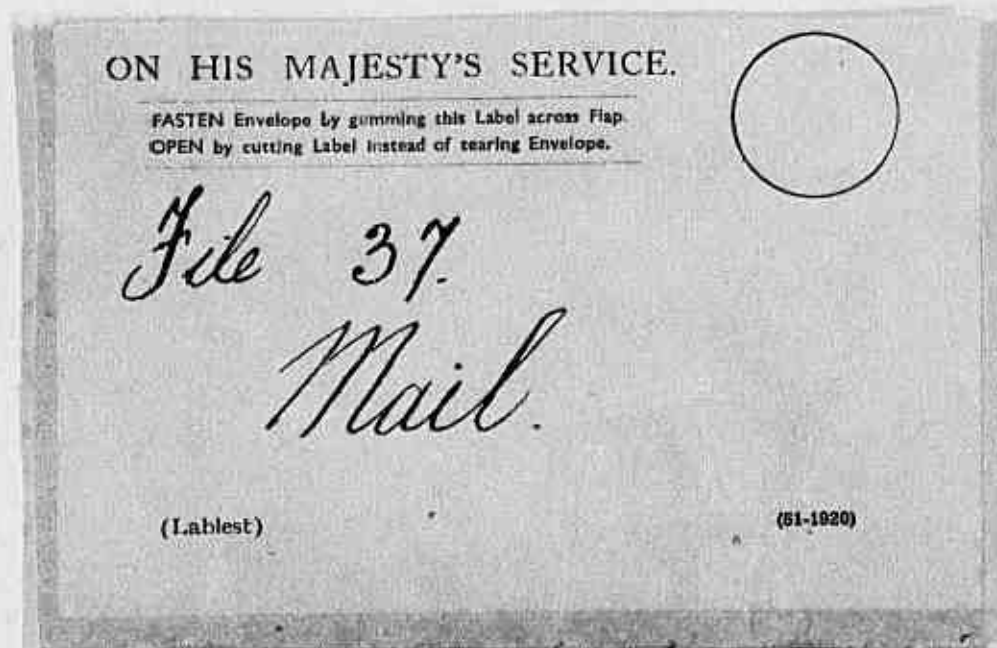

1. Investigation indicates that it has become almost universal practice throughout this theater to dispatch via letter dispatch letter services, Air Dispatch letter services, and Army Courier Service, often under official franking, communications and packages which are purely personal, shoes underwear and other personal items have been discovered where packages have broken open in transit. This practice has resulted in a considerable increase of AMC, AMC and AMC loads which are entirely unwarranted and unnecessary and have interfered with the proper transmission of official matter.

2. The AMC, AMC, and AMC services are provided for transmitting official mail only as outlined in letters this AG 311.1-5, AMC, dated 13 July 1943 and 1st Nov-ember 1943, and Signal Instruction Nos. 2, and 85, this H. C. C.

TO :- All concerned.

1. Investigation indicates that it has become almost universal practice throughout this theater to dispatch via Inter Dispatch Letter Service, Air Dispatch Letter Service, and Army Courier Service, often under official franking, communications and packages which are purely personal, since underwear and other personal items have been discovered where packages have broken open in transit. This practice has resulted in a considerable increase of R.E.S., A.E.S. and A.S. losses which are entirely unwarranted and have interfered with the proper transmission of official matter.

2. The R.E.S., A.E.S. and A.S. services are provided for transmitting official mail only as outlined in letters thin File No. 311.1-5. AR, dated 1st July 1943 and 1st November 1943, and signal instruction No. 4, and 65, this R. E. S.

3. Immediately upon receipt of this letter, commanding officers of units and formations stationed in this theater, British and U.S., will so instruct all concerned with the contents of this letter and issue explicit instructions that under no circumstances will other than official communications be transmitted by R.E.S., A.E.S. and A.S.

4. Effective immediately, all personnel on duty with R.E.S., A.E.S. and A.S. will be instructed to decline to accept any envelope or package unless it has on it the following statement :- OFFICIAL (AIR DEPARTMENT) (OR OFFICIAL MAIL) and signed by an officer whose name, rank, and unit will be clearly shown.

5. Officers in charge of R.E.S., A.E.S. and A.S. and officers of the Adjutant General's Department engaged in the handling for transmission of official communications and authorized to open packages suspected to be of an official nature, special care will be taken that no material bearing an indication that the material is operational is opened. Material found to have been mailed in violation of this directive will be held and a brief report made direct to this headquarters, the attention of the Adjutant General, showing:

- (a) Description of the envelope or package.
- (b) Place from which dispatched.
- (c) The name, rank and unit of officer who certified the article to be official.

SUBJECT:- Censorship Reports.

1. Recent censorship reports indicate that unit censorship is becoming increasingly unpopular, one of the reasons being alleged breaches of confidence on part of the censoring unit officers, and another that officers often do not censor letters for two or three days after receiving them and thus delay their posting.
2. If any such allegations are true the matter is one of some seriousness. Unit Commanders will draw the attention of all officers serving under them to FSPB Pamphlet 3, 1939, para 22(3), and to the grave view which will be taken of any breach of confidence and duty.
3. FSPB Pamphlet 3, 1939, para 22(3) reads as follows:-
"The franking of correspondence.
3. Officers franking correspondence will respect and preserve the secrecy of information which comes into their possession in the performance of their duties. They will on no account discuss or divulge any such matters either in public or in private, except when the interests of the public service require a report to a senior authority".
4. It is suggested that where possible censorship should be carried out by sub units' officers exchanging their mail and censoring the other sub units' letters.

 2. (a) The censor stamp will be kept by an officer.
(b) The censor stamp will be kept under lock and key.
 2. The Camp Commandant will hold and be responsible for the safe custody of the censor stamp.
 3. Officers detailed by roster to censor other ranks' mail will collect the stamp daily at 1700 hours from the Camp Commandant and will mutually arrange with him the time at which the stamp will be returned to him.
 4. Lt. Challoner will be responsible for stamping all officers' mail at 0830 hours in the "Post Office". He will obtain the Censor stamp from the Camp Commandant at that time and return it to the Camp Commandant on completion of his duty.

All incorrectly censored officers mail will be returned to the officer concerned, if the sender cannot be traced the Assistant Commandant should be informed that the necessary announcement may be made over the microphone at the next mornings parade, to trace the owners.

On Sept 5th I left the Military Government school & reported to AMGOT HQ, Sicily. Since then I have received no mail whatsoever, in spite of the most categorical assurance that all letters, airmails etc would be forwarded immediately. As immediately prior to my departure, mail addressed to myself, was beginning to arrive from England, I can only feel that some very serious clerical error has taken place & would be very glad if the matter could

be looked into. I have heard similar complaints from other English officers, who have recently arrived from N. Africa. In addition this state of affairs is particularly ^{annoying} ~~and~~ as the American mail continues to arrive with the utmost regularity.

Secondly, I was obliged to leave a Revelation Suit case behind (I have a receipt for it). This suitcase was clearly marked with my name & ~~old~~ present address & again I was promised most categorically that it would be forwarded at once. The contents are valuable & so far no news whatsoever about it has been received. It is hardly necessary to add that this is both disturbing & inconvenient!

I am very sorry to have to bother you about these things, but would regard it as a very great favour if you could use your influence to get the matter rectified.

1. Difficulties at present exist in arranging for the prompt disposal of mail and baggage of Officers and Other Ranks after they are posted overseas from the Military Government School and Centre.

These difficulties apply both to individual Officers and O.Rs. and to advanced parties of Regions and entire activated Regions, and are complex on account of the differences in British and American organization.

2. American Mail. Satisfactory arrangements exist for forwarding.

3. British Mail. Mail arriving for Officers and O.Rs. who have left the School and Holding Centre is despatched the following morning to the new address, if known, otherwise they are endorsed "Left School" and are returned to the APO.

4. British and American Baggage. The problem is the disposal of baggage after Officers have left the School. It falls under two heads, viz.,

(1) Officers who arrived at the School in possession of full scale of baggage:- In this case surplus baggage in excess of scale for air or sea passage is left at the School. This applies mostly to Officers detailed to proceed by air.

(11) Officers who arrive at the School by air, and who leave before the balance of their baggage arrives not in possession of full scale of baggage:- In this case their baggage subsequently arrives at the M.F.O. organization, Algiers.

5. (a) Suggested Solution. It is clear from the above that two things are required:-

(1) A correct postal address for mail must be notified to School, Postal Service, and 2nd Echelon, for both individual Officers and O.Rs. and also Regions when they are ordered to leave the

 - (ii) A correct address must similarly be given both to the School and to M.F.O. in respect of baggage.
 - (b) Both School and Planning Staff are quite willing to assume responsibility in the matter, but they are not at present in a position to do so. We suggest that:-
 - (1) You should be responsible for notifying authorities as in (a) above. School will then be responsible for forwarding any letters which arrive for personnel who have left.
 - (ii) The School should furnish you with the names of Officers coming under category (1) of para. 5 above, i.e. who have been ordered away and who have left baggage behind, giving particulars of duty on which despatched so far as known. You should then furnish School with address to which baggage should be consigned. School will then label baggage and take it by road to M.F.O., Algiers for onward transmission.

(ii) School should furnish you with names of Officers ordered away who come under category (ii) of para. 4 above, together with particulars of duty so far as known. You should then notify M.F.O., and instruct him to forward baggage accordingly when it arrives at Algiers. (Baggage in this category should emphatically NOT be sent to the school).
If preferred, the School could instruct the M.F.O. direct on receipt from you of correct consignment address.

6. Will you kindly forward your comments on this letter, with which the Commandant, Military Government School and Holding Centre is in agreement.
