1. In certain areas payment has not yet been made in respect of salaries for the whole or part of the month of July, and previous months. In order that the position may be uniform over the whole island it has been decided that all salaries in arrear to State officials irrespective of the date of accrual will now be paid.

Pension payments may also be paid for July and previous months.

In the majority of cases orders authorizing these payments have already been issued, but probably not encashed owing to the closing of the Banks and Post Offices, and payments in respect of these can be made in accordance with G.A.I. 3 para 2(c) and S.A.I. Finance 2 para 3(c). The Ufficio Provinciale del Tesoro will issue any further orders required to pay State employees and pensions for salaries etc. in arrear.

Payments will still not be made

- (a) to officials who have been removed or are absent.
- (b) of family allowances prohibited under AMGOT/2020/F dated 22 Aug. para 8 (ii)
- (c) to officials of syndicates which have been abolished or other bodies which are not now operating, since the date of their abolition.

2. Certain Italian officials who were retired shortly before the occupation have not had their official pensions fixed and authorised by Rome. The Ufficio Provinciale del Tesoro will be authorised by you to grant and pay provincial pensions to such persons on the scale of 75% of what appears to him from his knowledge of records, or those of the State organisation which employed them, to be the probable official pension. No payment of capital or lump sum payments due on retirement will be made.

### 3. STATE SALARIES

With reference to G.A.I. No. 18. Communal or provincial officials to whom advances of cash were made in the opening stages to pay State salaries will forward the lists of such payment to the F.O. who will pass them to the Intendente who will then arrange for the Ufficio Provinciale del Tesoro to mark them in his records and make any necessary adjustment for double payments.

### 4. RELIEF PAYMENTS

With regard to relief payments which may have been made in communes to pensioners, etc., it has been decided that no attempt will be made to recover past relief payments by deduction from later payments of pensions, etc. Para. 9 (ii) of AMGOT/2020/F dated 22nd August is amended accordingly.

### 5. TOLLERANZA

A Tolleranza on similar conditions to those given to collectors for the August instalment (see AMGOT 22/226 HQ dated 16 August and AMGOT 2037 F dated 5 September, para 6 & 7) may also be given for the October and December instalments where that course is considered necessary. In deciding tolleranza to be given for these months, regard will be had to the facts that more people have returned to their homes and that adjustments of assessments on damaged houses will be in a more advanced state.

SUBJECT: Uniform Wage Scale and Conditions of Employment  
Governing Civilians Employed by Branches of Allied Armed Forces on the Island of Sicily.

TO : All Branches Allied Armed Forces - Sicily.

1. Enclosed herewith are copies of Uniform Wage Scale and Conditions of Employment intended to cover civilians employed by all branches of the Allied Armed Forces on the Island of Sicily.

2. The wage scale and conditions of employment were prepared by the Headquarters of the Forces of representatives of the Allied Armed Forces; and after conference and consultation with representatives of the Eighth Army, Seventh Army, 15 Army Group, District 1, Naval Operating Base, Island Base Section, and Western Island Resources Board.

3. It was the intention of the Allied Armed Forces, and it is the recommendation of this Headquarters, that the conditions of employment and rates of pay established be uniformly applied throughout the Island -- effected immediately through Routine Orders or by Directive. Previously issued wage orders or directives should be rescinded.

4. The Allied Forces have also requested that the technical staff of AGCO Headquarters be utilized for continuing study and consideration of Army Wage Scales and related matters on an island-wide basis. In view of this request, it is recommended that each unit submit suggestions for additional classifications of work and revisions or adjustments in rates of pay as circumstances may warrant in their jurisdiction.

2. The wage scale and conditions of employment were presented by this Headquarters at the request of representatives of the Allied Armed Forces, and after conference and consultation with representatives of the English Army, Seventh Army, 15 Army Group, District 1, Naval Operating Base, Iceland Royal Section, and Western Island Resources Board.

3. It was the intention of the Allied Armed Forces, and it is the recommendation of this Headquarters, that the conditions of employment rates of pay established be uniformly applied throughout the Island -- effected immediately through routine orders or by Directive. Previously issued wage scales or instructions should be rescinded.

4. The Allied Forces have also requested that the technical staff of AGFOR Headquarters be utilized for conducting study and recommendation of Army Wage Scale's and related matters on an island-wide basis. In view of this request, it is recommended that each unit submit suggestions for additional classifications of work and revisions of adjustments in rates of pay as circumstances may warrant so that periodic joint conferences may be held for interchange of information, discussion, and revision of scale. In this manner, uniformity and stability in labor relations can be maintained, and fully informed consideration given to the labor requirements of the Armed Forces as well as to the social and economic problems of the Island.

UNIFORM WAGE SCALE AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT GOVERNING  
CIVILIANS EMPLOYED BY BRANCHES OF ALLIED ARMED FORCES  
ON ISLAND OF SICILY

**I. CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT - CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES.**

- (a) Eight (8) hours shall constitute a work day exclusive of meal time and time required to travel to and from work.
- (b) Time and one half shall be paid for work in excess of eight (8) hours in a given day. However, overtime work shall be discouraged in the interest of efficiency and employment of surplus labor; and shall be permitted only in case of emergency.
- (c) No extra compensation shall be paid for Sunday or Holiday work.
- (d) Civilian labor shall be employed at minimum rates for a probationary period of one week. Thereafter, the rates of pay may be revised within the maximum limit at the discretion of the employing arm or Service.
- (e) Wage rates in existing services, e.g. railroad, public utilities, etc., shall be continued unchanged until further notice. In cases where such services are actually taken over by the Armed Forces, civilian personnel of the particular organization involved shall not be placed on the military payroll.
- (f) All branches of the Allied Armed Forces, and all civilian contractors engaged to work for the Armed Forces, shall be bound by the provisions contained herein.
- (g) Branches of the Armed Forces which employ labor directly shall not be responsible for benefit payroll deductions directed and authorized by law. Responsibility for payment of such deductions shall

No extra compensation shall be paid for Sunday or Holiday work.

(d) Civilian labor shall be employed at minimum rates for a probationary period of one week. Thereafter, the rates of pay may be revised within the maximum limit at the discretion of the employing Army or Service.

(e) Wage rates in existing services, e.g. railroad, public utilities, etc., shall be continued unchanged until further notice. In cases where such services are actually taken over by the Armed Forces, civilian personnel of the particular organization involved shall not be placed on the military payroll.

(f) All branches of the Allied Armed Forces, and all civilian contractors engaged to work for the Armed Forces, shall be bound by the provisions contained herein.

(1) Branches of the Armed Forces which employ labor directly shall not be responsible for benefit payroll deductions directed and authorized by law. Responsibility for payment of such deductions shall be that of the individual employee.

(11) Civilian contractors engaged to work for the Armed Forces shall be responsible for making such employee payroll deductions and benefit payments as may be directed or authorized by law.
