1/. As a result of a visit to Churchill By Lt-Col. Robertson and an interview with Lt-Col. N.H. Huttenbach of Region 8 on 30th Dec 43, the following policy was agreed to and is submitted for confirmation.

- (a) A.F.H.Q., will retain all accommodation now in use at Churchill after the departure of Region 8.
- (b) Any hand over will be between Region 8 and the Military Government School and Holding Centre who will send up representatives of their permanent staff, in due course, to take over from Region 8.
- (c) Requisitions for the Hotel and other buildings will not be terminated.
- (d) All accommodation stores not in use, will be returned by empty ration lorries and other trucks going to Judgement - American stores to 2675th Regiment - British stores to Q.M., Military Government School.

2/. As regards para 1 (c) I attach as an appendix a list of the accommodation now in use - It will be noted that, prior to the visit of Lt-Col. Robertson, 5 small villas had already been closed, inventories checked, dilapidations noted and the keys handed back to a representative of the French Administration. These villas are lying empty as a result of the move of over 50 Officers away from Churchill in the last few weeks - they can be taken back immediately on charge if desired.

3/. The requisition for the Hotel calls on the lessee to provide all fuel for cooking, lighting, heating, etc., in the Hotel. It will be necessary for provision to be made for an adequate supply of wood for this purpose whether there are any Officers, EM or OR's in the Hotel or not.

4/. Certain Engineer fixtures e.g. stoves and water fittings are being left in place in the various buildings and are not being dismantled - they will be required so long as the buildings are retained for use.

5/. I would draw attention to my letter R8/53/5 (Admin) dated 28th Nov 43, and as needed.

- (d) All accommodation stores not in use, will be returned by empty ration lorries and other trucks going to Judgement - American stores to 2675th Regiment - British stores to Q.M., Military Government School.

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These villas are lying empty as a result of the move of over 50 Officers away from Churchill in the last few weeks - they can be taken back immediately on charge if desired.

3/. The requisition for the Hotel calls on the lessee to provide all fuel for cooking, lighting, heating, etc., in the Hotel. It will be necessary for provision to be made for an adequate supply of wood for this purpose whether there are any Officers, EM or OR's in the Hotel or not.

4/. Certain Engineer fixtures e.g. stoves and water fittings are being left in place in the various buildings and are not being dismantled - they will be required so long as the buildings are retained for use.

5/. I would draw attention to my letter R8/53/5 (Admin) dated 28th Nov 43, and as regards para 1, recommend that the school be handed back to the French authorities as soon as Region 8 moves out of Churchill. As regards para 2 no corrected copy of 957 inventory referred to has been received here.

Report on School at Churchill.

Upon inspecting the School it was found that damage of a more severe nature had been sustained (this was probably in view of the fact that the building had been used as men's dining room and cook house).

It was estimated as follows:-

Tiled floor of small room extensively chipped.
All walls splashed and discoloured.
Communicating door had apparently at some time been removed resulting in severe defacement and damage to Lock and Jamb.
Two windows panes above door broken.
Locking Bar of door shutter missing
Three keys lost.

Whilst some effort had been made, the rooms were not left in a satisfactory clean and tidy order. A fatigue party with mops, brushes and a supply of hot water is necessary to clean up the place. With my small party and in view of other tasks I could not undertake to complete this work in the time available.

2. It is now almost certain that the 2 buckets latrine, referred to in this office memo. R8/4/12 dated 14th. December, 1943, were loaded on to one of the lorries engaged in moving stores from Churchill on 17th. January, 1944, but the exact point at which they were off-loaded cannot be ascertained. It is thought that they may have been unloaded at the Stadium and taken into immediate use without the authority of this Region. Investigations are proceeding and as soon as they are located they will be handed over to Q.M. Stores.

3. For your information, none of the stores in use at Detachment Churchill were vouchered over to this Region on the march-out of Region 9 and had it not been for the fact that an Accommodation Stores Ledger, A.B.165 was already in existence in this Region, in which all physical stocks left by Region 9 were brought on charge by Certificate Receipt Voucher, no record of the stores in use at the station would have been available.

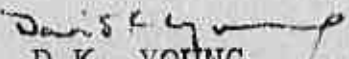

1/. As a result of a visit to Churchill by Lt-Col. Robertson and an interview with Lt.-Col. N.H. Huttenbach of Region 8 on 30th Dec 43, the following policy was agreed to and is submitted for confirmation.

- ✓ (a) A.F.H.Q., will retain all accommodation now in use at Churchill after the departure of Region 8.
- ✓ (b) Any hand over will be between Region 8 and the Military Government School and Holding Centre who will send up representatives of their permanent staff, in due course, to take over from Region 8.
- ✓ (c) Requisitions for the Hotel and other buildings will not be terminated.
- ✓ (d) All accommodation stores not in use, will be returned by empty ration larries and other trucks going to Judgement - American stores to 2675th Regiment - British stores to Q.M., Military Government School.

2/. As regards par 1 (c) I attach as an appendix a list of the accommodation now in use - It will be noted that, prior to the visit of Lt-Col. Robertson, 5 small villas had already been closed, inventories checked, dilapidations noted and the keys handed back to a representative of the French Administration.
These villas are lying empty as a result of the move of 50 Officers away from Churchill in the last few weeks - they can be taken back immediately on charge if desired.

3/. The requisition for the Hotel calls on the lessee to provide all fuel for cooking, lighting, heating, etc., in the Hotel. It will be necessary for provision to be made for an adequate supply of wood for this purpose whether there are any Officers, Em or OR's in the Hotel or not.
