DAR DIARY

Course of Instruction - Chiva

This course was initiated by Major General Theobald Kennell of 1st Airborne Division for officers destined for specific duties in connection with military administration. The Staff is Anglo-American, and the conduct of the Camp is linked with H.Q. 141 Force.

9 May 1943

Capt R.W. Harriman, RA and Lt J. Pearson started from Algiers to effect the occupation of premises, previously surveyed for a School. They came into touch with Major Beale, then Major Douville, and Mr. Evans, RASC of D.I.D. ELIDA. Capt Harriman to be Camp Commandant, Lt Pearson Adjutant of the course.

11 May 1943

Inventories were made of the buildings of the "Enfants de la Montagne" and of the Hotel Allemand. The keys of the former were delivered at 1830 hrs. Major Beale - Major Pearson of H.Q. 141 Force, also visited the sites.

12 May 1943

A party of 67 American troops (arrived 10th evening) and 33 British (arrived 11th afternoon), who had lodged in the Ski Club (taken over on 10th morning) moved in to the Hospital buildings of "Enfants de la

They came into touch with Major Beale, 10th Major Douffeville, and Lt. Evans, RASC, of DID, BLIDA. Capt Harriman took Camp Commandant, Lt Pearson Adjutant of the course.

11 May 1943

Inventory was made of the buildings of the "Enfants de la Montagne" and of the Hotel Allemand. The keys of the former were delivered at 1830 hrs. Major Beale - Major Teasley of HQ, 141 Force, also visited the sites.

12 May 1943

A party of 67 American troops (arrived 10th evening) and 33 British (arrived 11th afternoon), who had lodged in the Ski Club (taken over on 10th morning), moved in to the Hospital buildings of "Enfants de la Montagne". Water, light and rations had been arranged. The Americans were led by Lt Zimmerman and ^{DAVIS} Lt Davis, and they brought a Medical Officer, Lt Price. Lt Baker is their Liaison Officer in HQ, 141 Force. The French Divisional General of the Area, and

a staff of five officers, visited the premises in the morning, and Major Teasley and Teasley Smith in the afternoon.

13 May 1943

Lt Col Atkinson, S.H.A. Commandant of the course, arrived with Lt Col Douglass-Lansan (G-1) and Major Teasley Smith (Finance) on a tour of inspection. Capt H.E.F. Parmer (Internat. and Law) was also in the party.

Capt Binn (Haring-Regimentary) and Capt Gilpin (Catering) also visited the Hospital buildings in the morning.

The Hotel Allenward and Villa 74 "Hove" were taken over, the former as billeting and A mess, the latter as Camp Officers. The Hospital mess was used by all Camp Officers in the evening.

The following villas were taken over by Col Britten when inventories had been made :-

63 (Briggs) 35 (Leak) 42 (Weary) 69 (Wigan) 70 (Alpine). A Signals Officer selected a site for the Camp Telephone Exchange. Medical-Casualty returns were sent to HQ, 141 Force.

Major Todley with and Capt Secretariat and Capt Bentley (Finnish) arrived with 10 British OR. Capt Binn inspected Deary and Leak.

Major Seale came to inspect new villas required. Inventories were made of "Studio", "Thistle", and the villas taken over.

New names given to villas, American on the hill, British round School. Lt Col Bennett, Major Spafford, Smith, Lt Bell, Baker, Verdier arrived. Col Britten took over "London", "Bristol", "Boston" and "Hall". 14 men of Corps of Signals arrived for work.

Conference regarding WE/TO with Lt Col Spafford & Maxwell. Majors Korwell & Gorman and Group Captain Bentley arrived. Lt Jones & 43 REs came to lay out tented camp, attend to plumbing & wiring etc.

Telephone exchange (Chord OZS) installed by RCS. Lt Krupa arrived - WE/TO prepared for submission.

Civil telephones connected in Officers Camp and Hotel Allenward. Col Britten & Algers - back with Major Seaton The Lord Kenneth of Todd. Major Woolley, Pletcher, AAQM9, with Major Seaton in conference regarding supplies. Lt Col Seaton arrived.

Camp laid out. Lt Q. N. Sinclair, RF, arrived with Lt Col Bolles, Hill.

Seaton, Todley and Major Scheele, Knight, Graft, Witte and Martin. All OR/EM under canvas with RE detachment. RCS detachment.
