Mr. Royce, the Chairman of HARB phoned. He made two points:

a. That owing, probably to a slip up at Brig. Rabino's suggestion we communicated directly with the French regarding the payment for the recent sulphur shipment, the letter had gone from us to the French before having been cleared by him with Washington. I offered to try and withdraw the letter from the French but he said that he was perfectly satisfied with the method suggested and anticipated receiving the concurrence of Washington within a day or two.

b. He was very anxious to have a round table conference on the payment for exports to North Africa. I replied that we also were extremely keen on producing a plan and that I in fact had given instructions for an overall plan including exports not only to North Africa but to the government's combined boards, etc. to be prepared and that this plan was to contain financial clauses as to the means of payment. I undertook that we would clear this matter at a conference with him before cabling the full plan to the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

Reference Planning Directive No. 5 issued under even reference dated 20th September, 1943, and with particular reference to Para. 5, (b), (ii) thereof.

FOREIGN TRADE SUB-COMMISSION

(a) MISSION

To initiate and develop, together with the Sub-Commissions on Industry and Commerce, Agriculture, Forest and Fisheries, Fuel and Food Distribution and Rationing, policies and procedures relating to imports into and exports from Italy of industrial and agricultural commodities in the interests of the Allied Military effort, and of the restoration of economic order in Italy; to ensure that proper orders are placed and other measures taken to facilitate the flow of such imports and exports; and to consider what measures ought to be taken with respect to Italian trade agreements and other arrangements, measures and action entered into or taken by Italy which affect the problem of Italy's foreign trade.

(b) MAJOR FUNCTIONS

(1) The Foreign Trade Sub-Commission performs the following staff functions:-

- (a) Formulates and establishes policies, plans and procedures concerning imports into and exports from Italy.
- (b) Reviews progress of imports and exports, and prepares proper instructions, directives, etc. to facilitate the flow of imports and exports.
- (c) Formulates policies concerning outstanding Italian agreements and other Italian measures affecting imports and exports, and Italy's foreign trade policy.

(2) The Foreign Trade Sub-Commission performs the following operational functions:-

- (a) Negotiates with purchasers and sellers for Italian imports and exports, and with Italian, British, American and other governmental agencies involved in or concerned with Italian imports and

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Industry and Commerce, Agriculture, Forest and Fisheries, Fuel and Food Distribution and Rationing, policies and procedures relating to imports into and exports from Italy of industrial and agricultural commodities in the interests of the Allied Military effort, and of the restoration of economic order in Italy; to ensure that proper orders are placed and other measures taken to facilitate the flow of such imports and exports; and to consider what measures ought to be taken with respect to Italian trade agreements and other arrangements, measures and action entered into or taken by Italy which affect the problem of Italy's foreign trade.

(b) MAJOR FUNCTIONS

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(2) The Foreign Trade Sub-Commission performs the following operational functions:-

- (a) Negotiates with purchasers and sellers for Italian imports and exports, and with Italian, British, American and other governmental agencies involved in or concerned with Italian imports and exports.
- (b) Coordinates and negotiates with shipping and transport facilities in Italy and abroad, both military and non-military, respecting the carriage of Italian imports and exports.
- (c) Negotiates with the Italian Government and other non-Italian governmental authorities regarding trade and other related agreements to which Italy is or may desire to be a party.
- (d) Negotiates with the Italian Government relating to any other measures which Italy has or may desire to take, and which affect Italian foreign trade.
