The advance elements of the following units will carry 7 days rations with unit equipment: 31st Fighter Group, 58th Fighter Squadron, 3rd Communication Squadron, 82nd Fighter Control Squadron, 927th Signal Bn., ASC, Prov. A.W. Signal Bn., 815th Engineer, Air Formation Signal Det., #8035 GCI, #8044 GCI. The following detachments will carry 5 days rations with unit equipment: #1 ALC Signal Sec., #1, #2 and #3 Beach Dets., Det. #981, #982 and #985 Balloon DETS., #1 Field Force Signals Section; 2 LWS, 3201 Servicing Commando. These rations will be loaded on personnel ships at ports. All other units will carry two (2) days rations with unit equipment.

2. Water Trailers and water cans will be filled prior to shipment.
3. Motor vehicles will have full fuel tanks, and cooling systems, and will carry 5 gal. of water for the cooling system.
- c. (1) 3rd Comm. Sqdn., 82nd Fighter Control Sqdn., and Prov. A.W. Signal Bn. will waterproof vehicles in the first three echelons.

7. Combat echelons will be provided with life vests and rafts immediately. This equipment will be properly maintained.
8. Only personal C.W.S. protective equipment will be carried; gas masks, Pliofilm gas cape, protective ointment, shoe impregnite and organizational gas curtains.

- 10. All maintenance equipment not necessary for first and second maintenance will move with second or later echelons of units.
- 11. a. Equipment will be packed in packages of less than 200 lbs. All packages of a greater weight must be loaded in vehicles prior to movement.
  - b. Equipment that will be damaged by immersion in water will be packed in waterproof containers.
  - c. Vehicles will be loaded so that no part of the load extends beyond the dimensions of the vehicle.
    - (1) bows will not be removed and the cover will be pulled down snugly.
- 12. a. All packages, vehicles and equipment will be prominently marked with the destination (see letter this Hq. 9 June 1943, Sub: Destination of Units).
  - b. Unit designations will be used without showing the type of unit.
  - c. Force numbers will be obliterated.
  - d. Air Force units will mark all packages with two blue bands two inches (2") wide and four inches (4") apart, around the short circumference. Bands will be centered on the package.



SUBJECT: Disposition of Captured Enemy Cryptographic Material.

TO : All Concerned.

1. It is believed that during the recent campaign in Tunisia, various cryptographic documents and/or devices may have come into the hands of United States Units operating in the field.

2. Any and all information of this type is of real value and, if handled promptly may be of decisive importance. The effective date of documents or the fact they may be incomplete, is of minor importance. Sufficient information may be contained therein to be of extreme operational value, if the material can be placed immediately in the hands of personnel qualified to exploit it.

3. Items of principal interest include:

- a. Cryptographic Devices.
- b. Code Books.
- c. Cipher Key Lists.
- d. Signal Instructions.
- e. Plain and/or cipher texts of messages.
- f. Technical Manuals.

4. It is desired that all commanders direct personnel within their commands to forward such material as may be found to The Chief Signal Officer, Allied Force Headquarters, by the most expeditious means possible.

1. Duties of Liaison Officer:-

- (d) Visit the E.L.S. Office immediately prior to departure to collect any other unit which is awaiting despatch.

3. Before returning visit Information Room, Signals Office, and if necessary the War Room, to collect any documents for carriage to this Headquarters.

4. G(Liaison) Officers may only be employed under orders of C.G.S. or S.G.S. (Ops), who will allocate G(Liaison) officers ~~for~~ <sup>to</sup> formations their operational areas:-

- (a) When requested by Branches.
- (b) If L.O.'s are available.

## Subject:- INSTRUCTIONS RE ACCEPTANCE OF LOCAL SURRENDER.

To : General Officer Commanding, Force 343,  
General Officer Commanding, 12th Army.

1. Local commanders may only accept unconditional surrender by enemy troops or authorities in immediate contact with their own troops and no reservations of any kind are to be made. The civil authorities in areas so affected are to place all the resources of the area at the disposal of, and undertake to carry out any measures which may be required by the commanders in these areas.

2. Local commanders receiving offers of surrender of enemy formations, areas, or urban centres not in immediate contact with their own troops will notify Task Force Commanders, reporting the nature of the offer received, by whom made or purporting to be made (giving rank, appointment etc) and any credentials presented to establish authenticity. Local commanders are not authorised to discuss terms or to make or put forward recommendations.

3. Unless the situation requires otherwise Task Force Commanders will refer any offers of surrender of formations or areas not in contact with their troops to Headquarters 141 Force. Should however, immediate notice be necessary the following conditions will be demanded.

- (a) Axis Civil, Military and Air Force authorities in the areas affected to order immediate cessation of hostilities against the Allied Forces.
- (b) Axis ground, sea and air forces in the area to surrender unconditionally.
- (c) The civil authorities in the area undertake to place the whole resources of the area at the disposal of, and to carry out such measures as may be required for or on behalf of, the Allied Commander-in-Chief.

4. Without prejudice to the unconditional nature of a surrender in the above mentioned circumstances, the following conditions are given for the personal guidance of Task Force Commanders. These will be observed where applicable :-

- (b) All members of the Axis Land, Sea and Air Forces, including numbers of the FUSILIERS under arms will be treated in the first instance as prisoners of war. Task Force or Unit Commanders MAY permit such Naval personnel as they deem desirable to remain aboard ship.
