For example, the exchange at Ecole Normale, Bouzarea is still FORTUNE and a telegram addressed FORTUNE would now go to any one of the planning staff in the school.

Messages should be addressed by the title of the formation or organization.

There are certain "registered telegraphic addresses" such as PAMOX, FIBAT, etc which are registered with civil cable companies to ensure the correct routing of cables. These need not be used by Branches. Signals will insert them when necessary.

SUBJECT: Outgoing Official Mail.

TO : All Concerned.

Staff Memorandum Number 47, this headquarters, subject as above, dated 14 June 1943, is being rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

I - Official mail may be transmitted by:

1. U.S. Army Postal Service.
 - a. Army Courier Service.
 - b. Army Post Office.
2. Motor Dispatch Letter Service.
3. Air Dispatch Letter Service.
4. Special Courier.

II - ARMY POSTAL SERVICE

1. U. S. Army Courier Service.

a. Definition: Officer Courier Service is operated throughout the world where United States Army Forces are located and air service is available for the transmission by air of classified or urgent official mail, by the United States Army Postal Service. Courier Transfer Officers are stationed at the following places in North and Northwest Africa: Accra, Dakar, Marrakech, Casablanca, Oudja, Oran, Algiers, Telergma, Tunis, Tripoli and Cairo.

b. Functions: The functions and operations of the Army Courier Services are prescribed in letter, AG 322.06 Army Courier Service (4-19-43) AT-C, The Adjutant General's Office, dated 19 April 1943, subject, "Army Courier Service", copy of which is attached.

c. Procedure: The Army Courier Service provides a safe, expeditious means of transmitting classified or urgent unclassified documents via officer courier to points in Africa (indicated in a. above), the United States and to the United Kingdom. Documents for dispatch should be properly enveloped, carefully and clearly addressed, numbered and delivered to the nearest Courier Transfer Officer, and a record made of the serial number of each envelope dispatched in order to facilitate tracing if necessary.

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2. Army Postal Service.

a. Definition: A service for the delivery of official mail to all points where forces are located within and without this theater.

b. Procedure: Official mail may be dispatched at any Army Post Office. Classified documents not dispatched by other means will be registered and will not be transmitted as ordinary mail under any circumstance.

c. Although this service reaches every unit within this theater and the United States, and the Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, and offers safe means of transmitting classified documents, it is not recommended where immediate delivery is necessary. No regularly scheduled air service is available through this medium and official mail may therefore be unavoidably delayed from time to time due to the non-availability of air, motor, or sea transportation.

III - MOTOR DISPATCH LETTER SERVICE

1. Definition: A messenger service by motor for official correspondence and documents, either classified or unclassified, within this theater. This service is operated by United States and British Signal personnel and is available at all headquarters within this theater.

2. Procedure: The signal officer at each headquarters should be contacted to secure information concerning methods of dispatch and route schedules in effect between various headquarters.

3. This service is recommended for local delivery and for delivery to all points where no facilities exist for transmission by air.

IV - AIR DISPATCH LETTER SERVICE

1. Definition: A messenger service, via air, for official correspondence and documents, either classified or unclassified, to points indicated in current Signal Instructions, this headquarters.

2. Procedure: Official documents for transmission by ADLS to points East of ALGERIA may be delivered to any Signal Message Center or MDLS office for delivery to the ADLS office at the nearest airport or may be dispatched direct to the nearest ADLS office.

3. This service is recommended for units stationed in Eastern ALGERIA and TUNISIA where no Courier Transfer Officer is available.

V - SPECIAL OFFICER COURIER

1. Special officer couriers are authorized only in exceptional circumstances for the delivery of highly classified or extremely urgent documents. These couriers may travel by air or motor, whichever means is most expeditious. Whenever special couriers are designated, they will register with the

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Courier Transfer Officer both at point of departure and upon arrival at destination. Courier Transfer Officers will report to the Adjutant General, this headquarters, the name, grade, serial number, organization, destination and authority for travel of each special courier reporting at their station.

2. Classified mail of an extremely vital nature should normally be transmitted by Special Officer Courier.

VI - OFFICIAL MAIL FOR DISPATCH VIA ARMY COURIER SERVICE, AIR DISPATCH LETTER SERVICE OR MOTOR DISPATCH LETTER SERVICE WILL BE PREPARED AS FOLLOWS:

1. All documents will be properly enveloped and addressed. Confidential or Secret material will be placed in a double envelope as prescribed in AR 380-6, with receipt therefor included in the inner envelope.

2. Classified documents will be assigned registry numbers marked plainly on each parcel or envelope.

3. Itemized receipt will be prepared in duplicate, the duplicate to be retained by the Dispatch Office, the original to be signed and returned to the sender. Suspense files should be maintained to insure return of receipts. If the quantity of mail of any headquarters permits, the mail will be consolidated into one sealed package or pouch. An itemized receipt will be prepared and placed inside the pouch to be executed by the addressee. Each pouch will be numbered and a receipt therefor obtained from the dispatch office.

4. Under no circumstances will mail destined for one major headquarters be placed in a sealed pouch addressed to another headquarters. For example, mail originating from ABS destined for EES should be dispatched direct to the addressee and not placed in a sealed pouch directed to NATOUSA. Such routing causes unnecessary delay in that the mail must be rerouted by the headquarters to which sent, rather than by the Courier Transfer Officer or Signal Agency concerned.

VII - PERSONAL MAIL

1. The transmission of personal mail or parcels by any means other than through an Army Post Office is specifically prohibited. All agencies will refuse to accept personal mail.

VIII - ADDRESS

1. A complete address will be used where mail is to be transmitted by United States Army Courier Service. This address will include the following:

a. Forwarding Address. Names of units will not be abbreviated and will include in care of a place or higher headquarters. Mail improperly addressed or not showing proper return address will not be accepted.

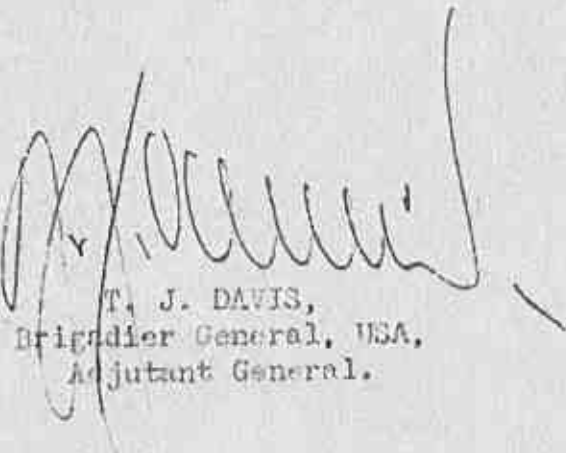

b. Return Address. All messages, mail or packages will show a complete return address.

c. Official mail will not be addressed to individuals for transmission by Army Courier Service. It will show the address of a headquarters or unit. It may be marked for the attention of an individual.

ARMY COURIER SERVICE

1. The following instructions are issued for the information and guidance of all concerned with the operation of the Army Courier Service. Army Courier Transfer Officers are stationed at ports of embarkation and debarkation where necessary and at control points of the Air Transport Command and Naval Air Transport Service. Courier Transfer Officers will perform the duties outlined in the following paragraphs.

2. Procure passenger lists from the Air Transport Command, Naval Air Transport Service and commercial airlines and select from these lists officer passengers to act as couriers.

3. Designate officer-couriers.

4. Deliver all courier pouches to designated officer-couriers and obtain receipt therefor.

5. Meet all incoming planes and take personal custody of pouches arriving thereon, giving officer-courier a receipt on WD, AGO Form 940.

6. Give all possible assistance to officer-couriers in safe-guarding and accelerating the movement of courier pouches.

7. Give maximum protection to all courier pouches reaching their custody, including pouches retained temporarily for couriers passing through transfer stations.

8. Make hand to hand delivery of pouch contents to addressees and secure receipt therefor on WD, AGO Form 941.

9. Courier pouches will originate in the War Department Foreign Mail Room, Washington, D. C. and at all control points along the various routes where there is a demand for such service. Only secret and confidential documents requiring safe and expeditious handling will be inclosed in courier pouches.

10. Terminus points on the routes will also make up courier pouches in order to maintain a continuous flow of pouches to and from the head and terminus points. Courier transfer officers at intermediate control points will dispatch in transit pouches secret and confidential mail originating at the stations for delivery along established routes, unless the quantity to be dispatched to any one point warrants the making up of a direct pouch to that point.

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11. Mail addressed to each control point will be made up in a small hand pouch and closed with a lead seal. The hand pouches will be invoiced, and dispatched in locked courier pouches. The courier pouches will be labeled to show the final destination and the first control point where withdrawal is to be made. The same procedure will be followed at all control points through which the courier pouch passes.

12. Courier pouches received at control points labeled to show first withdrawal at a point beyond will not be opened unless material is to be added for a station along the route. When pouches are opened the contents will be checked and the back of the invoice endorsed to show result. Opening of pouches will be witnessed when practicable. One copy of invoice will be withdrawn by stations where withdrawals are made to serve as an office record of pieces received. New material added to pouches passing through stations will be recorded on the invoice of the pouch and the invoice endorsed to show the number of pieces added and the name and rank of officer making the addition.

13. When a courier pouch is received, the courier transfer officer will take therefrom the small hand pouch labeled to that point and deliver the contents to the addressees, procuring the necessary receipt on WD, AGO Form 941. Such receipts will be filed at control points. Courier transfer officers will carefully observe the condition of each piece of mail received in courier pouches for delivery and if any irregularity is discovered, notation thereof will be made on WD, AGO Form 941 before delivery. The invoice will be endorsed to show withdrawals made at control points.

14. Courier transfer officers and officer-couriers will exchange receipts at intermediate and terminus points on forms provided for that purpose. Records of all pouches dispatched and received will be kept on WD, AGO Form 944 in the War Department Foreign Mail Room, Washington, D. C., and at terminus and intermediate points.

15. Any commissioned officer of the United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps or Coast Guard may be designated as an officer-courier, (See AR 380-5, paragraph 19) but it is preferred that Army courier pouches be placed in the custody of Army officers. Courier transfer officers at control points will see that courier pouches are dispatched on the first available plane, even if it is necessary to designate a new officer-courier to carry the pouches on to the next point. If anyone designated as officer-courier refuses to act as such a complete report of the fact will be made to The Adjutant General, Attention: Director, Army Postal Service, Washington, D. C., for appropriate action.

16. If courier pouches are not treated as part of the weight allotment for mail matter, the officer designated as courier will be provided with Government Requests for Transportation to cover costs of excess baggage if necessary.

17. The loss or non-receipt of a courier pouch, or other serious irregularity, will be promptly reported by radio by the courier transfer officer or officer-courier having knowledge thereof to The Adjutant General, Attention: Director, Army Postal Service, Washington, D. C.

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18. The receipt for each pouch by courier transfer officers will be reported to The Adjutant General, Attention: Director, Army Postal Service, Washington, D. C., immediately using WD, AGO Form 943.

19. Courier transfer officers will send an immediate report to The Adjutant General, Attention: Director, Army Postal Service, Washington, D. C., each time an officer is designated as a courier. This report will be on WD, AGO Form 942 and will show the numbers of the pouches or articles assigned to the designated courier as well as the name, rank, and serial number of the courier.

20. Promptly at the close of each month, courier transfer officers will submit to The Adjutant General, Attention: Director, Army Postal Service, Washington, D. C., a list of all pouches handled. This report will be on WD, AGO Form 944.

21. Courier transfer officers will keep this office advised as to facilities available or used in making delivery of courier materials to distant points served by them.

22. Pouches will be labeled as follows:

"Army Courier Service, Courier Transfer Officer

1. Station _____
2. First Withdrawal _____
3. Final destination _____"

a. Station -- will show first control point through which pouch will pass.

b. First withdrawal -- will show the first station where material is to be withdrawn for delivery.

c. Final destination -- place where last withdrawal is to be made.

23. Delivery of material received will be made by either of the following means:

a. For local points, personal delivery by the courier transfer officer and appropriate receipt obtained, or by armed enlisted messenger if material is not marked "Officer Courier Only."

b. To distant points served from a station the material may be handed to any officer, Army, Navy, or Marine as stated in paragraph 15, or any representative of the United States Government in the event no officers of the Army, Navy, or Marines are available. Receipts will be obtained from such individuals and they will be instructed to obtain receipts for their protection. The material and a receipt will be inclosed in an outer envelope and the prepared receipt will contain a request that the addressee sign and return the receipt to the courier station when the article is received. This will keep the courier station informed of the final delivery of all material.

24. Receipts will be given for material presented for dispatch, and a number will be assigned to each piece which number will be placed on the article and all records. Numbers will start at one (1) and for purpose of identification such numbers will be preceded by the first two letters of the station. A record will be maintained of such material and will show particulars of dispatch, i.e., pouch number, trip number, and date of dispatch.

C O N F I D E N T I A L

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25. Sufficient number of copies of invoices will be prepared for all pouches made up to insure a copy for each station through which pouches will pass.

26. Courier transfer officers will not be given any other duties to perform which will interfere with their primary duty of safeguarding and expediting courier pouches.
