Memorandum for: D.C.C. A.O.

1. Lt. Col. Jordan called this afternoon to ask for instructions on the future handling of the platoon formations which were originally set up at Canastota by the group which arrived under Col. Irish. The group is being diminished gradually and there is some dissatisfaction owing to the fact that American officers who did not arrive with this contingent have not been a part of the formations.

2. I directed Col. Jordan to continue the formation for the time being. On the basis of our discussion and what I have learned from others, I believe these morning turn outs serve a useful purpose and that with the new contingents arriving they should be expanded and continued. Accordingly, I recommend that arriving officers, both British and American, be formed into platoons for the purpose of morning formations, to be organized under senior officers, British or American. Since the existing group will have a different schedule it might be well to keep them in the same platoon and those arriving might be divided into platoons according to the huts to which they are assigned.

3. If this plan has your approval and that of the C.C.A.O., Col. Thorne Thorne and I will see that proper arrangements are made with the school and camp.

Memorandum for: Lt. Col. Aitken

1. The C.C.A.O. and D.C.C.A.O. have decided that the morning formations which the American contingent have been forming should be continued and the system expanded to include new arrivals, both British and American. Will you, therefore, arrange for the formation of platoons of whatever size seems practicable under senior British and American officers. The platoons are to form at 0820 in the morning or at such other time as you think convenient to hear announcements, stand inspection, etc.

2. Since the remaining American officers will have a different schedule from the new arrivals, they, together with any other officers who have been through the first course, should be formed in a separate platoon of which the existing one might be the basis. The C.C.A.O. suggests that the new arriving British officers may be formed under the senior officers in charge of the contingent. It is suggested that the formations might be organized on the basis of the huts in which the officers are billeted.

1. You will take charge of the discipline and administration of the AMGOT personnel in the training centre and with your staff will also deal with the administration of the personnel and its requirements of the staff of AMGOT in the AMGOT offices.
2. For this purpose you should set up an establishment and personnel officer in charge of a British and American Adjutant who will deal with the postings and second echelon work of officers and other ranks of both armies ~~with~~ their respective record and pay branches, the British Adjutant dealing with the British side and the American Adjutant dealing with the American side. In dealing with the American side you will be guided by the American Assistant Commandant of the Training Centre.
3. All officers and other ranks whether reporting as student officers, instructors, or for work in the AMGOT offices are to be instructed to report to you on arrival. You will take particulars and open a personal file as instructed by me for every officer in which will be recorded all personal matters affecting that officer, viz. posting, pay, movements, casualties, etc. etc. These personal files are to be treated as confidential and are not to be made available to any officer except myself or my deputy, or my G.S.O. I with special permission. You may nevertheless furnish all particulars required by the Chief Instructor at the Training Centre to enable him to arrange studies etc.
4. You will be responsible for the allotment of accommodation, messing, and general administration of the Chreia Centre on the lines I have verbally laid down. Your staff for this purpose will consist in addition to the Adjutants' office, of a Camp Commandants' office with supply, transport, and quartermasters' branches. You will be responsible for the care and maintenance of all requisitioned premises, the furnishing thereof, and of any material issued.
5. You will obtain the financial authority of the Chief Finance Officer, AMGOT, Lt. Col. A.P. Graftley Smith for any expenditure or equipment. The funds at his disposal are not available for the payment of any military ~~personal~~ which will be effected through the normal channels by the pay branches of both armies. You will render accounts of any expenditure to the G.S.O. and take his instructions regarding the disposal of any equipment purchased from his funds.
6. You will report to me and be under my direct orders, ~~and~~ ^{signing} me under those of my Deputy.

7. The Chief Instructor of the Training Centre, Major Rowell, will be in charge of studies and for this purpose will refer directly to me. The attendance of officers under instruction will be your responsibility and the orders relating to time tables etc. will be issued by you. You will not be concerned with the organisation of studies, lectures, syndicates etc.

8. All officers at Chreca are to make known their movements to your offices and student or instructor officers who are not concerned with the day to day work of AMGOT in the central office should not leave the Chreca neighbourhood without your permission. I wish to discourage any visits to Algiers or even to Blida without good and sufficient reason. All use of M.T. will be under the control of the transport officer of your organisation. You will of course understand that the Senior branch officers of AMGOT will frequently have to visit

9. In general, officers attending the Training Centre will be occupied, in addition to the academic studies which are being arranged, in physical exercise and elementary military training under your direction. You will see that O.Rs both British and American under British and American officers are exercised and inspected as you will consider appropriate and that they maintain a proper standard of cleanliness and military discipline.

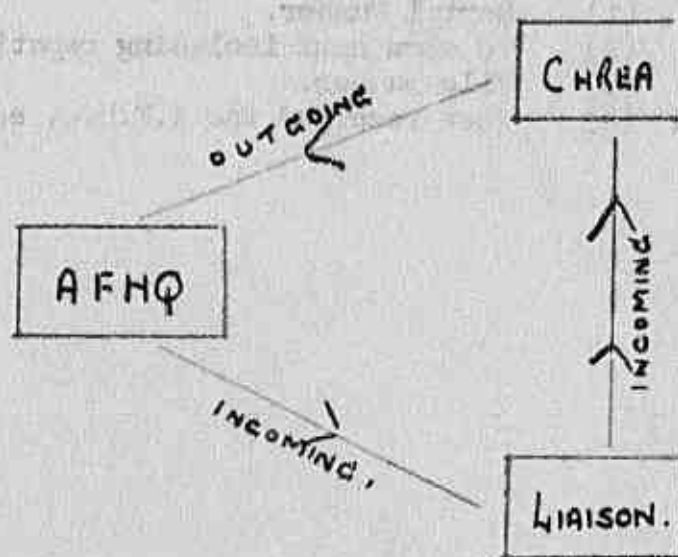
