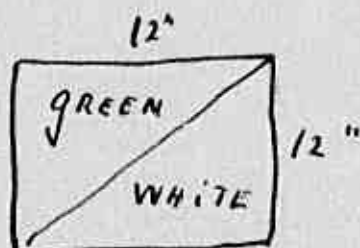

It has been suggested that AMGOT officers should wear a distinctive arm brassard when on duty in HORRIFIED, in order that officers and O.Rs of the Army can pick out Civil Affairs Officers immediately.

2. In the past all Civil Affairs Officers wore green and white arm bands, and it is proposed to continue this practice in Horrified, if agreed by you.

3. M.T. vehicles also bear a distinguishing mark in the form of a rectangular plate, triangularly green and white, with the number of the vehicle on the plate in black figures.

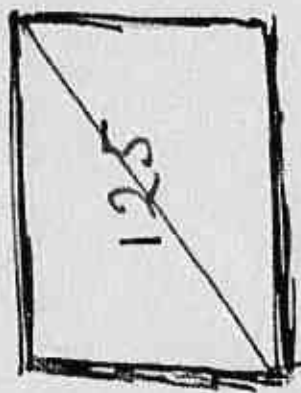

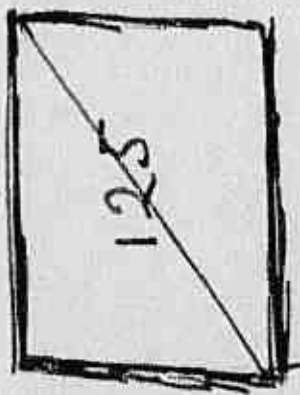
