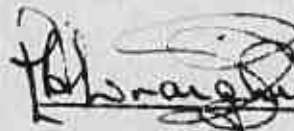
Sir,

The points contained in the enclosed letters have been investigated and I would report as follows.

1. The maximum of three parcels for Major F.H. Fletcher has been received at the School, and these have all been readdressed to Major Fletcher, Region 4 the following day.
2. Major Fletcher's letters have always been readdressed to Region 4 and never to Region 9. It is known however that Military Gov Section readdress mail to Region 9 as these have occasionally been received by the School via Region 9.
3. No remarks can be made regarding para 3. of Major Fletcher's letter without the envelope referred to. The Post Corporal denies having readdressed the mail of Major Fletcher's to any other Region, but admits that it may have been done by an assistant at some time.
4. The letters "Co, D" have never been used by the School at any time and their significance is not understood.
5. No information has come to light regarding the Mail Bag lost in transit on the 10th Jan.

6. Is any information available as to the contents of the Mail Bag which was lost in transit on 10th January.

- 1 I left Military Government School Tizzi Ouzou on Jan. 16th with "Party X", the movement order stating that Asst. Comdt. of the School would arrange for re-direction of letters.
2. My mail was not re-directed, and after I had been in Naples for over a week I wrote to the Postal Section of both Military Government Section and Military Government School, giving my address as Region 4. Letters were then sent on. I received eleven back letters in one batch on 30 Jan and have since received regular airletters and airgraphs.
3. On 20 Feb. I received three surface mail letters which had been redirected by the School to other Regions of AMG before being sent to "Co. D", thus reaching me. I enclose one envelope which shows that the letter was directed to Region 5 and another Region which I am unable to decipher. It will be appreciated that the last address, "Co. D", is not correct for British mail.
4. I am unable to appreciate this grossly haphazard method of dealing with mail. I presume that the same procedure is adopted with ORs mail, and it is an elementary principle of Man Management that a soldiers mail shall be dealt with accurately and expeditiously.
5. My family in England have despatched three or four parcels to me, commencing about 20 Nov. last, but so far none has reached me. It is known that a bag of British Mail was lost from a truck between Algiers and Tizzi Ouzou on Jan 10, which may account for one parcel as no information was made available as to the contents of this mailbag.
6. Due to past experience it will be understood that I lack confidence in the methods adopted by Military Government Section and/or the School for dealing with mail. The earlier parcels were addressed to me at Military Government Section, as this was the address given me before leaving England. M.G. Section were duly advised of my transfer to the

1. While it cannot be stated definitely, it is thought that consequent on the irregular inclusion of 'Allied Force H.Q.' in the address the items would be included with correspondence prepared at the Home Postal Centre for delivery to that H.Q.
2. It is understood that if received at AFHQ the item would normally be passed by the relative post orderly to the post orderly of the Mil. Gov. School & Holding Centre. Whether such procedure was followed in that instance cannot be confirmed but the absence of a forwarding address on the correspondence would indicate that the erroneous re direction to "Region 4" was effected through other than A.P.O. channels.
3. The endorsement "No record in Reg 4" accounts for the items being finally submitted to O2E for tracing purposes and a certain amount of delay is inevitable during such process.
4. In the circumstances, it would appear that the trouble has mainly arisen through the use of an incorrect address. In this connection it has been confirmed with M.G.S. (Br) AFHQ that the correct address for use by personnel employed at your HQ. is

Sir,

I had occasion to write to you about a week ago regarding certain missing mail addressed during August last to me at "O.T.A., A.F.H.Q., Algiers" which was the postal address given to me by the War Office when I left London.

On moving from the Military Govt. School I was notified that my address would in future be "A.C., A.M.G., C.M.F." and accordingly registered out at the School accordingly.

On 13 November, I received three letters from England forwarded correctly. I received no mail after that until today when I received the following packets:

1. Surface letter dated 27 Sep.
2. Surface letter dated 25 Sep from Pay Office, Manchester.
3. Surface letter dated 12 Oct.
4. Airgraph dated 14 Oct.
5. Air letter dated 10 Nov and sent direct to this address.

I am forwarding herewith the envelope of the first mentioned, from which it will be seen that someone has marked this letter "Unknown" and that it was only readdressed correctly on 2 Nov, by which time it had presumably been in North Africa for some time.

It is not unreasonable to suppose that three air letters, which are still missing, and which should have arrived in North Africa during the early part of this month addressed to me at the Military Government School, have also been marked "Unknown" and I should be obliged if this matter could be investigated. I have complied with all regulations as regards forwarding of mail, and it is distressing to receive letters after much delay marked in this fashion. As I am unable to say where the marking was put on, I feel it best for me to address you on this matter at the outset.

Dear Evans,

With reference to your letter of the 25th Oct., I have discussed the matter referred to with Lt.-Col. Aitken and have also examined the arrangements for dealing with mail at this Centre. The procedure for the receiving, sorting and distribution of correspondence is in conformity with the instructions laid down and appears to be satisfactory. This also applies to the treatment of correspondence for officers who have left the school and of correspondence wrongly circulated here. It is the latter correspondence which is the subject of complaint.

Lt.-Col. Aitken complains that there is, invariably, a considerable number of items circulated to the school without any apparent good reason and that this mistreatment inevitably causes delay to correspondence and gives rise to complaint. He is particularly interested in this aspect of the matter because he is constantly receiving complaints of non-receipt of mail from officers who have left the Centre and he feels that this correspondence may, also, be mistreated although correctly redirected according to records here.

During my inspections of the arrangements this morning, I selected the enclosed items ^{actually received in last night's incoming mail} and I think that you will agree that there is no reason why any of the items should have circulated here. A recent classic case of mistreatment was a letter addressed to :-

Gen. The Hon

Sir Harold Alexander K.C.B., C.A.G., C.S.I., D.S.O., M.C.
A.F., H.Q.

which was re-addressed H.Q., A.M.G.O.T. and sent to Tizi-Ouzou.

This letter was referred to in a letter (ASC - Post/29 dated Oct. 12 '43) which Lt.-Col. Aitken sent to M.G.S., A.F., H.Q., and which should presumably have been reported to you.

Lt.-Col. Aitken recently called at your H.Q. to make representation regarding the miscirculation of correspondence but was apparently referred from there to the Camp Commandant A.F., H.Q. + who, to save further delay, had a personal interview on the matter with Captain Bailey.

Now that you have placed a check on the correspondence circulated to the M.G.S. & H.C., the complaint should be rectified.

I am leaving here on Friday the 29th October and there is no other Postal Representative here but I have arranged with Lt.-Col. Aitken, that if there is any further cause for complaint he will visit you personally at your Headquarters.

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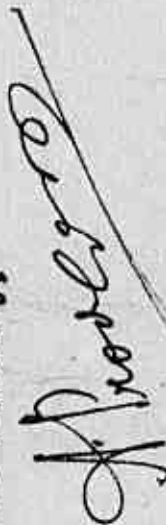

A great number of letters (British Mail) are being misdirected to this school. In some cases the original address is crossed out and re-addressed to AGHQ without any apparent reason. In others there is no mention in the address of either AGHQ or Military Government School.

It would appear that occasionally all the mail of a convoy Serial Number irrespective of whether they belong to AGHQ or the Military Government Section are forwarded and addressed "en bloc" to the school.

There is unexcused negligence somewhere and the officers concerned are the unfortunate sufferers as the school, in conformity to procedure adopted, will all letters for officers not on the school register for a week in case of non arrival.

MAIL PROCESSING

Incoming mail will be disposed of as follows, immediately on arrival in the Post Office at London:

- Mail will be sorted out into two groups. Officers and O.D. mail.
- O.D. mail will be sent immediately to the British H. Q. Office and handed over to the A.P.O. on duty there who will be responsible for the issue of mail to individuals.

(c) Officers' mail will then be divided as follows:-

1. Officers' mail only.
2. Officers' mail only.

Mail placed in box as possible into the respective letter boxes at Windsor and London for officers' mail.

(d) The post corporal or assistant will, in the following morning at 0830 hours, re-collect all mail remaining in the letter boxes at Windsor and London for a further "posting out" as in the next sub para (e).

(e) Re-shipment of officers' letters will be made as follows.

- (1) The boxes will be checked with the two registration books.

- (2) All mail of officers shown as still at the school will be returned to the appropriate letter box.

- (3) All mail of officers whose name appears in the Registration Book for officers who have left the school will be returned to the A.P.O. A.P.O. or other redressed with the new address if known or otherwise, marked "left the school".

- (4) All other officers' letters which cannot be traced through either book will be kept a week in case of new arrivals and then returned to A.P.O. A.P.O. marked "unknown letters". Before return of these

Letters the Camp Commandant should be asked for confirmation that the officers in question are not known here.

5. The Post Corporal will allot and mark spaces on the letter shelf in his office for the various assortment of letters awaiting distribution, forwarding or being temporarily retained, i.e. for officers temporarily detached, etc.
6. The Post Corporal's Office will always be kept clean, orderly and tidy and no odd letters will be left about except in their correct assortment as marked on the shelves.
7. No officer or other rank unless on "post office" duty will be allowed to enter the office except the Assistant School Commandant or Camp Commandant. A notice showing "OUT OF BOUNDS TO ALL RANKS" will be posted on the outside of the door.
8. No American mail will be handled or retained in the British Post Office.
9. The Post Office will be kept locked whenever there is no one inside on duty.
