1. Attached are the proposed War Establishments for
 - (a) Allied Military Government Tactical Headquarters
 - (b) Two amendments to War Establish of Allied Military Government of Occupied Territory (SICILY) - Appendix "G" to JEC Meeting No. 27 refer.

It would be appreciated if these Establishments could come before the War Establishment Committee at the earliest opportunity, if possible, at the next meeting on 28 October, since it is urgent that authorisation of 1(a) be obtained with minimum delay.

AMG Tactical Headquarters.

2. This establishment comprises three separate sections as follows:

- (a) HQ AMG 15 Army Group
- (b) HQ AMG 8 Army
- (c) HQ AMG 5 Army

These AMG Headquarters are all mobile AMG elements to accompany the respective Army Group or Army Headquarters where ever they may be operating. This organisation has been prepared on the recommendation and with the approval of the G.O.C. 15 Army Group. The remainder of AMG is organised on a Regional basis. Personnel of the various AMG Regions will be placed under command of HQ AMG 15 Army Group during the tactical phase of operations. As the tactical phase of operations moves North in Italy these Regions will cease to be under command HQ AMG 15 Army Group and come under command of Headquarters Allied Commission and personnel of other Regions further North will be placed under command HQ AMG 15 Army Group.

3. The corresponding American T.O. is approximately equal in numbers to that of the British Section of HQ AMG 15 Army Group and HQ AMG 8 Army, and about twice the strength of the British Section of HQ AMG 5 Army.

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4. It is requested that authority be given to ante date these establishments to 9 October, which is the date on which this organisation started to function in the field.

5. The establishment does not increase present AMG commitments in personnel. The majority of personnel for this establishment has been found from AMGOT (SICILY) who now requires considerably less personnel for AMG than during the operational phase in that island.

6. In order to give greater flexibility it is proposed to amalgamate all AMG War Establishments into two WE's as follows:

- (a) AMG Tactical Headquarters, as attached
- (b) One WE to cover Allied Commission, All Regions, and an Administrative HQ to co-ordinate the requirements of the Allied Commission and Regions. This will be submitted as soon as possible.

7. This re-organisation will involve the cancellation of all existing AMG Establishments including AMGOT (SICILY).

Amendments to War Establishment of AMGOT (SICILY)

8. These amendments, from the dates shown are required in order to cover

- (a) GSOI for AMFA (Allied Military Financial Agencies) which were overlooked when the original WE was prepared.
- (b) GSOI (Royal Signals) for Communications Division, made necessary when AMG took over a larger responsibilities for local communication when the tactical forces moved to the mainland of Italy.

MEMORANDUM TO : Military Government Section.

SUBJECT : Establishment - Allied Commission

Reference conversation General Holmes - Brigadier Strong.

1. When the Allied Commission is set up in Italy it will require to have an Intelligence Section as an integral part of its organization to supply both the needs of the Commission and to collect and distribute information accessible to or obtained by the Commission but required by other agencies.

2. To achieve this it is suggested that the organization should consist of a Secretariat (Intelligence) with a small inter service, inter allied staff. A total of six officers with appropriate office staff is suggested. So long as A.P.H.Q. is in being, this organization, although serving the needs of the Commission, should be affiliated to the J.I.C. (Algiers), a joint inter-service, inter allied committee which, under the chairmanship of the A. C. of S., G-2, co-ordinates Intelligence in the A.P.H.Q. Area and should operate under the general instructions of J.I.C. (Algiers).

3. It is also anticipated that certain interrogating personnel will be required. This personnel will be found from the C.S.D.I.C. which co-ordinates all interrogation in this theatre. As, however, the War Establishment of C.S.D.I.C. will not be numerically sufficient to carry these officers it is requested that when proposing the War Establishment and that of the Commission, provision for both the Intelligence Secretariat and the interrogators is made by you in the proposal.

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2. To achieve this it is suggested that the organization should consist of a Secretariat (Intelligence) with a small inter service, inter allied staff. A total of six officers with appropriate office staff is suggested. So long as A.F.H.Q. is in being, this organization, although serving the needs of the Commission, should be affiliated to the J.I.C. (Algiers), a joint inter-service, inter allied committee which, under the chairmanship of the A. C. of S., co-ordinates intelligence in the A.F.H.Q. Area and should operate under the general instructions of J.I.C. (Algiers).

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Intelligence Secretariat and the interrogators is made by you in the proposal.

4. Owing to the acute shortage of Italian speaking Officers, it would be appreciated if the maximum possible warning could be given of your exact requirements.

Pursuant to the conference held on 21 October 1943 at H G S and Gen. Holme's directive there at, it has been necessary to further revise the TO/WE for the Allied Commission, by a reduction of officer personnel in many Sub-Commissions to conform to the overall total of officers available from the U.S.A. and U.K.

2. Appendix 'A' hereto gives the revised proposals in detail and supersedes all previous TO/WE. The overall strength of 379 officers includes 8 officers for the MILITARY SECTION. Allowing for this, the final figure will be 371 officers.

4. Public Health Sub-Commission.

Total numbers have been reduced from 36 to 23. This is on the assumption that the Italian Government Public Health Services will by then have been organized, and that under Armistice conditions the Paper No. 7 figures are in any case needlessly high.

5. Conclusion.

It is most important that early approval or otherwise should be given to these proposals. Without a reasonably firm basis on which to work, it is impossible to assign new arrivals to the best advantage or to maintain proper records. Your very early instructions are therefore requested. Meanwhile, assignments will be made on the new basis, and this TO/EE should be forwarded to Brig. Gen. McSherry at once as a provisional basis for reorganization of H.Q., A.M.G.

Experience in Sicily has shown that original estimates for EM/OR personnel for AMG and Armistice C. C. units were decidedly on the low side. This was particularly the case in respect of clerks. New estimates have now been made and the attached table shows the basis on which new demands have been made on Washington and London for the provision of personnel. These tables are for your information and no action should be taken by you until it is known whether these figures are accepted in principle.

It will be noted that Regions 1 and 2 are based on final Armistice C. C. level and all other Regions on AMG level. The number of vehicles it is proposed to allot to Armistice C. C. Headquarters have also been considerably reduced with a consequent reduction in personnel.

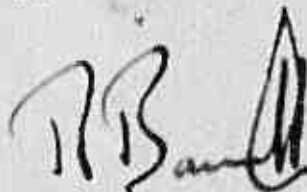

Reference the visit of Major Knighton to this office on 27 Sept.

1. This office memorandum of 2nd Sept. addressed to G-1 (Bn) a copy of which is understood to be in your possession, was based on providing other ranks for units in the process of forming to cover the following:

<u>Unit</u>	<u>Remarks</u>
Region 3	For military Government in Campania
Region 4	For military Government in Lazio and Abruzzi
Region 5	For military Government in Umbria and Marches.
Region 6	For military Government in Sardinia.
Armistice Control Commission H.Q.	To carry out the terms of reference to the Armistice. Commission for Italy at the seat of government.

2. These demands were first formulated early in August before any lessons from actual experience in Sicily were available, and were cabled to War Office in our cable 2137 of 16 Aug.

3. Experience in Sicily has shown that these estimates have been entirely inadequate.

(a) 202 clerks were asked for. This works out at about 0.6 clerks per officer. Experience has shown that this must be raised and increased estimates have been made which bring the figure up to about 1.1 clerks per officer.

(b) One of the major lessons from Sicily was that AMG must be adequately supplied with its own transport if it is to carry out its role with any efficiency. Increase in transport entail a corresponding increase of drivers and the necessary technical and supervisory grades.

(c) Although, it is often possible for AMG to obtain assistance from field force units for attachment for messing purposes etc., nevertheless all AMG units must be prepared to function as self contained units. Military guards are a vital necessity, for general security reasons and also because AMG handles a very large amount of money which must be safeguarded. These reasons lead to an increase in the number of general duty personnel required.

- 2 -

4. In addition to the increases mentioned in para 3 above, further increases are required to cover Region 8 and Region 9 (N.B. Region 7 does not in fact exist) for which plans are now being formulated. Region 8 covers Toscana and Region 9 Emilia.

5. To compensate for the above increases, reductions are being effected as follows:-

(a) AMGOT Sicily has an authorized establishment of 379 other ranks. This establishment is adequate to cover new Region 1 (Sicily), Region 2 (Calabria, Lucania, Appulia) and AMG Hq which is the AMG Headquarters which will accompany 15 Army Group and be responsible for Military Government of Regions in the tactical phase of military operations. Regions 1 and 2 are "Thinned" out to Armistice Control level as opposed to Military Government level, and a small saving is effected here and made available for other Regions.

(b) Region 6 (Sardinia) is missing out the Military Government phase, and will operate in the first instance under Armistice Control Conditions, thus saving a number of other ranks.

6. It is envisaged that this demand will cover present commitments and also later commitments in the North of Italy. This entirely depends on how soon Region 3, 4, 5, and later 8, and 9 can be turned over from the military Government phase to the Armistice Control phase. This again depends on the following:-

- (a) progress of present military operations.
- (b) extent of damage in areas where heavy fighting takes place, and amount of dislocation caused.
- (c) ability of Italian Government to administrate liberated territory.

7. Net increased requirements in excess of those contained in our memorandum of 2nd Sept. referred to above and with reference to paras 3, 4, and 5 of this letter are 342 other Ranks. These are split as follows:

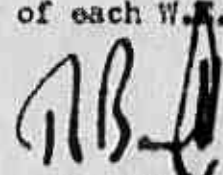

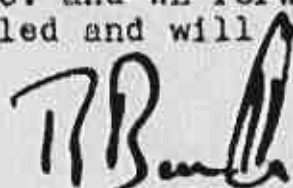

1. Under the proposed Officer personnel Region VI, and the allocation regarding functions, a total of 2 Legal Officers (The Chief Legal Officer and an Assistant) are provided. I understand that there is a possibility that a third may be allowed. The purpose of this memorandum is to comment upon the inadequacy of this personnel (even should the third officer be approved) for the duties and requirements of the Legal Section in the Civil Administration of Sardinia. The considerations herein mentioned pertain it is believed to the entire period of military occupation with its accompanying Civil Affairs administration but they apply with especial force to the initial phases.

It is hardly necessary to invite attention to the obvious fact that innumerable phases of Civil Affairs which have no direct relation to legal affairs of necessity not only pass through the legal section but require its serious consideration, study, advise and in cases decision. This self evident situation needs only passing mention. Neither need more than such mention be made of the many details attendant upon the initial, landing which must be handled solely by the Legal Section, with its officer personnel of 3, assuming the addition of the third officer.

These matters are now unpredictable in their scope and variety other that it must be recognised that they will arise and will require disposition. The certain matter which will at once confront the legal section is that of the Military Courts. Innumerable violations of many of the mandates of the proclamations will ensue following their posting. This must inevitably occur in the case of a people different in race, nature and tongue from the occupying force. The violations will be both minor and grave but they will surely be numerous and their handling will be the work of the Military Courts and the Legal Section. The regulations provide for the examination of the record of all cases by the Chief Legal Officer so that he is at once disqualified from any participation in the cases either as prosecutor or judge. This leaves but 2 officers (Still assuming a total of three) for the entire Region. The region includes one province of 500,000 population and 2 others of 500,000 between them. This will require a minimum of three cities or towns in which courts will function continuously, at the start at least. The practical impossibility of discharging this legal function alone with the personnel allowed must be self evident.

One other matter closely allied to the subject of Military Courts should be mentioned, that of jails and prisoners as we shall find them. The jails may be overloaded with no room left for those who will be sentenced by our courts. There will probably also be an extensive immediate job to do in the way of classifying for release or paroles occupants of the jails who may be there for political considerations alone or who may have been awaiting for long periods, trials not destined ever to occur, or for special reasons applicable to particular cases.

Memorandum

1. The undersigned Legal Section will be charged with responsibility here. The following alternative suggestions are proposed.

(a) That an earnest effort be made to procure an increase of officer personnel for the Legal Section from 2 to 9. (I am told that an allocation of 30 was made for the Sicilian invasion although only 24 actually functioned at any one time and that this proved to be very inadequate)

(b) That the increase proposed in (a) be procured at least for the first phase of the occupation, after which some could be released. The first phase will obviously be the most demanding ²⁰⁰⁰

(c) In the event that neither (a) nor (b) is possible of accomplishment a selection for Civil Affairs Officers of persons who are actually lawyers or who have had legal education or experience. This will help somewhat although it will by no means solve the situation.

2. The foregoing memorandum and recommendations have been prepared after conference with Col. Upjohn presently head of the Legal Section, National Headquarters, and Lieut. Col. Chandler Chief Legal Officer, Angot Headquarters who have authorized me to say that they are in agreement with the recommendations.

WAR ESTABLISHMENTS REGION VI.

1. I append a copy of what I consider should be the MINIMUM establishment for Region VI. The total of officers is 17 up on the provisional number shown in M. G. S. paper No. 7. The reasons are:-

It is therefore necessary to reallocate now the existing personnel to include Regions VIII and IX or assume that new Headquarters Companies will be formed at a later date from transferred personnel or new personnel.
