Dear *Sutton*

Lt. Col. Briggs who is leaving for CHIMPANZEE tomorrow is taking with him three sets of Aide-Memoire which we have prepared for the use of C.A.P.O.'s. They cover the towns listed in Appendix D to the AMGOT plan for Region II, less those for which the particulars were sent to you two or three weeks ago. These latter towns were considered to be of particular interest to the assault forces.

The enclosed copy of AMGOT Public Safety Bulletin No. 1 explains the proposed use of the Aide-Memoire and it is suggested that distribution to C.A.P.O.'s is not necessary at this stage. We should, however like C.A.P.O.'s to have them when the assault phase is over and they begin to make their reconnaissances.

In compliance with your signal No. CA/138 of the 8th June, there is now sent to you by fast air a typewritten copy of the translation of the above Code which was made by Sir Charles Belcher in 1941. This has now been checked by him with the original typescript made from his manuscript at that time.

2. It will be observed that in the case of certain Italian legal terms (e.g. "istruzione") which have no precise English equivalent the translator has thought it better to leave the word or phrase untranslated rather than use a lengthy phrase in English or a single English word which may not have precisely the same connotation. Your Legal Advisers will no doubt consider whether or not it is desirable to prefix to the Code as you print it a note in which such words or phrases are defined at length. But it is suggested that use will quickly familiarise the Officers who may have to use the Code with the precise meaning of such words and phrases even without a definition, which it may not be easy to frame without a certain amount of practical experience.

3. The translator has thought it best in other respects to keep as closely as possible to the Italian, even at the risk of making the English version a little bald and stilted in places.

4. He recognises that, even so, errors may have crept into the translation because of his unfamiliarity with the Italian legal system, and he suggests that it should be made clear in one way or another that in the event of a divergence in meaning between the texts the Italian shall prevail. We adopted the converse course in Somalia, where no Italian Courts were left to function, but where there are such it would seem to be a breach of International Law to introduce a foreign Procedure Code. In fact, the two Codes are so closely interwoven that it is thought impossible to apply the substantive Code satisfactorily without at the same time using the Procedure Code.

5. In checking the typescript the translator notices that the typist has generally placed Italian law terms left untrans-

Probably it would be better to omit the commas and to leave the words in ordinary type, or alternatively to print them in italics. It is a matter of relative convenience.

6. It will be observed that the Italian practice is to summarise the contents of an Article in a heading rather than by way of a note in the margin. To make the Code easier for the use of English lawyers accustomed to the latter practice, you may think it desirable to convert the headings into marginal notes, curtailing them where convenient.
