It contained small things, a black pair of Army boots, a pair of brown shoes new and of high quality, and some technical (Engineering) papers and small books etc which to me are most important.

2. I have a strong impression that the pack MUST be here at Tizi Ouzou, as I saw the pack on the deck of the ship with all the other baggage.

It is now 11 days, and I wish to ask if I may go round with one of your Staff, when the batmen are on duty some morning after breakfast, and make a personal search. Nothing less is likely to be effective. The batmen themselves seem to be doing nothing about it. It may be lying in another officer's room.

The matter is now very urgent.
