At 12.30 p.m. on Friday 15th October 1943, a telephone message was received at this office from the R.T.O. Station, to the effect that Major ROBINSON (unit unknown) had lost, on the 14th October 1943, a "Revelation" type suit case containing Military Secret documents.

This suitcase was believed lost from a Train No. 6011 during a journey between Agha Station Algiers, and Palestro.

It would appear that at 9.20 a.m. on the morning of the 14th October 1943, Major ROBINSON boarded a Troop Train at Archa Station, Algiers, for the purpose of proceeding to Bizerta. He was then, so far as is known, in possession of the suit described as above.

During the course of the journey, the Train made halts at Maison Carree, Houiba and Menerville Stations. When nearing Palestro, Major ROBINSON had occasion to use the suit case but after a search, it was ascertained that the suit case was not on the train.

On arrival at Palestro, Major ROBINSON immediately informed the Station Master, and an intensive search was made of the Train and of the Railway line towards Menerville. This search was without result.

After leaving instructions with the Station Master to contact the R.T.O. at Setif Station, Major ROBINSON proceeded on

On arrival at Palestro, Major ROBINSON immediately informed the Station Master, and an intensive search was made of the Train and of the Railway line towards Menerville. This search was without result.

After leaving instructions with the Station Master to contact the R.T.O. at Setif Station, Major ROBINSON proceeded on the Train to Bizerte.

On Saturday the 16th October, 1943, I visited Agha Station, Algiers, and through the medium of an interpreter, made extensive enquiries at the British French and American Lost Property Offices, and also personally searched these, but with no good result.

Further enquiries regarding the lost suit case, were also made at the Railway Stations at Maison Carree, Kouba, and Menerville also with negative result.

Further enquiries will be made in this area, but I respectfully suggest that there is little likelihood of concluding this enquiry satisfactorily until further details are received from Major ROBINSON, when a further report will be submitted if any useful information is then obtained.

I respectfully suggest that a copy of this report be forwarded to Major Jackman, Military Government Section, A.F.H.Q., Algiers, at the request of Major ROBINSON.

Ref. para. 7 of Minutes of P.H. Planning Committee Meeting No. 7 (13 Sept).

1. Difficulties at present exist in arranging for the prompt disposal of mail and baggage of Officers and Other Ranks after they are posted overseas from the Military Government School and Centre.

These difficulties apply both to individual Officers and O.Rs. and to advanced parties of Regions and entire activated Regions, and are complex on account of the differences in British and American organization.

2. American Mail. Satisfactory arrangements exist for forwarding.

3. British Mail. Mail arriving for Officers and O. Rs. who have left the School and Holding Centre is despatched in the following morning to the new address, if known, otherwise they are endorsed "Left School" and are returned to the APO.

4. British and American Baggage. The problem is the disposal of baggage after Officers have left the School. It falls under two heads, viz.,

(1) Officers who arrived at the School in possession of full scale of baggage:- In this case surplus baggage in excess of scale for air or sea passage is left at the School. This applies mostly to Officers detailed to proceed by air.

(2) Officers who arrive at the School by air, and who leave before the balance of their baggage arrives not in possession of full scale of baggage:- In this case their baggage subsequently arrives at the M.F.O. organization, Algiers.

5. (a) Suggested Solution. It is clear from the above that two things are required:-

(1) A correct postal address for mail must be notified to School, Postal Service, and 2nd Echelon, for both individual Officers

5. (a) Suggested Solution. It is clear from the above that two things are required:-
 - (1) A correct postal address for mail must be notified to School, Postal Service, and 2nd Echelon, for both individual Officers and O.Rs. and also Regions when they are ordered to leave the School, so that letters may be addressed correctly by the postal authorities, thereby avoiding considerable delay.
 - (ii) A correct address must similarly be given both to the School and to M.F.O. in respect of baggage.
 - (b) Both School and Planning Staff are quite willing to assume responsibility in the matter, but they are not at present in a position to do so. We suggest that:-
 - (i) You should be responsible for notifying authorities as in (a) (i) above. School will then be responsible for forwarding any letters which arrive for personnel who have left.
 - (ii) The School should furnish you with the names of Officers coming under category (i) of para. 5 above, i.e. who have been ordered away and who have left baggage behind, giving particulars of duty on which despatched so far as known. You should then furnish School with address to which baggage should be consigned. School will then label baggage and take it by road to M.F.O., Algiers for onward transmission.

(iii) School should furnish you with names of Officers ordered away who come under category (ii) of para. 4 above, together with particulars of duty so far as known. You should then notify M.F.O., and instruct him to forward baggage accordingly when it arrives at Algiers. (Baggage in this category should emphatically NOT be sent to the school).
If preferred, the School could instruct the M.F.O. direct on receipt from you of correct consignment address.

6. Will you kindly forward your comments on this letter, with which the Commandant, Military Government School and Holding Centre is in agreement.
