9. Each OR's/EM's baggage will be limited to shelter-half (EM), ground sheet (or Gas Cape), 2 blankets and small kit. The balance of baggage will be carried on British and American baggage lorries with the 2nd Section in Convey.

10. Quartermaster will issue the following stores to Officer i/o Section:-
