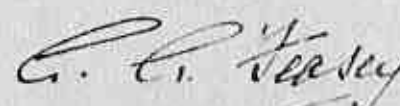

APPENDIX A. - CONTD.PROBLEMS.

SERIAL 1. At 0800hrs. the C.C.A.C. tells the Team Comd. "I want you to take your team to MICHELLE at once. You will have to proceed in convoy the first part of the way. Movement control can fit you in if you pass the Garde Mobile at 0900hrs. Speed 15 m.l.l. Density 20 V-T-1."

It is proposed to set up a central relief food store at MICHELLE for the GRAND RAILLON area. We shall need storage space for up to 2000 tins of foodstuffs, accommodation for 7 officers, 30 O.R.s, and about 100 Italian drivers, storemen etc, and parking space for up to 50 heavy vehicles. We may want to set up a workshop there for repairs to this M.T. I know it is a small place, compared to other towns in the neighbourhood, but it is thought best to locate the store there for public safety reasons. Speaking of which, the Carabinieri may have to be reinforced to find the necessary guards.

There is a convoy with 300 tons of foodstuffs at MAILLOT on the South side of the COL DE FINGOURA. The COL is blocked by snow and likely to stay blocked for six weeks. I want you to find out whether it would be possible to get this stuff over the COL by using local mules. It would be a great help in getting our food store going and I am afraid if we send it round by PALAICHE 10th Army Q will pinch the lot.

Is that quite clear? Let me have a report by 1700hrs. this afternoon.

Information Digest - Region IV.

(Restricted)

Region IV comprises the two "Regioni" of Lazio and Abruzzi-Molise, stretching about 100 miles across the Italian Peninsula; total area, 14,500 sq. mi.; population 4,600,000. Lazio and Abruzzi-Molise are roughly divided by the Central Apennines. As of December 18 the battlefront lies wholly within Region IV; approximately 2/3 of Abruzzi-Molise has been taken, but only a small area in Lazio. (See map).

LAZIO

GEOGRAPHY - Boundaries: North, Tuscany; East, Abruzzi-Molise; West the Tyrrhenian Sea; South, Campania. Main features: La Campagna Romana, fertile area surrounding Rome (volcanic soil); I Castelli Romani, around great crater of Alban Hills, famous for wine; Le Paludi Pontine (Pontine Marshes), reclaimed with considerable success by Fascist government.

Five Provinces: Frosinone (451,000); Littoria (224,000); Rieti (167,000); Viterbo (253,000); Roma (1,600,000). Total population, 3,000,000; total area 6,600 sq. mi. There are 347 communes, most of them very small.

Rivers, Tiber, navigable only for very small craft from Rome to sea; Garigliano, not navigable.

CLIMATE - Winters are mild; summers are hot; rainfall is light.

COMMUNICATIONS - Five main railway lines run into Rome: two connect with Northern Italy, one along coast, the other via Florence; one crosses the Apennines, connecting Rome with Adriatic Coast at Pescara; the "Diretissima" (electric) follows the coast to Naples and S. Italy; another line passing inland, goes to Naples. There are many suburban lines out of Rome.

CHARACTERISTICS OF PEOPLE - The aristocratic tradition of Rome has always been strong (few of the nobility were Fascists). Rome has a large and intelligent middle-class population, in addition to artisans and common people. The intelligenzia is centered in Rome.

ABRUZZI - MOLISE

GEOGRAPHY - Boundaries: North, Umbria; East, the Adriatic Sea; West, Lazio; South, Campania and Apulia. This is an extremely mountainous country which includes the southern and eastern sections of the Apennines. The topography is far more rugged in the south than further north.

Five Provinces: Aquila (356,000); Campobasso (387,000); Chieti (367,000); Pescara (206,000); Teramo (240,000). Total population 1,645,000; total area, 7,753 sq. mi. There are 416 communes, many of them very small.

The principal towns are Aquila (57,000); Campobasso (32,000); Chieti (35,000); Lanciano (24,000); Ortona (25,000); Pescara (62,000) and Teramo (36,000).

Rivers - The most important are: Sangro, Aterno, and Tronto. None is navigable.

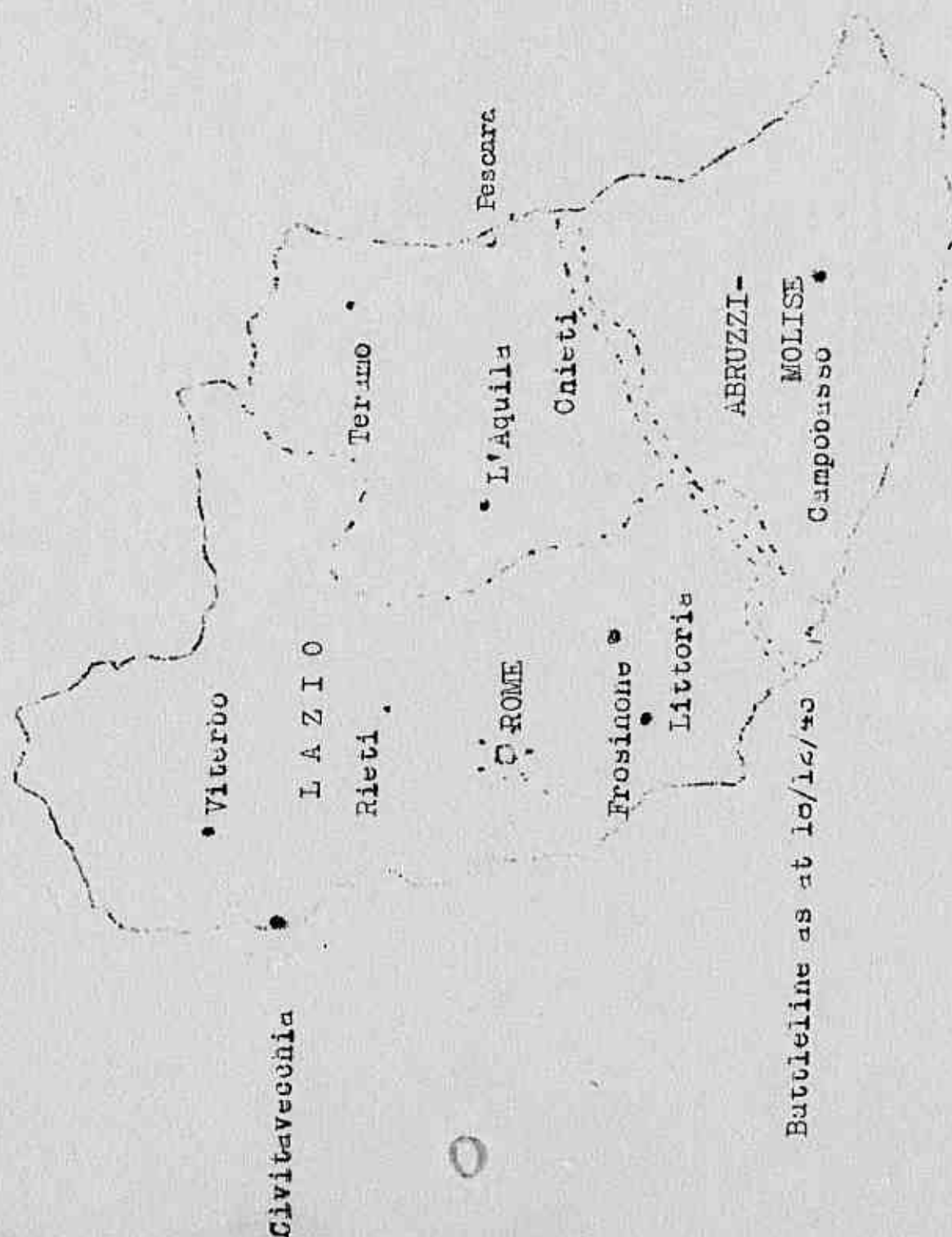

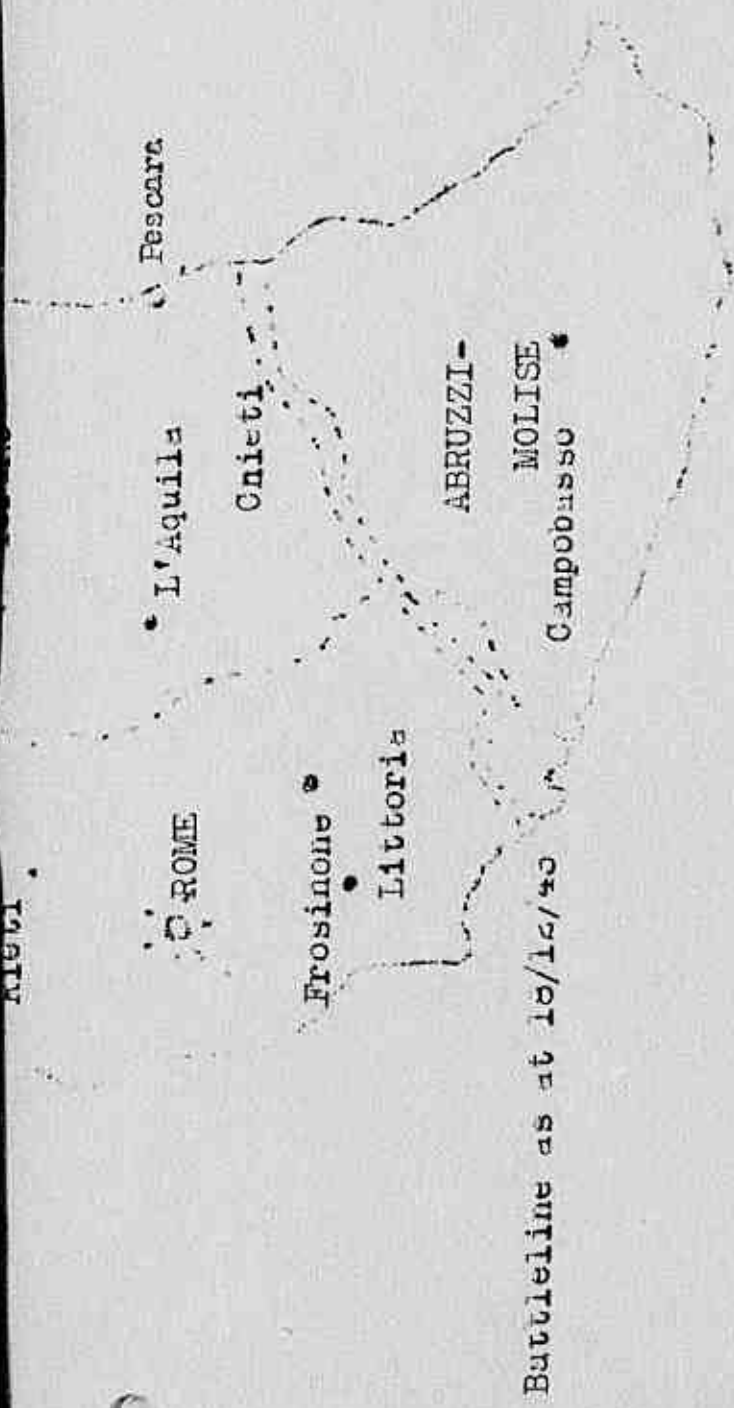

PROBLEM IN SUPPLY ESTIMATION

It is the 1st January 1944. The Battle Line has been stabilised for some weeks 50 miles south of the southernmost boundary of Region IX. At 1000hrs I Jan you, as Regional Civil Affairs Officer, are called to the office of the Chief Civil Affairs Officer, 15th Army Group, who says, "This is for your personal information only. At 0445hrs 15 Feb the town of RAVENNA received its first serious air raid of the war. Severe damage was done to the town. There was a direct hit on the Hotel used as a billet by the Provincial S.C.A.O. and his Officers. All these Allied Officers were killed or seriously wounded, except one Captain who escaped with a broken arm.

Lt Col Lynch-Blosse, the S.C.A.O. of FORLI, was awakened by the noise of the raid and, appreciating its importance, sent a Staff Officer and Despatch Rider across to RAVENNA to offer help. The Staff Officer found severe damage and serious dislocation of all telephone and other means of communication. He therefore sent the Despatch Rider back to FORLI with the news. Lt Col Lynch-Blosse passed the news to Regional Headquarters BOLOGNA and then started off to RAVENNA with all available Officers.

The demonstration should commence with the arrival of Lt Col Lynch-Blosse in RAVENNA at 0900hrs 15 Feb.

At 900 hrs infm was received by special DR from 8th Army that PRUGIA was too badly damaged to accomodate the Region HQ "for some time to come". Last evening our L.O. (Capt. Hotchkiss) with the 8th Army arrived. He is here to answer any questions, but the list of his report is as follows :- He had been told that H.Q. was at FOLLIGNO but had seen the Regional colours on the signpost on the main road and had come up to investigate.
