1. a. Individuals will carry emergency rations as follows:

CENT Units	1 D and 2 K
DHE Units	1 D and 2 K
JCSS Units	1 C, 1 D, and 1 K

Rations will be obtained through normal channels. Service Group Quartermasters requisition through M.A.A.S.C. QM's.

- b. The advance elements of the following units will carry 7 days rations with unit equipment: 31st Fighter Group, 58th Fighter Squadron, 3rd Communication Squadron, 82nd Fighter Control Squadron, 927th Signal Bn., ASC, Prov. A.W. Signal Bn., 815th Engineer, Air Formation Signal Det., #8035 CCI, #8044 CCI. The following detachments will carry 5 days rations with unit equipment: #1 ALC Signal Sec., #1, #2 and #3 Beach Dets., Det. #981, #982 and #985 Balloon DETS., #1 Field Force Signals Section; 2 LWS, 3201 Servicing Commando. These rations will be loaded on personnel ships at ports. All other units will carry two (2) days rations with unit equipment.
2. Water Trailers and water cans will be filled prior to shipment.
3. Motor vehicles will have full fuel tanks, and cooling systems, and will carry 5 gal. of water for the cooling system.
- c. (1) 3rd Comm. Sqdn., 82nd Fighter Control Sqdn., and Prov. A.W. Signal Bn. will waterproof vehicles in the first three echelons.
- (2) The following units will waterproof vehicles in the first and second echelons:

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- (4) Waterproofing will be obtained from the Service Command through normal automotive parts supply channels. Requisition by type and number of vehicles plus 25%. Waterproofing will be accomplished by transportation sections at ports of embarkation under supervision of Ordnance Companies (M) (Q) and S. O. S.

Signal Bn., RAF Air Formation Signal Det., #1 ALG, #1, 2 and 3 Beach Pts., Pts. #981, #982 and #985 Balloon Sqdn., #1 Field Force Hq. Signal Section, #8035 GCI, #8044 GCI, 2 LWS, and #3201 Servicing Commando, will be provided with 100 hours operation of fuel and oil in the unit supplies.

- (1) 40 hours operating requirements will be provided for such equipment of the advance echelon of the 33rd Fighter Group, 27th and 86th Bomb. Groups, 111th Observation Sqdn., 3rd Communication Sqdn., 82nd Fighter Control Sqdn., 927th Signal Bn., ASC, Provisional A. W. Signal Bn., Air Formation Signal Det., #2 ALG Signal Section, #324 Fighter Wing Hq. Signal Section, #8035 GCI (Bal), #8043 GCI (Nucleus), #8044 GCI (Bal), Medical Receiving Station, #3202, #3203 Servicing Commando, Wing ALO, and #14 and #15 W.U.

4. The advance echelon of all tactical units will carry portable refueling pumps.
5. Airplane engines with over 100 hours this date will be changed.
6. Advance Squadrons of tactical groups will carry 3 Table I Supply kits.
 - a. Advance Squadrons of Tactical Groups will carry three 10 day supply kits of Table II Supplies. Other Squadrons will carry one kit.
7. Combat echelons will be provided with life vests and rafts immediately. This equipment will be properly maintained.
8. Only personal C.W.S. protective equipment will be carried: gas masks, plicofilm gas cape, protective ointment, shoe impregnate and organizational gas curtains.

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- a. Stocks of Chile of Lima will be turned in to the Base C.M.S. officer immediately.
9. Troops in the advanced echelons of units in Par. 1 will carry only field packs and necessary hand tools. Tools will be loaded in vehicles if possible. The balance of the baggage will be carried by the second echelon of the Group or Squadron.
- a. Personal baggage 125 lbs. per individual, excluding flying equipment.

10. All maintenance equipment not necessary for first and second maintenance will move with second or later echelons of units.
11. a. Equipment will be packed in packages of less than 200 lbs. All packages of a greater weight must be loaded in vehicles prior to movement.
- b. Equipment that will be damaged by immersion in water will be packed in waterproof containers.
- c. Vehicles will be loaded so that no part of the load extends beyond the dimensions of the vehicle.
- (1) bows will not be removed and the cover will be pulled down snugly.
12. a. All packages, vehicles and equipment will be prominently marked with the destination: (see letter this Hq. 9 June 1943, Sub: Destination of Units).
- b. Unit designations will be used without showing the type of unit.
- c. Force numbers will be obliterated.
- d. Air Force units will mark all packages with two blue bands two inches (2") wide and four inches (4") apart, around the short circumference. Bands will be centered on the package.
- e. Priority for unloading will be indicated by the following:

1st Priority	XX
2nd Priority	AA
3rd Priority	BB

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- (1) Air Force Signal Units in par. 1 will use priority AA.
 - (2) All other Air Force Units will use priority BE.
 - (3) The code will be placed on two (2) adjacent sides and one end of all packages.
12. a. For water movements, units will be divided among vessels. Personnel and equipment will be on the same ship when possible. When not possible unit C.O.'s will make every effort to place a detachment on the ship to coordinate the assembly of the equipment after unloading.
- b. Drivers will remain with vehicles.
- c. Units will place guards over equipment to prevent loss or damage and to supervise the loading.
13. All personnel will carry one unit of fire.
14. All references to 1st Bomb. Group, 27th Bomb. Group, should be changed to 91st Squadron, 27th Bomb. Group.
15. Add "Field Jack" to list of personal equipment.
16. Modify Sheath Knife to read "Sheath Knife (Combat Crews Only)".

SUBJECT: Disposition of Captured Enemy Cryptographic Material.**TO :** All Concerned.

1. It is believed that during the recent campaign in Tunisia, various cryptographic documents and/or devices may have come into the hands of United States Units operating in the field.

2. Any and all information of this type is of real value and, if handled promptly may be of decisive importance. The effective date of documents or the fact they may be incomplete, is of minor importance. Sufficient information may be contained therein to be of extreme operational value, if the material can be placed immediately in the hands of personnel qualified to exploit it.

3. Items of principal interest include:

- a. Cryptographic Devices.
- b. Code Books.
- c. Cipher Key Lists.
- d. Signal Instructions.
- e. Plain and/or cipher texts of messages.
- f. Technical Manuals.

4. It is desired that all commanders direct personnel within their commands to forward such material as may be found to The Chief Signal Officer, Allied Force Headquarters, by the most expeditious means possible.

Subject:- INSTRUCTIONS RE ACCEPTANCE OF LOCAL SURRENDERS.

To : General Officer Commanding, Force 343.
General Officer Commanding, 12th Army.

1. Local commanders may only accept unconditional surrender by enemy troops or authorities in immediate contact with their own troops and no reservations of any kind are to be made. The civil authorities in areas so affected are to place all the resources of the area at the disposal of, and undertake to carry out any measures which may be required by the commanders in these areas.
2. Local commanders receiving offers of surrender of enemy formations, areas, or urban centres not in immediate contact with their own troops will notify Task Force Commanders, reporting the nature of the offer received, by whom made or purporting to be made (giving rank, appointment etc) and any credentials presented to establish authenticity. Local commanders are not authorised to discuss terms or to make or put forward recommendations.
3. Unless the situation requires otherwise Task Force Commanders will refer any offers of surrender of formations or areas not in contact with their troops to Headquarters 141 Force. Should however, immediate action be necessary the following conditions will be demanded.
 - (a) Axis Civil, Naval, Military and Air Force authorities in the area affected to order immediate cessation of hostilities against the Allied Forces.
 - (b) Axis ground, sea and air forces in the area to surrender unconditionally.
 - (c) The civil authorities in the area undertake to place the whole resources of the area at the disposal of, and to carry out such measures as may be required for or on behalf of, the Allied Commander-in-Chief.
4. Without prejudice to the unconditional nature of a surrender in the above mentioned circumstances, the following conditions are given for the personal guidance of Task Force Commanders. These will be observed where applicable :-

4. Without prejudice to the unconditional nature of a surrender in the above mentioned circumstances, the following conditions are given for the personal guidance of Task Force Commanders. These will be observed where applicable :-

- (a) Destruction or damage of arms, ships, aircraft, ammunition, equipment, installations, buildings, airframes, stores, fuel, supplies, animals, documents, maps, charts, sketches, photographs, ciphers and records of AXIS land, Sea and Air Forces will cease and they will be placed undamaged at the disposal of the Allied Forces.
- (b) All members of the AXIS Land, Sea and Air Forces, including members of the FASIST Militia under arms will be treated in the first instance as prisoners of war. Task Force or Unit Commanders MAY permit such Naval personnel as they deem desirable to remain aboard ship.

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- (c) Italian air victims will, if deemed necessary, by the Task Force or this Commander, supplies and deliver to the Allied Commander such rules of personnel included in the regular Italian Navy, Military and Air Forces, the FASCIST Militia, the GUARDIA DI FINANZA, the POLIZIA and such other military, and law enforcement agencies as may be required.

Appropriate authorities will take such measures as the Allied authorities may require of them to maintain the security of the Allied Forces and law, order and peaceable civil government throughout the area.
- (i) All ports and port facilities, lighthouses and other aids to navigation, public and industrial installations, all means of transportation, including roads, bridges, locomotives, rolling stock, railways, public utility services and other conveyances will be maintained intact together with their full operational staffs.
- (j) All telegraph, telephone and wireless services and all telecommunication services of any other form whatsoever will be allowed down and placed, in good order, at the disposal of the Allied authorities.
- (k) Measures will be taken by the local authorities to prevent damage to or removal or destruction of public or private, movable or immovable property, including any currency, such and valuable securities, stocks of art and archives.
- (l) All cultural institutions will be safeguarded.

Tunnel accommodation to be as shown on the amended plan attached.

Staff of 39 Officers and 37 O.Rs. to have Tunnel accommodation as shown on the amended plan and in outside office accommodation in half only of the building being prepared for offices South of CARUCHIN CHURCH. Suggest rooms originally noted as being for Engineer Officers and Clerks, C.S.C. and P.A. Officers and Clerks be earmarked.

One office room of about 150 ft. sq. is required as near as possible to the Combined War Room in the LAGAN'S TUNNEL.

Two Senior General Officers and P.A.'s will be accommodated at the Palace as originally arranged by Lieut-Colonel Gillette.

Four Senior Officers will be accommodated in the Union Club.

Staff of 39 Officers and 37 O.Ss. to have Tunnel accommodation as shown on the annexed plan and in outside office accommodation in half only of the building being prepared for offices South of CHURCHING CHURCH. August rooms originally noted as being for Engineer Officers and Clerks, C.S.O. and R.A. Officers and Clerks to be converted.

One office room of about 150 sq. ft. approx. is required as near as possible to the Combined War Room in the LASCHUS TUNNEL.

Two Senior General Officers and P.M.'s will be accommodated at the Palace as originally arranged by Lieut-Colonel Gillette.

Four Senior Officers will be accommodated in the Union Club.

Thirty three Officers will sleep in the Phoenix Hotel and mess in the converted Store South of CHURCHING CHURCH.

81 O.Ss. (37 Clerks employed in Tunnel and 44 Administrative Personnel, Drivers, Batmen, Mess Orderlies) to sleep in the Phoenix Hotel and mess in the converted Store South of CHURCHING CHURCH.

141 Signal Party numbers 122 and may be accommodated in the St. PHILIP'S (REVELIN) BARRACKS. They will work in the Oil Tunnel.

GENERAL NOTES.

Some accommodation at Signal Transmitting Stations is required and 5541 indicated by Signal Office representatives.

The foregoing with ablutions, latrines, etc., to some are the armed personnel strengths and requirements for A.F.H.Q. and 141 Army Staffs and Signals.

No dispersion of living accommodation has been considered and the sleeping and messing indicated above are given only as a guide to what would be suitable. The sleeping and messing may be altered to meet dispersion and convenience.

The H.Q. 141 Force Army Signal party will be a self-contained unit capable of running its own messing.

The A.F.H.Q. Signals party are not self-supporting and will be attached to 141 Signals for messing etc.

The above does not include Security Police and Traffic Control personnel which MIMA are to be requested to provide.
