SUBJECT: Identification of AMGOT's

1. With reference to Informal Routing Slip dated 30 July 43, returned herewith, it is suggested that the following procedure be adopted in respect of the identification of different AMG units.

2. (a) AMERICAN COY.

When activated, this will be given a serial number as in the case of Region III, "HQ Co 2876."

(b) BRITISH COY.

The formation letter should be entitled "Region III (or whatever the number may be), British Section."

On mobilization, the combined American and British contingents will be officially entitled, "Region No. V" (or whatever the number may be.)

3. In the case of the National HQ, the American Coy will be activated as above, the British formation letter being called "Region VII (British Section)". On mobilization, the combined American and British contingents will be officially entitled "Hq. A.C.A."
