1. With reference to ARO 492/43, the aims of the Army Education Scheme are as follows:-

- (a) To assist in maintaining morale by providing interesting and profitable facilities during leisure hours of all ranks.
- (b) To stimulate mental alertness, thereby improving the individual as a soldier.
- (c) To make the soldier "duty-conscious" as a future citizen of the British Empire.

2. To implement this policy, facilities, as outlined in Appx "A" to this letter are available by application to the Area Education Officer.

3. It is considered that most practicable activities are informal and should be held outside training or working hours, but Comd and O&C are authorised to widen the scope of the scheme at their discretion.

4. It would be of assistance to my Area Education Officer if Comd and O&C would forward names, subjects and availability of suitable officers and other ranks who are willing and able to give lectures and organise discussions in their own and adjacent units.

Subject: Education in HOPRIFIED

1. The AMGOT plan contemplates an Educational Advisor to the C.C.A.O.
2. The C.C.A.O. in his Notes on Miscellaneous Services (23/4) speaks of a Director of Education at the Hq of the Military Government.
3. It is clear that much executive action of a technical nature will certainly be required in connection with Education, which it would not be practicable for the Central Secretariat to handle direct. It would seem necessary therefore to consider amending the layout of AMGOT to create a Division with a Director of Education, with a small staff of officers.
4. If this is agreed, it will be for consideration <sup>whether</sup> / the existing post of <sup>ex</sup> advisor should be retained but under the Director, (Maj. Public Health Dept.) or abolished. If the second course is adopted the qualifications of the Director or his No. 2 would need to include wide Educational knowledge in addition to / of Educational administration.
5. The question of whether the allocation of this post will need to be submitted to Washington and London also arises.
6. The question of studying the existing <sup>curriculum</sup> / with a view to modifying in ~~is~~ order to get schools started as soon as possible will need considerable study and it is suggested that the C.C.A.O. should take up this question either now, or after the existing post have been settled.
7. If the Directorate is decided upon, the selection of personnel will need careful consideration.
