Affairs Staff Centre, with their personal history and gradings, and recommendations (shown in red). I am forwarding these to you on loan as they should be a help in placing those officers who attended the various courses and who are arriving on Friday at TIZI OUZOU.

2. Further points from Brigadier Dunn's letter I am passing on to you as they should serve as a helpful guide.

(a) Some of the officers arriving are technicians, only suitable for employment in their particular line of country. It is of course most important that they be suitably placed, as if they report home that their technical qualifications are not being fully used, it becomes increasingly difficult to get the right kind of people we want.

(b) There are two brothers Findlay in the present draft, one a Brigadier and one a Col. Both are reputed to be outstanding, in particular the former who although rather elderly would run a Region extremely well. I will let you have Gen. Holmes' views on where these officers should be placed as soon as possible.

(c) In order to make up deficiencies one or two officers have been sent who have qualifications for and were previously earmarked for Germany or France. These officers may be a little disgruntled at having been sent out here, and while no promises have been made in London it has been accepted as a matter of policy that if the situation allows for it at a later date some of these officers may be transferred from Italy to other parts of Europe.
