1. General

It is essential to the success of future operations, as well as to the present one, that all ranks should realize and adopt the correct attitude to be taken with regard to the Italian people, their institutions and their property. While direct responsibility for military government is in the hands of a staff (A.M.S.O.F.) specially appointed for that purpose, there must inevitably be, in certain cases, direct contact between the armed forces and the civil population.

Sufficient copies of the pamphlet entitled "Do's and Don'ts", attached as Appendix "A", are therefore being printed and will be issued to Task Force Commanders (and to G.O.C. Canadian Div) for distribution to section leaders and their equivalents in accordance with Security Instructions which are being issued with them.

2. It is the duty of Task Force commanders to issue such orders as they consider necessary to make the pamphlet authoritative and ensure obedience to it.

3. The following additional factors should be remembered when issuing orders on this subject.

(a) Ancient Monuments and Works of Art

Both the British and American governments have set great store on the preservation and security of ancient landmarks in Italy. By ancient monuments is meant all monuments proper such as Greek temples, churches, museums, etc., as well as works of art like pictures etc. From the artistic and architectural point of view, ITALY is particularly rich in all monuments ranging from Greek, through Sarcophagi, Roman, Angevin to 18th Century examples. The two governments desire to use the protection of monuments by the Allies as counter propaganda to German looting, official and otherwise, of works of art in occupied countries. G.O.C. officers have been instructed to close all museums etc. and monuments where large may be done by troops and may at a later stage re-open them after properly conducted parties under supervision. Such monuments will therefore remain closed till further notice and, in consultation with G.O.C. officers, are to be placed out of bounds to troops. It is, further, very important to prevent swiftness in works of art, and the acquisition of souvenirs of artistic value, the export of which is in any event prohibited. Any infraction of this rule should be made a serious disciplinary offence. Part authorities and administration officers should be warned accordingly.

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(a) Ancient Monuments and Works of Art

Both the British and American Governments have set great store on the preservation and security of ancient monuments in Germany. By ancient monuments is meant all man-made proper such as Greek temples, churches, museums, etc., as well as works of art like pictures etc. From the artistic and architectural point of view Germany is particularly rich in all monuments ranging from Greek, through Saxon, Roman, Angevin to 18th Century examples. The two Governments desire to use the protection of monuments by the allies as counter propaganda to German looting, official and otherwise, of works of art in occupied countries. G.O.C. officers have been instructed to close all museums etc. and monuments where damage may be done by troops and may at a later stage re-open them for properly conducted parties under supervision. Such monuments will therefore remain closed till further notice and, in consultation with G.A. officers, are to be placed out of bounds to troops.

It is, further, very important to prevent trafficking in works of art, and the acquisition of souvenirs of artistic value, the export of which is in any event prohibited. Any infraction of this rule should be made a serious disciplinary offence. Port authorities and embarkation officers should be warned accordingly.

(b) Souvenirs

Over and above this the acquisition of any form of souvenir either by theft, gift or purchase is a cause of potential trouble. It should be prevented by every means possible. Not only does it, in the case of theft or looting, render those concerned liable to court martial, but it also opens the way to dishonest practices, and the creation of embarrassing situations. The creation of a souvenir market is a source of potential inflation and should therefore be avoided; the possession and transport of unnecessary items is also an extra strain on our resources. Gifts, entertainment and a tendency to excessive hospitality are to be discouraged in the early stages, at any rate until we are certain that there is no ulterior motive behind them.

"WE'VE GOT DON'TS"

DO

1. Remember that the Italians are not Germans and many of them dislike the Germans almost as much as we do.
2. Remember that the Italians have millions of relatives in U.S.A. where they have learned to value the liberty they have lost in Italy; and that the British fought to help Italy gain her unity and independence.
3. Remember that the Allies don't want to destroy Italy but to deliver the people from the Fascist regime which let them into the war.
4. Remember that the Italians who don't know U.S.A. or Britain will judge Your country by Your behaviour and that of Your troops.
5. Be firm and correct, bad manners are not a sign of toughness.
6. Respect private and public property as you would your own. Plant and machinery is necessary for the Allied War Effort and must not be damaged.

ON ENTERING A TOWN

7. Post guards on power stations, wireless, telephone and telegraph stations, warehouses, goods, banks, post offices, museums, etc., to prevent looting. Remember that when there is disorder the local population may try its hand at looting. Bank and treasury safes and buildings with public records, are to be locked up. The bank staff must not have access to remove valuables. Take the keys and give them to the nearest Civil Affairs officer or to the Provost Marshal, or Military Police.
8. Let shops and markets run as soon as possible. The population must eat, and if they can't get their food, we shall have to issue them some of ours.
9. Remember that all the people who will offer their assistance are not necessarily disinterested. The best people are not the turncoats and the traitors.
10. Essential services and the local machinery of government must be kept going. Don't take this more difficult. Certain officials will be arrested or interned: it is not your business to decide which.
11. Consult your nearest Civil Affairs Officer about buying or requisitioning.

DON'T

Your country by Your behaviour and that of Your troops.

5. Be firm and correct, bad winners are not a sign of toughness.
6. Respect private and public property as you would your own. Plant and machinery is necessary for the Allied War Effort and must not be damaged.

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10. Essential services and the local machinery of government must be kept going. Don't make this more difficult. Certain officials will be arrested or interned: it is not your business to decide which.
11. Consult your nearest Civil Affairs Officer about buying or requisitioning.

DON'T

1. Don't fraternize with the population, male or female. The Italian Army is still fighting you.
2. Don't talk politics or religion.
3. Don't believe all the stories you will hear from Italians about their unlying friendship for the Allies. 627
4. Don't allow, or close your eyes to looting, theft or trafficking in money, works of art, or valuables.
5. Don't destroy or allow to be destroyed or removed any archives, documents or books in any premises you may enter. They will be needed for the Allied Government of the country.

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6. Don't occupy any government office if you can avoid it. The Allied government of the country will need the offices to govern from. Use as offices hotels, business premises, apartment houses, etc.
7. Don't requisition goods unnecessarily "just because they might come in useful". Don't remove bits of machinery or loose tools, if it can be avoided; we may need the equipment as a whole and the removal of one piece or certain tools, may destroy its utility.
8. Don't allow favoritism to individuals. Don't let them try to bribe you by presents, entertainment, or "concessions". Don't accept presents from anyone.
9. Don't take or use motor transport without higher authority. If you take all the trucks, food can't be brought into the markets.
10. DON'T FORGET WE ARE FIGHTING FASCISM IN ALL ITS FORMS.

1. It is understood that the Fascist militia will be immediately disbanded. Does this include the special units, such as Railway, Ports, Posts and Telegraphs, Forests and Frontier Fascist Militia? ANSWERS

1. In most cases the Fascist Militia as such does not exist. What does exist is that a certain number of, say the Railway men, is in the militia of their service. Such employees cannot be dismissed because there would then be no working personnel. Unless a given militia is a standing body, e.g. in a quasi military formation, the men should not be dismissed but must not meet as a militia body. When the militia is a standing body it must be disbanded: when used as a military formation, treated as P of W. Any prominent or dangerous leaders of non-standing militia should be interned as civilians. No militia uniforms to be worn.

2. C.C.R.R. are a military body under the Minister of War and take oath to the King. They are entitled to be treated as P of W when not wanted or unwilling to serve. If they serve they can do so as released P of W. An "Enlisted man" or "Other Rank" cannot give parole; only officers give parole. Enlisted men released as P of W for duty should sign a declaration that they will do what they are told and do their duty; but C.C.R.R. cannot be asked or ordered to bear arms against their own army.

3. Yes, if you can find any.

4. Keep them on as part of the local police unless they are undesirable. They must however, be under supervision of C.A.P.O.s and it will not do any harm to put a few in if at all suspect.

5. Yes.

6. In W.T.F. area, answer is no, not necessarily, but probably, unless you have good reason to do otherwise. The Sotto Prefetto should carry on under C.A.O. The prefects of the larger cities such as FUSTIAN, LADEROKE, or MALICIOUS should be removed as a matter of principle.

Don't use C.A.O.s unless you can help it.

7. Yes, provisionally but they should not meet till further orders.

8. Any bad one, Yes. Others, No. If removed, find his substitute or some respectable citizen. Don't use C.A.O.s; there won't be enough to go round.

9. See 7.

10. Yes; replace by any competent local civil servant.

11. As above but be more careful; replace by C.C.R.R. officer.

12. No, certainly not. No political activities to be allowed.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

ADMINISTRATIVE

Reference Telegram 1410/5/5(2) of 15th April, 1943.

1. The intention is to set up a Civil Administration (or Military Government) of the occupied territory from the first moment of landing. This organization will be based on the Allied Military Government of the Occupied Territory of GERMANY (short title AGOT).

2. The staff of the administration will be U.S. and British officers. It will consist of the main of the provincial administrations of GERMANY, probably following the existing provincial boundaries, and a headquarters staff covering the subjects of finance, law, education, supply, trade, public health, police, custody of enemy property, etc., will be set up. These special divisions will be staffed by qualified U.S. and British personnel.

3. The Chief of Staff, Force 141, will be the Chief of the Civil Administration and the Chief of the Civil Affairs Officer (CAO) will be his chief Civil Affairs Staff Officer, assisted by a Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer (DCAO) and personnel appropriate to the central organization of a government. The whole of the Civil Affairs personnel will be military, will be under the C.A.O., Force 141, and will command the service through which he will govern the territory.

4. The Civil Affairs officers at headquarters and in the provinces will include the following grades and in their corresponding military ranks:-

- CAO - Major General or Lt. Col.
- DCAO - Lt. Col. (in some cases Lt. Col.)
- CAO - Capt. or Subaltern.
- DCAO - Lt. Col.
- CAO - Major and below.
- DCAO - Lt. Col. and below.
- CAO - Lt. Col. and below.

5. At the present time all the AGOT (Civil Affairs) headquarters organizations, which each Force headquarters is, as well as the main AGOT headquarters, which will be in the main AGOT, are being set up. It is the intention to have a Back Force Civil Affairs headquarters which will merge with the main AGOT, or a substantial part of it, and be responsible for the whole of the AGOT. The AGOT will then be under the C.A.O., Force 141, for the whole territory. The Civil Affairs administration in the provinces will then function directly under the central administration.

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- 2 -

7. The Civil Affairs officers with the assault forces are assigned in such a manner as to form the provincial administrations of the areas in which the assault troops deploy. Thus the party accompanying the "ACID (MORRIS)" and "OED (GUTH)" assaults will include personnel to form the nucleus of the provincial administrations of the large centers which are the objectives of these forces.

8. The Civil Affairs officers of the assault parties, as well as those with Task Force H.I., will be attached to, form part of, and be under the direct orders of the formation (unit) commanders concerned. Subject only to directives which they and the formation (unit) commanders will receive on the way to be followed during the initial phase, these Civil Affairs officers will not give direct instructions from their superior Civil Affairs officers until such time as they can make direct contact with the latter, and the task force commander determines that the Civil Affairs (Task Force) headquarters can properly take charge of them.

During the assault and initial phases of the operation the officers of the Civil Administration assigned to task forces of assaulting units will operate as Staff Officers to the commanders. The formation (unit) and assaulting unit (operation) Commanders will have full responsibility and authority.

9. It is anticipated that the Civil Affairs officers with the assault formations will not be provided with a formal mode of transport. The balance of transport will arrive in the follow-up convoys. These officers will therefore have to depend in the initial phase on locally requisitioned vehicles for the use of the combat units. The object of landing with few vehicles is to avoid hampering the assaulting troops with any HT which is not strictly necessary.

Assault commanders will be the source of HT and be given instructions to assist Civil Affairs officers in the execution of their duties.

10. Subject to any observations which task force commanders may have to make, this policy, which is most commendable, but it is a prerequisite of its success that combat formation commanders will regard the Civil Affairs officers as constituting a necessary service, of use to themselves and therefore entitled to all such assistance.

11. If task force commanders would prefer the Civil Administration officers attached to the assault parties to be provided with their full scale of transport, they could arrange accordingly and notify this headquarters as soon as possible.

12. Full information about the situation on questions of HT and other matters, including the general policy to be adopted towards the local population and administration, will be notified later.

1. The basic AEGOT plan will be transmitted by COC 141 to the Task Force Commanders accompanied by an order directing that military government be conducted in accordance with the plan. (12A)

2. Each Task Force will prepare a Task Force plan and order for military government based upon the basic AEGOT plan which will in turn be transmitted by the Commanding General of each force to the Sub-Task Force Commanders.

3. The Sub-Task Forces will abstract such portions of the Task Force plan as may be appropriate for transmission to the military commanders of the various areas.

IV ANGOT ORGANIZATION

(1) It has been determined by the respective governments that responsibility for military government of HORRIFIED will be joint. Accordingly, ANGOT, as the joint agency of the Allied Forces for the administration of military government in the territory, will be directed by a joint staff with personnel drawn from British and American forces.

(2) C.C.A.O. and D.C.C.A.O. Chief Civil Affairs Officer will advise the M.G. on political matters and questions relating to the military government of HORRIFIED. He will be chief of ANGOT, and as such will be responsible to the M.G. for the military administration of the territory.

DRAFT INSTRUCTION TO TASK FORCECIVIL AFFAIRS ADMINISTRATION

Reference telegram LAM/40/017 of 15th April, 1945.

1. The intention is to set up a Civil Administration (or Military Government) of BRENTHAM from the first moment of landing. This organization will be known as the Allied Military Government of the Occupied Territory of BRENTHAM (short title AMGO).

2. The staff of the administration will be U.S. and British officers. It will consist in the main of the provincial administrations of BRENTHAM, probably following the existing provincial boundaries, and a headquarters where special divisions covering the subjects of finance, law, civilian supply, trade, public health, police, custody of enemy property, etc., will be set up. These special divisions will be staffed by qualified U.S. and British personnel.

3. The G.O.C., Force 121, will be the Military Governor of BRENTHAM and the Chief Civil Affairs Officer (CCAO) will be his chief of Civil Affairs Staff Officer, assisted by a Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer (DCCAO) and personnel appropriate to the central organization of a government. The whole of the Civil Affairs personnel will be military, will be under the G.O.C., Force 121, and will constitute the service through which he will govern the territory.

4. The Civil Affairs officers at headquarters and in the provinces will include the following gradings (with their corresponding military ranks):-

CCAO - Senior Civil Affairs Officer - Col. or Lt. Col.
 DCCAO - Civil Affairs Officer - Maj. (in some cases Lt. Col).
 JCCAO - Asst. Civil Affairs Officer - Capt. or Subaltern.
 JCO - Senior Finance Officer - Lt. Col.
 JCO(CA) - Finance Officer (Civil Affairs) - Maj. and below.
 LO - Legal Officer - Lt. Col. and below.
 CCAO - Civil Affairs Police Officer - Lt. Col. and below.

5. At the outset there will be two regional Civil Affairs headquarters, one at BRENTHAM and one at BRENTHAM, as well as the main civil affairs headquarters, which will remain with the G.O.C., Force 121, at BRENTHAM. The function between task forces has been discussed, the two regional headquarters will merge and when the whole of BRENTHAM, or a substantial part of it, has been recaptured there will be only one Civil Administration headquarters, under the CCAO, for the whole territory.

The Civil Affairs administration in the provinces will then function directly under the central administration.

6. A small number of Civil Affairs officers will be attached to the headquarters of the formation or unit commander of each assault force. Subject

3. At the outset there will be two Regional Civil Affairs Headquarters (RHQs) organisations, one with each Task Force (one in the north, one in the south), as well as the main civil affairs headquarters, which will remain with the G.O.C. Force 141. The RHQs will function between Task Forces as has been collected, the two Regional Headquarters will merge and when the whole of BURENIA, or a substantial part of it, has been occupied there will be only one Civil Administration Headquarters, under the CMAO, for the whole territory.

The Civil Affairs administration in the provinces will then function indirectly under the central administration.

6. A small number of Civil Affairs officers will be attached to the headquarters of the formation or unit commander of each assault force. Subject to the discretion of the formation (unit) commander, these officers will be sent ashore as soon as possible after the assault has consolidated any territory containing inhabited centres. These Civil Affairs officers will get in touch with the local administrative authorities, and relations with them should thereafter be conducted, whenever practicable, through these officers by formation (unit) and unit (organisation) commanders. The detailed duties of these Civil Affairs officers will be notified later. In general their task will be to ensure continuity of local administration under Allied control, to preserve law and order, and to assist formations (units) to procure local supplies and labour within the limits of local resources.

7. The Civil Affairs officers with the assault forces are destined as soon as possible to form the provincial administrations of the areas in which the assault troops deploy. Thus the party accompanying the "HILL (one)" and "HILL (two)" assaults will include personnel to form the nucleus of the

provincial administrations of the large centres which are the objectives of these forces.

8. The Civil Affairs officers of the assault parties, as well as those with Task Force H.Q. will be attached to, form part of, and be under the direct orders of the formation (unit) commanders concerned. Subject only to directives which they and the formation (unit) commanders will receive on the policy to be followed during the initial phase, these Civil Affairs officers will not receive direct instructions from their superior Civil Affairs officers until such time as they can make proper contact with the latter, and the task force commander determines that the Civil Affairs ^(unit) headquarters can properly take charge of them.

During the assault and initial phases of the operation the officers of the Civil Administration assigned to task forces or assaulting units will operate as Staff Officers to the commanders. The formation (unit) and assaulting unit (organisation) commanders will have final responsibility and authority.

9. It is anticipated that the Civil Affairs officers with the assault formations will only be provided with a minimal scale of transport. The balance of transport will arrive in the follow-up convoys. These officers will therefore have to depend in the initial phase on locally requisitioned HT and the use of the combat units' HT. The object of landing with few vehicles is to avoid encumbering the assaulting troops with any HT which is not strictly necessary.

Assault commanders will be made aware of this and be given instructions to assist Civil Affairs officers in the execution of their duties.

10. Subject to any observations which Task Force Commanders may have to make, this policy seems the most economical, but it is a prerequisite of its success that combat formation commanders will regard the Civil Affairs officers as constituting a necessary service, of use to themselves and therefore entitled to as much assistance as possible.

11. If Task Force Commanders would prefer the Civil Administration officers attached to the assault parties to be provided with their full scale of transport, they should arrange accordingly and notify this headquarters as soon as possible.

12. Full information about the organisation and functions of AMOR and other matters, including the general policy to be adopted towards the local population and administration, will be notified later.
