MEMORANDUM TO: Capt. Todd (M.G.S.)

1. Regret delay in returning memorandum from J.C.C.A.C.C. of 17 September.

- 2. Attached is corrected figure on reference Tonnages.
- 3. It should be understood that footnote (\*) states that figures so marked, are 42 gal bbls, NOT Long Tons. This intended to convey the meaning that there are, for example, in column 2, 4,438 42 gal. barrels.
- 4. Factor used in recalculation is 5.615 cu. ft. per 42 gal bbl in bulk. No calculations are made on the attached sheet for any petrol products actually in barrels. Dead weight tonnage of petrol products varies with the Specific Gravity and is as follows:

S.G. .73 8.8 bbls/LT (Gasoline) S.G. .85 7.5 bbls/LT (derivatives) S.G. 1.60 6.4 bbls/LT

- 3. The question has been raised as to whether or not there is an error in the calculations in Table V.
- 4. If the figures for the 1st Period for Petrol 44,438 long tons should read 44,438 x 42 gall barrels it would appear to be approximately 6,350 long tons instead of 5,400 ship tons shown in table or approximately 10,000 ship tons if delivered in 42 gallon barrels.
- 5. Similar calculations will apply for 2nd Feriod.
- 6. May this please be clarified?
