ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT OF OCCUPIED TERRITORY

DECLARATION NO. 11

GENERAL POLICE AND SECURITY REGULATIONS

I, Harold R. L. G. Alexander, G.C.B., C.S.I., D.S.O., M.C., General,
General Officer Commanding the Allied Forces in and Military
Governor of the Occupied Territory, hereby proclaim as follows:-

ARTICLE I

Regulation of Private Means of Communication.

Section 1. Declaration of Radio Receiving Sets. Every person having in his possession any radio or wireless receiving set or equipment, or any parts, accessories, or material used in connection with wireless reception, or any private telephone wire or telegraph wire or any carrier pigeons will declare the same within the time and at the place specified by official notice in each locality.

Section 2. Possession Unlawful. From and after the date fixed by such notice it shall be unlawful for any person in that locality to have in his possession or custody any of the articles above-mentioned which have not been declared as required by Section 1 hereof.

ARTICLE II

Prohibition of Photography and Declaration of Photographic Equipment.

Section 1. Photography, Printing and Developing Forbidden. From the effective date of this order all persons in the occupied territory are forbidden:

- (a) To take photographs of any sort, whether indoors or out-of-doors, and whether by still or cine or other type of camera;
- (b) To develop or print any photographic film or plate of any nature, whether received from members of the Allied Forces or from any other person,

except with a written permit of the Allied Military Government.

Section 2. Declaration of Cameras, Photographic Supplies, Telescopes and Binoculars. Every person owning or having in his possession or custody any camera or any photographic supplies, or any telescope or binoculars will declare the same within the time and at the place specified by official notice published in each locality. For the purpose of such declaration photographic supplies shall include:

Cameras - cine or still
Projecting apparatus

Telescopes and dark room equipment

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ARTICLE II

Prohibition of Espionage and Declaration of Photographic Equipment.

Section 1. Photomaking, Printing and Developing Forbidden. From the effective date of this order all persons in the occupied territory are forbidden:

- (a) To take photographs of any sort, whether indoors or out-of-doors, and whether by still or cine or other type of camera;
- (b) To develop or print any photographic film or plate of any nature, whether received from members of the Allied Forces or from any other person,

except with a written permit of the Allied Military Government.

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Cameras - cine or still
Projecting apparatus
Developing and dark room equipment
Unexposed or exposed film, cine or still
Photographic paper and chemicals.

ARTICLE III

Identity Cards

Section 1. Possession of Identity Card. All persons must have in their possession at all times an identity card in accordance with Italian law and must produce the same upon the demand of any member of the Allied Forces.

Section 2. Loss of Identity Card. If any person has lost or shall lose his identity card he shall report that fact both to the senior Civil Police Officer in his territory and to the official of the local government by whom the pass was originally issued. A duplicate pass may be issued to him providing the word "duplicate" is noted thereon.

ARTICLE IV

Regulation of Newspapers and Printed Matter.

Section 1. Publication of Newspapers and Printed Matter Prohibited Without a Permit. No newspaper, magazine, book, pamphlet or circular may be published or printed without a written permit from the Allied Military Government. Such permits will be either specific or continuing and will be issued by the Allied Military Government upon such terms and conditions as may be prescribed. 2130

Section 2. Importation and Exportation of Printed Matter. Importation into and exportation out of the Occupied Territory of newspapers, magazines, books, or other printed matter is prohibited except under permit issued by the Allied Military Government.

ARTICLE V

Meetings and Assemblies.

Section 1. Permitted Meetings and Assemblies. Meetings and assemblies for the following purposes may be held without permits:

- (a) Meetings for religious purposes, including baptisms, weddings and funerals;
- (b) Such courts of law as are authorized to function by the Chief Legal Officer of the Allied Military Government upon such terms and conditions as he may prescribe.

Section 2. Other Meetings and Assemblies Prohibited. Except for the foregoing, no person shall promote or attend any public meeting, theatrical, moving picture or other representation or performance, any public assembly or other public gathering, whether indoors or out-of-doors, or any parade or demonstration for which a written permit has not been granted. Such permits will be either specific or continuing and will be issued by or on the authority of the Commissioner of Civil Police of the Allied Military Government through the Civil Police Officer for the locality upon such terms and conditions as may be prescribed.

Section 3. Power of Civil Affairs Officer or other Officer to Disperse Assemblies. Notwithstanding the issuance of any permit, any Civil Affairs Officer or Civil Police Officer, if he has reason to believe that public disorder will ensue or that the safety of the Allied Forces is threatened, may order any meeting, performance, assembly, or parade to be suspended or terminated and require all persons present to disperse. Any such order will be complied with immediately by all persons present.

ARTICLE VI

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ARTICLE VI

Flags and National Anthems.

The public display of any flag or colours of Italy or of any other country at war with Great Britain or the United States and the public singing and playing of the national anthems and any other patriotic or political song or music of any such country are prohibited.

Penalties

ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT OF OCCUPIED TERRITORY

Proclamation No. 10

Financial Regulations

I, Harold R.L.G. Alexander, G.C.B., C.S.I., D.S.O., M.C., General, and Military Governor of the Occupied Territory, hereby proclaim as follows:-

Article I.

Restriction on Exchange and Commerce.

Section 1. Transactions Prohibited. From the effective date of this Proclamation, except as authorized by the Allied Military Government:

- (a) All transactions in foreign exchange, and the import and export of any coins, currency, securities and gold and silver bullion are prohibited;
- (b) All financial, commercial or other transactions involving trade or communication of any kind with any person outside the occupied territory are prohibited.

Section 2. Regulations Authorized. The Allied Military Government will from time to time issue regulations, rules, licenses, and instructions which may permit transactions with persons in certain areas and may prescribe conditions for licensing of transactions.

Article II

Regulation of Business.

Section 1. Orders Regulating Certain Business Transactions. The Chief Civil Affairs Officer or any officer empowered by him may from time to time by order direct:

- (a) that any specified company, institution, corporation, body or person shall be prohibited from entering into or carrying out any business, financial or property transactions, or that any such transactions may only be entered into or carried out upon such terms and conditions and subject to such limitations as the Civil Affairs Officer or such officer empowered may direct.
- (b) that the whole or any part of the property or assets of any specified company, institution, corporation, body or person shall be delivered or paid to any institution or agency designated by the Allied Military Government to be blocked or made subject to any other form of control.

Section 2. Publication of Orders. So far as consistent with the security of the Allied Forces, the name of any company, institution, corporation, body or person named in an order made under this Article will be published in the Gazette. All persons will be deemed to know of the making of any Order so published. Whether or not so published, a copy of the Order will if possible be supplied in every case to the company, institution, corporation, body or

- (b) All financial, commercial or other transactions involving trade or communication of any kind with any person outside the occupied territory are prohibited.

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Section 3. Offenses. It shall be an offense to fail to obey any such order and for anybody having actual notice of the Order to enter into or participate in any business, financial or property transaction with, or on behalf of any company, institution, corporation, body or person named in any such Order, if such transaction is not permitted pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this Article.

Article III

Penalties.

Any person violating any provision of this Proclamation shall, upon conviction by an Allied Military Court, be liable to punishment by imprisonment or fine, or both, as the Court may determine.

Article IV

Effective Date

This Proclamation will become operative in each province or part thereof within the Occupied Territory on the date of its first publication therein.

Dissolution of Fascist Organizations and Removal of Laws

Whereas by Proclamation No. 1 I proclaimed that it is the purpose of the Allied Powers to deliver the people of Italy from the Fascist Regime,

Now, therefore, I, Harold E.L.G. Alexander, G.C.B., C.S.I., D.S.O., M.C., General, General Officer Commanding the Allied Forces in and Military Governor of the Occupied Territory, hereby proclaim as follows:

ARTICLE I

Dissolution of the Fascist Party

The organization known as the Fascist Party (P.M.F.) in the Occupied Territory is hereby dissolved and declared to be illegal. The property and assets of the said organization shall be taken by or delivered to officers of the Allied Military Government appointed for that purpose in accordance with directions which will be issued by the Chief Civil Affairs Officer.

ARTICLE II

Organizations Affiliated to the Fascist Party

The Chief Civil Affairs Officer will from time to time issue Orders either dissolving the organization of any body or activity which appears to, depends from or is in any way affiliated to or controlled by the Fascist Party or declaring that the same or any branch thereof shall be carried on as being for the benefit of the people of the occupied territory but under such control or supervision and in accordance with such notification of rules, procedure and objects as the Chief Civil Affairs Officer may direct. Any such Order may make provision for the taking or safeguarding of the property or assets of any such organization and provide penalties for failure to observe and perform any provision of the Order.

ARTICLE III

Disposal of Property of Fascist Organizations

The Chief Civil Affairs Officer will make Orders as to the disposal of any property acquired by the Allied Military Government under this Proclamation and may in his discretion as a part of any such order direct that the same property or any part thereof shall be applied by the Allied Military Government for the benefit of the people of the occupied territory in such manner or through such organization as he may direct.

ARTICLE IV

ARTICLE II
Organizations Affiliated to the Fascist Party

The Chief Civil Affairs Officer will from time to time issue Orders either dissolving the organization of any body or activity which appears to, depends from or is in any way affiliated to or controlled by the Fascist Party or declaring that the same or any branch thereof shall be carried on as being for the benefit of the people of the occupied territory but under such control or supervision and in accordance with such modification of rules, procedure and objects as the Chief Civil Affairs Officer may direct. Any such Order may make provision for the taking or safeguarding of the property or assets of any such organization and provide penalties for failure to observe and perform any provision of the Order.

ARTICLE III
Disposal of Property of Fascist Organizations

The Chief Civil Affairs Officer will make Orders as to the disposal of any property acquired by the Allied Military Government under this Proclamation and may in his discretion as a part of any such order direct that the same property or any part thereof shall be applied by the Allied Military Government for the benefit of the people of the occupied territory in such manner or through such organization as he may direct.

ARTICLE IV
Repeal of Laws

The Chief Civil Affairs Officer will by Order annul, amend or render inoperative any law in force in the Occupied Territory which relates to a Fascist Organization or any dependent or allied organization thereof or which affects prejudicially the United States or Great Britain or their nationals or any other of the United Nations or their nationals and any law which discriminates on the basis of race, colour or creed, and he may also by any such order provide penalties for the failure to observe or perform the same.

ARTICLE V

ARTICLE XIIREPEALING DATE

This Proclamation will become operative in each province or part thereof within the Occupied Territory on the date of its first publication therein.

Section 2. Declaration of Property.

All public officials of the Italian Government and all other persons in the Occupied Territory who have under their control or administration or in their possession or custody any property of the nature referred to in Section 1 shall:

CLOSING OF FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND ESTABLISHMENT OF MORATORIUM

I, Harold R. L. G. Alexander, G.C.B., C.S.I., D.S.O., M.C., General,
General Officer Commanding the Allied Forces in and Military
Governor of the Occupied Territory, hereby proclaim as follows:

ARTICLE I

CLOSING OF FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

Every company, institution, corporation, body or person within the occupied territory engaged in the business of receiving and paying out deposits, making loans, selling or purchasing securities, exchanging money, dealing in foreign exchange, maintaining safe deposit facilities or transacting any other form of financial business shall forthwith suspend any and all such business and the premises shall be closed. The reopening of all such business shall be upon such terms and conditions and the transacting of further financial business shall be subject to such restrictions as the Chief Civil Affairs Officer or any officer empowered by him may from time to time prescribe by order. Such orders may be of general or specific application and may be notified by public announcement or by written communication addressed to any company, institution, corporation, body or person concerned.

ARTICLE II

MORATORIUM

Section 1. Obligations Affected. A moratorium is hereby proclaimed in respect of all debts, claims, deposits and all other obligations for the payment of money. The Chief Civil Affairs Officer or any officer empowered by him may by general or specific order suspend or terminate the above moratorium in respect of any obligation or class of obligations or in any part of the territory.

Section 2. Effect of Moratorium. During the period of the moratorium, obligations affected by this proclamation are suspended and extended for the said period. No rights or powers shall be exercised at any time with respect to such obligations solely by reason of their non-performance as a result of this Proclamation, nor shall any interest accrue during the period of such moratorium. Subject to the extension hereby granted, all such obligations shall be of full force and effect upon the termination of such moratorium. The moratorium shall not apply to obligations entered into in any place within the occupied territory after the date on which this Proclamation shall come into force in such place.

No rights or powers shall be exercised at any time with respect to such obligations solely by reason of their non-performance as a result of this Proclamation, nor shall any interest accrue during the period of such moratorium. Subject to the extension hereby granted, all such obligations shall be of full force and effect upon the termination of such moratorium. The moratorium shall not apply to obligations entered into in any place within the occupied territory after the date on which this Proclamation shall come into force in such place.

ARTICLE III

TRANSACTIONS IN LANDS AND BUILDINGS

Section 1. No Transfer of Lands or Buildings or Leases for More than One Year. No transfer of any lands or buildings, or any interest therein, in the occupied territory, whether by sale, gift, mortgage, charge or otherwise, and no lease of any such lands or buildings or any interest therein for a term longer than one year shall hereafter be effected without the written consent of the Chief Civil Affairs Officer, or of an officer empowered by him.

Section 2. Transfers of Leases Without Consent to be Void. Any such transfer or lease or contract therefor made hereafter without such written consent shall be void.



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ARTICLE VIII

CONFIRMATION OF DEATH SENTENCES

No sentence of death shall be executed unless and until confirmed in writing by the Military Governor of the occupied territory, or by a specified officer not below the rank of Brigadier General or Brigadier to whom he may have delegated such power in writing.

ARTICLE IX

POWER TO MAKE ORDERS

The Chief Civil Affairs Officer may make and from time to time amend such orders or regulations as he may deem requisite for the purpose of this or any other proclamation issued by me.

Section 2. Fines. Where under any proclamation or order an offense is made punishable by fine, the Court imposing the fine may give such directions as appear to be just with respect to the payment of the fine and in default of payment of whole or part thereof may order the defendant to be committed to prison. Any such direction or order shall, for the purposes of review, be considered as part of the sentence.

Section 3. Order as to Residence. The General Military Court or a Superior Military Court, in lieu of or in addition to any other lawful punishment, may direct that the defendant establish his place of residence within a specified area.

Section 4. Confiscation. If under any proclamation or order a defendant shall be convicted of wrongful sale, purchase, use or possession of any article, a Military Court, in lieu of or in addition to any other lawful punishment, may order restitution or compensation to the owner, or the forfeiture to the Allied Military Government of such article.

Section 5. Padlocking. If under any proclamation or order a defendant shall be convicted of an offense involving the sale of a harmful article or the operation of an improper place of business, a Military Court in lieu of or in addition to any other lawful punishment, may order that such place be vacated or closed for a fixed time.

Section 6. Suspension of Sentence. A Military Court may direct that the whole or any part of a sentence of imprisonment imposed by it shall be suspended, on such terms as to good behavior together with such other conditions (if any) as the court may impose. A subsequent conviction for any offense by an Allied Military Court shall have the effect of putting into operation any suspended sentence which the defendant may not have served unless the Court otherwise directs.

ARTICLE VI

GENERAL POWERS OF COURTS

An Allied Military Court may make such orders and do all such acts and things as may be requisite for the due administration of justice and, without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provision, may grant bail, accept and forfeit security therefor, make orders for the attendance of witnesses with or without documents, administer oaths, make orders for the disposal of exhibits, and punish contempt of court.

ARTICLE VII

REVIEW

Section 1. Right of Petition. Any person convicted by a Military Court may, within thirty days after the imposition of sentence, file with the trial court an appeal to the Chief Legal Officer, a petition, addressed to

Section 5. Peddling. If under any proclamation or order a defendant shall be convicted of an offense involving the sale of a harmful article or the operation of an improper place of business, a Military Court in lieu of or in addition to any other lawful punishment, may order that such place be vacated or closed for a fixed time.

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ARTICLE VII

REVIEW

Section 1. Right of Petition. Any person convicted by a Military Court may, within thirty days after the imposition of sentence, file with the trial court or forward to the Chief Legal Officer, a petition, addressed to the Chief Civil Affairs Officer, submitting reasons why the conviction should be set aside or the sentence should be modified.

Section 2. Disposition of Record. Every record of trial by an Allied Military Court shall be transmitted to the Chief Legal Officer for examination and file.

Section 3. Powers on Review. The record of any case may, on the recommendation of the Chief Legal Officer, and shall, in the event of a sentence exceeding two years' imprisonment or a fine of 50,000 lire, be reviewed by the Chief Civil Affairs Officer or by an officer of the Allied Military Government not below the rank of Colonel who may be appointed by the Chief Civil Affairs Officer for that purpose. The reviewing authority shall have power to set aside any conviction, to suspend, reduce or commute the sentence, or to order a new trial.

Section 2. Superior Military Courts. Superior Military Courts shall consist of one or more officers of the Allied Forces, at least one of whom shall be a Judicial Officer of the Allied Military Government if available. A Superior Military Court shall be competent to try all offenses within the jurisdiction of the Allied Military Courts and to impose any lawful punishment other than death or imprisonment for more than 10 years.

Section 3. Summary Military Courts. Summary Military Courts shall consist of one officer who need not be a Judicial Officer but may be any officer of the Allied Military Government if available, or otherwise any officer of the Allied Forces. A Summary Military Court shall be competent to try all offenses within the jurisdiction of the Allied Military Courts other than offenses for which the maximum punishment is death, and to impose any lawful punishment except death or imprisonment for more than 1 year, or fine of more than 50,000 lire, or both such imprisonment and fine.

ARTICLE IV

PROCEDURE

Section 1. Public Sessions. The proceedings of every Allied Military Court shall be public except when otherwise ordered by the Chief Civil Affairs Officer or the Court.

Section 2. Rights of Defendants. Every defendant before an Allied Military Court is entitled:

- (a) To have in advance a copy of the charges upon which he is to be tried, if he so desires;
- (b) To consult a lawyer before the trial and have a lawyer or other representative of his own choosing defend him at the trial, except that the Chief Legal Officer or any Court may at any time prohibit any lawyer or other person from appearing in any Court. In any case before a General Military Court, the Court may at the request of the defendant or otherwise, assign to him an officer to assist in the defense of the case;
- (c) To apply to the Court for further time to prepare his defense, which application the Court may grant or deny in its discretion;
- (d) To bring with him such material witnesses as he may desire or have them summoned by the Court at his request;
- (e) To give evidence on his own behalf at the trial, but he may not be compelled to do so;
- (f) To have the proceedings translated for his benefit when he is unable to understand them otherwise.

Section 3. Rules of Procedure. The Chief Civil Affairs Officer shall make rules of procedure for the Allied Military Courts.

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- (c) To apply to the Court for further time to prepare his defense, which application the Court may grant or deny in its discretion;
- (d) To bring with him such material witnesses as he may desire or have them summoned by the Court at his request;
- (e) To give evidence on his own behalf at the trial, but he may not be compelled to do so;
- (f) To have the proceedings translated for his benefit when he is unable to understand them otherwise.

Section 3. Rules of Procedure. The Chief Civil Affairs Officer shall make rules of procedure for the Allied Military Courts.

Section 4. Assessors. Every Military Court may appoint one or more assessors to sit with the Court. The duty of the assessors shall be to give such advice or assistance on any question as the Court may request.

ARTICLE V

IMPRISONMENT, FINES AND OTHER PENALTIES

Section 1. Previous Convictions. Before imposing sentence upon any person found guilty by an Allied Military Court, evidence of good or bad character including any prior criminal record of the defendant before either military tribunals or the civil courts may be received and considered by the Court in determining the sentence to be imposed.

ALLIED MILITARY COURTS

WHEREAS by Proclamation No. 1 issued on the _____ day of _____ 1943, I assumed all powers of government over the territory in _____ occupied by the Allied Forces under my command, and

WHEREAS by Proclamation No. 2 issued on the said _____ day of _____, 1943, I established offenses to be tried by Military Courts and prescribed punishments therefor,

NOW, therefore, in order to establish Military Courts for the trial of offenders against the proclamations and orders issued under the authority of the Allied Military Government, I, Harold R. L. G. Alexander, G.C.R., C.S.L., D.S.O., M.C., General, General Officer Commanding the Allied Forces in _____ and Military Governor of the occupied territory, hereby proclaim as follows:

ARTICLE I

CREATION OF ALLIED MILITARY COURTS

Allied Military Courts for the occupied territory are hereby established. There shall be General Military Courts, Superior Military Courts and Summary Military Courts, the constitution and competence of which shall be as set forth in Article III.

ARTICLE II

JURISDICTION

Section 1. Over Territory. Jurisdiction of every Allied Military Court shall extend to the whole of the territory occupied by the Allied Forces, and, as regards each part of the territory, from the time at which that part was first occupied.

Section 2. Over Persons. Jurisdiction of every Allied Military Court shall extend to all persons in the territory except (a) members of the Allied Forces; and (b) persons who are treated as prisoners of war under the Geneva Convention of July 27, 1929.

Section 3. Over Offenses. Allied Military Courts shall have jurisdiction over:

- (a) All offenses against the laws and usages of war;
- (b) All offenses under any proclamation, order or regulation issued under the authority of the Allied Military Government;

ARTICLE ICREATION OF ALLIED MILITARY COURTS

Allied Military Courts for the occupied territory are hereby established. There shall be General Military Courts, Superior Military Courts and Summary Military Courts, the constitution and competence of which shall be as set forth in Article III.

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Section 3. Over Offenses. Allied Military Courts shall have jurisdiction over:

- (a) All offenses against the laws and usages of war;
- (b) All offenses under any proclamation, order or regulation issued under the authority of the Allied Military Government;
- (c) Any offense under the Italian Penal Code, or under the Ordinances of any commune, provided the Military Governor or an officer acting under his authority shall have ordered the trial of the case or class of cases by a Military Court.

ARTICLE IIICONSTITUTION OF ALLIED MILITARY COURTS

Section 1. General Military Courts. A General Military Court shall consist of not less than three officers, at least one of whom shall be a Judicial Officer of the Allied Military Government. A General Military Court shall be competent to try all offenses within the jurisdiction of the Allied Military Courts, and to impose any lawful punishment.

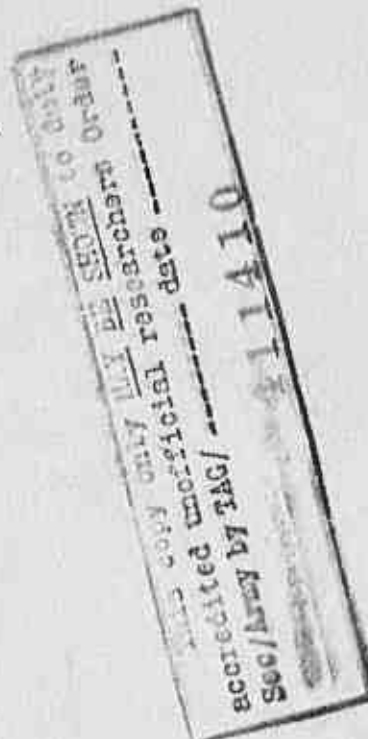

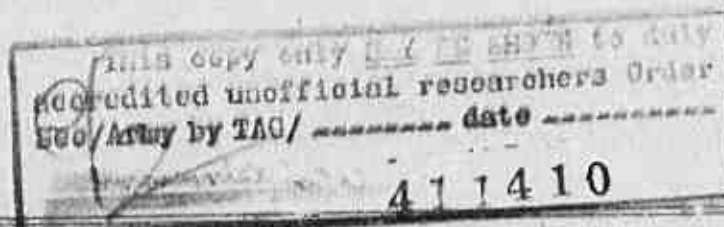

SUBJECT: Operation Instruction No. 1 for P.W.B. Combat Teams
5 June 1945

I. TASKS.

The following tasks will be performed by the P.W.B. Combat Teams:

1. Tactical propaganda against enemy troops.
2. Local propaganda amongst the civilian population.
3. Radio propaganda
4. Collection of propaganda intelligence.

II. METHOD.

The above tasks will be accomplished by the following methods:

1. Tactical propaganda against enemy troops:
 - (a) Leaflets. If the local military situation permits, previously prepared leaflets of general application, but addressed to enemy troops may be distributed by means of:
 - (i) Patrols
 - (ii) Converted 25-Pdr. base ejection smoke shells. Combat Teams will take with them 100 "mushrooms," i.e. modification of smoke shell, together with 50,000 special leaflets.

If necessary, tactical leaflets can be produced locally at a later stage for distribution to enemy troops by either of these means.

- (b) Loudspeakers. If available, portable loudspeakers of the Naval Portovox type will be taken and used for front-line enemy propaganda if circumstances require and permit.

2. Local Propaganda amongst the civilian population:

- (a) Posters. A supply of suitable posters will be taken by the Combat Teams for displaying in occupied localities.

- (b) Leaflets and Circulars. A supply of leaflets and circulars will be taken by the Combat Teams for hand distribution amongst the civilians in occupied areas.

- (c) Printing Press. Any printing press available will be taken over and used for the local production of leaflets, posters, etc., as required.

- (d) Newspapers. If it is decided to continue publication of an existing newspaper, or even to launch a fresh one, the Teams will undertake this task.

NOTE: Above will be done in close liaison with AMCOT.

At a later stage, as practicable, mobil radio transmission units will be landed and operated as required.

4. Intelligence.

Information will be collected regarding the morale of enemy troops and civilians for the purpose of immediate tactical and local propaganda from base. Good communications from Force HQs. to base via force 141 will be essential.

The principle heading for the types of information required as follows:

- (A) Attitude of military and civilians to Allied landings.
- (b) Information on the political situation, both local and on the mainland.
- (c) Reactions of military and civilians to our propaganda as guide to future psychological warfare.

2. The Allied Forces have no intention of changing or undermining the traditional laws and customs of the Italian people. They will take all necessary measures, however, to eliminate "the Fascist system in whatever Italian territory they occupy." Accordingly, the Fascist Party organization will be dissolved, and its appendages "such as" the Fascist Militia and the so-called Youth Organization will be abolished. Fascist doctrines and propaganda in any form will be prohibited. No political activity whatsoever shall be countenanced during the period of military government.

3. In furtherance of the policies of the Allied Governments proper steps will forthwith be taken to "stop the operation in HONORIFIED of all laws which discriminate on the basis of race, color, or creed." Freedom of Religious Worship will be "upheld" and, to the extent that military interests are not prejudiced, Freedom of Speech and Press will be instituted.

4. "Measures will be taken for prompt release of political prisoners." The Special Tribunal for the Defense of the State will be abolished. End part 1.

this part of proclamation emphasis should be placed on factor likely to have psychological appeal to Italians, namely their dislike of Germans, rather than opposition to Fascism with which substantial proportion of Italians have come to identify themselves. 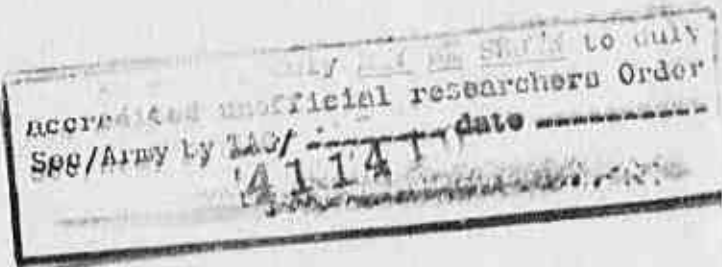

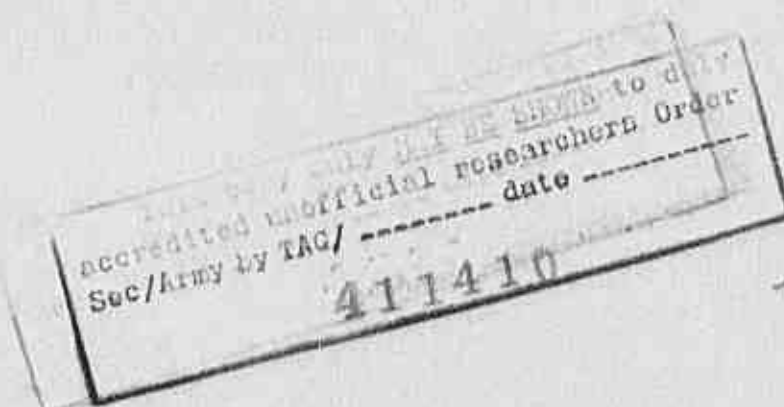

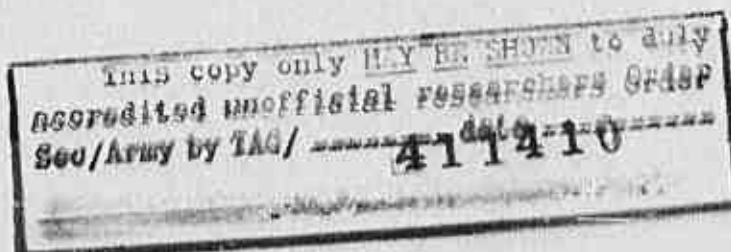

" WE ARE ABOUT TO ENGAGE IN THE SECOND PHASE OF THE OPERATIONS WHICH BEGAN WITH THE INVASION OF NORTH AFRICA. WE HAVE DEFEATED THE ENEMIES FORCES ON THE SOUTH SHORE OF THE MEDITERRANEAN AND CAPTURED HIS ARMY IN ACT. THE FRENCH IN NORTH AFRICA FOR WHOM THE YOKE OF AXIS DOMINATION HAS BEEN LIFTED, ARE NOW OUR LOYAL ALLIES.

THE TASK IS DIFFICULT BUT YOUR SKILL, COURAGE AND DEVOTION TO DUTY WILL BE SUCCESSFUL IN DRIVING OUR ENEMIES CLOSER TO DISASTER AND LEAD US TOWARD VICTORY AND THE LIBERATION OF EUROPE AND ASIA.

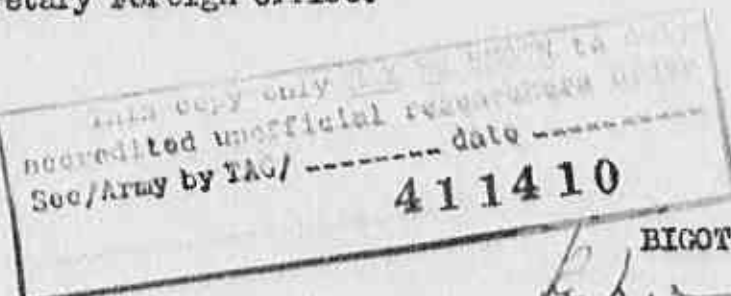

ANNOUNCEMENT TO THE ITALIAN PEOPLE

To the People of (HORRIFIED):

As Commander in Chief of the Allied Forces I transmit this message on behalf of the Governments of the United States and Great Britain.

The Allied Forces are occupying Italian territory. They are doing this not as enemies of the Italian people, but as an inevitable part of their war to destroy the German overlordship of Europe. Their aim is to deliver the people of Italy from the Fascist regime which led them into the war, and which that has been accomplished, to restore Italy as a free nation.

The Allied Forces have no intention of changing or undermining the traditional laws and customs of the Italian people. They will take all necessary measures, however, to eliminate the Fascist system in whatever Italian territory they occupy. Accordingly, the Fascist Party organization will be dissolved, and its appendages such as the Fascist Militia and the so-called Youth Organization will be abolished. Fascist doctrines and propaganda in any form will be prohibited. No political activity whatsoever shall be countenanced during the period of military government.

In furtherance of the policies of the Allied Governments proper steps will forthwith be taken to stop the operation in (HORRIFIED) of all laws which discriminate on the basis of race, color or creed. Freedom of religious worship will be upheld and, to the extent that military interests are not prejudiced, freedom of speech and press will be instituted.

Measures will be taken for prompt release of political prisoners. The Special Tribunal for the Defense of the State will be abolished.

The Military Governor of the occupied territory will take action by proclamation or otherwise to carry into effect the foregoing measures as military conditions may permit.

These evidence the principles to which the Allies are attached and for the re-establishment of which they will relentlessly fight. They are principles to which the Axis leaders, under German domination, are opposed. You will be beneficiaries of their defeat. It is therefore your interest, as men whose fathers fought for their freedom, not to resist the Allied arms, but to facilitate their mission - the lifting of the Nazi yoke from Europe by quick and total victory.

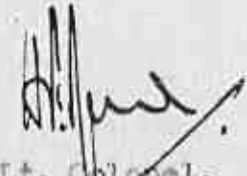

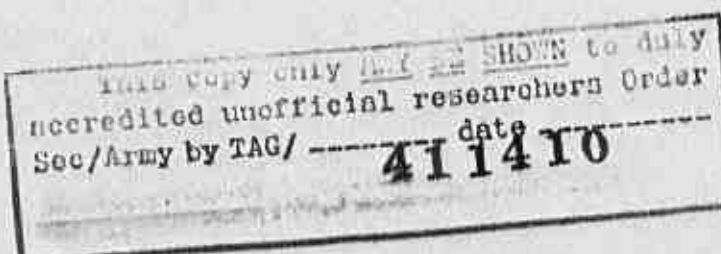

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Minute by C.C.A.O.

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1. I agreed with C.C.S. the text of a leaflet "Do's and Don'ts" for troops, suitable for distribution down to all ranks. While AMGOT can arrange for the printing it can probably best be printed in Egypt for Twelfth Army and in A.F.H.Q. Security printing for 343. W.O. will look after the printing and distribution to Force X. But the distribution to formations is not I think the duty of AMGOT which has no direct concern with combat units etc.

2. In addition to the above AMGOT have prepared and are having printed an explanatory note on how the Military Government will work. This will be available for distribution down to Company Commanders. But the distribution of this also must be done by the appropriate branch of 141 and not by AMGOT which here also has no relations with the commanders of combat units for such purposes.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMMUNICATION TO ALL CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICERS

These instructions are divided into two parts, the first part deals with general policy and the attitude to be adopted towards the civil population. The second part deals with the immediate duties of Civil Affairs Officers on entering occupied centers.

PART I

GENERAL POLICY

1. The Military Government of GERMANY will be a joint Anglo-American Government, in which British and American officers share the responsibility and privilege of administering the first portion of enemy territory occupied by the Allied Forces in Europe.

The administration is under the direct orders of the General Officer Commanding M.I. Force.

During the first phase, in which active military operations are in progress, all C.A.O.s are placed under the direct orders of the formation commander engaged in that particular part of the operation to which they have been allotted.

2. The formation commander to which you, as a British or American officer are attached, may at any time be either an American or British officer. Your superior Civil Affairs Officer may equally be either American or British. You must understand that there are differences in procedure, custom and outlook between the two armies of which you form part. It will be for you to see that these differences do not affect the efficiency of your work and in no circumstances form the subject of complaints or gossiping. A serious view will be taken by your superior officers of any idle chatter or criticism of any member of the other forces. This administration constitutes the first attempt at a Joint Allied Administration and it is your work, your efficiency, and your attitude of mind which will make the administration a success or a failure and will serve as a model or a warning for the other administrations which will have to be built up in other parts of the world.

3. You will be guided in your attitude towards the local population by the memory of years of war in which the Italians fought against your people and your Allies. You will remember that until Italy is out of the war, Italians are enemies of your country. You will, perhaps, be tempted not only by your own inclinations, but by the advances made to you by Italians, to fraternize and to enter into personal relationships, which are not becoming between people who are at war. You must be particularly careful not to fall into the trap of assuming that just because you have taken part in the occupation of a small portion of enemy territory, that the local population has ceased to be hostile or has ceased to wish for the success of their own

Government, in which British and American officers share the responsibility and privilege of administering the first portion of enemy territory occupied by the Allied Forces in Europe.

The administration is under the direct orders of the General Officer Commanding 141 Force.

During the first phase, in which active military operations are in progress, all C.A.O.s are placed under the direct orders of the formation commander engaged in that particular part of the operation to which they have been allotted.

2. The formation commander to which you, as a British or American officer, are attached, may at any time be either an American or British officer. Your superior Civil Affairs Officer may equally be either American or British. You must understand that there are differences in procedure, custom and outlook between the two armies of which you form part. It will be for you to see that these differences do not affect the efficiency of your work and in no circumstances form the subject of complaints or gossiping. A serious view will be taken by your superior officers of any idle chatter or criticism of any member of the other forces. This administration constitutes the first attempt at a Joint Allied Administration and it is your work, your efficiency, and your attitude of mind which will make the administration a success or a failure and will serve as a model or a warning for the other administrations which will have to be built up in other parts of the world.

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4. The general line which will be adopted towards Italian institutions, the Italian people on the mainland and the Italian Government, is not your concern. They are the concern of your superior officers and then only at a high level. Your job is to administer and not to frame policy or talk politics. You are not to discuss political matters with local Italians. You are not to discuss religious matters.

5. You will administer to the best of your ability with a sense of impartiality and justice, without fear or favor. In administration and especially in the administration of justice all men and women must be equal for you. You must learn to disregard the nationality of the people whom you are administering, if you are going to be a good administrator. The principle of good administration are the same in all countries and for all people. They are the preservation of law, order and justice, the prevention of disease and distress, the removal of fear and the creation of economic well-being. To these, for a military government, is added as the first duty, to assist in the prosecution of the war by enabling the high Command to reduce garrison troops for use elsewhere and to provide, within the resources of the country whatever materials are available, which will assist in the prosecution of the war. For obvious reasons economic development must take a second place and can only occur within the limits of transport and of military requirements.

6. In order to economize in manpower, it will be the policy of the military government to secure the maintenance of the Italian administrative machine, subject to the elimination of the Fascist party and its influence. The Fascist party machine will be broken up from the earliest possible moment and in every way in which it is open for us to do so, but the machine cannot be broken up or Fascist influence eliminated in a day. Since also nearly all Italian administrative officials are, at any rate nominally, members of the Party, it will not be possible to remove or intern all members of the Party. This would merely cause a breakdown, not only of the whole of the Italian administrative machine, but also of all technical services, such as transportation, etc. The manner in which the policy of the two governments toward the Fascist Party and its officials is to be carried out will be the subject of joint directives from the governments to the Commander-in-Chief. Specific instructions based on these directives, will be communicated to you. In any event, you should forthwith seek out information as to the identity of officials of the Fascist Party in the territory in which you are serving, as well as the identity of Fascist leaders and pro-Nazi partisans. You will also collect information on the Fascist Secret Police (OVRA), its personnel and its operations in your region.

7. You will treat religious personnel with deference and leniency, unless it can be shown that any of them is acting as an agent for subversive elements, espionage, etc. Cases of internment of Church dignitaries except in cases of real urgency, must be referred by you to your higher Civil Affairs authority.

8. As soon as the storm of war has swept away from your area, you will take steps to restore economic exchanges and the normal life of the inhabitants. It is particularly important that markets and shops should be re-opened and that access to them should be permitted, since without this, the civilian populations will starve. Shipping space to import food must be avoided; food must at all costs, be secured locally if possible. It is most important that agriculture and fishing (subject to Naval approval) should be resumed and that everything should be done to assist the farming population to carry on with their work. Circulation of trucks, etc., to carry farm produce must be permitted as soon as military security allows of this.

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6. In order to continue in non-power, it will be the policy of the military government to secure the maintenance of the Italian administrative machine, subject to the elimination of the Fascist party and its influence. The Fascist party machine will be broken up from the earliest possible moment and in every way in which it is open for us to do so, but the machine cannot be broken up or Fascist influence eliminated in a day. Since also nearly all Italian administrative officials are, at any rate nominally, members of the party, it will not be possible to remove or intern all members of the party. This would merely cause a breakdown, not only of the whole of the Italian administrative machine, but also of all technical services, such as transportation, etc. The manner in which the policy of the two governments toward the Fascist Party and its officials is to be carried out will be the subject of joint directives from the governments to the Commander-in-Chief. Specific instructions based on these directives, will be communicated to you. In any event, you should forthwith seek out information as to the identity of officials of the Fascist Party in the territory in which you are serving, as well as the identity of Fascist leaders and pro-Nazi partisans. You will also collect information on the Fascist Secret Police (OVRA), its personnel and its operations in your region.

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9. One of the earliest and most important duties of Civil Affairs Officers, Civil Affairs Police and Civil Affairs Public Health personnel is to clean up and keep clean inhabited centers. You should aim at a standard of cleanliness, not only as good as it was before occupation, but better. Public Hygiene around military cantonments is the responsibility of the Military Government. It is the local responsibility of all G.A.O.s. You will chase and stimulate the local Italian administration by all means in your power to attend to public hygiene.

10. In taking over a district or any center, try to preserve the local administration and not try to do everything yourself. Give instructions to the higher Italian officials for them to pass on to their subordinates. If you give orders to subordinates, you will find that the authority of the local administration is so impaired that we might have to take it over ourselves entirely; we have not the personnel for this. Remember that there are other areas in Europe where Civil Affairs personnel will be needed. But when you

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give orders make sure that they are carried out.

11. Remember finally that you are in a position of trust as regards your behaviour and that your administration will directly affect the attitude of many thousands of the enemy population towards the Allied Forces.

PART II

DUTIES OF CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICERS ON TAKING OVER DISTRICTS AND OTHER URBAN CENTERS

1. Identified members of Civil Affairs Officers have been allocated to each assault force and are for this purpose attached to the assault Commander of each assault.

Officers

Civil Affairs will not go ashore in the first assault stage, but will, subject to the discretion of the assault commander, go ashore as soon as a sufficiently substantial area has been occupied to warrant their presence ashore. As soon as they go ashore, which should be as far as possible be in parties or not less than two, they are to ascertain the whereabouts of combat units and make arrangements for their own transport to the places where they consider within their own discretion, that their presence may be needed. They will take ashore with them a supply of the proclamations with which they have been furnished.

As soon as an urban center has been occupied, a copy of proclamations number one and number two, followed by such other proclamations as may be provided, will be posted up in a public place (e.g. Town hall, market, public squares, etc.). Proclamations will not be posted on churches. Several copies of each proclamation will be posted in the larger centers, where people are likely to congregate and to read them. The posting of proclamations should follow contact with the local civic or administrative authority, who should be brought along with the Civil Affairs Officer for the first posting of proclamations.

The posting of proclamations in other parts of such centers may be undertaken by the local authorities, if considered reliable or by any other personnel detailed for the purpose.

2. On making contact with the Administrative or Civic authorities, Civil Affairs officers will instruct them to remain at their posts and to continue doing their work, except in the case of officials who are to be removed in accordance with special instructions. Civil Affairs Officers will be opened in suitable premises which for choice should be in the local Fascist headquarters (Casa del Duce). If not suitable, Civil Affairs Officers will install themselves in the town hall or administrative office. In any event they will take offices in a prominent and suitable building and evict any occupants for the purpose, but care will be taken not to remove, destroy or damage any archives or records.

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3. Local Fascist and police records are to be seized and secured. Combat units are to be warned of the necessity of securing records of all sorts and preventing their destruction.

4. Having set up the offices and displayed a notice to that effect, all the military and civil authorities in the area will be notified of the location.

5. If time permits before entering any substantially inhabited center, arrangements should be made by Civil Affairs Officers, with the combat units engaged to deal with the following matters:

1. To close and mount a guard on all Bank premises.
2. To guard power stations and public utilities.

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3. To prevent the access of troops to Church premises (e.g. Convents, etc.), of monuments which are liable to be damaged, or warehouses containing valuable goods.
4. To arrange in cooperation with military security organizations for the arrest and internment of undesirables.
5. To discuss billeting with the local authorities, if available.
6. To discuss markets, provision of food for troops and to ascertain the amount of local resources.
6. In the event of combat units bypassing, without entering large urban centers, Civil Affairs Officers will visit these, with escort if considered necessary and make the same arrangements as have been described above, with the local administrative and civic authorities.
7. In the case of banks in centers which have been occupied by our troops, Civil Affairs Officers will, themselves, close banks and seal vaults, removing such keys as they can secure. They will do the same with police and other archives, unless it is practical to remove these in the event of there being no Civil Affairs personnel available to remain permanently in the center. However, in removing such archives, care must be taken not to damage or lose them. The sealing of banks, premises and archives should be resorted to in the presence of the local administrative officials. The act of sealing in the eyes of the local administration has considerable value. It will, of course, be explained to them that any unauthorized breaking of such seals will render the senior civil administrative official in the place liable to arrest and severe punishment.
8. It is, however, important for Civil Affairs Officers to remember that the available Civil Affairs personnel in the immediately post assault phase will be very limited and that they must preserve a sense of proportion about what is important. The most important thing is to assist the troops in their operations. It may, therefore, be less important to formally take over a center which has been bypassed than to go forward with the combat troops to help them in procuring food and maintaining order in their immediate rear. The rule of "first things first" must be remembered and "first thing" is to clear the enemy out of the territory. The "first thing" therefore is to help the combat units, even if this is at the expense of efficient administration.
9. In the first stages, a clear distinction between the duty of Civil Affairs Officers on the administrative side of Civil Affairs, Police Officers, etc., will be difficult to draw. You will be so few that you must all know and do each others job and never, never say that it isn't your job to do something which a combat unit commander has asked you to do.

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ALLIED MILITARY COMMISSION ON OCCUPIED TERRITORY

Copy to J. G. G. 17

Under International Law the obligation of the occupying power is to restore public order and to see that civil government is continued. This is also important from the standpoint of occupying forces whose character is the war bringing lives of communication and the safety of the troops.

Military Government is established by the Commanding General and staffed by personnel of his command. As experience has shown, particularly in this war, the military government can best be performed by personnel especially trained and assigned for that duty to relieve existing units of the burden and inconvenience of relations with civil authorities, responsibility for keeping civilian services operating and like matters having no relation to their tactical duties.

ALLIED MILITARY COMMISSION ON OCCUPIED TERRITORY

The forces participating in forthcoming operations will be Allied forces. For this reason the Commander-in-Chief of the Allied Forces has created Allied Military Government of Occupied Territory (AMGOT) as the agency of the Allied Forces to administer the territory of Germany. This organization will operate as a unit under the command of the C.A.F. Force 121. Personnel from this organization will be attached to Forces 843 and 545 and to missions for military government duty.

ORGANIZATION OF AMGOT

The structure of AMGOT falls into two parts:

(a) The actual executive government of provinces and towns which is carried out by Civil Affairs Officers (C.A.O.s), with the assistance of Civil Affairs Police Officers (C.A.P.O.s). The special functions of these officers will be dealt with below.

(b) The headquarters of AMGOT which in the case of military government and which has a number of special divisions to deal with matters of a technical nature. These are:

(1) Legal Division which organizes military courts, other than courts martial, and supervises civil courts. It deals with all legal matters affecting civilians but does not deal with British and American law governing members of their armed forces as set out in the British Army Act and American Articles of War.

(2) Financial Division which deals with all the financial aspects of government. It controls taxes, insurance companies, banks, monopolies, etc., and deals with customs and excise, currency matters and economic intelligence.

(3) Civilian Supply Division which deals with all aspects of the supply to civilians of food, fuel, clothing, petrol, light, etc. It exercises its supervisory labor, agriculture, fisheries, civilian transport and rationing to ensure that the civilian population is equitably provided for.

(4) Public Health Division which controls civilian hospitals, etc.

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ARMY STAFF AND HEADQUARTERS, WASHINGTON, D.C.

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ORGANIZATION OF AMGOT

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- (a) The actual executive government of provinces and towns which is carried out by Civil Affairs Officers (C.A.O.s), with the assistance of Civil Affairs Police Officers (C.A.P.O.s). The special function of these officers will be dealt with below.
 - (b) The headquarters of AMGOT which is the seat of military government and which has a number of special divisions to deal with matters of a technical nature. These are:
 - (i) Legal Division which organizes military courts, other than courts martial, and supervises civil courts. It deals with all legal matters affecting civilians but does not deal with British and American law governing members of their armed forces as set out in the British Army Act and American Articles of War.
 - (ii) Financial Division which deals with all the financial aspects of government. It controls banks, insurance companies, railways, etc. and deals with customs and excise, currency matters and economic intelligence.
 - (iii) Civilian Supply Division which deals with all aspects of the supply to civilians of food, fuel, clothing, petrol, light, etc. It also supervises the distribution of relief in kind to civilian transport and rationing to ensure that the civilian population is suitably provided for.
 - (iv) Public Health Division which controls civilian hospitals, civilian medical personnel, sanitation in civilian areas, etc. This division has the responsibility for relief work and will also supervise the distribution of relief in kind immediately and coordinate the activities of relief organizations later.
 - (v) Public Safety Division which is responsible for all civil police matters, including the organization and supervision of those foundations of native police which it is considered should continue in operation. The division also supervises prisons, the fire services and civil defense.
 - (vi) Assets and Property Division which takes over the property formerly belonging to the enemy state and also administers property of abandoned private owners.

ARMY STAFF AND HEADQUARTERS, WASHINGTON, D.C.

There will be a Senior Civil Affairs Officer who will be the principal staff officer of and who will have command on matters relating to military

Government. The G.A.O.s will be responsible to their respective local
Police Commission for military administration.

Civil Affairs Officers (G.A.O.s) will be the central military advisors
of the occupied territory. Provisions will be made to station one or
more G.A.O.s in each province and in each city or town in the territory down
to a population level of 25,000 to 15,000, and possibly in smaller centers
where special conditions exist, such as the presence of enemy troops or the
presence of a port or airport in the vicinity. Location may be made in the
case of continuing towns which may be supervised by a single G.A.O. -

(G.A.O.s) in the occupied territory.

As soon as practicable the G.A.O.s in the field will be organized on
a provincial basis under a Senior Civil Affairs Officer (G.A.O.) in each
province. After the occupation has progressed, it may be feasible to combine
several of the smaller provinces under one G.A.O. The G.A.O.s in charge
of a province will be the channel of communication between the G.A.O.s and
the G.A.O.s in his province.

The functions of the G.A.O.s in their respective areas will be:

- (a) to continue in operation the municipal administration and essential
local services, utilizing existing personnel wherever possible;
- (b) to publish the proclamations and orders of the G.O. and with the
G.A.O.s to enforce the law of military government;
- (c) on behalf of the local unit commander, to issue local regulations
to insure security and local order;
- (d) to coordinate with enemy units in requisitioning, moving,
and billeting in the local area and to assist local unit
commanders in any other matters involving the civil population;
- (e) to organize interior military courts;
- (f) generally to implement the policy of the military administration
of areas.

It will be the responsibility of the G.A.O.s to become familiar with

In large centers there may be stationed in addition to one or more G.A.O.s
members of the Public Safety, Legal, Municipal, Health, and other special
divisions. In the small towns, G.A.O.s will receive advice and assistance
from members of the Special Division assigned to the province under arms.

assist as and when as is necessary in the towns to discharge their functions.

- (a) to continue in operation the municipal administration and essential local services, including ordering essential services wherever possible;

 - (c) on behalf of the local unit commander, to issue local regulations to insure security and local order;
 - (d) to coordinate with combat units in registration, protection, and billeting in the local area and to assist local unit commanders in any other matters involving the civil population;
 - (e) to coordinate military orders;
 - (f) generally to implement the policy of the military administration of AFHQ.

It will be the responsibility of the C.A.C.O.s to become familiar with the areas in which they are stationed as soon as possible, and to keep AFHQ informed as to local conditions and developments, political and economic. The C.A.C.O.s will be responsible in their areas in particular for the maintenance of order and the directing the movement of arms and photographs and equipment, the collection of food stuffs, fuel, motor vehicles and parts and identification or surrender of other articles of use to the combat units or in direct supply to the enemy.

In large centers there may be stationed in addition to one or more C.A.C.O.s members of the Public Safety, Legal, Financial, Health, and other special divisions. In the small towns, C.A.C.O.s will receive advice and assistance from members of the Special Division assigned to the province under emergency orders issued out by the C.A.C.O.s. For the present, local officers will establish channels for Allied military courts and financial officers will spend as much time as is necessary in the towns to direct their functions.

ARTICLE - PUBLIC SAFETY DIVISION IN THE AREA

At least for the initial period, it is planned that the civil police will be organized on the basis of the Government, suggested by such other police organizations as may be considered reliable. These police organizations will be supervised by C.A.C.O.s.

In each city or town where a C.A.C.O. is stationed there will be one or more C.A.C.O.s. In the operation of these the C.A.C.O.s will not under the direction of and in close consultation with the Bureau General. It will be the function of the C.A.C.O.s:

- (a) to take over the administration of the existing police forces, clearing them necessary and reorganizing on the situation may require;
- (b) to set up patrols for security in conjunction with combat units where necessary;
- (c) to coordinate with military intelligence and military police officers;
- (d) to assist the C.A.C.O.s in enforcing law.

3 -

1. THE TASK OF MILITARY GOVERNMENT OF OCCUPIED TERRITORY.

The manner in which the ARMY personnel will be distributed among the task forces and combat forces will be separately indicated.

The task of military government of enemy territory and the enemy population is a difficult one and one in which both the political and military advantage of the occupying power depends in a large measure. The task of military government can be substantially facilitated by the cooperation of combat and unit formations of all ranks. This cooperation should and must be authorized to military government personnel. They are assigned to your forces to relieve you of difficult time-consuming duty. It is your job also to help them.

Finally, it must be borne in mind at all times that the military government is an allied undertaking. Whether the G.I.O. or G.A.P.O. assigned to your unit be British or American he has the authority of the Allied Military Government of Occupied Territory, the agency of your government for the military administration of the area you have occupied.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Major General Lord Rennell

3. Colonel Maxwell, Colonel Chanler, Major Rowe, have been working on modifications we will wish to recommend. These will not be available for despatch to London tonight but it can be made by cable if after further discussion you agree. The suggested modifications will be sent in either by the earliest DR in the morning or brought by Colonel Maxwell and myself. We expect to be at 141 by lunch time.

"DON'TS AND DO'S"

DO:

1. Remember that the Italians are not Germans and many of them dislike the Germans almost as much as we do. But remember the Italians have grossly ill-treated Allied prisoners of war.
2. Remember that the Italians have millions of relatives in U.S.A. where they have learned to value the liberty they have lost in Italy; and that the British fought to help Italy gain her unity and independence.
3. Remember that the Allies don't want to destroy Italy but to preserve Italy as a free sovereign state.
4. Remember that the Italians who don't know U.S.A. or Britain will judge your country by your behaviour and that of your troops.
5. Be polite and firm; bad manners are not a sign of toughness.
6. Respect private and public property as you would your own. Plant and machinery is necessary for the city's life and must not be damaged.

3. Don't allow or close your eyes to looting, theft or trafficking in money, works of art or valuables.

4. Don't destroy or allow to be destroyed any archives, documents or books in any premises you may enter. They will be needed for the Allied government of the country.

5. Don't occupy any government office if you can avoid it. The Allied government of the country will need the offices to govern from. Use as offices hotels, business premises, apartment houses, etc.

6. Don't requisition goods "which may come in useful." Don't remove bits of plants; we may need the plant as a whole and the removal of the piece may destroy its utility.

7. Don't requisition or buy local food stuffs as long as you can possibly get your own. Consult your nearest Civil Affairs Officer or local purchasing and requisitioning. The occupying army is bound to see that the local population is fed and the more you take which is in existence the more we shall have to bring in.

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8. Don't allow favoritism to individuals. Don't let them try to bribe you by presents, entertainment, or "bargains." Don't accept presents from anyone.
9. Don't requisition motor transport without higher authority. If you take all the trucks, food can't be brought in to the markets.
10. Don't forget we are fighting Fascism in all its forms.
