I. FERRY SERVICE.

1. Effective at once, the Ferry Service to Tunis is discontinued.

2. The Officers Beach Ferry Car will continue but will go to one beach only. Passengers will decide which beach they will go to.

3. Officers desiring to go into Tunis, either on official business or for recreation, will notify the Car Dispatcher in advance. If sufficient number of officers register their desire, Car Dispatcher will then notify each officer as to time of departure and time of return. Cars will not be available to individual cases.

4. No further trips will be made to points beyond Tunis, either on official business or otherwise, without official authorization of Deputy Chief of Staff and then only in case of urgency.

5. These instructions are necessary due to lack of adequate motor transport. All officers are enjoined to follow them.
