ITALIAN TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS : RELATIONS BETWEEN THE MOVEMENTS AND
TRANSPORTATION ORGANIZATION OF THE ALLIED MILITARY FORCES, AND THE
TRANSPORTATION ORGANIZATION OF THE ALLIED COMMISSION.

I — RAILWAYS

1. This directive deals with the respective responsibilities for the control and operation of ITALIAN railways of:

a. The Movement and Transportation organizations of the Allied Military Forces, including the Military Railway Service *

b. The Internal Transportation Sub-Commission of the Allied Control Commission, and the Transportation Sections of the Allied Military Government, 15th Army Group.

2. The directive also defines the relations between a. and b. above.

3. a. The responsibilities of G-4 (Mov & Tr), this headquarters, and the staffs and services operating under its control* are laid down in Administrative Memorandum No. 13, this headquarters, dated 20 October 1942. The instructions contained in that memorandum are a guide to the general policy to be adopted by the Allied forces for establishing their movement and transportation organizations in occupied territory.

b. These instructions, with any amendments in detail which may from time to time become necessary, will continue to form the basis of the movement and transportation policy to be followed in all parts of ITALY occupied by the Allied Forces under command of this headquarters.

*NOTE: Instructions covering the establishment on the mainland of ITALY, and the functions of AFHQ Advanced Administrative Echelon (FLAMBO) are given in Administrative Memorandum No. 67, this headquarters, cs. In this directive, FLAMBO will be regarded as the appropriate military authority, and the Movements and Transportation organizations under its control as the appropriate Movements and Transportation organizations, in all cases covered by the responsibilities of FLAMBO as given in Administrative Memorandum No. 67.

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ADM MEMO # 76 (Cont'd)

4. The responsibilities of the Director General, Military Railway Service, for the development and operation of all Italian railways are given in General Order No. 60, this headquarters, cs.

5. a. The responsibilities and functions of the Internal Transportation Sub-Commission are given in Allied Control Commission Planning Directive No. 7 dated 26 September 1943, Appendix "P". (NOTE: To be reissued with slight amendments shortly).

b. Of these responsibilities and functions, those concerned with the control, supervision and operation of Italian railways will only be applicable to those sections of railway which are from time to time returned (by the Allied Military Forces) to civilian administration under the supervision of the Transportation Section, Allied Military Government, or the Internal Transportation Sub-Commission. (Reference is made to paragraph 1, General Orders No. 60, this headquarters, cs).

6. In those parts of Italian territory where the railways are under the control of the Allied Forces, through their Movements and Transportation organizations, the Internal Transportation Sub-Commission will detail personnel to be attached to the appropriate military Movements and Transportation organizations. Such personnel of the Internal Transportation Sub-Commission will be commanded and administered through normal Allied Military Government or Allied Control Commission channels. Detailed allocations of staff will be made in accordance with direct arrangements between G-4 (Mov & Trn), this headquarters, and the Internal Transportation Sub-Commission.

7. The responsibilities, so far as the subject of this directive is concerned, of the personnel of the Transportation Sub-Commission referred to in paragraph 6 above, will be:

a. Liaison and cooperation with Movements and Transportation personnel of the Allied Military Forces.

b. To coordinate at the appropriate levels, all demands made by the Allied Military Government, the Allied Control Commission and the Italian authorities, for movement designed to meet civil needs, and to establish relative priorities between those demands.

c. To represent such requirements to the military Movements and Transportation staffs concerned, in order that these bids may be considered by the military authority in common with bids for military requirements.

d. To make preparations for taking over the supervision of any parts of the Italian railway systems returned to civilian administration as described in paragraph 5 b above.

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AFHQ - 76 (Cont'd)

c. To agree with the appropriate Movements and Transportation staffs of the Allied forces what portions of the Italian railways the movement and transportation staffs will recommend to the Commander-in-Chief, Allied Forces, for return to civilian administration under the supervision of the Transportation Section of the Allied Military Government or of the Internal Transportation Sub-Commission.

NOTE: Such portions of the Italian railways will not be handed over on the orders of the Commander-in-Chief, Allied Force, to civilian administration until

- (1) the Allied military forces have no further vital interests in the area concerned.
- (2) the Internal Transportation Sub-Commission is in position to provide such supervisory personnel as the Sub-Commission considers necessary
- and (3) the Italian Railway Administration is capable, in the opinion of the Commander-in-Chief, of operating sufficiently to meet essential needs, the portion of railway concerned.


II - LAND LINES AND HIGHWAYS (Except local bus and tram services)

The relations between the organizations shown in paragraph 1, a. and b., above, will be based on the principles given in Section I - RAILWAYS, above.

1. Introductory.

These notes are addressed to Regions and have particular reference to the organization and functions of Transportation Sub-Commission under Allied Commission as at present understood. Attention is directed to P.D. 5, APPX. A which gives notes on the fundamental distinction between A.M.G. and Allied Commission. It must be distinctly understood that the suggestions and directive given herein only take effect from the time that Regional Transportation Officers come under the control of Armistice Commission.

2. Brief description of responsibilities of Transportation Sub-Commission.

- (a) Railways. - Supervision of whole of Railways.
 - (b) Docks. - Supervision or rail transportation from and to entrances to Dock areas. This may be direct or via interior workings or any docks are turned over to Allies Commission.
 - (c) Highways. - Supervision of public passenger and freight road transportation organizations except local bus and tram services which will be supervised by Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission.
- (a) Inland Waterways. - Supervision of all Inland Water Way transport organizations.
- b. Railways.
- (a) Rail movements will in many cases concern two or more regions. Carriages, wagons, locomotives, power supply, etc. cannot be controlled in self-contained Regional pools or Regional sources of supply. It will therefore be appreciated that Railway transportation is "National" and NOT "Regional".

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(e) The Information pertaining to the return of prisoners should be referred to the Italian authorities. The Italian authorities are asked to make available to the Italian State Arrears Office for **1943** **Domestic** and to the Italian Government all relevant information concerning the movements of all Italian citizens, and especially those who have been captured and members of their armed forces. Such information shall be sent to Transcarpathia Sub-Commission.

(2) The Information regarding German (Sovietization) will be sent to the Soviet Strategic Division, and, where necessary, at the direction of the Italian Government, to the Italian General Commissar.

(e) Under Instructions from **W. S. G. O. M. S. S. R.** the chief function of regional and district offices

(1) To receive the instructions of Italian **W. S. G. O. M. S. S. R.** Government by **Allied Commission** or the direction issued through the Italian General Commissar.

(2) To assist the Italian military administration to re-establish the organization and to supervise such work as is required to ensure that the Italian Forces, and to receive the requirements of **High Command**, and the movement of Allied personnel and the control of all roads of the country.

(3) To take all possible steps to prevent sectional strife and the breakout of racial or religious fanaticism, intrigues, scandals and all illegal plots.

(4) To submit to **Allied Commission** reports as necessary, but not less than monthly. Such weekly reports to be up to date and including some satirity. See Annex 10.

(5) To submit details of transport required daily to Amispace. Note: See Annex 11.

NOTE: Army orders for movement of all citizens of S.S. and the Italian Armed Forces will be issued by the Italian General Commissar. (General Commissar) will be responsible for such operations and will be authorized to carry out all movements. The procedure for other movements (those for which the orders do not apply to citizens S.S.) will be: national command (from Amispace) will issue orders which the movements will direct the movements. These will be issued to the various command, which will be given directions, and organize and manage such movements. When such movements are required to deal with administrative purposes, local officers (municipalities) concerned will be made to supervise such movements in their areas.

(1) to assist the Industrial Administration to establish the works of their districts and to supervise such works - to insure that they are used to the best advantage, subject to the requirements of the Allot Bureau, and to meet the requirements of MICRODATA, i.e. the movement of demobilized military personnel and the general civil needs of the country.

(2) to take the necessary steps to insure maximum output and the most efficient utilization of all electric power generating, pumping, and oil mobile plants.

(3) to submit to Allied Commanders information required as necessary, but at least monthly intervals. Such weekly reports to be up to date, including each Saturday. See App. "B".

4. To limit movements carried out until to 1000 hrs. S.C. See App. "B".

Note: Any orders for movement will originate at Armistice C.C. and the first point of civilian authorities will be reported accordingly. Sectional Officers (Transportation) concerned will be notified of such operations and will supervise the carrying out of the movements.

The programme for other movements (those covering the areas not originally in Armistice C.C.) will be: regional (corporations, cities) or local, from which the movements will commence, will direct the appropriate Divisional Supply Divisions to arrange the movements, subject to priorities which they will be given. Instructions, and on receipt the appropriate authorities. When such movements are required to pass through some other sectional offices (transportation) concerned will be notified so that they will be able to make such arrangements.

5. Locks.

It is expected that locks will continue under 1000 for time considerably longer. National Officers (Transportation) will, however, complete reversion of C.C. locks and not in accordance with Para 7(a), the standard being adopted as necessary.

6. Highways.

In order to prevent (transportation) will contact administrative authorities and civilian road organisations, except local fire and rescue services, and fulfil the basic function of those transport vehicles (para 7). In addition, in accordance with para 5(a), the civilian transport arm being adopted as necessary.

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6. Interdiction Days.

Interdiction officers (translates), will contact interdictors, one or two days prior to the report of interdictions and fulfill the same function as are shown for liaison officers. Action will be taken in accordance with para. (3)(e) of the situation report form being selected by interdictor.

7. Conclusion.

- (a) Further notes emanating from reporting those will be issued forthwith to the commander of his division, and
- (b) The following stages of the operation, interdictors will be informed in steps 3 & 4 of course about same, until advised when to commence their action against untranslatable sectors.
