1. Reference is made to the recommendations of this Directorate dated 16 September, listing personnel requirements of this Division in Headquarters and Regions I and II.
2. Decentralisation of medical store distribution to Provinces and the necessity for provincial accounting for them makes it necessary that an extra clerk per province be added to the estimate for the Field in Regions I and II. Thus 9 more clerks should be added for Region I, Field, and 10 more should be added for Region II, Field.
3. The 9 men for Region I are required urgently at the present time. Is it possible to assign an additional man to each province at this time with the proviso that the SAOs could attach them to their SAPHO staffs for the purpose of assisting on stores distribution and accounting?
4. Half of the M/OR should be British and half American.

In conformity with Paragraph No. 3 of Memorandum of 3 September, 1943, the following is submitted :-

- (1) Recommendations for Public Safety Officers, Regions I and II and combined Headquarters AMGOT attached.
- (2) The recommendations are based on the assumption -
 - (i) That Lt.-Col. Briggs has been able to join AMGOT Fifth Army and is therefore available for Region III; and
 - (ii) That Lt.-Col. FRANCIS' assignment to the Military Government School precludes his inclusion in the proposals.
- (3) Comment specifically called for, it is the opinion of this Division that Public Safety should be established promptly and maintained constantly. It is more difficult to recover control of police and other Public Safety agencies once out of hand than it is to establish it in the early stages of occupancy. To do this in a prompt and satisfactory manner, it is essential that a sufficient number of qualified specialists officers and men be available.
- (4) Careful consideration of the numbers of officers proposed for both ^{regional} headquarters and for combined headquarters leads to the conclusion that these staffs are inadequate to meet the needs of the situation.
- (5) It is intended to forward in the course of this week a number of recommendations for the promotion of U.S. officers which will make possible the filling of higher ranks by officers of not less than one grade below that authorised.

- (6) Since Civil Affairs Police Officers in the field are responsible for all phases of Public Safety, it is recommended that the term "C.A.P.O." be discontinued and that "Public Safety Officer" (P.S.O.), be substituted therefor in future.
