MINUTE I

TO: Assistant Chiefs of Staff

Attach 14(A). My recommendations for the composition of Advance Party C.C. advanced party are given herewith. See Appendix "A".

1. I shall inform heads of sub-commissions in whose cases there are reductions in numbers from those previously submitted, *- after receiving your concurrence.*

2. The names starred are recommended for once advance party should such be required.

3. Recommendations for M.T. are attached. See Appendix "B". It is very desirable that the advance party should take its own M.T. and not be dependent on local formations. If you concur I shall take the matter up with HQS. Provision of transport would allow us to take office furniture and equipment packed in the lorries.

4. In the suggested requirements for officers' accommodation of advance party, provision is made for two rooms for Assistant Chiefs of Staff and their PAs, but those officers have not been included in the composition of such party. It is assumed that they would probably cross by air after the advance HQ had been set up.

5. It would be a better balanced team for the move if G.I. could be reinforced by a U.S. major or captain preferably from the Quartermaster Corps.

A. Advance Party - Move.

- (1) The Advance Party (Cavalier) of Allied Commission will be ready to move w.e.f. first light Thursday, Oct 7th.
- (2) This party will move to SICILY - NOT to the destination previously ordered.
- (3) It will come under the orders of C.C.A.O. A.M.G. instead of under the orders of General Mason MacFarlane.

B. Change in Composition & Command of Advance Party.

- (1) Planning Directive No. 8 will be considered as modified in accordance with the changes outlined in paras (2)-(7) below, but it is not proposed to issue detailed amendments. Separate instructions are being given verbally to Lt. Col. Hindley Smith (see para (4) below.)
- (2) The following will not proceed :-

- (3) There will be two Assistant Chiefs of Staff :-

- (4) Colonel J.W. Dunlop OBE, MC, will hand over to Lt. Col. Hindley Smith who will command the Party until arrival at destination.
- (5) Ref App "A" to P.D. No. 2, the Executive Officer and Office Superintendent who were to have been provided by A.F. HQ. will not now be provided and the appointments will be left unfilled.
- (6) Major Driffield-White will fill a position on the Central Secretariat and will no longer be available for the position for which he was originally designated.
- (7) Only Lt. Col. Moss Vernon and Lt. Denning of the Recce Party have left North Africa. The remainder of the party is returning to this H.Q. to-morrow, Tues, 5th Oct, and will proceed with the rest of the Advance Party.

PLANNING DIRECTIVE No. 9.
(OPERATION CAVALIER)

TO: Col. J. K. Dunlop, O.B.E., M.C. (7).

Ref. ACC/1014/1, dated 29 Sept 43, para 7 of P.D. No. 8, dated 1 Oct 43.

1. Scope.

This Directive is issued subject to any overriding orders you may receive from MGS, AFHQ, or from the acting Chief of the Allied Commission (See Para. 7 below).

2. Command.

You are appointed to command an Advance Party of the Planning Staff at the Military Government School & Holding Center, and will hold yourself in readiness to proceed to a destination in Italy of which you are aware, with the party, at five days' notice.

3. Composition of Party.

Composition of the party is as laid down in App. "A" to ACC/1012/2202 dated 29 Sept 43, as subsequently amended.

4. Recece Party.

Orders have already been issued regarding the composition and duties of the Recece Party, which has already left.

5. Move.

Move will be in own transport and you will arrange details direct with the School and Holding Center and MGS, AFHQ as required for the rationing and accommodation of your party, en route to point of embarkation.

6. Rations.

You will take 10 days' rations for your party.

7. Acting Chief of Allied Commission.

On arrival, you will report to Lt. Gen. Mason McFarlane, acting Chief of the Allied Commission, and will come under his orders.

2. Command.

You are appointed to command an Advance Party of the Planning Staff at the Military Government School & Holding Center, and will hold yourself in readiness to proceed to a destination in Italy of which you are aware, with the party, at five days' notice.

3. Composition of Party.

Composition of the party is as laid down in App. "A" to ACC/101/2202 dated 29 Sept 43, as subsequently amended.

4. Recece Party.

Orders have already been issued regarding the composition and duties of the Recece Party, which has already left.

5. Move.

Move will be in own transport and you will arrange details direct with the School and Holding Center and MGS, AFHQ as required for the rationing and accommodation of your party, en route to point of embarkation.

6. Rations.

You will take 10 days' rations for your party.

7. Acting Chief of Allied Commission.

On arrival, you will report to Lt. Gen. Mason McFarlane, Acting Chief of the Allied Commission, and will come under his orders.

8. Temporary Constitution of Allied Commission.

(a) Your party will, on arrival, be absorbed by the nucleus of the Allied Commission headed by Lt. Gen. Mason McFarlane which is already there. The situation will therefore be that the advance portion of the Allied Commission will have been formed and will be established in Italy.

(b) This advance portion will in fact constitute the Allied Commission, and will be charged immediately with executive and administrative functions.

9. WE/T.O.

A War Establishment for the British portion of the Allied Commission has been approved, and a copy is attached hereto. There will be no corresponding T.O. for the American portion as all personnel of AMG and Allied Commission are to be held on the strength of one Regiment on one T.O. Details will be forwarded to you as soon as known.

10. Regions, etc., Under Allied Commission Control.

It will assume command and administration not only of its own personnel, but of any Regions, or portions of Regions, which may by order be released from IIG control to the control of the Allied Commission. These will include, immediately, certain personnel of Region 2 in the "Liberated Areas", and probably in the near future Region 1 and the remainder of Region 2. For the present, Region 6 will remain directly under AFHQ (MGS).

11. Designation of Planning Staff.

The Planning Staff at the Military Government School and Holding Center, hitherto known as "Armistice C.C." will constitute the rear portion of the Allied Commission and will be known as "Rear Allied Commission" (Rear A.C.). You should be prepared to receive officers from Rear A.C. as and when they may be ordered to join the Allied Commission.

12. Relations Between A.C. and Rear A.C.

The Allied Commission will of course deal direct with AFHQ, but you will ensure that Rear A.C. is kept informed of all developments so far as may be permitted by your Chief. Similarly, Rear A.C. will forward copies to you of all important directives and instructions issued by them.

13. Code Names and Addresses.

- (a) The Code Name of the Allied Commission will be "Fatima". This will be used as a telegraphic address - e.g. a message from JACS to A.C. would be addressed "MGS, AFHQ for FATIMA".
- (b) The postal address of the Allied Commission will be "Allied Commission, South Italy".
- (c) The postal address of Rear A.C. is "Joint Asst. Chiefs of Staff (JACS), Military Govt. School and Holding Center, BNAF."
- (d) The telegraphic address of Rear A.C. is "MGS, AFHQ for JACS".

14. Communications and Channels.

- (a) It is understood that communication to AFHQ and Rear A.C. will be by Air Courier (twice daily) and W/T. Cipher is already provided for.
- (b) Heads of Sub-Commissions in your party may correspond direct with their "Opposite Numbers" at Rear A.C., and vice versa, on technical and departmental matters only - otherwise correspondence will be from Allied Commission to JACS.

12. Linkage Between A.C. and Rear A.C.

The Allied Commission will of course deal direct with AFHQ, but you will ensure that Rear A.C. is kept informed of all developments so far as may be permitted by your Chief. Similarly, Rear A.C. will forward copies to you of all important directives and instructions issued by them.

13. Code Names and Addresses.

- (a) The Code Name of the Allied Commission will be "Fatima". This will be used as a telegraphic address - e.g. a message from JACS to A.C. would be addressed "JGS, AFHQ for FATMA".
- (b) The postal address of the Allied Commission will be "Allied Commission, South Italy".
- (c) The postal address of Rear A.C. is "Joint Asst. Chiefs of Staff (JACS), Military Govt. School and Holding Center, BNAF."
- (d) The telegraphic address of Rear A.C. is "JGS, AFHQ for JACS".

14. Communications and Channels.

- (a) It is understood that communication to AFHQ and Rear A.C. will be by Air Courier (twice daily) and W/T. Cipher is already provided for.
- (b) Heads of Sub-Commissions in your party may correspond direct with their "opposite numbers" at Rear A.C., and vice versa, on technical and departmental matters only - otherwise correspondence will be from Allied Commission to JACS.

Organization of Allied Commission.

The outline initial organization of the Allied Commission is shown in App. "A" hereto. A more detailed chart, showing the proposed final set-up will be handed you by Brig. E.A.L. Gueterbock.

- (i) A Secretariat to serve the Allied Commission is included. Some of its members are being found from Rear A.C. and will proceed with your party.
- (ii) The Military Staff (which will probably be under your immediate orders) administers all personnel of the Allied Commission. (See para. 8 above).

16. Office System.

- (a) The establishment of the Secretariat may mean that the Staff Duties and Office System in vogue here, as laid down in the various Planning Directives, will have to be changed. You will use your best endeavours to ensure that as few modifications are made as possible.

(b) You will forward to Rear A.C. details of the Office System immediately as early as possible.

(c) Unless and until the system is changed, you will use the system as is in force here.

17. Liaison with Military Organization.

You will establish friendly relation and liaison with the local military authorities, and especially with the District and Base Sub-Commanders concerned. You have been furnished with particulars of the military organization under ACC/1110/9 dated 1 Oct. 43.

18. Administration of Personnel.

The Allied Commission will use the Military Organization above referred to for all purposes connected with internal administration. I.e., rations, military supplies, transportation, postal, medical, pay, cash, etc. (See para. 19 of P.S. No. 2 dated 29 Aug. 43.).

19. Promotions and Advancement of Officers.

(a) British:- You will note from the British W.E. that all Officers with the exception of HQ Comdts and Staff are Staff Officers. There is therefore no question of Regtl. promotions. The normal system of promotion is - A.F.s B194 D, E, F & G will operate, and Officers of the rank of Lt. Col. and above should be specially reported upon every 6 months. You should issued comprehensive instructions on this matter some after arrival to all personnel under command (See paras. 8(b) & 10), subject to any from the acting Chief of the Commission, to whom you should refer. It is suggested that you bear in mind the following points in formulating your instructions:-

(i) All recommendations must be made through the usual channels to HQ Allied Commission (C-1), as follows:-

Example:- Recommendations for advancement etc.

A. G.A.O. through S.C.A.O. and H.C.A.O.

B. An officer of a Special Division in a Special Division through Chief of Special Division and H.C.A.O.

C. An Officer in a Sub-Commission, or the Staff of HQ Allied Commission, through Chief of Sub-Commission or Head of Staff of Sub-Commission, and Vice-President (when Directorate and Hqs of Sections are formed).

(ii) Recommendations should in no case be made direct

19. Promotions and Advancement of Officers.

(a) British:- You will note from the British W.E. that all Officers with the exception of HQ Comdts and Staff are Staff Officers. There is therefore no question of Regtl. promotions. The normal system of promotions - A.F.s B194 D, E, F & G will operate, and Officers of the rank of Lt. Col. and above should be specially reported upon every 6 months. You should issued comprehensive instructions on this matter soon after arrival to all personnel under command (See paras. 8(b) & 10), subject to any from the acting Chief of the Commission, to whom you should refer. It is suggested that you bear in mind the following points in formulating your instructions:-

(i) All recommendations must be made through the usual channels to HQ Allied Commission (3-1), as follows:-

Examples:- Recommendations for advancement of:-

- A. C.O.D. through S.C.A.O. and K.C.A.O.
- B. An officer of a Special Division in a P.D. through the Special Division and K.C.A.O.
- C. An officer in a Sub-Commission or the Staff at HQ Allied Commission. Through Chief of Sub-Commission or Head of Staff Section, Director, and Vice-President (When Directorate and Hqs of Sections are formed).

(ii) Recommendations should in no case be made direct i.e. from Chief of Regional Special Division to Chief of Allied Commission. Pending Sub-Commission at HQ Allied Commission. Directors and Vice-Presidents must submit Chiefs of Sub-Commissions as

(iii) In order to avoid a mass of copies of AFs B194D on which possibly no action can be taken for some time, you should institute a quarterly return of Officers recommended for promotion, A.F. B194 D being called for by H.Q. Allied Commission when required. This return should give the following particulars:-

Name
Rank (Subs, temp, & acting)
Present Appointment
Appointment and rank for which recommended.
(Alternative appointments may be recommended)

The Officers recommended for other appointments carrying the same (i.e. not a higher) rank may be included in the return.

(iv) AFs B194 E or F should be submitted at once, as & when the occasion arises. The number of copies to be submitted by originator will need to be calculated and laid down.

(b) American:- Rules for advancement and promotion are contained in a mimeographed pamphlet, a copy of which will be given to you before departure. You should issue appropriate instructions thereon.

(c) You will keep Rear A.C. constantly informed of promotions carried out and of approved recommendations for advancement of Officers for whom there are as yet no vacancies, and of American Officers permanently assigned to appointments which call for a rank higher than that held, in order that suitable assignments may be made here, and accurate records maintained.

20. Copies of Correspondence, Records of Service, etc.

(a) You will take with you such copies of Planning Directives, MGS Papers, etc. as seems to you appropriate in consultation with JACS. In this connection your attention is invited to App. "B" of P.D. No. 8.

(b) You will also take with you one copy of the "Civil Affairs Forms" prepared by each Officer on arrival at the Holding Center, and in the case of American Officers, the Official Record of Service Form (66-1)

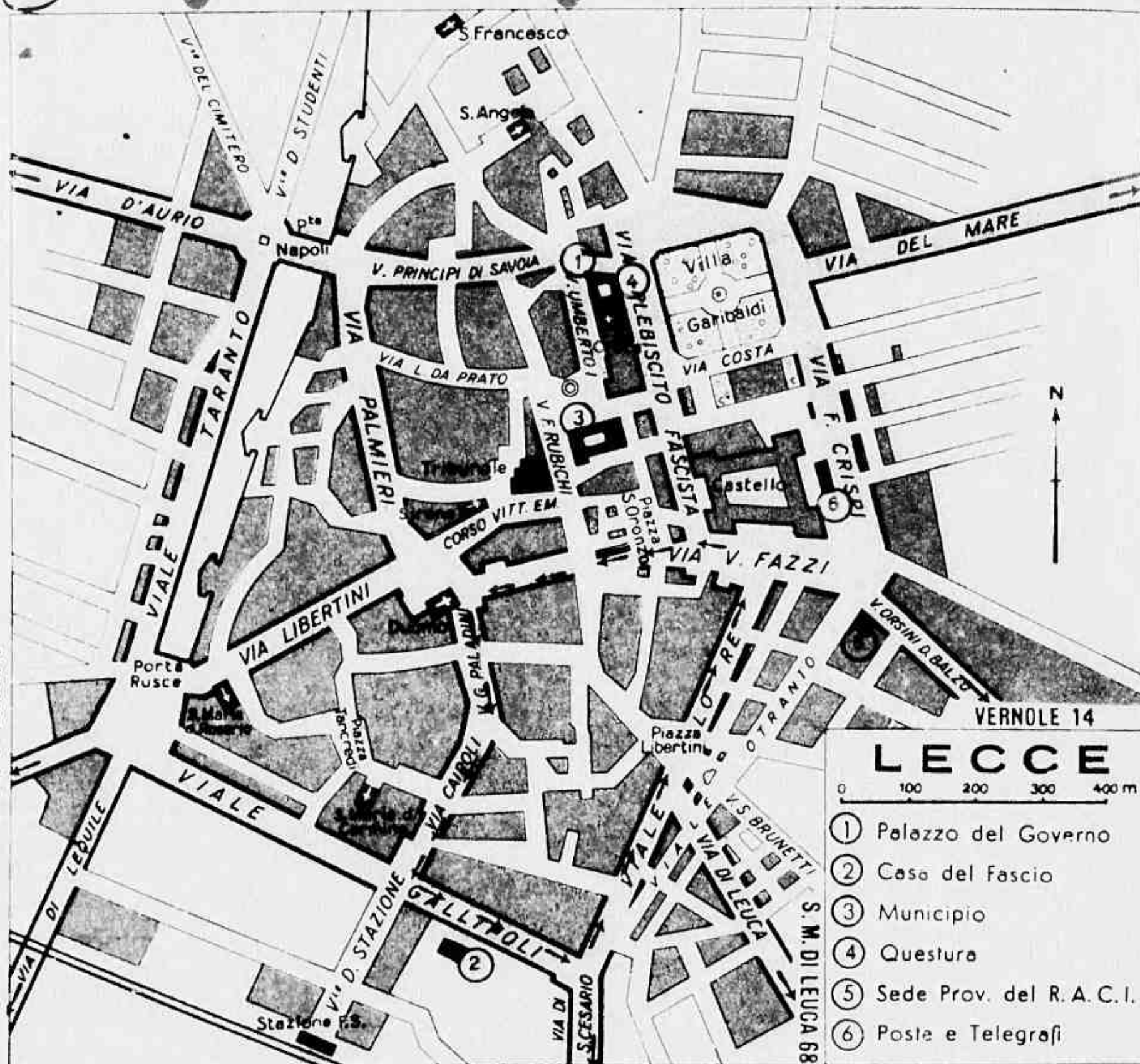

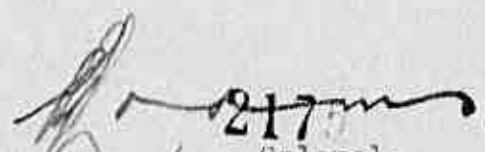
