1. Your memorandum of 21 October 1943 proposes delivering to Colonel Rooney 1,300 million lire in as much as he has been virtually promised 2,000 million before going over to AM lire payments, plus 800 million lire a month thereafter.
2. In para 2 (b) of my letter of 18th October, 1943 (AC/1011/5) I outlined my reason for feeling that an additional 800 million lire at this time would take care of Col. Rooney's needs in view of Lt. Col. Marden's statement that the shift to AM lire would not begin November 1. However, if in fact Col. Rooney began large AM lire disbursements in October, I see no serious objection to your proposal to provide him with an additional 1,300 million lire now. I suggest, however, that no further commitments be made to Col. Rooney until I arrive in Palermo and we have an opportunity to go over our estimates together.
3. Paragraph 4 of your memorandum of 21 October indicates that an additional 900 million will be needed for the redemption of SMA's in Sicily by Colonel Rooney but that the amounts you had planned to give him would cover this operation on the mainland. I do not consider it desirable under the present circumstances to require Army personnel to turn in SMA's in exchange for lire, although I would have no objection to exchange being made on the Italian mainland and elsewhere on a voluntary basis such as is done by the U.S. Army Finance Officers, providing AM lire for such purpose, if not excessive in amount.

CURRENCY IN SARDINIA

Received 25 Oct. 43

Commander Spears of the U.S. Naval Base at CAGLIARI, who was in Palermo today, told us the following:

1. No Proclamation dealing with currency has yet been posted in Sardinia.
2. Consequently the public, with rare exceptions, refuses to take AM Lire.
3. The public are willing to take yellow seal dollars at 19 lire per dollar, and usually hoard them at that rate.
4. His men were reluctant to part with dollars at that rate, but had done so in some cases where they had no other way of getting money to spend.
5. He had heard of no quarrels between U.S. personnel and civilians over exchange matters.
6. However, he understood that considerable numbers of American Army troops were now on the way, and did not know what would happen when they arrived.

We gave Cmdr. Spears, through Lt. (JG) Hunt, L.30,000 in Metropolitan lire to go on with. He said that this would be enough for the current needs of his small party.

It seems to me that the time has now come when the Badoglio Proclamation ought to be posted even if it is considered imperfect. The King can doubtless be ~~IMMEDIATE~~ induced to sign a revised Proclamation, if that is thought necessary, and this revised Proclamation can then be published later. But it seems difficult to justify a delay of such length in posting any Proclamation at all. *30/10*

(Reference your 940 of 18th October) If the Italian government does make payments, their resumption in occupied territory seems indicated, provided machinery for purpose can be reestablished without undue difficulty. As to servicing of national debt, question is being passed to CCS. Arrangement of 15th December maturities ~~taxes and expenses~~ and other major questions concerning public credit presumably will have to await contact of Allied Commission with Italian government.

SUBJECT : Finance of Sardinian Coal Mines.

TO : Military Government Section, AFHQ.  
for Brigadier Keenig.

1. Lt. Col. Keenig of Regional Allied Commission to Sardinia called here yesterday and asked for L. 50 million to finance requirements of Sardinian coal-mines for purposes including inter alia:

- (a) Payment in Sardinia of running expenses pending time when mines can collect payment for coal sold in Sicily and on mainland.
- (b) Payments on mainland, e.g. for pit props from CRYONE.
- (c) Payments subsisting Italy with insurance and freight on cost shipped purchase of material and machinery in North Africa and U.S.A.
2. Have told Keenig that AMFA will split L. 50 million to Regional Allied Commission in Sardinia herewith (these are the L. 50 million requested by your cable 62533 of 12 Oct.) plus further L. 250 million after ship NY 349 comes in. Have added the following proposals are subject to approval of Lt. Col. Waters, Brig. Boulinier and yourself.
3. Keenig should obtain now L. 50 million from Commission and hold this money for purposes of coal-mines as Sub-accountant to Commission, who will account to AMFA Palermo for expenditure of all money received by Commission.
4. Keenig should advance lire to mines as required, obtaining their receipt on Form P/12 in such way as to make clear that debt to AMFA or mines as Italian State Institution is recognized on each occasion.
5. He should cover expenditure on mainland for time being by sending actual notes in custody of mine official who is going to CRYONE in any case to arrange shipment of pit-props to Sardinia. Later AMFA hopes to provide facilities for delivery of lire for such purposes from AMFA in Region 2, if required.
6. He should NOT attempt to pay dollars or other external currency for any purpose, but should wait instructions from you as to how much 300,000 outside Italy will be effected.
7. He should NOT expect to make or receive cash payment for any transactions with Allied Armed Forces, but should confine himself to recording quantities of goods delivered or received.
8. Keenig has seen Chief Accountant here and received preliminary instructions in use of accounting forms.
9. It has expressed himself satisfied that foregoing arrangements will enable him to start operating Sardinian mines.

2. Have told Keenig that AMPA will mail L.50 million to Regional Allied Commission in Sardinia forthwith. (Lines 2-3) The L. 50 million requested by cable 62535 of 12 Octo. plus further L. 250 million after ship NY 349 comes in. Have added the following proposals are subject to approval of Lt. Col. Water, Brig. Bouleauis and yourself.

2. Keenig should obtain now L.50 million from Commission and hold this money for purposes of coal-mines as Sub-accountant to Commission, who will account to AMPA Palermo for expenditure of all moneys received by commission.

3. Keenig should advance lire to aims as required, obtaining their receipt on Form 2/12 in such way as to make clear that debt to AMPA of mire as Italian State institution is recognized on each occasion.

4. He should cover expenditure on mainland for time being by sending actual notes in custody of mine official who is going to Sardinia in any case to arrange shipment of pit-yards to Sardinia. Later AMPA hopes to provided facilities for delivery of lire for such purposes from AMPA in Region 2, if required.

5. He should NOT attempt to pay dollars or other external currency for any purpose, but should wait instructions from you as to how much ~~300,000~~ outside Italy will be effected.

6. He should NOT expect to make or receive cash payment for any transactions with Allied And Forces, but should confine himself to recording quantities of goods delivered or received.

8. Keenig has seen Chief Accountant here and received preliminary instructions in use of accounting forms.

9. He has expressed himself satisfied that foregoing arrangements will enable him to start operating Sardinian mines.

10. Cols. Foley and Bernstein have seen this and agree.

Island Base Section here think Ship NY 349 ex convoy UGS 19 carrying 2,000 boxes AM Lire weighing 82 tons has been diverted to PARI or possibly some other port (name indecipherable - may be ORAN). Request you depute Bennett, Anderson or other suitable officer to locate ship, deliver 1,300 million Lire to Rooney at Taranto in denominations ascertained from him and then supervise reshipment of balance to Palermo if this is practicable. 1,400 boxes are marked 1492 - U - AMG - FIN and 600 are marked 1492 - W - D - FIN. Roman numerals should be stencilled on outside of each box indicating denomination of notes which it contains. Conducting officer on ship should have detailed list of contents which should be sent to AMFA Palermo. AMFA Palermo can provide one box of thousands and fifteen boxes of five hundreds in addition to what are on ship in order to make up 1,300 million in denominations required by Rooney.

It is requested that the following be transmitted to the appropriate French authority (Commissariat aux Finances)

"With reference to the question of the disposition of the French francs possessed by Italians now being repatriated from Corsica, the Combined Chiefs of Staff in Washington propose the following procedure:-

That in Sardinia the Italian authorities should arrange to exchange the francs for the same amount of lira currency as the troops would have been entitled to prior to repatriation had they then received lira instead of francs. Appropriate arrangements should be made so that disposition of the francs thus acquired by the Italian authorities will be the subject of subsequent negotiation and settlement.

This Section AFHQ will be pleased to discuss this matter with you should you have any views you would care to express at this time on this situation. The Combined Chiefs of Staff stipulated that the use of a particular franc-lira rate of exchange in this settlement would not, of course, be taken as sanctioning for any other purposes any rates of exchange other than the official dollar-lire and pound lire rates decreed by the Allied Military Authorities, with which, presumably, the franc-lira cross rate has been brought into conformity.

Perhaps you would be so kind as to indicate your agreement."

PRESENT: Brigadier Hamlyn,  
Lt. Col. Marden (representing Brigadier Brickman),  
Lt. Cdr. Southard.

1. Brigadier Hamlyn asked Col. Marden if Brigadier Brickman had indicated whether he had any money problems he wished to put to AFPA. Col. Marden replied that Brigadier Brickman had left word that he was planning to go onto AM lire in the Central Mediterranean Theater on 1 November, provided he could accumulate enough lire by then and had reasonable assurance that his needs could be met in the future.

2. In response to Brigadier Hamlyn's question, Col. Marden explained that the estimates of currency needs of the British Armies in the Sicilian-Italian Theater are as follows:

£5,250,000 (or 1,500 million lire) for October.  
£3,500,000 (or 1,400 million lire) for November.  
£5,700,000 (or 1,550 million lire) for December,  
excluding the S.A. in the E.W.

3. Brigadier Hamlyn and Lt. Cdr. Southard then suggested the following as being a reasonable basis for meeting Brigadier Brickman's needs: During November and December the needs would be about 3,000 million. To meet this, the Paymaster's already have about 1,600 million. Another 800 million will be earmarked at Palermo for them, during October, making a total of 2,400 million available by November 1, against needs of 1,400 million. During November another 1,000 million will be made available, making a total of about 2,000 million available at the end of November. This would cover the 1,500 million needed for December, etc. would also meet the maximum estimate of 2000 million held by Brigadier Brickman, to be a possible need.

4. Col. Marden agreed that there would be an adequate basis on which to proceed.

Wing, 5. For the time being, the proposed note register of arms should continue to be kept at Sierra. A note register will be kept in Algiers covering the notes received and stored there. In addition a record will be kept at Port Qayouf of the movement of shipments from the time that under this plan they are cleared into one or another A.D.L. note register.

Letter referred to in message 291 of 25 October from A.D.L. Radio Co.

This message was referred to A.D.L. Wing and has subsequently resolved A.D.L. Three points in it immediately concern A.D.L.

(a) Section 3 reports that the first two financing officers have an immediate supply of arms for Algiers, but will need 700 million lire in November, making allowances for an eventual replacement. Colonel Sims, D.G., Army Finance Officer at A.D.L., is requesting the Under Finance Officer within the next forty days to verify this figure, indicating what denominations are needed and when. This information it will be possible to furnish when A.D.L. should supply the fifth A.D.L. force Valence or Algiers. If the bulk ~~of~~ the 700 million can be supplied in four sets, A.D.L. would demand it.

(b) Section 3 also reports that British paymasters require an additional 20 million in 30 days, which has been referred to the Command Paymaster in Taranto. In the absence of information to the contrary, it is assumed that this amount is included in Colonel ~~one's~~ estimates and consequently can be taken care of as proposed in my letter of 19th October, 1943, to A.D.L.

(c) With reference to previous instructions concerning use of

Area. 1 - 4. A few boxes of the three shipments to which  
in Algers, car is the box that yet remains. A full amount of  
the shipments and the box lines will be established to Almeria,  
as soon as the final boxes arrive.

Area. 5. For the time being, the principal port register  
of AFM should continue to be kept at Algiers. A more register will

addition a record will be kept at MI6 Bureau of the movement of  
shipments from the time they enter this theater until they are cleared  
into one or another AFM note despository.

2. Matters raised in message 234 of 15 October from MI6 Reg.:

This message was reported to AFM, Algiers and has presumably  
reached AFM. These points in it immediately concern AFM:

- (a) Region 3 reports that the MI6, now Missionary officers  
have an adequate supply of lire for October, but will need 700  
million lire in November, making allowance for an urgent requirement.  
Colonel Sime, U.S. Army Chief Finance Officer to AFM, is requesting  
his Chief Finance Officer with the 1st Army to verify this figure,  
indictating what denomination lire needed and when. On receipt of  
this information it will be possible to advise whether AFM should  
supply the 700 million lire to Almeria. If the bulk  
700 million can be supplied in 1000 and 100 lire, AFM can handle it.
- (b) Region 3 also reports that British Missionaries require an

  2. This message is for Finance action, rather than MGS, but it raises an issue which has already been faced on a small scale by AMFA in Sicily and will probably arise on a larger scale in Italy. Consequently the following message to CCS is proposed:

From: AFHQ (MGS)  
TO: AGWAR for CCS

Cases beginning to rise of bona fide refugees from France wishing to exchange Bank of France notes in territory covered by AMFA. Is it agreeable to you for AMFA to make such exchanges in reasonable amounts? If so, what limit should be set and, in view of statement in paragraph 3 of your 146 of 15 October, is exchange rate to be 2 lire for 1 franc?

1. The Chief Financial Officer of the Allied Commission was informed on 19th October, at a meeting in Major General Gale's office and at a subsequent meeting with Brigadier Dunlop, that it is proposed by officers of the British Army presently at Bari to enter into a contract with an oil refinery (A.M.I.C.) for storage facilities, and that an advance equivalent to 1,600,000 lire is urgently needed.

2. The Chief Financial Officer stated that he preferred to defer discussion of entering into a contract with a firm in unoccupied territory and he also stated that he was not entirely familiar with the policy with reference to requisitioning which was to be followed in either occupied or unoccupied Italian territory now that Italy has been accorded the status of co-belligerent. He agreed, in the meantime, to propose to the responsible officials of AFPA the making of an emergency advance of 1,000,000. An appropriate cable was drafted and handed to MSG for approval.

3. The contract with A.M.I.C. which is under consideration may be taken as typical of a large number which may be drafted if the Allied Commission or the Armies use this method of obtaining from Italian enterprises and individuals in unoccupied Italy the performance of services and delivery of goods required for the Allied war effort or by the Allied Commission. The considerations of costs, rates of compensation, and other terms which the drafting of such contracts will involve will require the Allied Commission greatly to increase its legal and accounting staffs, to employ the services of Italian lawyers, and so on. This method of operation may also give rise to a great amount of litigation with the extremely undesirable consequence that someone on behalf of the Allied Commission might find himself as a plaintiff or even a defendant in the Italian Courts.

4. It is suggested that the whole policy of Allied Commission be revised in the Armistice terms is not to enter into a series of individual contracts but to obtain the material and such other supplies and services as may be required by the method of ordering the Italian Government to produce them. This is suggested that resort be had to appropriate provisions of the Armistice terms, by which the Italian Government may be required to provide the Allied Forces with supplies and facilities. In particular, Article 21 (5) provides that the Italian authorities "will make available Italian territory all transport facilities required by the Allied Nations, ... and will comply with instructions issued by the Allied Commandant-in-Chief" regarding the use and control of cities, ports, inland transport systems, vehicles, intercommunication systems, power stations and public utility services, oil refineries, stocks and such other fuel and related supplies and means of producing same, as United Nations may specify.

It is suggested that the whole policy of Allied Commission be centralized in the Armistice terms is not to enter into a series of individual contracts but to obtain its material and such other supplies and services as may be required by the method of ordering the Italian Government to produce them. This it is suggested that resort be had to appropriate provisions of the Armistice Terms, by which the Italian Government may be required to provide the Allied Forces with supplies and facilities. In particular, Article 21 (c) provides that the Italian authorities "will move available in Italy occupied Italian territory all transport facilities required by the United Nations, ... and will comply with instructions issued by the Allied Commander-in-Chief regarding the use of ports, harbors, docks, railroads, inland transport systems, power stations and public utility services, oil refineries, stocks and such other fuel and power supplies and means of producing same, as United Nations may specify, together with complete repair and construction facilities." Thus in the present case there seems no difficulty in ordering the Italian Government to make arrangements with AFHQ for the storage of the required amount of oil and for the refining of the oil to be brought ~~over~~ to it and this is primarily a matter for attention by the Industry & Commerce Sub-Commission. The Italian Government carries out these tasks, however, by requisition contract, i.e., the cost of "United" Commission, will reflect the Italian authorities' contribution to the Allied Commission's contractual arrangements.

5. Under this procedure the Italian Government would be concerned in firm's all questions of finance. The Allied Commission would be concerned in these matters primarily only: (a) in the course of its scrutiny of the Italian budget and current expenditures and (b) to the extent that it may be necessary needed by the Italian Government.

1. Cable 98 from FAIR indicating that Francs are being ordered to be turned in by Italian troops before leaving CORSICA substantially covers enquiry in your 9/38 of 9 October. If substantial amounts of French Francs are nevertheless brought into SARDINIA by Italian forces, advise this Headquarters and await instructions before taking action. For your information matter is being discussed with CCS and with French Authorities in ALGIERS and we have recommended to CCS that any French Francs brought into SARDINIA by Italian troops should be withdrawn by Italian Authorities in exchange for Italian or A M Lira at rate of exchange at which Italian troops were paid in French Francs and leave for later adjustment between French and Italians the disposal of such Francs. French Officials here state that French have always used prewar official rate of 2.22 Francs to Lira whereas Italians have used a rate of approximately 2.70 to 3 Francs to Lira in paying Italian personnel in French areas for part of their pay. We are awaiting views of CCS on forgoing. Kindly furnish us from time to time information as to French Francs being brought into SARDINIA by Italian troops.

2. Col. Clairborne of AMFA should arrive your Headquarters shortly and you should discuss your currency requirements and other financial problems with him. We are cabling PALERMO to send you Fifty Million (50,000,000) Lira immediately. You should arrange with CLAIBORNE and MATHERS to keep Head Office of AMFA informed as to ~~how~~ distribution of funds so that AMFA can make proper records and can advise CCS through us appropriately.

3. Require General BASSO to order publication of King of ITALY'S Currency Proclamation showing King signing as King of ITALY and nothing else. Kings ALBANIAN and ETHIOPIAN titles must be omitted. Reference your cable 426 of 8th October, understand that answers are as follows:

1. AMG Proclamations 3 and 12 were posted within a few days of arrival of Allied troops everywhere except in Sardinia and four provinces of Apulia under Badoglio government.

2. Public in four provinces of Apulia under Badoglio is aware of Badoglio decree making AM lire, AMA notes, and yellow seal dollars, legal tender and "provisionally" fixing rates at dollar equals 100 Italian lire because this was announced on radio Bari on date of signature of Proclamations and published in Bari newspapers the following morning. Believe that public in Sardinia and other areas referred to is not yet AMG aware of this Proclamation.

3 (a) Prior to posting of Royal Proclamation in four provinces under Badoglio, public was unwilling to accept AM lire, AMA notes and yellow seal dollars.

(b) Have heard of a case where public in Sardinia refused to accept AM lire.

(c) Such unwillingness was due to fact that Proclamation had not yet been posted.

(d) After posting of Proclamation, it has commonly occurred in all areas that public show reluctance to accept currencies which are rarely seen in their particular area. For instance, public in Palermo area for some time unwilling to accept AMA notes and such unwillingness still occurs from time to time. 6. Have heard of only isolated transactions at rates other than 100 per yellow seal dollar and 400 per AM note and no transaction between AM lire and Italian lire at rate other than one equals one. Before posting of Proclamation, for instance in Apulia, members of public have sought to deal at rates such as 150 per pound, but in such circumstances, dealings have rarely taken place.

7. Apart from isolated cases, neither troops nor public appear to show marked preference for any one currency over another. It is commonly said that certain persons are hoarding yellow seal dollars but we have no concrete evidence in support of this.

1. With reference to your 5868 of 17th September, Lt. Col. Gunston Chief of A.M.F.A. is leaving by plane this afternoon for Brindisi, he is taking AM Lire 101 million

2. No definite guarantee can be obtained here of an aeroplane from Catania to Brindisi, but it is thought that it can be arranged.

3. Gunston will deliver what is necessary to General Mason MacFarlane and will distribute the balance where it is most wanted.

4. I imagine that this will apply particularly to Puglia, as reports from our Finance Officer in Reggio indicates that Calabria is plentifully supplied with Metropolitan lire, and in fact he suggests opening the banks for unrestricted withdrawals at once. The Banca d'Italia at Catanzaro has L.130 million and if only some contact had existed between the North and South of Regno 2, the needs of Brindisi could easily have been met.

5. Gunston will also do his best to indicate the right channels for this type of request. The cable from Brindisi to the British Minister in Algiers is about as clumsy a method as could be employed. I am told that communications between Brindisi and 15 Army Group are good; and if a request for currency had been placed to the letter, they can be connected to us on the telephone within 5 minutes.

6. As soon as I can obtain priority for a passenger and a requisite number of boxes I will send you A.M. Lire 50 million in mixed denominations. It seems anomalous to be flying back currency which has only recently come from North Africa, but I assume that you have no small denomination notes.

7. I am sending this note by Fast Air in amplification of a cable already despatched to you.

3. Please inform me whether this is correct, and if so inform AGWAR for C C S and Carter.

4. Question remains whether AMFA Accounts should show how Brigadier BOULNOIS distributes this money to British, American, Italian or French Forces or to other recipients.

5. If this is required, will you please (a) instruct Brigadier BOULNOIS what statements he is to render of such distribution, (b) inform me what statements AMFA may expect to receive on this subject, and from whom.

6. As Cluiborne and Southard will have explained, AMFA has no suitable officer available to send to Sardinia and stay there for purposes you indicated.

7. It would seem very desirable to send either Cluiborne or Southard now to Sardinia to ensure that issue of Proclamations and payment of money into banks in such manner as to produce best results are correctly handled.

8. Suggest that unless there is strong valid reason to contrary Brigadier Boulnois be directed to use Bank of Italy as depository rather than any local bank's branch or agency.





- a) that they agreed to supply French troops with the special notes in lire which they might need. In case small notes in lire do not exist in sufficient quantities, certain bills (yellow seal) shall be supplied.
- b) that the ruling under which these issues will be made remain temporarily reserved and will only be fixed when instructions have been received from the Allied High Command, Paris.
- c) that French & the French Army would accept the rule applied by the American and British Armies, which consists in keeping in a blocked account, the countervalue of the special notes issued.

It is normal that every army should keep in its national currency the countervalue, in a blocked account, of the amounts of foreign monies issued for the requirements of the units going to Europe. On that principle, the French Army will keep in a blocked account, the exact countervalue of special notes (lire or other monies, including yellow seal dollar or military pounds) that will be put in circulation by French troops.

However, French authorities cannot, without giving to part with foreign currencies (dollars or pounds sterling) to effect name of payment of this nature, the issue of which costs nothing more than the price of paper and printing. Apart from the fact that the French authorities have only limited resources in foreign currencies, this method would mean that the French should be treated unfavourably compared to the American and British Armies, which constitutes each in their own national money, the covering of the special notes that they issue.

By the Grace of God and the Will of the Supreme Commander in Chief of the Allied Powers

With reference to Decree Nos 15, 17 and 18  
It is considered necessary, in the present circumstances, to regulate the circulation and exchange rate of Allied Military Currency.

ARTICLE I.

All paper currency issued at such bath for payment and for receipt Densities are Lit. 1, £, \$, 10, 50, 100, 500 and 1000

ARTICLE 2.

"For the time being and until further notice, the United States, Great Britain, Canada and all other countries of the United States, especially "yellow seal" dollars, bearing a yellow seal on the right side of the face of each bill, and also all British notes being and paper currency in sterling of the same country bearing the inscription "British Military Currency" issued by the British Government are hereby made legal tender.

ARTICLE 3.

The exchange rates of the various currencies mentioned in article 2 above are fixed provisionally as follows:

1 U.S. Dollar	=	Ltr. 100
1 British Pound	=	\$100
1 Canadian Pound	=	6 U.S. Dollars

Any transaction of exchange rate other than those established above is forbidden.

The exchange is compulsory for all persons in the business of banking or the exchange of money, free of all commissions and fees for making such exchanges.

Article 1.

Paper currency issued by the Allies bearing the inscription "United Military Currency" and bearing the values in Italian Lira at one out of the undermentioned denominations, shall be accepted as legal tender bearing the same value as that of Italian currency and shall be regarded as such both for payments and for receipts destinations are Lira 1, 5, 10, 50, 100, 500 and 1000

Article 2

For the time being until further notice, all metal coins of the United States and all paper currency of the United States, currently bearing gold tellers, bearing a value not exceeding one million lire, shall be paid back to the face of the bill, and also all British metal coins and paper currency in Sterling of the same denominations as the American "British Military Currency" issued by the United States Government are hereby made legal tender.

Article 3

The exchange rates of the various currencies mentioned in article 1 above are fixed provisionally as follows:

U.S. Dollar	=	Ltr. 100
1 British Pound	=	Ltr. 400 (otherwise 20 shillings)
1 British Penny	=	6 U.S. Dollars. (as above)

Any transaction at exchange rates other than those established above is forbidden.

The exchange is compulsory for all persons in the business of banking or the exchange of money, from or to contractors and fees for making such exchange.

A schedule 4 attached showing the relative values of the United States and British notes and coins (as set out in Article 2) and Italian notes and coins.

Article 4

Any person violating the provisions of this proclamation will be prosecuted within the ultimate power of the law.

Article 5

This proclamation will be inscribed in the Registers of the various Commissari in the territory and will be affixed to the walls in public places and will immediately become operative.

Have agreed with BADOGLIO and his Finance Minister to provide if necessary pay ITALIAN Army, Navy and Air Force formations in this region equivalent to (Gp corrupt) 15 Divs in all and in addition finance current expenditure of BADOGLIO Government in so far as necessary. Finance Minister is unable to estimate how much cash generally required before he has access to bank of ITALY in ROME and it's printing works at ACQUILA. Since, however ACQUILA is not yet occupied by ALLIED FORCES and printing works may be sabotaged by GERMANI before Allied occupation I suggest WASHINGTON prints forthwith further; 100,000,000,000 Allied military lire in denominations as recently requested by AMFA. These notes should if possible bear words in ENGLISH and ITALIAN indicating amount of notes. And as Finance Minister says he can finance all including his government which are drawing on funds available locally in Bank of ITALY and by authorising bank of ITALY and possibly other banks to issue circular bankers checks as substitute for current. Following from Hamlyn with which we concur:

"In view of need for AMFA planning for all regions of Italy including Armistice Commission Control and general agreement here that there should be a single AMFA for all of Italy even though both AMG and Armistice C. C. exercise jurisdiction in Italy and that someone should be designated to act for AMFA in regions which are about to be or which may be occupied I suggest if agreeable to you that Lieutenant Commander Southard be sent to Tizi Ouzou to deal with all of AMFA problems from this end. He could function at Tizi or wherever Armistice C.C. Headquarters is located and keep MGS and AMG informed. In this way it would be possible to unify AMFA activities in all regions and in all Headquarters. A military mission is leaving for region 6 very soon with 2 finance Officers both of whom have essentially accounting experience. They will have 10,000,000 (Ten million) A.M. Lire with them obtained at Algiers. I think it would be most desirable if you could send here together with about 200,000,000 (two hundred million) Lire an officer of AMFA like Captain Cook or Captain Bennett picking the 1 with best banking experience and we will send him to Sardinia. We will send to you Major Macchin British for attachment to AMFA. If foregoing is satisfactory please take necessary steps at your end and advise. If you have any questions re foregoing or otherwise on the subject of Finance that you would like to discuss we should be very happy to have you visit us in the next few days."

1. Paymasters holdings at TRIPOLI of BMA sterling are surplus to his requirements TRIPOLITANIA. All out payments in BMA ceased on 15 Sept. and only MA Lire now being paid out.

2. We hold here BMA sterling 6,000,000.00 and expect in due course further 4,500,000.00. Your 54111 of 29 July, Para 2 refers. Have received 50 cases Series (?) L recently which presume are first instalment of 2nd 5,000,000.00 promised. Have no knowledge approximate date arrival of the 4,500,000.00

3. In certain eventualities 6,000,000.00 at present held would NOT provide any surplus our requirements. Have taken view however that you would not wish same series BMA sterling issued in ATB territories as those issued in TRIPOLITANIA. If this view correct, your 70612 of 18 Sept seems to confirm, then all holdings of any series used in TRIPOLITANIA will be surplus our requirements. Such holdings comprise: (a) 750000 pounds held by Paymaster, (B) 526000 pounds (520000 (?)) held by ME and (C) All acquisitions per present exchange operations in TRIPOLITANIA.

4. Time factor in regard to arrival of BMA sterling 4,500,000.00 and high policy reference ATB territories put outside my competence decision as to whether or not we have surplus.

TO : The Chief of Staff Attn: Brigadier Sugden

I. DISCUSSION

1. Yesterday we received a cable from General Mason McFarlane in which he urges forwarding of very large amounts of Allied Military Lire to the mainland of Italy for use in paying the Italian Military Forces and for Italian governmental expenditures.

2. General Mason McFarlane indicated that Marshal Badoglio is willing to make one Italian cruiser and one Italian destroyer available for the delivery of currency from the United States to Italy. However, this is likely to involve a considerable time delay.

3. The only method of meeting the immediate needs of the Italian Government and its Armed Forces for Lire, in view of the fact that the Italian printing presses are in areas occupied by the Germans, is to ship by plane immediately three and one half to four billion lire of AM Lire currency.

II ACTION RECOMMENDED

1. It is requested that the Chief of Staff direct the Air Priorities Board to assign air priority I for three plane loads of three and one half to four billion Lire of Allied Military currency to go to Tunis.

1. Early arrival earliest possible time in which you will complete printing of first 6 orders of all LAFS currency and show we may expect to receive balance of first order 1P shipments by winter.

2. General MACARTHUR has been discussing with BLOOMFIELD and his Finance Minister plan of delivery of American Army forces and supplemental purposes before Italian authorities have cause to hold up COMINT and its printing works at Anzio. Possibility of sabotage by Germans or printing works before LAFS occupation to be recognized.

3. United States has other than its own money needs by drawing on units arriving regularly to Italy on behalf of the American Bank of Italy and other units to issue checks that should be substituted for American. We are investigating such procedure if local banks are O.U. strong enough to handle same and if there is no record bending objection to such policy.

4. Reference your Acct of 1st September just arrived, I should like to make the following comments:

Ref para. 1.

- (a) The system evolved was a compromise to implement the restrictive regulations of the U.S. Finance Division.
- (b) As stated in my Acct of 8th Sep, neither Colonel Tillman nor Lieutenant-Colonel Hayes may know what details of such information had to be submitted to R.A.F.P.A. Copies of such instruments and of Form 4C are still wanted.
- (c) At this time's draft from Colonel Tillman have now been replaced and a copy of the revised sent to M.C.C. for onward transmission to R.A.F.P.A., may it be assumed that Major 7 is now cleared? If this is the case, the need for the special instruction at Annex 6 on American officer in the accounting instructions of the existing form 4C would not appear to be necessary.
- (d) The inability to contact us longer necessary in Section 1 nor our loss in Series 2 where the system utilized British Paymaster control entirely. In my opinion certain Officers and collectors were not in touch with American officers of Section 3, I suggest that they have received the full instructions and copies of Form 4C, similarly in detail the information necessary to the Chief Financial Officer's account. My own relations with this party do not exist, as I cannot correspond with them. If M.C.C. considers that the American officers are not fully aware of what accounts should be submitted, may I suggest that you send a writing order to Lieutenant-Colonel Barrett?

Previous instructions require radio advice from AMFA and radio acknowledgment from U.S. Army Finance Officers, covering lire, turned over to such Finance Officers by AMFA. Inasmuch as both the radio advices and radio acknowledgments have been signed by EISENHOWER, some difficulty has existed in the past in determining whether the radios originated from AMFA or from Army Finance Officers and accordingly it is recommended that future radio advices from AMFA read substantially as follows: "AMFA advises delivery of blank lire to Colonel JOHN DOE disbursing symbol number blank on Sept blank", and that radio acknowledgments from Army Finance Officers read substantially as follows: "Colonel JOHN DOE disbursing symbol number blank acknowledges receipt of blank lire from AMFA on Sept blank". Such radio advices and acknowledgment should be addressed to Fiscal Director HQ Army Service Forces and should include HQ other subject matter.




I. Inflation; Use of gold to combat inflation.

1. Mr. Lloyd stated that one of the greatest problems facing the M.Z.S.C. throughout has been inflation. The degree of inflation varies in the different territories. The worst case is that of Persia whose whole economy has been strained by the use of that territory as a channel for supplies to Russia. There is an acute shortage of supplies for civilian consumption and the budget is not balanced, one-third of the expenditure being met by advances from the Central Bank. Compared with pre-war levels the prices in Persia and Syria have risen about 7 times while in Iraq they have risen about 6 times, chiefly on account of the expenditure of the allied armies. On the other hand the countries least affected by inflation are Egypt and Palestine where price levels are at about 2½ to 3 times pre-war. In the worse group of territories prices have risen more than the currency in circulation whereas in the second group currency has increased faster than prices have risen which indicates that money is being hoarded. I. Inflation; Use of Gold to combat inflation.

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2. The territorial Governments tend to ignore the inflationary gap caused by military expenditure on the part of the visiting armies since they consider that the position is covered by the fact that an extra currency output is covered by sterling or dollars in London and Washington. An instance is Palestine, where of a total national income of about 90,000,000 pounds sterling, military expenditure represents about 35,000,000 pounds or just over one-third. The extra currency required by the military expenditure has been backed by sterling in London. As the pre-war budget of Palestine just balanced, this military expenditure represents a large inflationary gap. The M.E.S.C. have tried to persuade the territorial governments that this military expenditure should be offset against loans to the Allies in the local currency rate of 37/- per

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increased taxation, loans, etcetera. These representations have met with but little success. Saving certificates have been attempted in Palestine and certain lottery loans have been issued, but with little effect. Government borrowing throughout the Middle East is extremely limited. Mr. Lloyd stated that in terms of its pre-war purchasing power the value of the pound now represents in the U.K. 12/6d., Egypt 7/6d., Palestine 6/4d., Persia 4/4d., Iraq 3/4d., and less than 3/- in Syria.

3. Two of the main remedies against this position are 1) to restrict the need for more currency, and 2) to bring in more consumer goods. Since the import of consumer goods must necessarily be restricted for shipping considerations, the Minister of State has urged during the past six months that he should be allowed to bring in gold for sale in the Middle East. The paper money price of gold has risen to a point where the prevailing price for one gold sovereign is five to six pounds, while the highest price touched has been eight pounds in Syria. Mr. Lloyd pointed out that the relation of paper money to gold should be borne in mind in considering paper money prices of for instance wheat. Although the Middle East wheat prices appear very high if they were considered from the angle of the ratio of paper currency to gold, the prices bore a surprising correlation with North American prices, 1 gram of gold being about/equivalent of one bushel of wheat in both cases. If the cultivator can be persuaded to hoard gold instead of wheat both the supply and the inflation position will be greatly improved. Briefly therefore, the use of gold was 1) to save money for the Exchequer, and 2) to mop up purchasing power, thus reducing the demand for new currency and indirectly ceasing the dehoarding of wheat, because the native will sell his wheat in order to procure paper currency with which to buy gold. There is general opposition to any suggestion of the use of gold in any direct barter scheme.

Mr. Glasser asked whether, assuming that the selling of gold introduced dehoarding and increased commercialisation of supplies produce, it was intended to permit this extra commercialisation of supplies to be consumed within the territories and whether it was expected that these would have the effect of bringing the prices down. Mr. Lloyd stated that the cereals collection scheme in the Middle East have been successful and the cereals collection scheme to descend. The present year's collection is now in progress and it is felt that this would have been more successful if more consumer goods had been available for distribution. In Persia silver is at present being sold in the villages as an inducement to dehoarding and if, as may well be, there is a still greater shortage of cotton piece goods next year, gold and silver will be of even greater value in this way. Gold in itself, however, is regarded not as a solution to the problem but rather as a palliative and it is not expected that the gold policy in itself will bring

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down prices. The aim is rather to stabilise prices and to reduce the rate of increase in currency circulation. It must furthermore be borne in mind that one of the first effects of the sale of gold will be a fall in the price of gold itself, which will thus lose some of its value in the eyes of speculators who will tend to turn rather to other commodities including land. Mr. Glasser suggested that if this policy caused the price of gold to fall lower and lower the purchasers would lose faith in gold as they already lost faith to a great decree in paper currency, but Mr. Lloyd thought that the Arabs in particular attach an intrinsic value to gold as a store of wealth if only for the simple reason that it is more durable than paper. He added that he thought that about six months would have to pass before one could judge how successful the scheme had been.

## II. Problems arising from divergent price levels in adjacent territories.

6. Mr. Lloyd stated that one of the greatest problems of inflation was that of the different price levels existing in the different territories. An instance of the difficulties caused by this had been quoted by Commander Jackson in the recent meetings between the M.E.S.C. and the N.A.E.B. when on account of having received offers of 80 pounds to 90 pounds per ton from Syria and the Lebanon for their rice the Egyptians though unable to export to Syria and the Lebanon were influenced by this offer to impose an export duty of 50 pounds per ton on the rice which the Ministry of Food was to purchase at 25 pounds per ton for Ceylon. Commander Jackson had also described the way in which transport facilities and the exercise of censorship through the territorial governments have been used to combat this sort of difficulty. One extreme instance is provided by Syria and Palestine. Before the war fruit and vegetables crossed freely in both directions but now Palestine cannot afford to buy those goods from Syria, and export from Syria to Palestine has in any case been forbidden. It is hoped that the gold policy will prevent the various price levels from getting too much out of line with each other. The problem has been systematically tackled in the Sudan where the Government sell a great deal to the British Ministry of Supply at reasonable prices which are lower than those of any other Middle East territory. The Government also sells locally through the U.K.C.C. who herd any profits from these sales to the Sudan Government which sets them off against losses on high cost imports from surrounding countries.

7. Syria represents the other extreme since importers are there allowed to make windfall profits. A recent report has urged that the Syrian Government should impose import duties in order to subsidise exports but this has met with resistance from those who consider that an import duty cannot have an anti-inflationary effect since it tends to put up prices to consumers. Mr. Lloyd said that this need not be so if retail prices are already as high as supply and demand determine and unreasonable profits are being made by intermediaries.

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8. Mr. Lloyd suggested that, as in the U.K., prices of essential commodities should be pegged, if necessary by subsidy, and prices of unessential goods should be allowed to rise, particularly through the imposition of a tax which could be used to meet the subsidies on essential items. He did not consider that prices should be fixed in the light of landed costs.
