List of Suggested Contacts in Italy

What follows is a partial and by no means up-to-date list of commercial agencies, cartel offices, special industrial research and similar organizations, where it is believed a great deal of information of industrial and economic character will be found. A great many of these organizations have been functioning as buying and selling agents of entire branches of the Italian industry and consequently all data necessary to manage the industry had to be supplied to them by the various operating enterprises. Through these organizations the Army will be able to get a clear picture of the condition of the industry and, on the basis of information obtained in these offices, move forward to obtain further information from the individual enterprises. To rely only on commercial and industrial companies would be a mistake since large sections of Italian industry are owned by individuals and partnerships.

Particular attention should be given to the coal distribution system. The records of these companies will contain a great deal of information of all consumers, such as schedules of delivery, needs, types, etc., and as a result will permit a check on their operations.

The list does not include the offices of all the Federation of Employers which it is assumed will be immediately put under Army control. These offices are all in Rome. The present list is a mixture of public and private organizations.

*L. Kamenarovich would be likely to have made the most frequent contact with German firms because of his position and the fact that he spoke German fluently. Other personnel was sent to Germany as the need arose but up to 1939 no one was particularly engaged in foreign relations.

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At Rome:

Dr. Alberto Campolongo

Dr. Campolongo was a member of the research staff of the Banca d'Italia, the central bank of Italy. He speaks English fluently, is a very well trained economist and statistician, has been to England and knows economic financial conditions very well. If he is still there, should prove an excellent entree to the extensive economic records of the Banca d'Italia.

Dr. Carlo Pangl

Dr. Pangl was an important executive in the National Federation of the Italian woolen industry. He has been to the United States, speaks English fluently and is just a luke-warm Fascist. He could supply important economic data and would be able to tell American officials which Italians could be trusted.

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AT MILAN:

Prof. Libero Lenti

Professor of statistics at Bocconi University, the leading economic university in Italy. It is thought that Lenti is also an official of the Montecatini Company, the largest chemical firm in Italy.

Prof. Giovanni Damaris

Professor of economics at Bocconi University and probably the outstanding economist in Italy today. Has written articles criticizing Fascist economic policy and has advocated a policy of free trade even when Fascists were in power. He should prove a very able helper in forming future Italian economic policy.

Prof. Fausto Pagliari

Librarian of Bocconi University, which has the finest economic and business library in all Italy. Should be able to supply needed materials on northern Italy.

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
