MEMORANDUM:

1. The Table of Basic Allowance and the Table of Organization for the U.S. Contingent of Headquarters Force 141 is sealed upon the basis that all essential services, supplies and equipment for the functioning of the headquarters as such would be furnished for the British, and that only those supplies, services and equipment which were for strictly U.S. purposes, are to be domestic housekeeping of the U.S. Headquarters, Headquarters Company, Military Police Detachment and Car Detachment would be supplied by the U.S. A few exceptions to the rule exist. It has been agreed that the U.S. would furnish typewriters for the Headquarters as a whole proportional to the U.S. officers and clerks assigned.

2. No U.S. motor transportation has been assigned to sections of Headquarters 141. That which is assigned to this Headquarters is for the housekeeping of the Headquarters Company, the Military Police Detachment and the Car Detachment. The transportation for the U.S. Provost Marshal, the U.S. Attending Surgeon, the U.S. Disbursing Finance Officer, the U.S. Chaplain and the officers of the above company and detachments will be furnished by the U.S. Headquarters Commandant.

3. Requests for transportation for U.S. officers will be made by Section Chiefs direct to the British Transport Officer.

4. When the resources of the British Transport Officer are exhausted he has been authorized to apply to the U.S. Headquarters Commandant for assistance for either British or U.S. official transportation. Every effort will be made to give assistance where it can be done without sacrificing essential U.S. services.

5. Whenever U.S. transportation is used the following will apply:

- a. Use will be for official use only.
- b. A trip ticket will be made out for each trip showing point of origin and destination. Travel will be by shortest usually

- c. Cars and drivers will not wait around either before or after the trip. They will be dismissed promptly. If the trip is not to start within one half hour from time of reporting, drivers will report back to the car park.

d. Cars will not be dispatched without a driver. The driver must remain with his vehicle and will not turn it over to another driver (either officer or soldier). When a driver must leave his car he will assure its safety and that of its contents. A vehicle will never be left unguarded.

e. The use of motor vehicles for programed recreational purposes is authorized for both officers and enlisted men. A responsible officer will accompany all recreational parties to assure the safety and conduct of the party and its vehicles.

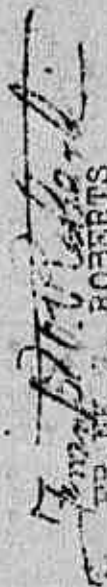
