REPORT, PALERMO PROVINCE

I. ADMINISTRATION

The month of September saw the completion of the administrative machinery of the Province of Palermo, the establishment of a firm administrative and governmental foundation based on liberal ideals, and the complete elimination of Fascist restrictions and super-impositions. An acting Prefect, S.E. Francesco Lusotto, was appointed by order dated September 10, 1943 (Appendix 1). This appointment was greeted with satisfaction from all quarters, as Lusotto had a long and clear record of Anti-Fascism. There followed the appointment of a Sindaco and Giunta for the Comune of Palermo by order dated September 27, 1943 (Appendix 2), and subsequently, that of a Provincial President and Council on September 30, 1943 (Appendix 3). Realizing that the Comune and Province of Palermo and its administration would be the subject of great scrutiny and that action taken here would have reverberations throughout the Island, all of the above appointments were made only after the most thorough consideration and consultation with leading liberals and representatives of all classes within the Province. As further demonstration of the avowed intention of the Allied Military Government to eradicate all evidences of Fascist doctrines, an order was issued dated September 24 (Appendix 4) to the effect that all references to racial origin were to be eliminated from official documents. A further order dated September 28 (Appendix 5)

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The administrative set-up within Provincial Headquarters and the control of CAO's in the field were continued along the lines of the previous month. Bi-monthly meetings were still held at Provincial Headquarters, when individual officers had the opportunity of discussing problems peculiar to their territory,

and when future policies regarding the province as a whole could be decided on the basis of their experience in the field.

Officers in Provincial Headquarters and in the field have demonstrated remarkable energy, intelligence and resourcefulness in dealing with extremely difficult governmental problems. The Officers have worked with patience and with no limitation as to hours. Their whole-hearted cooperation has been a source of great aid and comfort to the Senior Civil Affairs Officer.

IA. SUGGESTIONS FOR ACTION BY AMGOT HEADQUARTERS

There are several matters on which action by AMGOT Headquarters would be most helpful to the administration of Palermo Province. These matters have already been submitted to AMGOT Headquarters and are merely repeated here for their convenience.

1. The grain situation in Palermo Province is not a happy one. In fact, we have commenced requisitioning, and, in cases of violation of law, the process of confiscation. The matter was presented to Headquarters before action was taken by us.

Ten days ago, request was made of AMGOT Headquarters for permission to bring some grain from Caltanissetta. We were asked to make our own arrangements. We tried, but with no success. We are in no position to give orders to Caltanissetta. AMGOT Headquarters should decide what grain Palermo should receive and when.

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It is obvious to us that farmers will not turn in their grain at the existing price of 400 lire. The price is quite inadequate by comparison with the general price level and the cost of living.

2. The importation of flour into Palermo City would be most helpful, particularly since it would relieve the acute transportation situation. Some of the roads in the Province are already impassable and although contracts

have been let on all bridges and the contractors are being pushed to the limit, some of the bridges will not be completed for some time.

3. The importation of coal is rather urgent, since so many activities depend on it. For instance, the production of essential building materials is impossible without coal. In some instances, we have been using charcoal in place of coal, but this is not good economy, as Sicily has little enough charcoal. Incidentally, arrangements might well be made for the importation of charcoal from Calabria.

4. We believe the schools should and can be reopened this fall. Why not direct such reopening?

5. We have, after careful exploration, recommended Professor Baviera as the President of the University. Delay in his appointment is to be avoided if possible.

6. We are convinced that the salaries and wages of governmental officials and employees, including all the police forces, are far too low. We recommend that all the existing categories of payments, together with the various supplements hitherto paid by the Italian government, be retained. We do not believe the basic salaries should be altered because that opens up complications with respect to pensions and so forth. Instead, we recommend that

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7. Upward revision of wage rates in private employment.

8. Review of rents.

9. A better price for olive oil - higher than the one submitted in the AMGOT Headquarters memorandum. Our views have already been transmitted in some detail.
10. Recognition of "assegni circolari" and "voglie bancarie".
11. Can Sindaci be paid a salary, or possibly an honorarium, as some communes have done in the past?
12. With the exception of two drivers, none of the enlisted men of Palermo Province has been promoted, although I am advised that those at AMGOT Headquarters have been.
13. Promotion of officers of Palermo Province who have delivered the goods. Likewise, although we appreciate the difficulties, an early clarification of the status of AMGOT officers vis-a-vis the higher-ranking officers of the proposed Armistice Control Commission.
14. The C.I.C. does not coordinate with AMGOT officers. Much of the good will built up by AMGOT has been and is being impaired by the actions of the C.I.C.

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II. FIELDS OF ACTION

A. SUPPLY

1. Food Supply, Rationing, and Prices

a. Administration: During the early part of September, it became increasingly clear that vigorous and constructive control over the entire field of the procurement and distribution of food was necessary. To this end, a Sovraintendenza was established to control and coordinate the functions of all agencies dealing with food supplies, and Avv. Salvatore di Piazza was appointed to that office (Appendices 7 and 7A). In addition, several of the chief officials of the Sezione dell'Alimentazione and other administrative organizations were replaced by men who were considered to be more able and dynamic. Although it is too early to predict the ultimate results of these changes, we feel confident that the steps thus far taken will be justified by a very definite improvement in the functioning of the organization as a whole and the consequent increase in the flow of food through legitimate channels.

One of the first actions of the newly appointed Sovraintendente was to make a tour of the Province to survey the food situation in gen-

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One of the first actions of the newly appointed Sovrintendente was to make a tour of the Province to survey the food situation in general and to meet the officials of the communes who were responsible for the procurement and distribution of food supplies. He was accompanied by Captain Alexander of the Supply Division. These conferences with the local officials were mutually beneficial and provided an opportunity for free discussion of the food problem by those most responsible for its solution.

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- b. Distribution of Bread: Because of the critical shortage of electrical power in Palermo, and because of widespread abuses of the bread rationing system by many bakeries, a new scheme for the distribution

of bread was adopted, effective as of October 1st.

Briefly, the plan contemplated the reduction in the number of bakeries in the city proper from about 187 to 22. These 22 are so located that they can be supplied with electric power and may operate on a 24 hour schedule. The distribution of the bread to ration card holders will be done by at least 90 former bakers at their shops.

Ration card holders must register with a distributor for a period of one month, and no distributor may accept more than 2500 registrations. Eight additional shops will distribute to certain specified groups - Carabinieri, institutions, etc. Bakeries in the suburbs of the city will operate as before.

- c. Fish: A difficult problem arose from the destruction of the city fish market by bombing. The fishing interests with some justification objected to paying the communal tax for the services of a non-existent market. Numerous and lengthy conferences have been held and the question is now approaching a final settlement. In the meantime, many fishermen have continued to work, and substantial amounts of fish have been available at the established prices.

- d. Meat: The demands of the large population of the City of Palermo naturally presented the most serious problem that arose in connection

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d. Meat: The demands of the large population of the City of Palermo naturally presented the most serious problem that arose in connection with the meat supply. The requirements have been met to a large extent, though the unwillingness of many farmers throughout the province to bring cattle to Palermo for slaughtering has operated to prevent the existence of a completely adequate supply. It is believed that the closer supervision of the whole field by the Sovraintendente and his contact with local communal officials will result in the delivery of more cattle to the city. 4502

e. Olive Oil: Plans made for dealing with this season's olive oil production include the assurance of a supply of electric power to

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operate some of the presses. It is probable, however, that resort to other less satisfactory methods of manufacturing will be necessary due to the shortage of electric power.

Prices for the new supply of oil, as proposed by ALLIOT Headquarters, are entirely inadequate. Not only would they fail to attract the oil to the ammassi but they would tend to encourage a flourishing black market in the product. An upward revision of the prices for the several grades of oil has already been recommended by Major Hancock after conferences with oil experts. It is urged that the prices suggested in this revision be adopted immediately.

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2. Supplies, other than food

- a. General: Generally this office has carried out its functions with more ease than the previous month. Nevertheless it is felt that by exercising control on so many commodities a heavy burden has been placed on the department in examining all applications for goods and materials to ensure that they are being used for essential purposes. Consideration is being given to the setting up of a civilian agency to handle the rationing and distribution of all controlled merchandise. Work in connection with the collation of information received in accordance with General Order No. 5 is proceeding, and a coordinated report will be forthcoming shortly.
- b. Fuel: The general shortage of mineral coal supplies has forced this Headquarters to use charcoal and firewood for industrial purposes. This is causing an acute shortage of charcoal. Arrangements have been made whereby the engineer in charge of distribution will go to Calabria to investigate the position with regard to exports from that area to Palermo Province.
- c. P.O.L.: Bulk demands for October have been submitted to AIGOT Headquarters. Shortage of electricity and coal has caused the consumption of P.O.L. to increase considerably.
- d. Fish: A small fleet of fishing boats (Approximately 23) has been made sea-worthy and motor fuel has been provided. A small ice plant has been put into operation to supply the fishermen with about seven tons of ice a day.

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e. Boat: The necessary raw materials have been distributed, so far as supplies would permit, to manufacturers, and output has been resumed in several factories.

f. Cement and Building Materials: Since urgent repair work has been started the demands for cement, timber, and other building materials have increased. These goods are not being manufactured at present with the result that existing stocks are being used up. In order to get production started again coal is needed and until there is sufficient coal available there will be a serious shortage of certain

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building materials. The effect of this on the housing situation and the necessity for making provisional reparation to dwellings should be considered.

g. Leather: A small distribution has been made and tanneries are again functioning.

h. Clothing: Stoves have been re-opened and goods which were transported to places of safety during the air raids are being brought back to Palermo.

i. Electricity: Due to the restriction of current this office has had to deal with some 400 requests for electric energy out of which about 30 have been forwarded to Headquarters with recommendations for compliance.

B. PUBLIC HEALTH

1. Diseases: During the last month there were reported 472 cases of malaria, 251 of typhoid and 10 of broncho-pneumonia. No other communicable diseases were reported. This represents about the normal incidence of these diseases; we can, however, predict a definite increase in the future due to (a) Better reports from Medical Officers, (b) Troop movements, (c) Refugees. The health of the province at present is still normal.

2. Hospitals: The hospital situation throughout the province has been

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2. Hospitals: The hospital situation throughout the province has been re-evaluated. All C.A.O.s were urged to make funds available to improve hospital care and to relieve the load at Palermo, the situation in the latter city being serious because of the abnormal bed-space demands of the Army. Exclusive of Palermo there is available 1 bed per 1000 population. 4501
3. Sanitation and Water Supply: The water and sewage problem is being resolved slowly but surely. Captain Downs has visited various communes and made recommendations. The most urgent problem was the commune of

Misilmeri. Funds and authority have been given to remedy the situation. In this regard we are planning through the Provincial Doctor an educational campaign on hygiene for the general public. This will be done by the ambulatory clinic which goes about the province from commune to commune.

4. Nutrition: The nutrition of the people is still good. There have been no reports of deficiency diseases even though the average diet is not 2500 calories, but closer to 1800 calories. Here too we have planned an educational campaign showing that bread and pasta are not the only foods which give caloric value.

5. General: In the coming week, a plan will be presented to unify malarial control. This has been a sore point for years. A huge amount of money has been spent with little or no results. At the same time some changes in the whole sanitary organization will be proposed.

The Doctors association was re-established according to the law of 1910. They are to make proposals to improve the Mutual Aid societies, to control distribution of benzine, registration of cars, and distribution of alcohol within the confines of their organization.

We have accumulated for the province some local medicine supplies. These will be sold to the Prefettura and they will arrange to dis-

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We have accumulated for the province some local medicine supplies. These will be sold to the Prefettura and they will arrange to distribute and resell the items to hospitals and pharmacies. It is estimated that there is enough for about five months.

Attached is a report of the technical services rendered by this office to the various communes. (Appendix 8).

C. PUBLIC SAFETY

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1. General State of Crime: It is observed that coincident with the return of

the civilian population to the City of Palermo, crime is on the increase. During the last month, four murders and 269 cases of serious or aggravated thefts have been reported. This problem is accentuated by black-out conditions, damaged and insecure buildings, influx of merchandise and return to normal conditions in the town. Special directions have been given to the Carabinieri and Questura Police to enforce the provisions of the Proclamation as regards curfew and to pay special attention to property with a view to the prevention of crime and arrest of offenders.

In the country districts, the position is being met by concentrating all available Civil Police on normal police duties. The increase in civilian activity in the City of Palermo has resulted in additional police problems. Numerous peddlers and beggars have appeared on the streets. The owners of private homes in some of the side streets are sending boys into the main street to solicit soldiers with the offer of food which is served in these private homes. The food is undoubtedly from the Black Market and the sanitary conditions are a menace to health. Vigorous police action is being taken against conditions of this kind.

Prostitution continues to be a problem. No mention of it is made in the proclamations and the Italian Law does not seem to provide adequate control. Women arrested are examined for disease and if none is found are released. Procurers (pimps) operate actively and at present there is no provision of law adequately to control their operations.

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Traffic police continue to operate efficiently. Thru the cooperation of the Military Police, instruction in American methods of handling traffic are being given for the purpose of eliminating confusion where vehicles are operated by the Military. The traffic police, cooperating with Military Police, have surveyed bus routes to determine loading and unloading areas which will not interfere with traffic and cause stoppages. Civil police are active in preventing civilian traffic from travelling on military routes and in restricted areas.

There has been a great deal of rumor and speculation as to the revival of the Mafia organization. All investigation and interrogation of informed civilian agencies at present indicate that there is little positive proof of the resurgence of Mafia activity. The riots at Gangi and Geraci were the culmination of local discontent at the continuance in office of certain administrative officials who were felt by the citizens to be still representative of the old order, but in neither case could Mafia influence be traced. The legal department confirms that no cases tried by our courts have indicated Mafiosi origin.

We have decided on the policy of scrupulous care in not appointing any Mafiosi to public office and of surveillance of the Mafiosi which have all been listed. However, no action will be taken against Mafiosi until they commit an overt act in violation of Allied Military Government or Italian Law.

There have been outbreaks of the rustling of cattle and other livestock in Corleone, Bisacquino and Prizzi. Prompt action has been taken by the local police, and consideration is being given to the establishment of special squads of mounted police to deal with the problem.

Recently the Chief of Transportation, Island Base Section, requested that AMGOT assist in regulating passenger traffic on railroads.

A permit system with police supervision was worked out and is in effect.

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A special effort is being made to locate undeclared firearms and the C.C.R.R. are reporting dumps of abandoned war materials which in turn are reported to and now being removed by Island Base Section.

In order to assist the civil police and identify them to the Military, "Special Identity Cards" have been issued. (Appendix 9). Posters have been placed at all police stations advising that the military

are not to enter such premises unless they are on official business.

Civil Police also perform duties as guards at banks, warehouses, storage depots, railroad stations, monuments and other such places of importance.

2. Discipline and Reliability of Carabinieri and Other Police Forces: On the whole, the conduct of the Carabinieri and other Police Forces has been good and it appears that the officers of the various forces are endeavoring to cooperate with the Allied Forces. Cases have, however, arisen where attention promised to particular items of police duty has not been carried out and it is evident that constant check and supervision is required to insure prompt compliance with directions.

The following outstanding cases of devotion to duty and diligence are reported for information:

- a. On 24 August 1943, a riot occurred at Geraci Siculo in which a crowd numbering about 3000 persons was concerned. In the course of the demonstration, the mob attacked the Municipio, Law Office, Ammasso, and private premises burning and destroying books, records, documents and furniture. In the attack on the Ammasso, the crowd took four cases containing explosives and threw them on the fire, causing an explosion which resulted in the death of eight persons and injury to 62 others. Two Carabinieri, named Cardillo Piccolino Boraventura and Zoppo Filiberto of C.C.P.H. station

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b. On the night of 20/21 September 1943, premises at No. 1 Via Giostro, Palermo, occupied by Allied Forces, Psychological Warfare Branch (Film Section), were entered by thieves and a safe containing

111,716.80 Lire, typewriter, value 10,000 Lire, brief bag, value 20,000 Lire and a bicycle were stolen. The case was turned over to the Questura Department and Vice Commissario Piazza Salvatore was detailed to conduct the inquiry. As a result of painstaking and diligent police work, five persons were arrested for being concerned in committing the crime and the following property was recovered: 87,913.50 Lire, Safe, typewriter, brief case and bicycle. The conduct of Vice Commissario is highly commendable and will be brought to the notice of the Allied Military Court when the case is heard.

3. Air-Raid Precautions: No air-raids were reported during the month of September.

A basic scheme for civil defences for the city of Palermo has been completed and approved during the month. Commandante Bigi, Chief of the Fire Brigade, has been appointed to take charge of Civil Defence arrangements and is at present coordinating with all departments concerned. Progress has been made with the repair of sirens and 20 out of a total of 24 are now in working order.

Arrangements are in hand by the Municipio, public health and welfare services, for homeless persons to be removed from shelters, cleansing and

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Arrangements are in hand by the Municipio, public health and welfare services, for homeless persons to be removed from shelters, cleansing and disinfection to be undertaken, and doors to be provided to keep out unauthorized persons except during active air-raids.

D. TRANSPORTATION, CIRCULATION, AND TRAFFIC

Applications for circulation passes have shown a considerable decrease during the past month, due, in some measure, to the return of many people who were "sfollati" to their normal habitations in Palermo. This was further affected by the order dated September 27, 1943 in which free circulation within the Province

of Palermo was permitted other than during the hours of curfew.

The number of curfew passes issued has considerably decreased. A plan was in course of preparation whereby the issuance of automobile permits was to be handed over to an agency operating as part of the Prefettura. The appropriate forms had already been printed (Appendix 10) when we were advised that AMGOT Headquarters was issuing a new General Order establishing island-wide regulations for the granting of automobile permits. In view of this, we are suspending all action on our plan and as soon as the order is published will be prepared to put it into effect in the Province.

The transportation situation generally is showing slow improvement. On September 28, we were able to obtain a garage large enough to house all our vehicles, which should make for more efficient utilization of and better control over our equipment. The clerical and dispatch offices of the Consorzio Agrario have also been set up in the garage, which is well-policed by the Carabinieri, who are on duty 24 hours a day and are quartered and fed there. One Carabinieri goes out with each truck dispatched. With regard to passenger cars, this Headquarters now has sufficient to enable it to carry out its duties, though an additional strain has been put on the department due to the necessity for obtaining cars for the use of important Italian officials of Palermo.

The public transportation problem was further complicated by the order issued

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The public transportation problem was further complicated by the order issued at the request of the Transportation Section, Island Base Section, dated September 21 (Appendix 11) which limited travel on the trains to civilians engaged in work directly connected with the Allied War effort, and established a system of passes. This had the effect of further over-loading the buses, so that it became necessary to issue the order dated September 29 (Appendix 12) establishing a pass system for the buses to ensure that proper preference was given to those travelling for business purposes and, so far as possible, to prevent the overloading of the buses, with the consequent heavy depreciation of the vehicles and the possibility of serious accident. The situation still continues to be unsatisfactory but it is to be hoped that shortly the restrictions on the trains will

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be lifted.

E. LABOR AND COMMERCE

1. Administration

A great step forward in the elimination of Fascist organizations was the order dated 3 September 1943 (Appendix 13) dissolving all labor syndicates and unions and also the Consiglio Provinciale delle Corporazioni, the Fascist distortion of the old Camera di Commercio. At the same time, the Camera del Lavoro (subsequently changed to the Ufficio del Lavoro) was instituted (Appendix 14) to re-establish a free labor movement with the right of organization subject to the approval of the Ufficio Del Lavoro. This office is also charged with the duty of setting up a system for the registration and placement of labor, for the stabilization of wage rates, the examination and control of working conditions, and the mediation and arbitration of disputes. Prof. Antonio Sallerio was appointed Director of the new organization. (Appendix 15).

Subsequently, by order dated 30 September (Appendix 16) the Camera di Commercio ed Industria was established in place of the dissolved Consiglio Provinciale delle Corporazione, to represent the interests of industry and commerce in the province, to develop its economic growth, and to cooperate

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2. Registration and Employment

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From 31 July, the date the Palermo Labor Registration Office opened, to 25 September 1943, a total of 45, 203 individuals have registered for work. Of this total 35,431 are men and 9,772 are women. Placements have been made for 6,068 men (17.6%) and 134 women (only 1.4%).

The following table gives the number of men and women registered and the number employed according to four main categories.

The foregoing should not be regarded as a true picture of unemployment in Palermo because many of these registrants have found work thru other channels and others may have registered just to secure a registration card in order to apply for relief during the early days when the means test idea was not understood by the population in general. However, the number of women employed is exceedingly small and the condition of this group is becoming increasingly serious.

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The rate of new registrations is declining and the number placed has increased since August 26th (See Appendix 17).

There are increasing demands for upward revisions in wage scales from both employees and employers. Employers are taking the initiative in this matter and an early announcement of AMGOT's new labor policy is highly desirable.

It is very clear to us that the wage scale will have to be substantially increased both for governmental and private employment. Of course, wage increases will entail other changes. For instance, the General Electric Company has spoken to me on several occasions about the impossibility of retaining its present wage scale and I agree with their position. Then in all fairness, it will be necessary to modify the utility rates charged to consumers. Again, a rise in wage scale will entail a revision of rents.

F. WELFARE AND RELIEF

1. Provincial Administration: A public welfare department for the Province of Palermo was established 13 September. (See Appendix 18). The Commissioner of the Department and the heads of the two divisions have also been appointed (Appendix 19). This action completes the organization structure started last month when a child welfare division was set up. Under the new commissioner of Public Welfare, there are now divisions for child welfare, public assistance, and administrative services. It is contemplated that public assistance will continue to be administered at the commune level but be supervised by the Province which has a strong financial interest. The Province will also assume responsibility for institutions for dependent adults, homes for the aged, the physically handicapped, and other special groups in need of assistance in their own homes or in institutions.

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Care of children away from their own homes will be directly supervised and controlled by the Child Welfare Division from the Provincial level as most public and private child caring and child placing institutions and agencies operate on a province-wide basis.

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The Child Welfare Division, in cooperation with an established orphanage, is establishing a reception center for neglected children. Children brought to this center will be studied and observed before being placed in institutions or in foster homes. Physical examinations will also be arranged for through the Childrens Hospital or other reliable medical facilities.

Under the order of 13 September, an administrative service unit may be established for such functions as accounting, reporting, auditing, collection and analysis of statistics, personnel management, and office facilities and services.

The main objectives of this reorganization are to provide a central agency equipped to deal effectively with the many welfare problems with which the City and Province of Palermo are currently faced and to free AMGOT Welfare officers from the details of administration.

2. Public Assistance in Palermo City: The communal assistance machinery described in the August report has continued to function with only minor changes and refinements. An improvement in investigational procedures is reflected in the drop in average daily payments from L. 400,000 during the latter part of August to L. 260,000 for the corresponding period in September. The hope that payments would not go over L. 400,000 has been more than realized.

Another indication of the fact that aid is not being given to every "Tom, Dick and Harry" is an analysis of applications during the closing days of September. For example, on 25 September, 2,065 persons made application for aid. Of this number, only 602 or 29% were permitted to fill out application forms. Of this 29%, 434 or 21% were given emergency grants. Of the remaining 3% less than 1/2 were found eligible as a result of home investi-

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As a matter of actual fact, the rate of Palermo assistance payments at the close of the month of September had fallen to about half the amount formerly paid out in the form of military assistance to wives and children of Italian soldiers. It is increasingly apparent that the improved procedure for investigating relief applications is securing lower total payments while

at the same time providing better care for those unfortunates who are really in distress.

A limited number of cases have been discovered whose needs are not realistically met by the flat daily grant of L.15 for the head of the family and L.5 for children and other members of the household. As of September 26th the following exceptions up to the AMOT Headquarters maximum of L.25 and L.5 per day have been allowed:

- a. Cases of sickness requiring the purchase of medicines or special diet foods.
- b. Purchase of orthopaedic devices, wooden legs, etc.
- c. Released political prisoners living alone and who, for health or other good reasons, are not able to secure employment.

3. Child Welfare: Plans have been completed for providing special medical and dietary service to pregnant women and nursing mothers. Under the proposed scheme, needy cases will be first sent to the central office of the City Doctor (Medico Condotta) for examination and reference to the proper doctor or hospital when such care is indicated. If special feeding is necessary, the case will be sent to a feeding center where foods will be given as prescribed under adequate supervision and follow-up. In effect, the feeding is regarded as part of the medical treatment and care program and is provided only to those whose need is both specific and urgent. The availability of

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4. Problems: Communal public assistance agencies are under increasing pressure to grant relief to persons formerly in receipt of Italian military pensions or allotments from soldiers and officers. As soon as the Italian military political situation is stabilized and communications established, these demands should decrease. In the meantime, assistance for the needy cases will continue to be granted.

With the cool rainy season almost here, housing is another serious question. The advisory committee of the Palermo E.C.A. has been asked to work

out a plan for temporary housing of the most urgent cases. Whatever practicable measures which can be developed will be handled through the commune of Palermo under the supervision of the Civil Affairs Officer.

Clothing for the poorer families and for certain institutional groups is obviously short. A survey of minimum requirements is in process and results will be reported to ALGOT Headquarters at an early date. The public health implications of this problem and that of windowless, heatless houses are clear to any casual observer.

G. LEGAL

1. The volume of Court work has continued to be heavy during this period and a Summary Court has sat almost every day in Palermo to dispose of cases, which included more than 750 curfew offences, numerous charges of black market transactions and sales of wine to soldiers, and various cases of persons found in possession of rations, cigarettes and other types of military property. The most important case dealt with was that brought against the property owner and manager of the Olympia Bar, as a result of which the former was fined L.50000 and sentenced to 6 months imprisonment and the latter was fined L.25000 and sentenced to 3 months imprisonment, the premises being closed by order of the Court for two weeks.

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2. Two charges of wire-cutting were dealt with by a General Court and sentences of 3 and 5 years imprisonment imposed. A number of cases of possessing arms and ammunition as well as one of forging an ALFA note have been disposed of by Superior Courts. A number of Italian lawyers appear regularly before these Courts and render increasingly valuable assistance as they become more familiar with the Court procedure.
3. A large number of charges have been dealt with on behalf of the Army authorities, but difficulties continue to be encountered in ensuring the attendance of military witnesses and in obtaining sufficient evidence from them on which

to base a conviction.

4. Appeals against the sentences imposed by the Military Courts have been lodged in 56 cases and are now under consideration by the Chief Legal Officer, AMGOT Headquarters. Most of these have been based on compassionate grounds.
5. The efforts made by the Italian Courts to function on a normal basis have been further hampered by the refusal of permits for the officials to travel by train and by the continued difficulties in transport and communications. The Tribunale Perale recommenced work on September 24th and the following day disposed of 13 cases, and the Procuratore del Re has been active in the matter of granting provisional liberty in cases where delays are likely before trial.
6. Applications for permission to transfer land continue to be received in large numbers and in approved cases authority is given in accordance with instructions from AMGOT Headquarters.
7. Throughout the Province C.A.O.s are holding Courts regularly and substantial fines have been imposed for black-market offences in many districts with good results. Petralia was visited during the month and a Superior Court held to dispose of several arms cases, and arrangements have been made to deal with cases of the same type at Baudina, Alia and Termini early in October.

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H. FINANCE

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The month was marked by a smoother functioning of the general financial structure in cooperation with the Ufficio del Tesoro, the Prefettura, the Provincial Administration, and the Communes through the C.A.O.'s. Comparative figures began to appear and more detail was available. A rough comparative estimate of the distribution of AMGOT funds to the various sources for the months of July, August and September is attached (Appendix 20).

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5. Communal Finance

This is being absorbed slowly into this office as the C.A.O.s remit their balances and final accounts as sub-accountants and receive imprest funds for AAGOT expenses. We are endeavoring to establish a system of advances to the Communes either supervised by or made directly through the Prefettura. This system incidentally will help to relieve hard-working C.A.O.'s.

A lack of control on demolition, street, sewer, and water contracts led to suspension of payments, a thorough investigation by the police, and a re-organization of the contract system. It was decided to centralize the approval and control of all accounts through the Genio Civile and this office⁸⁷ with full responsibility placed on the Genio Civile.

The question of debt from Government Bodies to civilian creditors is a complicated one, and the arbitrary line of July 1st is subject to different in-

terpretations. Some private institutions still caring for the Provincial and Communal sick are without funds due to slow payment. In one case, we have advanced against assigned accounts through the Prefettura a sum for current needs. This was supported by the Public Health Department on a statement of necessity.

6. Revenue:

Major Gilbertson has done an excellent job on the analysis of the revenue side of the budgets. As a result of conferences and new plans, we have endeavored to coordinate the efforts of the tax authorities, "Guardia di Finanza" and the "Esattori". In fact, these various officials had never met before to discuss common problems. Avvisi (Appendices 2A, B & C) have been issued, notifying taxpayers and tax collectors of the resumption of the system, and it is proposed to follow these up with personal visits throughout the Province by our Finance Officer.

In the various trips made by the S.C.A.C. in the various communes of the Province, the local esattori were contacted. It is pleasing to report that the residents of communes other than Palermo have resumed the payment of all taxes on a substantial scale. Of course, Palermo City presents special difficulties, resulting from the heavy bombardment and the departure of most of the population from the city.

I. PUBLIC WORKS

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I. PUBLIC WORKS

Operation of the Public Works Division of this Headquarters was considerably impeded by the sudden transfer of Major Matthews at the end of the month. Captain Dastoli, who had been working at the Municipio and concentrating on the public works situation within the commune of Palermo, is now in charge of the division. The task of assuring control was rendered more difficult for him by the fact that Major Matthews had no time to confer with him before leaving and to advise him as to the existing situation from the Provincial aspect.

Instructions have been given to the Genio Civile, the Provincial Engineering Office, and the City Engineering Department, that detailed reports of all work

completed or in process are to be submitted to the Provincial Public Works Division at the end of each month, beginning with the month of September. In the meantime, the general situation is as follows:

1. Work in the Province of Palermo

- a. Provincial Engineering Office: This agency has been primarily occupied with the repairing and maintenance of provincial roads and bridges and the construction of retaining walls and culverts. Its work has naturally been greatly increased, as has that of all these organizations connected with the repair and maintenance of the roads, by the damage caused by heavy military traffic and by bombing. During the month, 13 major contracts were completed, employing approximately 400 men, estimated to cost L.460,000.00. Estimates for future projects amounting to L.2,000,000.00 are being considered.
- b. Genio Civile: At present the majority of the work done by this organization has been confined to the City of Palermo, but some specialized contracts for the repair and reconstruction of public buildings and state roads and bridges within the province have been carried out, totalling L.900,000.00. Estimates for future work amounting to L.31,000,000.00 have been received.
- c. A.A.S.S. (Azienda Autonoma Statale della Strada): Eleven major contracts, involving the building or re-building of bridges and the reconstruction

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c. A.A.S.S. (Azienda Autonoma Statale delle Strade): Eleven major contracts, involving the building or re-building of bridges and the reconstruction of retaining walls and culverts, have been completed during the month, in addition to the regular heavy maintenance work on the state roads. Estimates approved to date amount to L.3,000,000.00 while proposals for further work estimated at L.10,000,000 are being considered.

2. Work in the City of Palermo

a. Genio Civile:

(1) The Genio Civile, under the direction of Chief Engineer Verderame,

which deals with the removal of debris and the demolition of dang-

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erous buildings, reports that demolitions were made on 650 buildings and that debris was removed from 100 streets. All work of this nature is now being let by contract and they expect to finish the greatest part of it by the end of October.

(2) In addition to the work mentioned above, the Genio has also started the repair of Public Buildings as instructed by the S.C.A.O. However, progress on this type of work is slow due to the acute shortage of construction materials.

b. City Engineering Department:

The City Engineering Department, under the direction of Chief Engineer Mastrogliacomo, which is responsible for the repair and maintenance of city streets, sidewalks, sewers, and schools, public offices, etc., reports the following:

(1) Temporary repairs were completed on streets to a total length of 3,700 meters.

(2) A total of 56 breaks in the sewer mains were repaired.

(3) 80 per cent of the repairs in progress on 10 public buildings were completed.

(4) The water main of the Gabriele water system, which was badly damaged, has been repaired, and water is now being furnished to the Northwestern suburbs of Palermo.

c. Palermo Acqueduct Company:

The technical director of the Water Company, whose duty it is to maintain

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c. Palermo Acqueduct Company:

The technical director of the Water Company, whose duty it is to maintain and repair the distribution system, reports that the following repairs were effected during the month of September:

- (1) 69 breaks in primary mains.
- (2) 315 breaks in secondary mains.
- (3) 22 hydrants.
- (4) 9 public fountains.
- (5) Minor repairs to prevent leaks were also made on 25 hydrants and 350 valves.

d. Municipal Gas Company

Luigi Di Maccio, the director of the Municipal Gas Company, reports that in

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addition to major and minor repairs made on the plant, the Company also repaired 24 breaks in the primary mains and 18 breaks in the secondary mains of its distribution system.

e. City Cleaning Department

The City Cleaning Department under the direction of Dr. Franco Moreno reports that they have 300 men cleaning streets and two trucks removing garbage from private and public buildings. To aid Dr. Franco in the street cleaning, orders were given to the Genio Civile that the contractors removing debris from the streets remove all rubbish and garbage in addition.

ments have been made for the operation of AGIP incorporating the Shell and Standard installations as a whole. Manager and two (2) sub-managers have been appointed. Examination of present condition and disposition of tanks, pumps, etc., proceeding. Accounts in course of auditing. Meantime

Supply Division is operating the installations as required.

2. Parastatal Concerns:

- a. ENIC: Cinema Massimo has been repaired and is now in first-class condition. Cinema Savoia has been repaired in quick time and was reopened during the month. Repairs cost approximately Lire 140,000 which has been paid out of current receipts. Both theatres are now doing good business and with assistance of P.W.B. provide possibly the only entertainment for the civilian population. Proper system of bookkeeping has been started and accounts and inventories prepared. The operation of this concern under present conditions should show a net profit of approximately lire 235,000 monthly.
- b. UNIONE MILITARE: This concern has been ordered to cease trading pending further investigation. Cash amounting to Lire 1,200,000 has been impounded and inventory of stock is proceeding.

3. State Property:

Complete list of this property has been prepared. Details of all damaged property has been obtained and all information made available to Armed Forces.

General examination and preparation of required inventories is in progress but the large number of Properties (over 200 in the Province) involved will make this work last some considerable time. Certain State concerns are operated by Supply Division with records and control by A.P.C. Administrative changes have in some cases been necessary. In cooperation with advisor on Fine Arts and Monuments, inventories of requisitioned properties to accommodate the National Library and other institutions, have been made. Arrangements have also been made to prevent the requisitioning of certain property of great historical value together with the valuable collections of pictures and works of art.

4. Abandoned Property:

Arrangements have been made for the handling of these cases by the Tribunale Civile through the President of the Notarial Syndicate and the procedure initiated in this province has been adopted for the whole of Sicily. Each application after recommendation will be reviewed by the APC but this procedure should result in the cases being dealt with more expeditiously and effectively than hitherto. The provisions of Proclamation No. 6, Article VI, Section (c), are being complied with but observing the general principle of using the existing Italian arrangements as much as possible. Prior to this new procedure many cases have been dealt with during the month by the APC ranging from one room hovels to large Villas and warehouses. Where necessary, inventories have been prepared, and leases up to one (1) year granted. Where goods were of a perishable nature these have been sold with the approval of the Supply Division and proceeds credited to accounts in name of absent owners. Where possible premises have been made available to the Armed Forces, who in turn have co-operated by arranging to have suitable units occupy the valuable and luxurious Villas; for example, the Villa Sofia, and Villa Malfitano, etc.

In each case bank accounts have been blocked, and cash taken into custody.

Leases have been cancelled, furniture and other moveable assets either removed to APC's warehouse or released to various organizations created by AMOT.

Investigation is proceeding to trace certain assets which have not been produced. Winding up statements are in course of being checked. Records in most cases are not entirely satisfactory, so we have recommended that Prefect should arrange for proper audit in due course by the Audit Department of the Prefettura. Payment of salaries up to 15 September 1943 has been sanctioned and payment will be made in course of next few days.

Arrangements have been made for all fascist properties in the Province to be taken into control and the assets impounded. G.I.L. and Dopolavoro premises and assets have been placed at the disposal of the Public Welfare Division but in the meantime, they are being cared for by C.A.O.'s under general control of APC.

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K. EDUCATION

1. Administration: By order dated 11 September 1943 (Appendix 22) Prof. Ferdinando Albeggianni was appointed Provveditore agli Studi to proceed with the task of reorganizing the schools, the selection of teaching staffs, and similar activities. A special committee was established, composed of university professors, a representative of the Church, and the president of a publishing house, to carry out a revision of school text books. This committee has ²³⁹ already accomplished a good deal. The archives and office equipment of the Provveditorato agli Studi were moved back to their official quarters in Pal-

ermo from the location in the country where they had been consigned for safe-keeping.

The Provveditori of all the Provinces of Sicily came in to see the S.C.A.O. and in the course of the talk they all expressed the opinion that it was quite unnecessary for the Provveditore of each Province to appoint a committee for the revision of text books, in view of the establishment of such a committee in Palermo. They stated that they were very satisfied to accept the findings of the Palermo Committee. They stated that after all Palermo was the Capital and had able men doing the job. Furthermore, in this manner, there would be uniformity throughout the Island.

2. Liaison with ANGOT Headquarters: Many discussions were held with the Educational Advisor, Major Cayre, on the several problems confronting the renewal of educational activities and the means and methods proposed to deal with them as a possible basis for an island-wide policy.

3. University of Palermo: A conference was arranged with the President of the University, the Deans of the various faculties, and the Prefect. The liberal democratic forces and the anti-fascists feel definitely that the President should be removed. At the conference removal of the President was discussed, together with the possibility of electing a new one. It was agreed by all present, including the three anti-Fascists, that such was not feasible.

3. University of Palermo: A conference was arranged with the President of the University, the Deans of the various faculties, and the Prefect. The liberal democratic forces and the anti-fascists feel definitely that the President should be removed. At the conference removal of the President was discussed, together with the possibility of electing a new one. It was agreed by all present, including the three anti-Fascists, that such was not feasible. After much inquiry Major Hancock, Major Pizzozero and the Senior Civil Affairs Officer agreed that the President should be removed and Professor Baviera appointed as interim President for the coming scholastic year. Thereafter the professors themselves can elect the President. Prof. Baviera is an excellent man, a vigorous anti-Fascist, an able scholar, tactful, friendly, and respected by his colleagues. His appointment was recommended by ALGOT Headquarters. Action is rather urgent since much has to be done before the commencement of the scholastic year at the University.

4. School buildings and reopening of Schools: Funds have been advanced to the appropriate engineering officer for the repair of school buildings. Every effort is being made in order to be ready to open the schools as usual. The opinion is unanimous that the schools should be reopened and that it will be practical and feasible to do so.

III COMMUNAL AFFAIRS

1. General: The morale of the people in the Communes continues to be good. There are several explanations for this: the relative end of the conflict for the islanders as reflected in the armistice, which meets with general approval, the abolition of Fascist organizations and methods, and increasing confidence in Allied justice. Political tendencies at present are of a minor character and devoid of serious implications. The main popular tendency in the political field, demonstrated by continuous petitions and deputations, has been the desire of the people for a clean sweep of all public officials, the removal of all those most recently serving under the Fascist government. Many changes and transfers in the communal officials have been made in close co-operation with the Prefetto, and all of these have been exceedingly well received by the people. The difficulties in all communes continue to be shortage of electric power, lack of shoes, oil, and cheese, and complaints about low wages and high prices.

2. Specific Reports

a. Corleone: The Archbishop of Monreale sent the Arch-Priest of Corleone to Provincial Headquarters to report that a house of prostitution has been opened in Corleone by the Army, much to the distress of the population and the Church, since the location chosen was in the main square, near the Cathedral. Shortly afterwards we received a visit from the chief of the Guardia di Pinenza, who was in a great state of agitation because the building selected by the Army had been the Guardia di Pinenza barracks, one of the best buildings in the town and one of the few possessing modern bathroom facilities.

Lt. Blythe of the Public Safety Department was sent to Corleone to make an investigation. He reported that Col. Hines of the 1st Armored Regt.,

finding that there was a very high rate of venereal disease among the men of his command, had decided to locate a suitable place in which to set up a bordello where the women and men could be supervised by the personnel of the 40th Medical Battalion, which was stationed also in Corleone. A building located outside the town was being considered, subject to certain repairs being made, but in the meantime a Major of the 1st Infantry appeared in the office of the local G.A.O. and stated that the selected location was not fit for use except as a stable.

Naturally, although the whole matter was laughable from one aspect, the loss of prestige of the respective police forces and the resultant indignation of their personnel, together with that of the members of the Church and the more sober elements of the town, was considerable.

The local Army officers were contacted by Lt. Blythe and finally General CAMPBELL of the 1st Armored Division issued the necessary orders that the house was to be returned to the former occupants, together with the beds and other materials taken from the Carabinieri.

- b. Palermo: A general feeling that the war, so far as Sicily is concerned, is definitely over and that there will be no more bombing, has resulted in a large influx of people from the country. So far, there has been no obvious attempt to revive politics and the interest of the population at large is more concerned with the material struggle for means of subsistence than in political matters.

This city has never been self-supporting and has depended on State contributions to balance its budgets. The collection of taxes is being pressed hard, and assessment and collection of State and Provincial taxes are receiving priority attention on a Provincial basis. A detailed report with the suggestions of the Vice-Sindaco and of the Ragioniere Generale

for improving the position, have been submitted, together with a comparative budget for September 1943 and 1949. Monopoly industries are at a standstill due to lack of transportation and electric power, resulting in a great loss of revenue and a complete absence of tobacco supplies for the civil population, leading to the further development of the black market and illegal trading in American cigarettes. In a similar manner the local Gas Company has at present very little prospect of re-commencing operations due to lack of coal, but every effort is being made to keep this and other local utilities ready for resumption of activity if and when the supply problem is solved. In the meantime, of course, this results in further loss of revenue.

c. Ustica: Captain Maude and Captain McKay visited the island, taking with them 50 re-patriated prisoners of war together with supplies of flour, vegetables, soap, and medicines. They found that the colony of Confinisti had been and still was being very badly treated. At least 200 had died of starvation and ill treatment between November and March last. The island was completely under the control of two men, Gaetano di Mauro and Ercole Cargano. It was alleged that the latter had many friends among the Questore in Sicily and Italy, and that he arranged with them to have men sent improperly to the island in order to increase the illegal profits obtained from the unfortunate prisoners. Housing and feeding of the prisoners was handled on a "racket" basis and Di Mauro

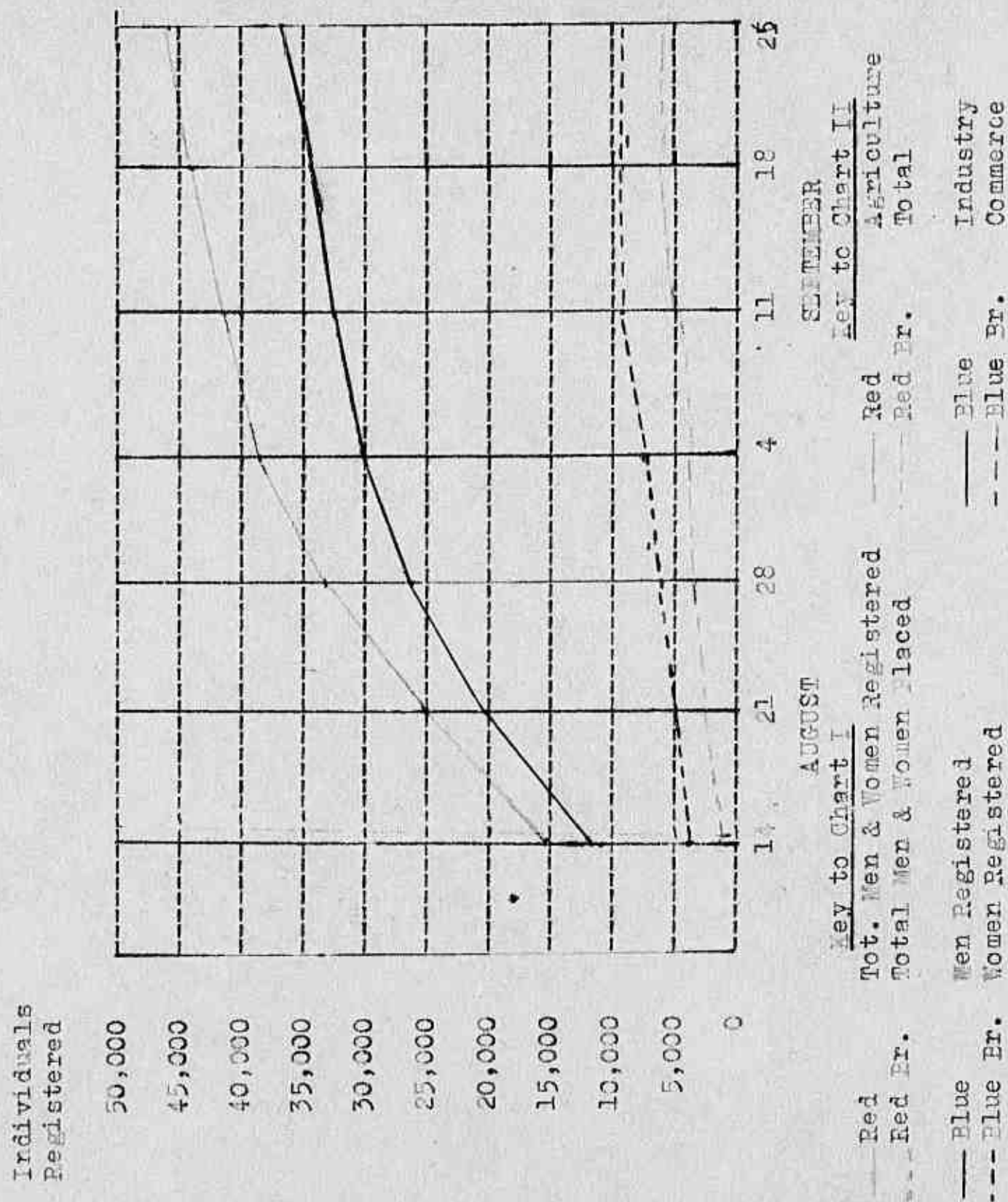
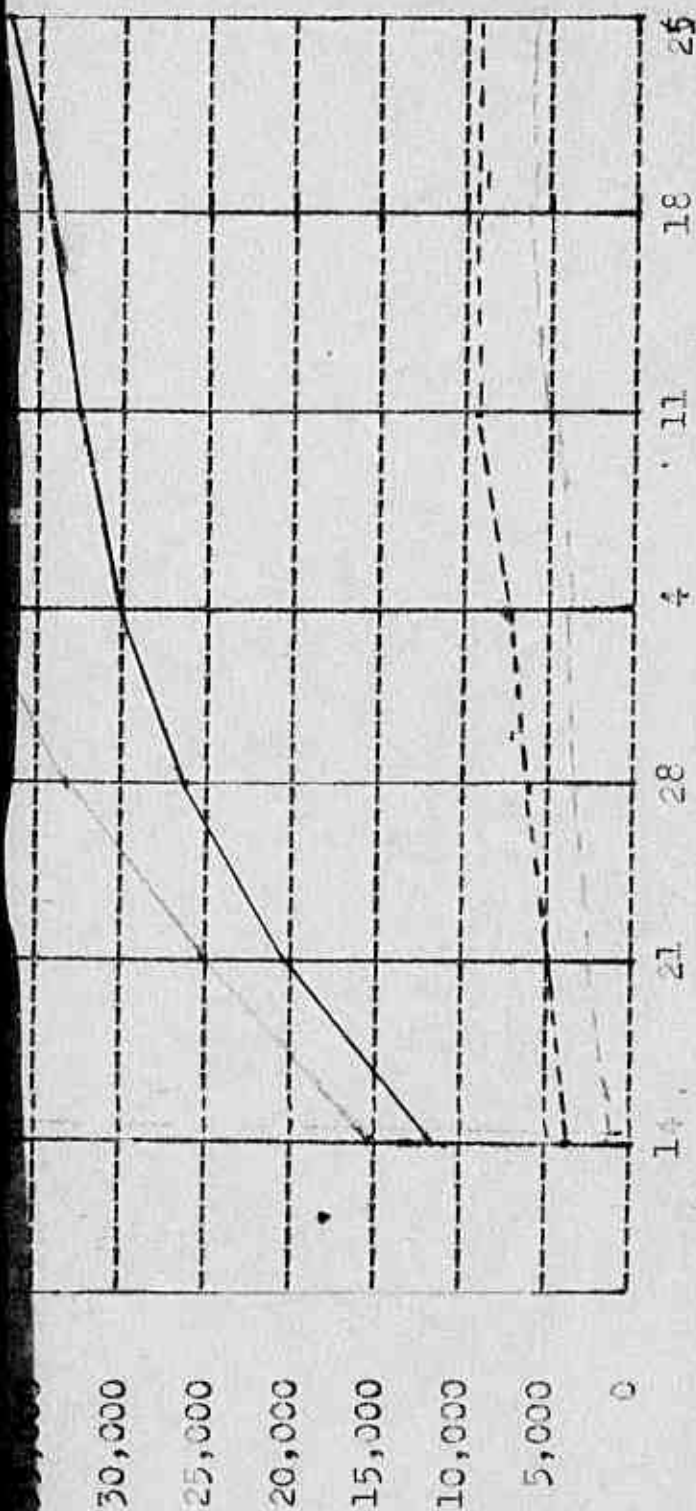
CUMULATIVE TOTALS OF INDIVIDUALS REGISTERED

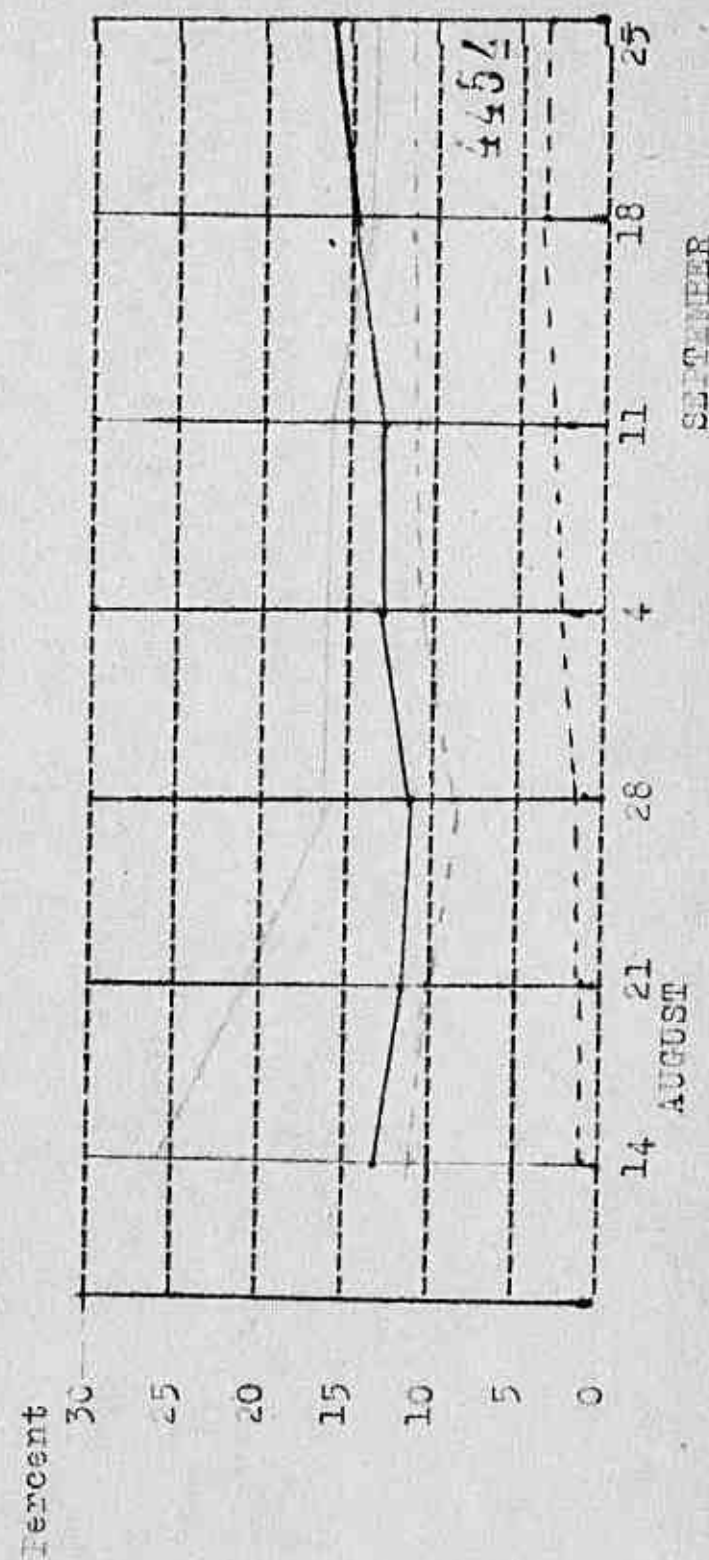
