1. As a result of recent re-adjustments and re-organisation certain Staff Branch positions appear to have become redundant. No instructions, however, appear to have been received as to re-assignment of the holders of these positions, and are accordingly requested as soon as possible.

2. Set out below is a list of the officers concerned with notes where relevant.

Major G.S. Franklin. (S)

This officer has been allotted a majors vacancy on H.Q. Admin. Staff of Econ. Admin. Section. He remained as a Rear Link but appears to be involved in the G-4 organisation.

Major K.F. Uhler. (A)

This officer appears to have become surplus to the G-1 branch and is understood to be working in an Executive capacity with the American Regt.

Major C.W.A. Kayser. (H)

Also apparently surplus to G-1 and has no clear position at the moment. Is qualified by legal, Colonial Civil Service experience for the Major (S) vacancy in the Interior, and would like the work. He came out on a legal assignment originally but was required for Staff duties and there is now no legal vacancy. If he is to be retained for Staff duties and Major Franklin is not to fill the position shown on HQ Admin. Staff of Econ. Admin. Section, this position might be suitable.

Major J Bullock. (A)

At present shown against G-4 but appears to be redundant. Is an officer of many years experience, is very capable and hardworking.

Major C.E.H. Allworth (B)

Assigned to Region VIII as a CAO. Has been and is working in G-4 for AMG (P) and also for AC. He is understood to have been earmarked as SCMO in his Region and at present cannot pursue studies either of Italian or of his province.

2. IT IS DESIRABLE THAT INDEX BE ESTABLISHED OF QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFICERS, BOTH BRITISH AND AMERICAN, BY OCCUPATIONAL TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE AND TECHNICAL KNOWLEDGES SUCH AS ACCOUNTING, STATISTICS, LANGUAGES, ETC.

PLANNING DIRECTIVE NO. 7.

1. Scope and Purpose.

This Directive deals solely with the functions and organization of Sub-Commissions, Armistice C.C. (as listed in App. C. to P.D. No. 4) with the provision of personnel for these Sub-Commissions and with other personnel matters. It is issued with direct reference to P.D. No. 3, paras. 5 and 8.

2. References.

References in brackets after paragraph headings are to the relevant previous P.D.s.

Copies of this Directive are sent to Regions for information.
(See P.D. No. 5 para. 1.)

3. Functions of Sub-Commissions. (No. 4. paras 5 and 6., No. 5. para 5.)

(a). Pending a directive from higher authority, the functions of Sub-Commissions will, for planning purposes, be as set out in Apps A to P hereto.

(b). It will be noted that the above Appendices cover all Sub-Commissions except Shipping and Telecommunications, as to which see para. 4 below.

4. Shipping Sub-Commission.

This will consist of Officers of the Joint North African Shipping Board, and will not, for the time being, be represented at the Planning Centre.

Personnel for this Sub-Commission will NOT count against the Paper No. 7 figures.

5. Telecommunications and Posts.

An appendix ("Q") defining the functions of this Sub-Commission will be issued later.

6. Provision of Personnel (No. 4., para 6. and Appx 'C', No. 5. para. 6.)

(a). The Committee constituted under P.D. No. 5., para. 6.,

3. Functions of Sub-Commissions. (No. 4. paras 5 and 6., No. 5. para 7.)

- (a). Pending a directive from higher authority, the functions of Sub-Commissions will, for planning purposes, be as set out in Apps A to P hereto.
- (b). It will be noted that the above Appendices cover all Sub-Commissions except Shipping and Telecommunications, as to which see para. 4 below.

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Personnel for this Sub-Commission will NOT count against the Paper No. 7 figures.

5. Telecommunications and Posts.

An appendix ("X") defining the functions of this Sub-Commission will be issued later.

6. Provision of Personnel (No. 4., para 6. and Appx 'C', No. 5. para. 6.)

(a). The Committee constituted under P.D. No. 5., para. 6., will present their recommendations in the shortest possible time, following the general lines of App. C to P.D. No. 4., and having regard to the functions of Sub-Commissions set out in the Appendix hereto.

(b). An up to date list of personnel on a new pro-forma will then be issued by G.I. (not to Regions), after which the responsibility for maintaining records will rest with Sub-Commissions, vide P.D. No. 4., para 14.

(c). G.I. will report transfers of Officers to the new Sub-Commissions to MOS., AFHQ., and Officers joining the Planning Centre will be assigned on the new basis.

1. Revised Proposals for TO/WE (Officers) for certain portions of the Allied Commission.

Ref Planning Staff, Armistice C.C. letters (2): AC/1006/1 dated 1 Oct and 2 Oct 43.

As a result of further consideration, we have come to the conclusion that certain modifications are required to our proposals above referred to. In brief, these are increases in the Foreign Trade, Public Works & Utilities, Labour, Education & Interior Sub-Commissions of 5, 4, 1, 5 & 1 respectively and decreases in the Property Control & Public Health Sub-Commissions of 3 and 13 respectively. There are also variations in the ranks proposed.

2. Proposals in Detail.

(a) Appx 'A' hereto gives our revised proposals in detail and supersedes Appxs. 'A' and 'C' to AC/1006/1 dated 1 Oct above referred to. Apart from the variations referred to in para. 1 above Appx 'A' differs from the old Appxs. 'A', 'B' and 'C' in the following respects :-

- (1) It shows, in one Appx., officers under the heading British, American and Total, in each rank.

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2. Proposals in Detail.

(a) Appx 'A' hereto gives our revised proposals in detail and supersedes Appxs. 'A' and 'C' to AC/1006/1 dated 1 Oct above referred to. Apart from the variations referred to in para. 1 above Appx 'A' differs from the old Appxs. 'A', 'B' and 'C' in the following respects :-

(i) It shows, in one Appx., officers under the headings British, American and Total, in each rank.

(ii) It shows the Staffs for the H.Q.s of the Economics & Administrative and of the Communications Sections, and for the H.Q.s of the Economics and of the Administrative Directorates, and for the Headquarters Section (hitherto "Military Adm. Staff") separately, instead of combined under "Admin Staff". In other words a complete break has been made with Paper No.7.

(iii) It includes the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission (Political Section) since that Sub-Commission was formed here. The Information Sub-Commission is also shown under the Political instead of the Economics & Adm. Section, in accordance with the recent decision of the C.C.S.

(iv) It includes proposals for the Executive & Secretariat ¹⁸³⁷

(b) Appx 'A' does NOT include the Deputy President, Vice Presidents, Directors, and their personal staffs, nor any proposals for the Military & Political Sections except as noted in (a) (iv) above.

3. Public Works & Utilities Sub-Commission.

It will be observed that there is a considerable preponderance of British Officers in the ~~senior~~ ranks. This is because it has been necessary in this case to draw up the TO/WE in relation to the

Officers actually existing and assigned to this Sub-Commission, or notified as arriving, and earmarked for it. The difficulty cannot be adjusted by transfers since the officers concerned are all highly qualified for Public Works & Utilities but not for other work.

4. Public Health Sub-Commission.

Total numbers have been reduced from 36 to 23. This is on the assumption that the Italian Government Public Health Services will by then have been organized, and that under Armistice conditions the Paper No. 7 figures are in any case needlessly high.

5. Conclusion.

It is most important that early approval or otherwise should be given to these proposals. 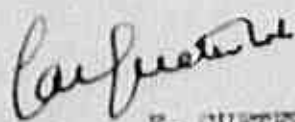

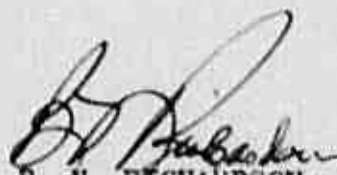

1. Your para 2. Approved in principle, subject to amendments as necessary at a later date. Following observations are made:

(a) It cannot yet be accepted that the Nationality of the Brigadier of the Admin. Staff (No. 3 Section) should be British.

(b) Director of Utilities Power and Fuel Division was Brig. (British). Consider Director new Sub commission Public Works and Utilities should be Brig. (British) and not Col. as shown.

(c) Nationality of Brigadier Interior cannot yet be finally determined.

(d) The re-allocation of officers by ranks to the new sub commissions is noted; your para 4 also refers. It is not yet clear how far this will be possible when personnel have arrived from U.S. and U.K. on the original Paper No. 5 basis. As soon as possible therefore the following information will be required.

(i) Nominal roll of officer whom it has not been possible to place in the new organization.

(ii) List of appointments it has not been found possible to fill with existing or future personnel arriving.

2. Your para 3 (b). On the American side the formation of the new Regt will in itself provide a pool from which officers can be drawn. It only remains to ensure that the Regt is large enough to cover such extra contingencies.

On the British side this proposal will be considered when submitting new ME or the necessary amendments to present M.E.

3. Your para 6. Noted.

4. Your para 7. This has already been taken up with Washington. Experience in Sicily has shown that CAFOs are not required to such an extent as CAOS. and in fact CAFOs are often required to undertake the duties of a CAO.

5. Your para 8. Your suggestions are only approved as a temporary measure. 6. Your para 10 (second half). The responsibility for the provision of staff for the Deputy President of the Allied Commission has not yet been settled. Any vacancie that required to be filled by us will necessitate a corresponding increase demand on Washington or London.

1. A plan for the assignment of existing (and approved) staff has been submitted.

2. At the moment, on the "approved" basis, the Sub-Commission is short of 4 Majors (2A, 2B) and 2 Captains (1A, 1B). One Captain (A) and one Lieutenant (A) are regarded as filling two Major (A) vacancies. Captain L.S. Williams (A) is at present marking time at this Centre; he is earmarked for Region 4 but his transfer to this Sub-Commission would be welcomed. A separate memo has been submitted suggesting that two Ministry of Labour officers, now serving in Malta, be asked for (one to fill a vacancy as an indoors 1st. Lt.)

3. On the British side there has been a marked dearth of candidates for selection and it is unlikely that other than Ministry of Labour Staff will adequately meet the needs of the Sub-Commission it is suggested that approach be made now to the Ministry for the release of two officers to fill Major (B) vacancies. Two junior Second Class officers would meet the case, one of them should, if possible, have Trade Board experience.

B.

5. The allocation already set out can be regarded only as provisional and does not meet minimum requirements. It is appreciated that until the volume of work to be performed can be ascertained the total number of staff cannot be finally assessed. However to ensure that the responsibilities of an adequate Labour Division are provided for it is considered essential that provision be made for the manning of what are regarded as the key positions.

1. The following information regarding the posting of officers from Britain to the M.G. Holding Centre has been given unofficially by D.B.C.A. (P & Trg) War Officer
2. Officers posted from Britain are posted in the rank and staff grade in which they are to be taken on the strength of the M.G. Holding Centre. Such postings are made w.e.f. date of embarkation for Africa. Officers will be taken on the strength of B.M.A.F. in those grades as notified in the list submitted to M.G.S., A.F.M.Q. Subsequent changes of grade on appointment to planning or other staffs will be notified as changes from these grades.

Example.

Major Jones, formerly G.S.O. 3 London District is posted as G.S.O.2 to M.G. Holding Centre and is subsequently appointed G.S.O.1 No. 38 Region. He assumes rank and pay as G.S.O.2 from date of embarkation and rank and pay as G.S.O.1 from date of new appointment. The second casualty is published as "relinquishes appointment as G.S.O.2 and assumes appointment as G.S.O.1."

N.B. BOTH casualties should appear in Part II Orders published by the competent authority. Until the first is published, the appointment of G.S.O.3 London District cannot be properly filled.

3. All other casualties affecting officers, such as notifications of re-grant of temporary rank etc., must appear in Part II Orders of the competent authority. (N.B. Re-grant of temporary rank is of some importance to officers of the regular army.)

1. FOOD DISTRIBUTION SUB-COMMISSION.

In accordance with instructions received on 28 September from Brig. E.A.L. Quarterback, steps have been taken to abolish the Food Distribution and Rationing Sub-Commission constituted under Planning Directive No. 4 para 6. This matter is being dealt with separately in a further Planning Directive.

2. ALLOTMENT OF OFFICERS TO SUB-COMMISSIONS.

The proposed allotment of Officer personnel (on paper) to the new Sub-Commissions from Old Special Divisions has now been completed and is shown in detail and by ranks in the attached Appendices, as follows.

3. TOTAL REQUIREMENTS IN OFFICERS.

It will be appreciated that, although careful estimates have been made in the light of information at present available, the number of officers proposed for each Sub-Commission and in particular, for the H.Q. Administrative Staff is, to a certain extent, guess work, especially until definite information is received as to the higher set-up.

(b) We feel however, that as a safeguard, provision should be made for an additional pool of 16 officers, (not allowing for two Major Generals) in order to allow for the number of personnel of any Sub-Commission being found unduly small. This, we consider, will give sufficient officers for Sections 2.3 and 4 (including Section H.Q. but no higher) and for the Military Internal Admin Staff which, it was agreed by Brig. Gusterbock, should be outside the Sections, on the staff of the Vice

President.

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4. The officers for the new Sub-Commissions have been found from existing Sub-Commissions as follows:-

- (a) 3 Officers from Finance Sub-Commission in agreement with Brig. Hamlyn.
- (b) 3 Officers from Public Safety Sub-Commission. Col. Young considers that in the present circumstances, the Public Safety Sub-Commission will require no more than 27 Officers.

(c) 5 Officers from Labour. It is thought that a total of 10 Officers for Labour Sub-Commission will be sufficient.

(d) 5 Officers from Information Sub-Commission.

(e) 2 Officers from Education & Fine Arts Sub-Commission.

(f) 1 Officer from Agriculture Sub-Commission.

These 25 Officers have been re-allocated as follows:-

- (a) 10 to Foreign Trade Sub-Commission.
- (b) 3 to Industry & Commerce Sub-Commission
- (c) 5 to Fuel, Telecommunications, Transportation, Public Works & Utilities in addition to the original allotment to Transportation & Communication and Utilities, Power & Fuel.

5. GENERAL QUESTIONS - OFFICER PERSONNEL.

We consider it opportune at this juncture to raise certain general questions regarding Officer personnel as at present authorized for Armistice O.C. in Paper No. 7. These are discussed in paras 6 to 9 below.

6. LIEUTENANTS, NATIONAL R.Q. ADMIN STAFF.

10 of these are provided by Paper No. 7. It is pointed out that it is very rare on the British side and almost unknown on the American, to find Officers of the rank of Lieut. with the requisite military background and temperament to make them

5. GENERAL QUESTION - OFFICER PERSONNEL.

We consider it opportune at this juncture to raise certain general questions regarding Officer personnel as at present authorised for Armistice C.O. in Paper

No. 7. These are discussed in paras 6 to 9 below.

6. LIEUTENANTS, NATIONAL H.Q. ADMIN STAFF.

10 of these are provided by Paper No. 7. It is pointed out that it is very rare on the British side and almost unknown on the American, to find Officers of the rank of Lieut. with the requisite military background and temperament to make them suitable for staff employment, and it will therefore be impossible to fill all these vacancies with suitable officers. It is therefore requested that the authorised numbers of junior officers should be in terms of "Captains or Lieutenants", as is sometimes done in War Establishments. This would actually enable all the vacancies to be filled by Captains, but we should certainly not do this automatically - if mid-level Lieuts. are forthcoming, they will be posted in that rank.

7. AMERICAN C.A.P.Os.

(a) You have already been apprised of this situation by telephone (Col. Albright - Lt. Col. Parkman speaking). Apparently the U.S. authorities are not ^{releasing} or any rate have not, up to date, released trained police officers in anything approaching

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the requisite numbers.

- (b) Officers who have arrived provisionally earmarked by Washington "C.A.P.O." are officers whose sole qualifications for police work have been a course at Fort Custer and a period of service (extremely brief in most cases) with the Corps of Military Police. The result has been that the Interview Board has, on the advice of the Chief of Public Safety, assigned such officers as C.A.Os. and not as C.A.P.Os.
- (c) This in turn will mean that Junior American Officers of the C.A.O. type, arriving in the future, will be displaceable, since nearly all such appointments will have been filled by officers designated by Washington as C.A.P.Os. It is therefore requested that urgent steps be taken to stop the flow of C.A.Os. and provide police-trained C.A.P.Os. as a matter of urgency.

8. AMERICAN STAFF OFFICERS.

As already stated (para 6) there is a great dearth of American Officers with sufficient Military knowledge and background to qualify them for positions on the H.Q. Staff of Armistice C.C. or of Regions. This is only natural, having regard to the comparatively shorter period during which the U.S. have been at war. Authority is therefore requested to post, if and where the necessity arises, British Officers in such vacancies provided the total authorized number of British and American Officers in each rank is not disturbed in the Region or Armistice C.C.

9. SENIOR OFFICERS.

8. AMERICAN STAFF OFFICERS.

9. SENIOR OFFICERS.

The following senior officers have not yet reported, and it is requested that their arrival be expedited as a matter of urgency. It will be appreciated that not only are assignments rendered difficult, but good planning and organization are delayed and impaired in the absence of a responsible head.

A list of the officers in question is attached at Appendix D.

10. Your approval is requested to the action being taken under para. 8 above. The earliest possible information of any change in the total authorized personnel, and a definition of the "upward limit" - i.e. the vacancies which this Planning Staff is responsible for filling would be appreciated.

11. As regards the paras. 6 - 9 you will realize that the situation is presented as it is at the date of this letter. i.e. up to draft on MAP 24. The total number of officers still required to complete up to Regions 8 and 9 and Armistice C.C. as at the date of this letter is shown overleaf.
